SUMMARY:

Cedar Ridge Park has been identified as a priority for development through the parks master plan. \$280,000 has been identified in the capital improvement plan to develop the park. The site is situated in a residential area. An initial review of the park has determined that based on the size and location of the park, Cedar Ridge Park is considered a neighborhood park. The park currently includes a playground, benches, and picnic area.

Two surveys were sent out to the community to get feedback on specific elements and final design options. 207 respondents provided feedback on the concepts submitted.

Six design firms created concepts for the park including: Kompan, Burke, Miracle, Wisdom, Playwell, and Playground Etc. Miracle's conceptual design was the overall supported winner with 57 of votes.



The concept includes:

- Standard and ADA glide along
- Two slides
- Climbers
- Climbing wall
- Music panels
- Imaginary play panels
- Manipulative play panels
- Integrated shade within tot lot play area
- Integrated shade within ages 5-12 play area
- Shade over existing bench





Background

- 2021- Parks researched opportunities to improve playability at Chisenhall Fields due to rainouts and requests for improved accessibility
- Early 2022- synthetic field conversion added to Parks and Recreation's Capital Improvement Program (CIP)
- February 2023- Staff presented presentation for the installation of synthetic turf on Arabian field
- Summer of 2023- City council provided direction to convert more fields at once compared to one per year
- \$2,125,000 allocated for funding in 2023-2024 CIP for this project



Current Infield

- Clay and Turf Surfacing
 - Requires occasional replenishment of material
 - Requires daily grooming
 - Requires weekly mowing and trimming
 - Requires daily marking
 - Requires dying maintenance after rain event
 - May require cancellation of play due to inability to dry field for safe play after rain events as clay is microporous soil that retains moisture





New Infield

- Synthetic Surfacing
 - Requires occasional replenishment of material
 - May require patching of high use areas (Evaluate from season to season)
 - Requires daily grooming and balancing of infill material
 - Requires no mowing or fertilization
 - Requires no marking
 - Requires little to no drying maintenance after rain event
 - Play not as likely to be cancelled by rain events with synthetic turf infields drain quickly






How often do you visit Meadowcrest Park?






Do you bring children to Meadowcrest Park? For example, grandparents, parents, caregiver, etc.




What are the ages of the children you bring to the park?






What type of play equipment do the children in your household most enjoy? Please select your top 3.







If you're a Burleson resident, do you live in the Meadowcrest Park neighborhood?




- Meadowcrest Park has been approved as a 2024 project in the Parks Capital Improvement Program

- Pickleball Court installation was supported by community vote for sports court surface




Survey Data

- Survey 1: 206 responses, open from October 30-November 20

- Survey 2: 196 responses, open from January 16-January 28
 - Additional requests made for items: Dog Park, fitness equipment, outdoor activities for adults, more seating (tables and benches), more shade, trees, skate park, repairs to drainage issues, improvements to open space by adding turf




How often do you visit Meadowcrest Park?






What are the ages of the children you bring to the park?






What type of play equipment do the children in your household most enjoy? Please select your top 3.







Revenue YTD October - January








Golf- Pro Shop and FB Revenue Year to Date






Golf- Food and Beverage Cost of Sales Percentages

Food and Beverage Cost of Sales % by Department




Food and Beverage Cost of Sales % Combined YTD


