SUMMARY:

The Parks and Recreation Department will provide a comprehensive update on current efforts and initiatives designed to support inclusive and accessible programming for individuals with disabilities and special needs. The report outlines existing programs and event accommodations, including designated special needs programming at community events, sensory-friendly activities, respite spaces, adaptive recreation programs, and partnerships that support individuals with different abilities.

Ongoing and recently implemented offerings include a designated special needs egg hunt at Bunny Daze, a respite area at Boo Bash, sensory hours at the Splash Pad, sensory-friendly family nights at the BRiCk, programs for individuals with different abilities, and weekly partnerships with Burleson ISD Adult Transition students at Russell Farm. Also, the recent addition of a Sensory Time at the Aqua Egg Hunt, which was implemented in direct response to community feedback.

In August 2025, Burleson ISD Special Education initiated conversations with the Recreation team to explore expanded partnership opportunities aimed at better serving individuals with special needs. These discussions highlighted the need for a broader, more coordinated approach, bringing together special education professionals, advocates, recreation staff, and youth sports organizations, all with a shared commitment to improving community access and inclusion.

In response, over the past six months, the Recreation team established a Special Needs Cohort, a collaborative group designed to align goals, identify service gaps, and explore opportunities to enhance inclusive and accessible programming across the city. The cohort includes representatives from the Burleson Recreation Department, Burleson ISD, the Center for ASD, with invitations extended to local youth sports organizations.

The cohort has met twice to date, on October 28 and March 5, and will reconvene on April 23 to continue advancing this work.

Key discussion topics from the cohort meetings, including building a shared understanding of who is being served, identifying opportunities for immediate collaboration, exploring methods for community input, and discussing strategies to improve communication and outreach so families and individuals are aware of available programs and services.

Next steps include a comprehensive review of Recreation Department programs and events through the lens of accessibility and inclusion at the April 23 meeting. The Special Needs Cohort will assist in identifying service gaps, potential program modifications, and new opportunities to better serve individuals with disabilities and special needs. Staff will then present recommendations to the Advisory Committee on People with Disabilities for review, followed by updates to the Park Board and future Council consideration and discussion.

SUMMARY:

The Chisenhall Hike and Bike Trail system includes over 10 miles of soft-surface trails, with difficulty levels ranging from beginner to expert. As part of continued efforts to enhance rider experience and support volunteer-led improvements, the Fort Worth Mountain Bike Association (FWMBA), a long-standing partner and active Beautification Agreement participant, has proposed the addition of three new wooden trail features, to be fully funded and constructed at no cost to the City.

Proposed Features:

- **Wall Berm**
 - **Location:** Cactus Jack Loop
 - **Purpose:** Enhance trail flow and rider experience while providing a safe, durable, and controlled riding feature.

Design & Safety:

- All features constructed using pressure-treated lumber and galvanized hardware
- Securely anchored and designed for beginner-to-intermediate rider progression

Maintenance & Oversight:

- Ongoing maintenance will be performed by FWMBA under their existing Beautification Agreement with the City.

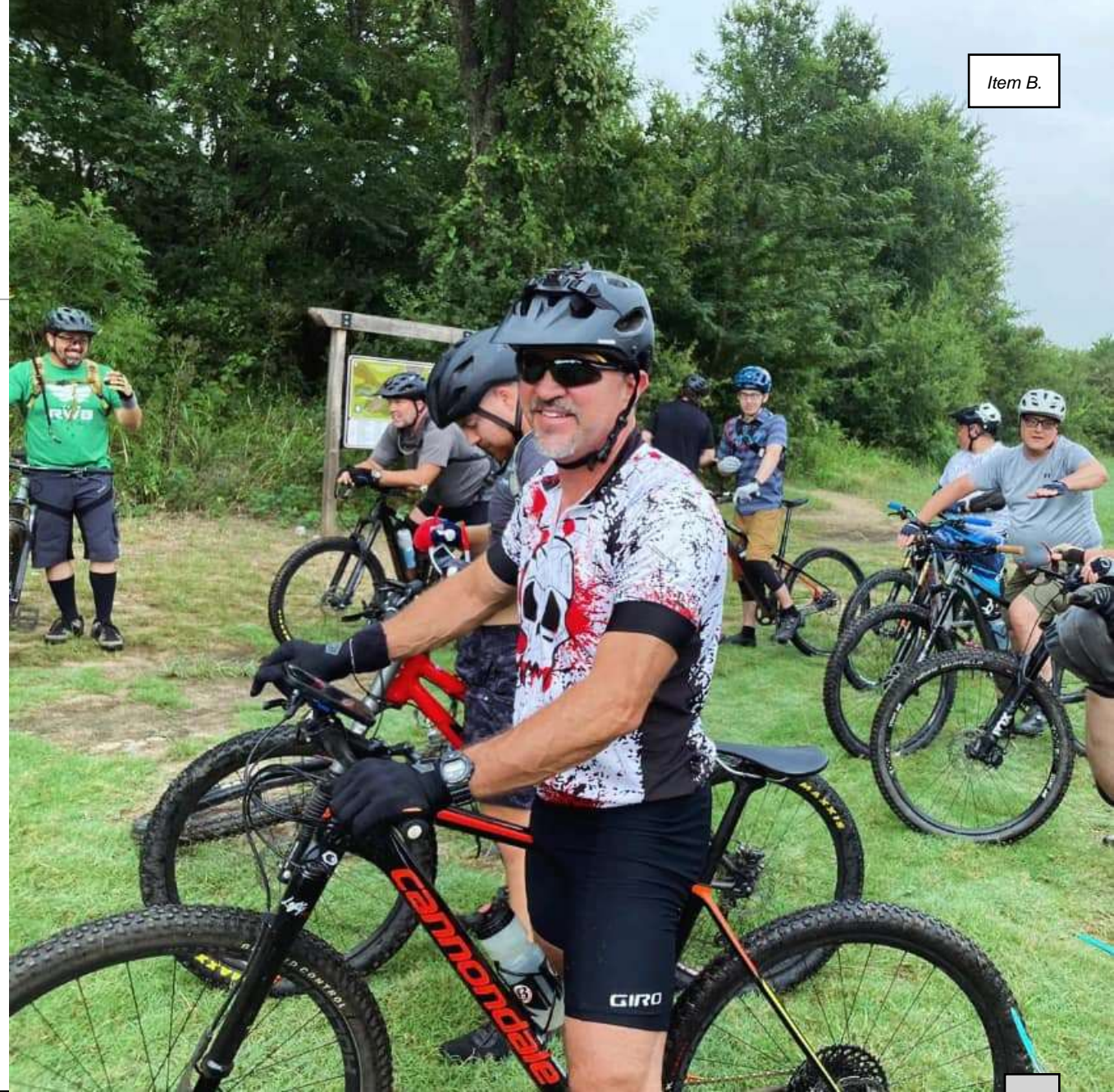


Background

- In September of 2023, Fort Worth Mountain Bike Association (FWMBA) entered into an agreement to maintain the trails.
- FWMBA currently maintains the trails and the existing features.
- They also design, propose, and install new features on a periodic basis.

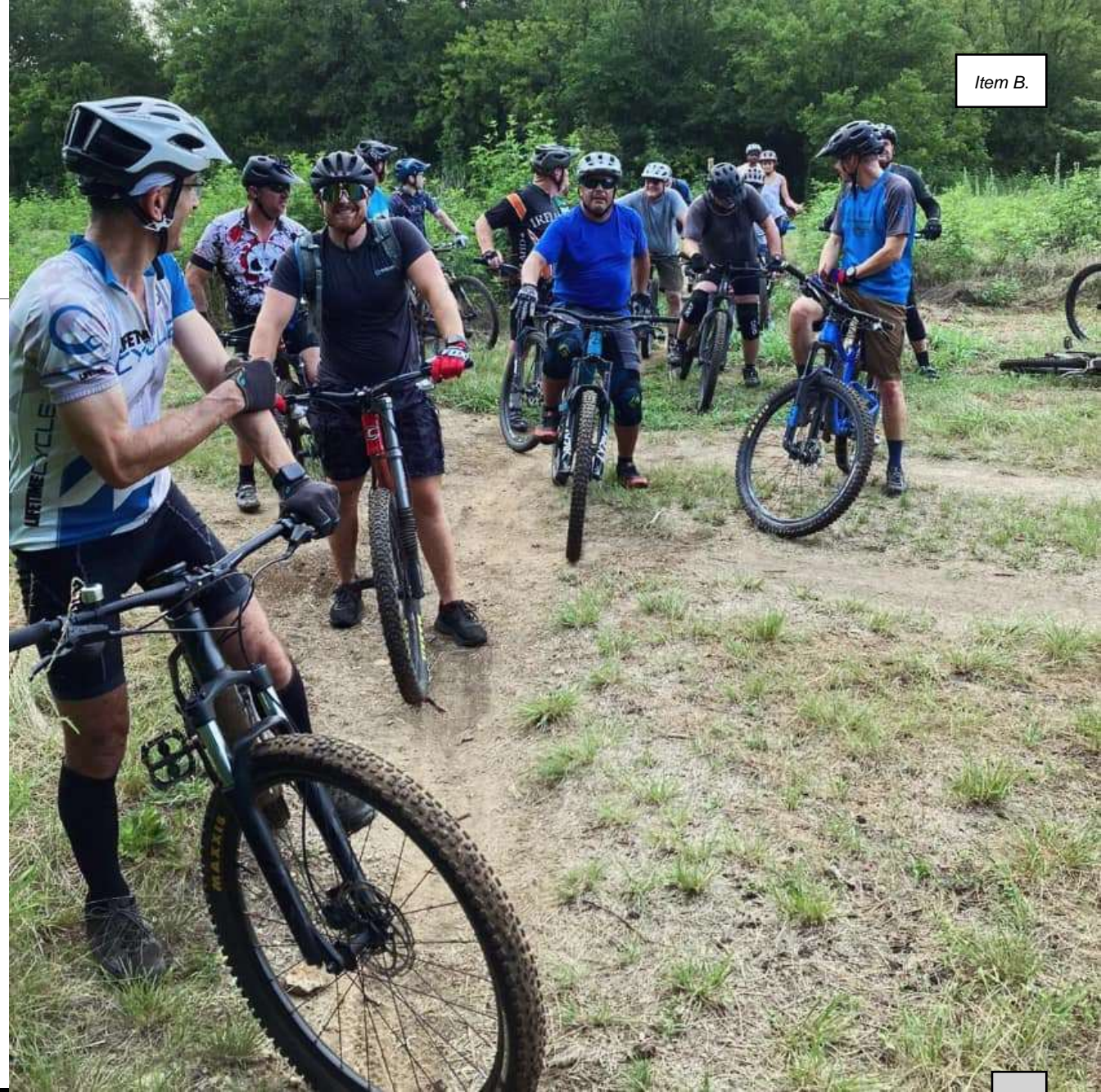

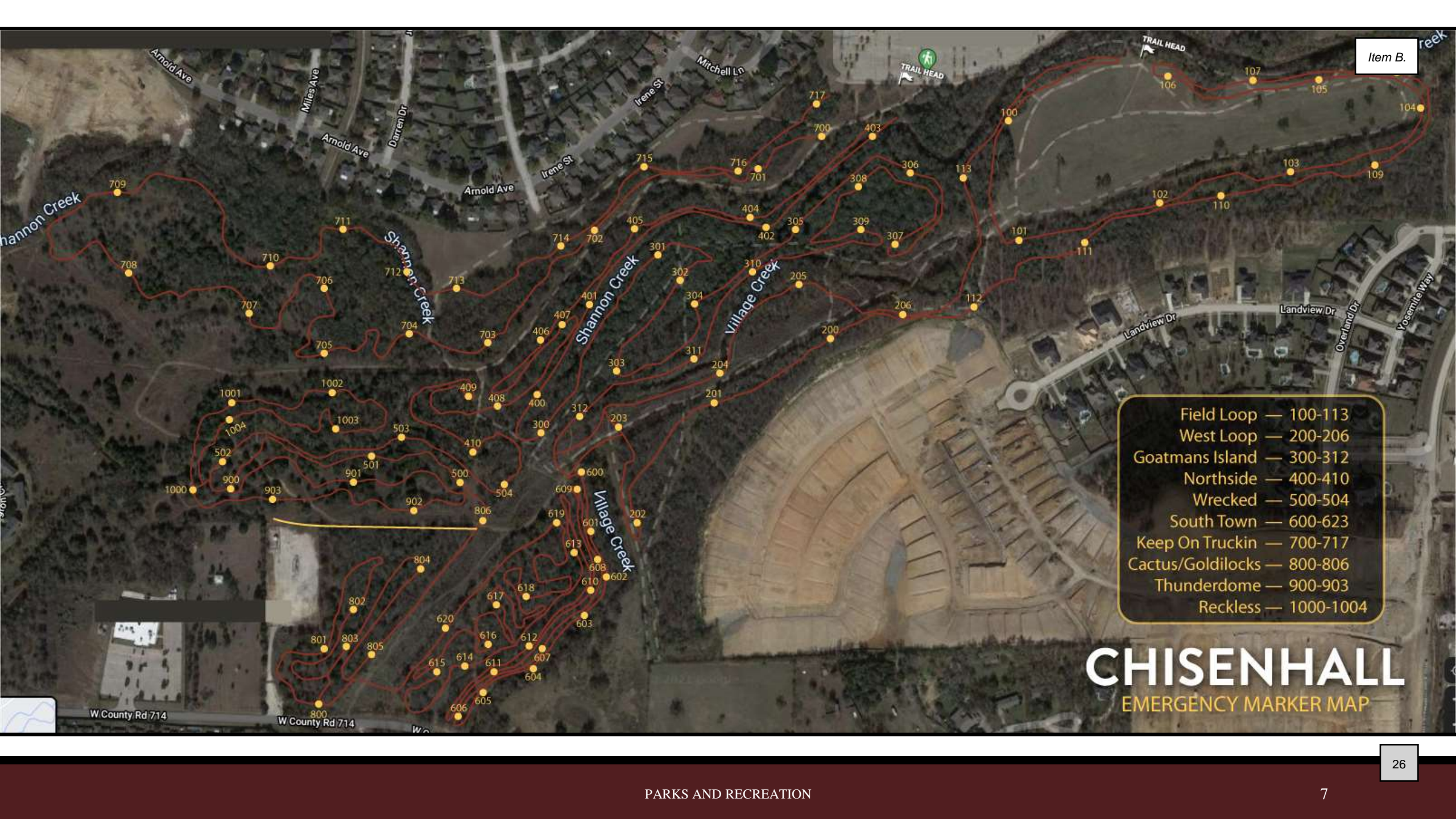

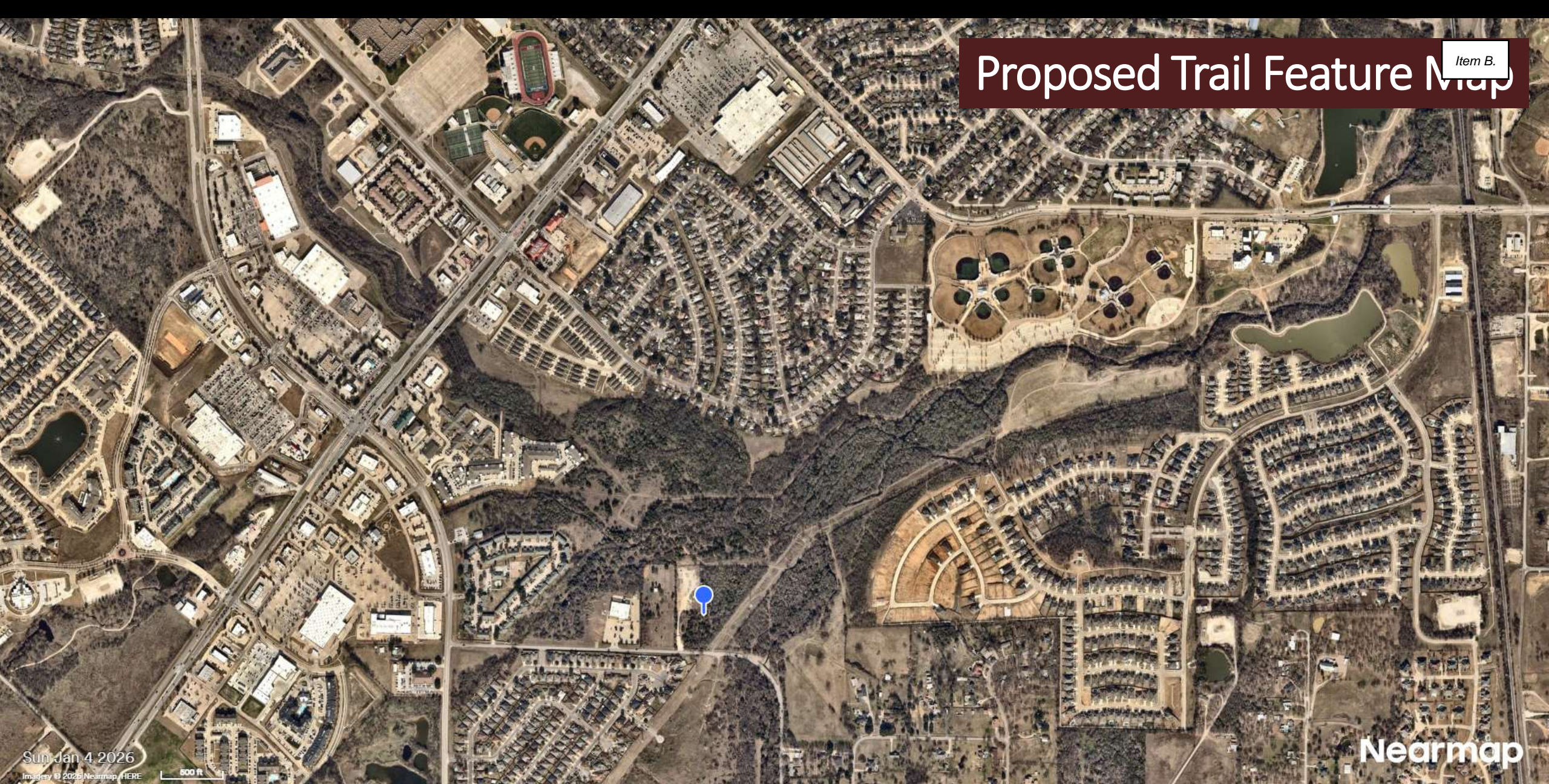

EMERGENCY MARKER MAP

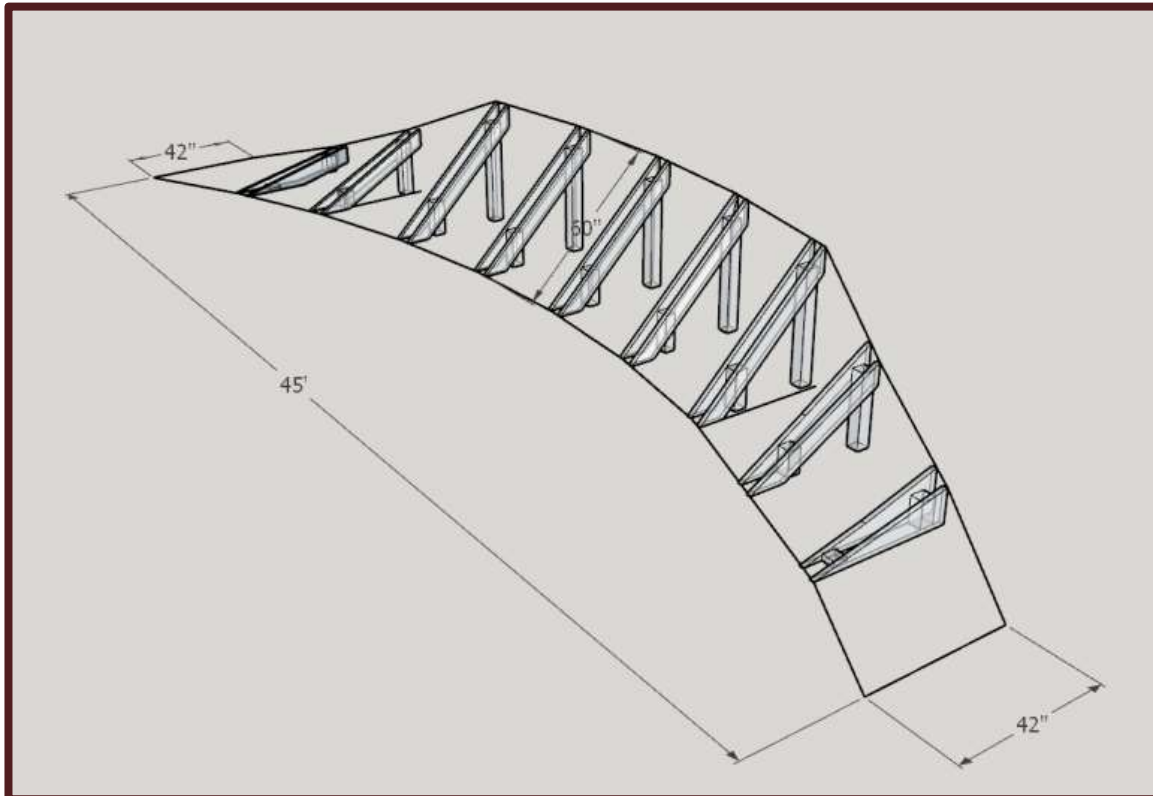
Proposed Trail Feature Map

- Location: Cactus Jack Loop



Design, Maintenance, & Safety

- Built using pressure-treated lumber and galvanized hardware
- Features anchored with concrete footers for long-term stability
- Designed for beginner-to-intermediate rider progression
- Emergency marker posts will be installed near each new feature to aid in response if needed
- Safety signage at each feature highlighting rider skill level, reminders, and trail etiquette
- All ongoing maintenance performed by FWMBA under existing Beautification Agreement
- The feature is adjacent to the trail and users who do not want to attempt the feature can continue the trail unimpacted

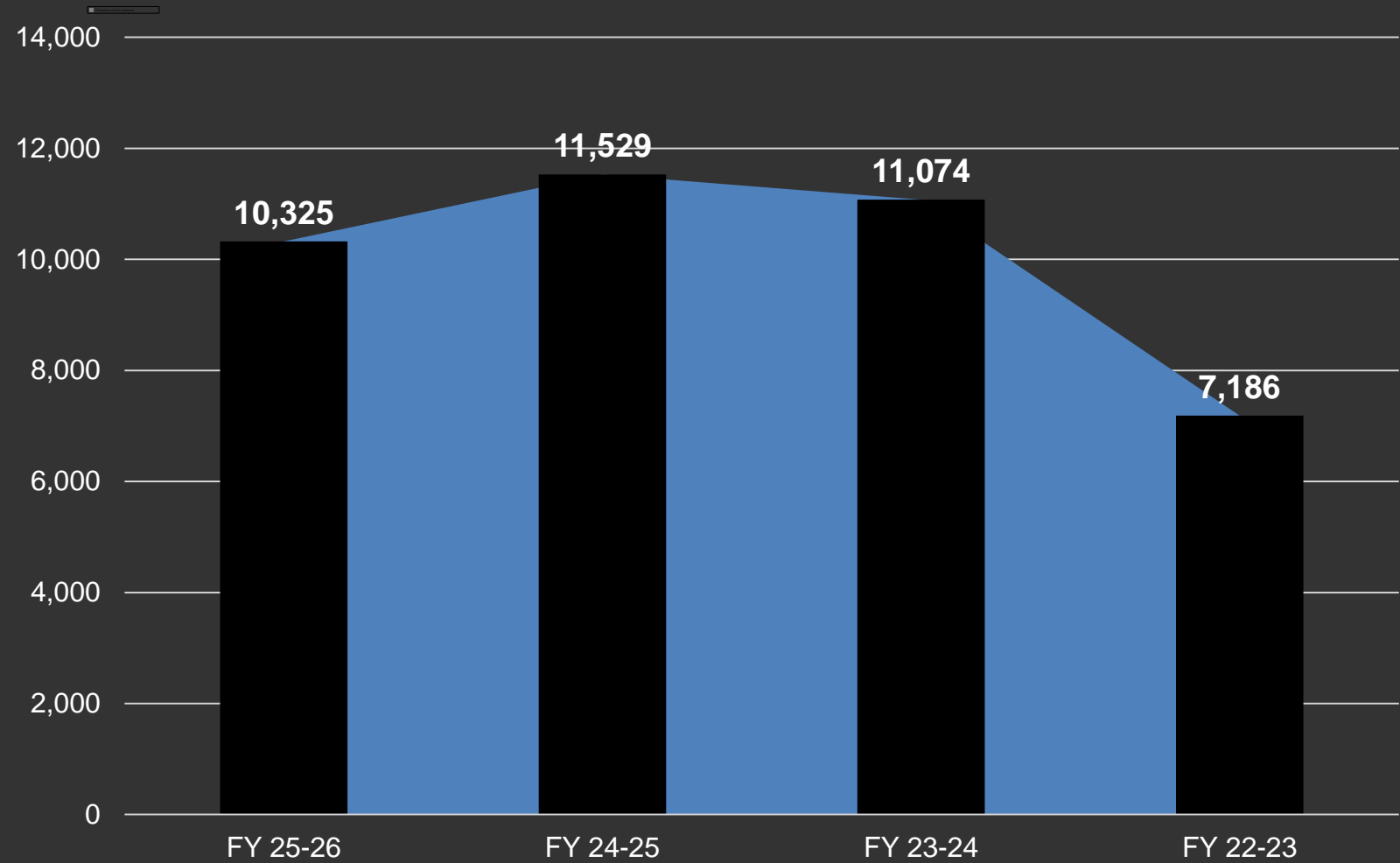

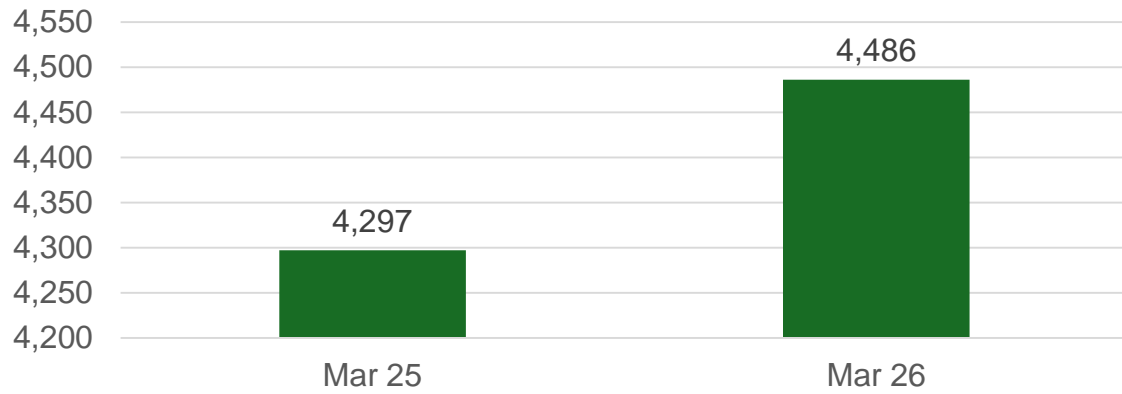

Rounds Played in March

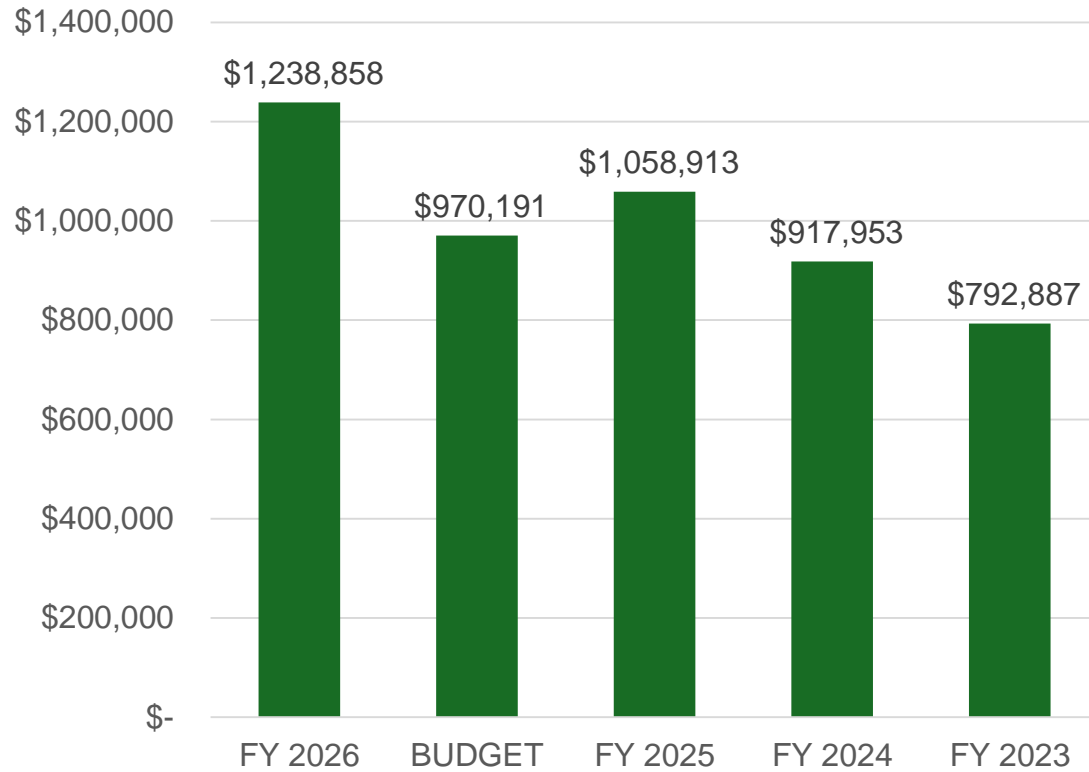

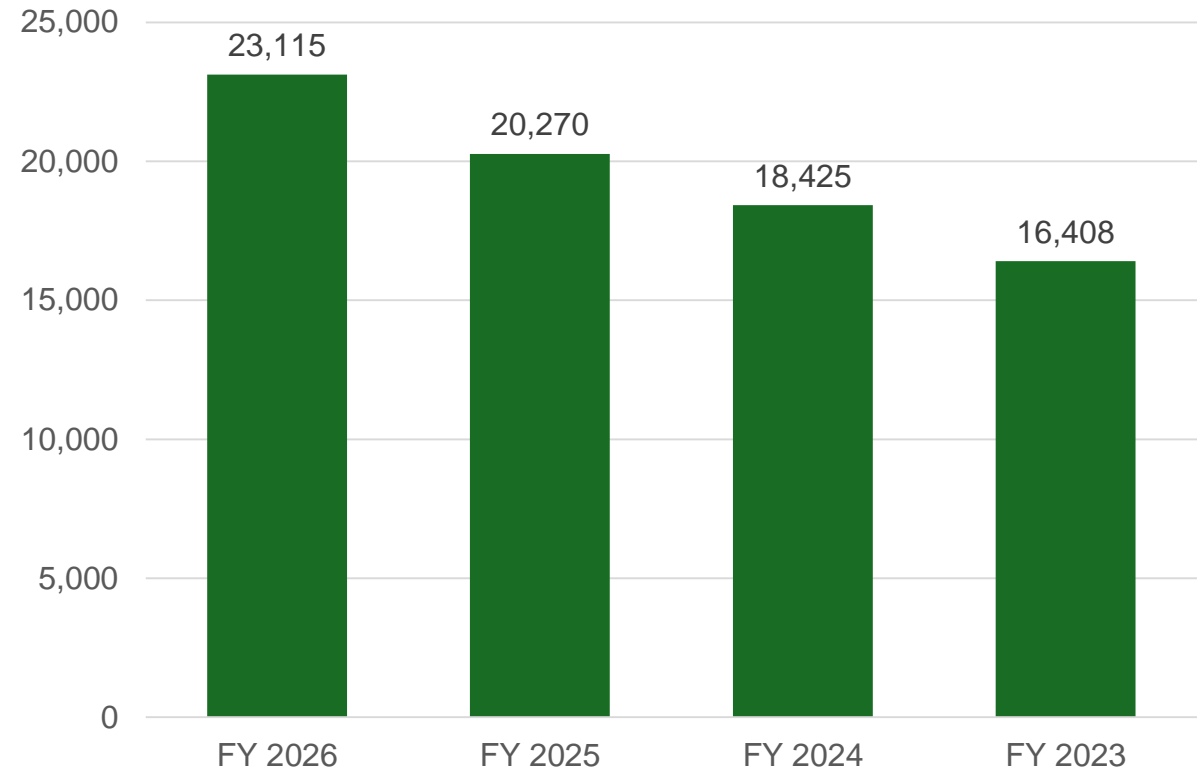


Hidden Creek Golf Course- Year to Date

Rounds Played YTD October- March

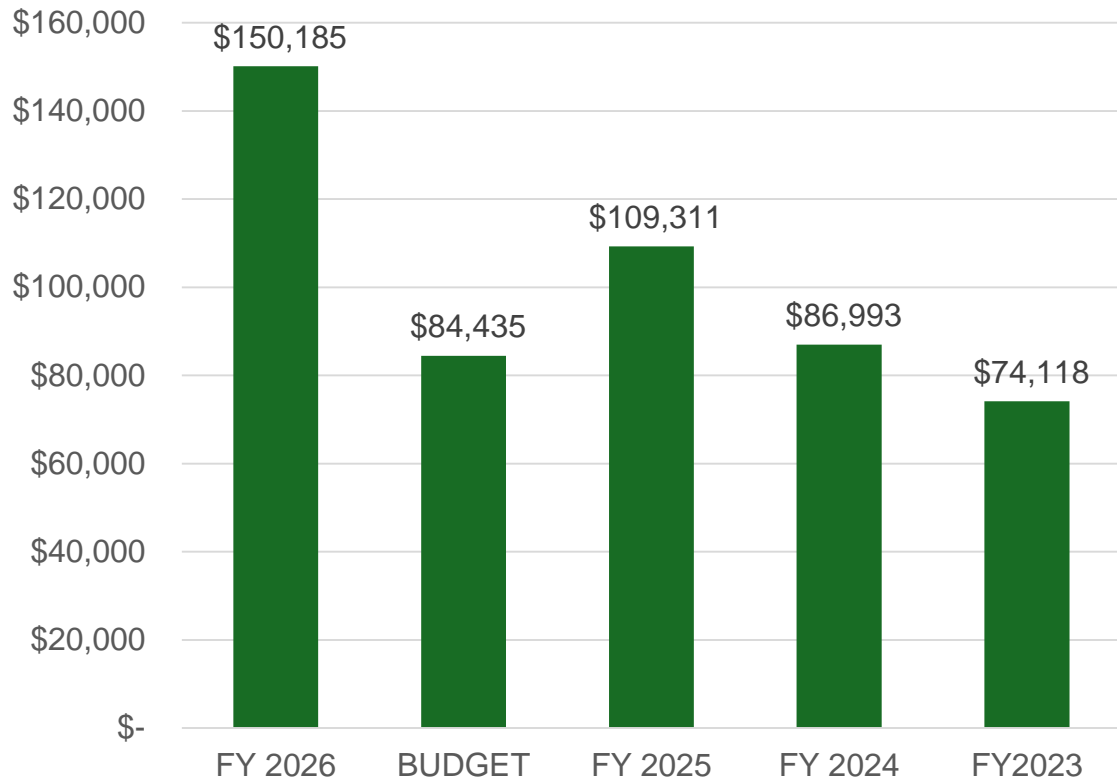

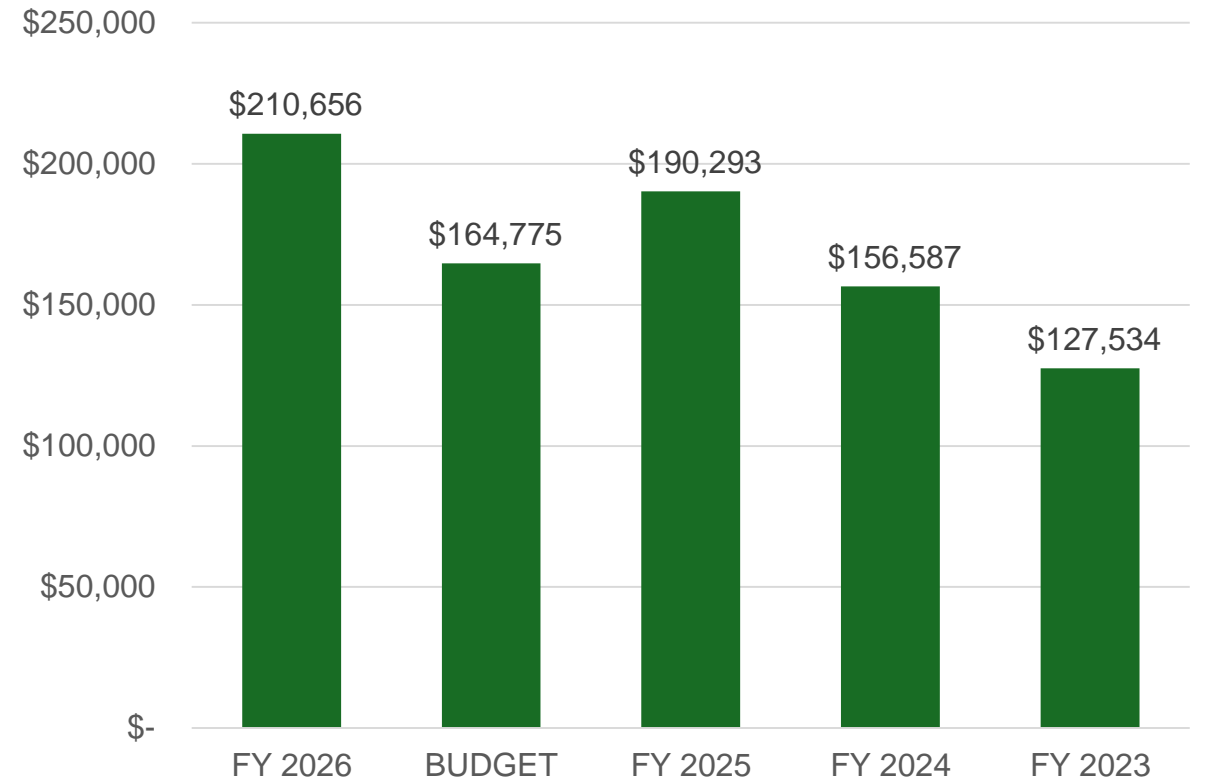

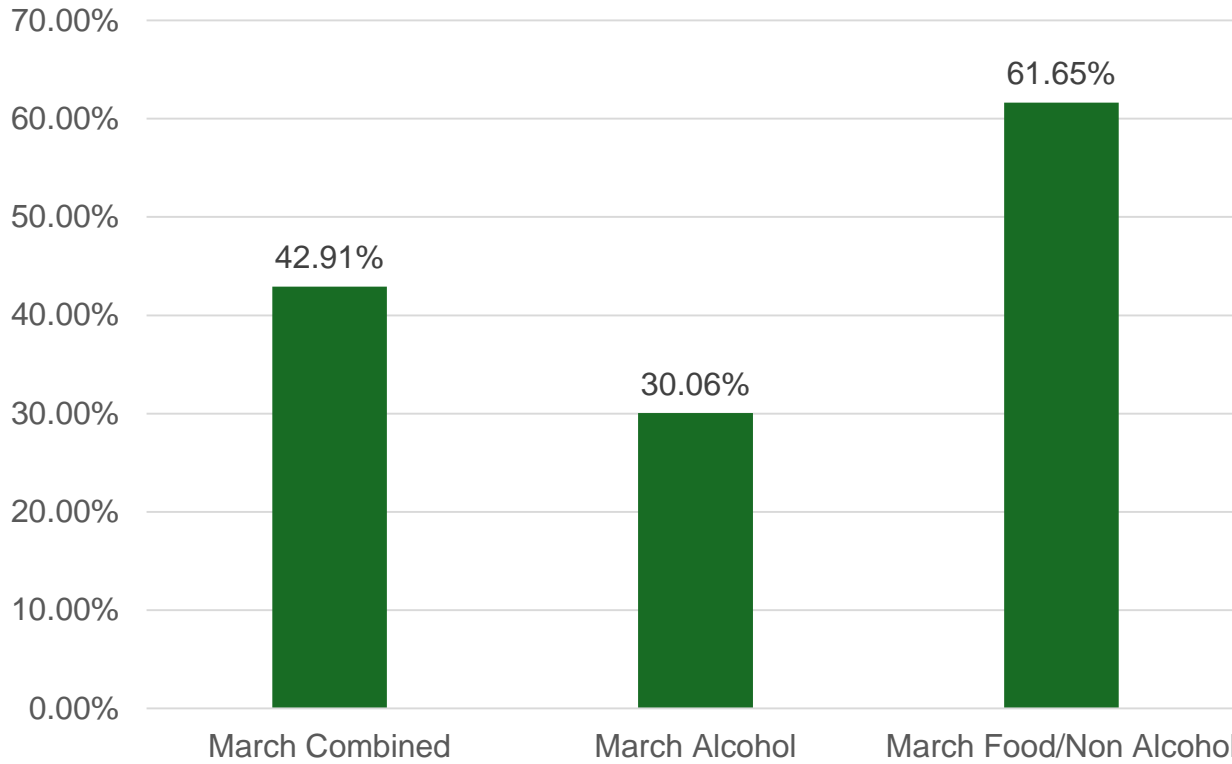


Hidden Creek Golf Course- Food and Beverage Cost of Sales Percentages

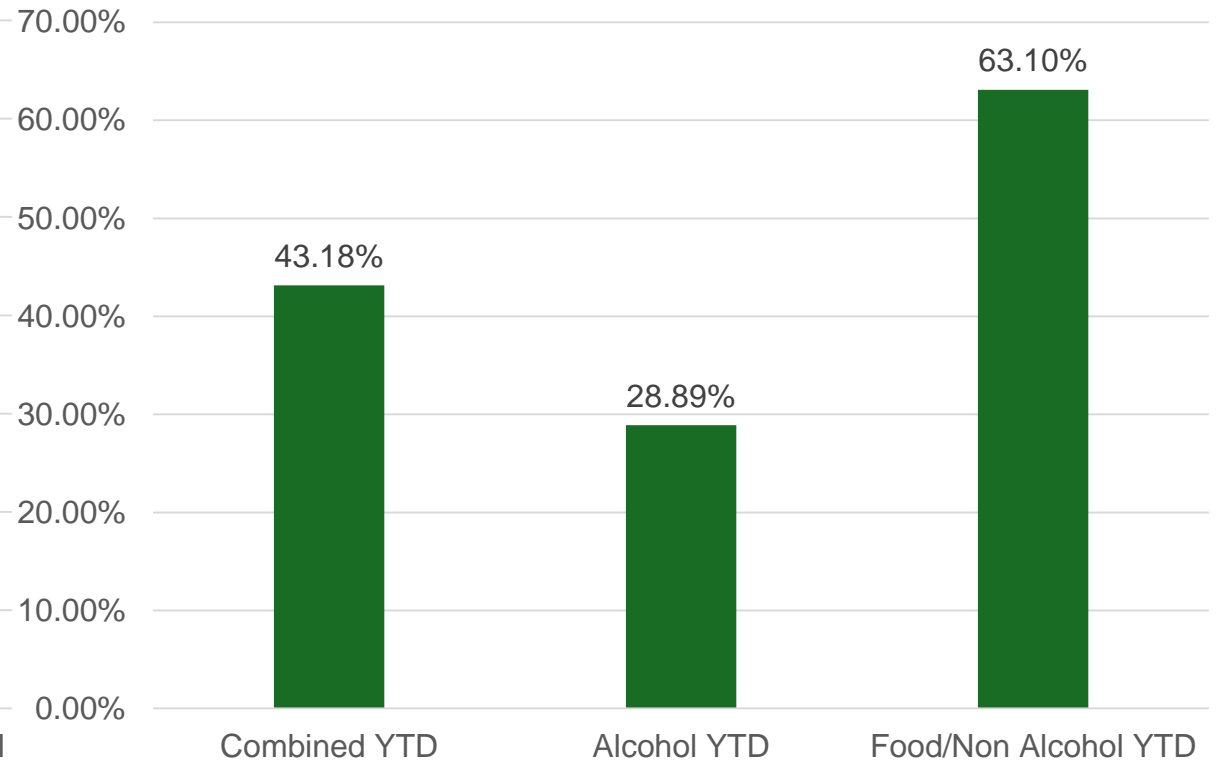

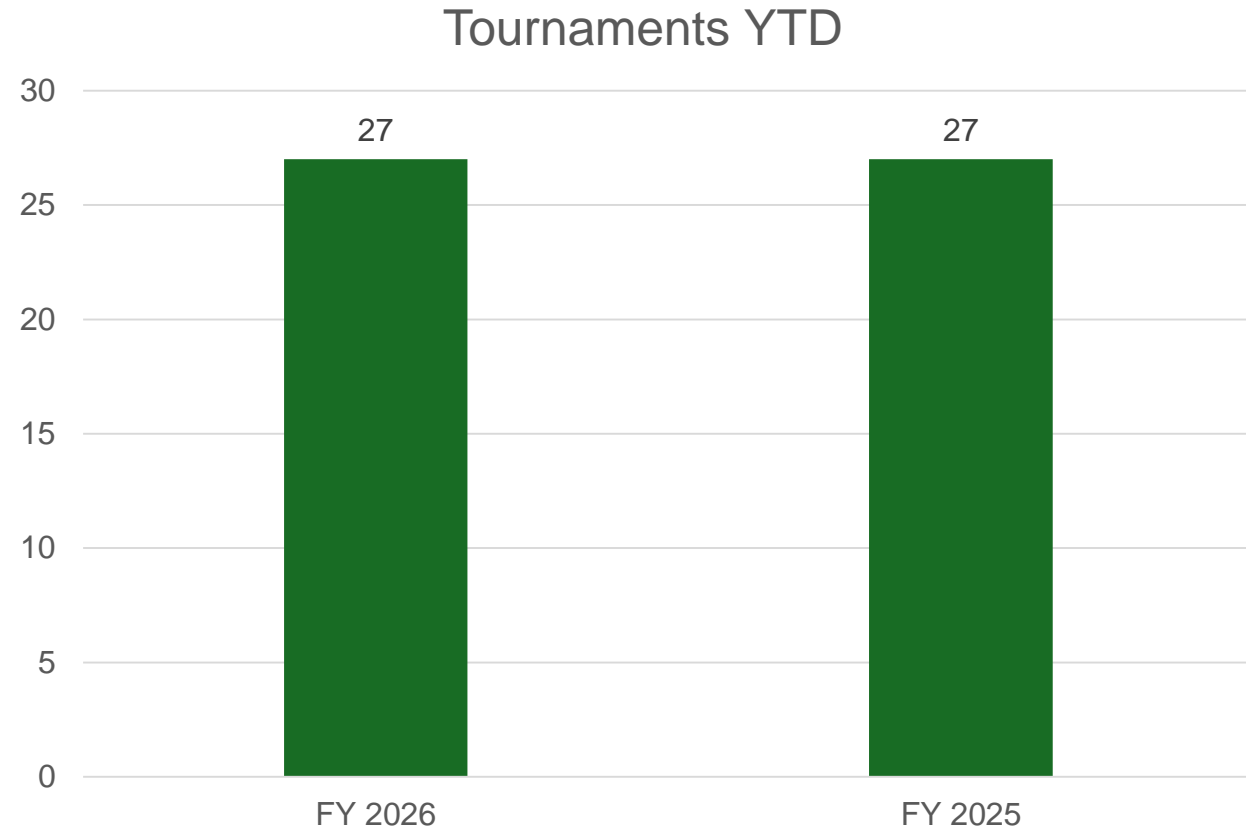

Food and Beverage Cost of Sales YTD



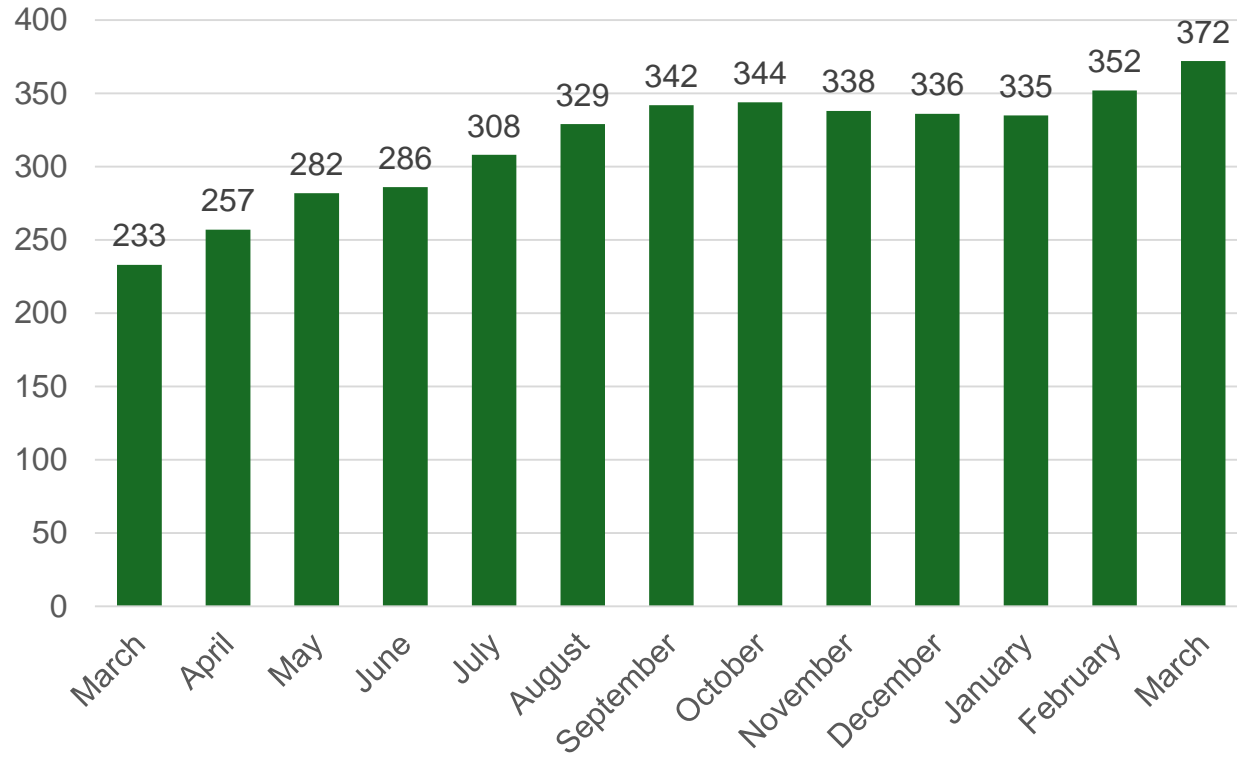

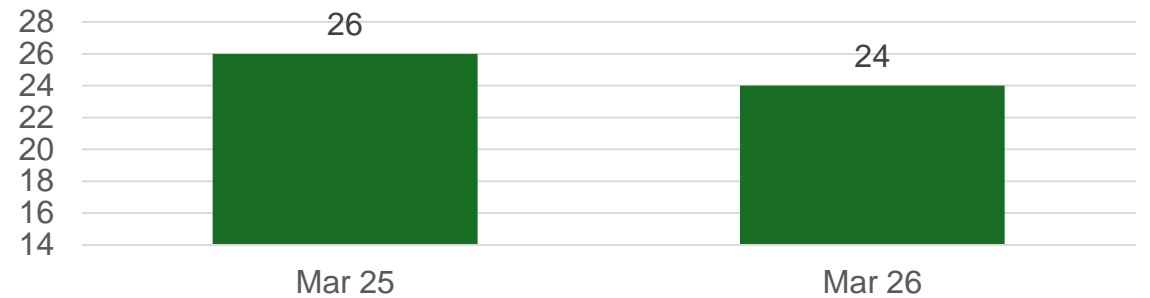


Hidden Creek Golf Course- March Comparisons

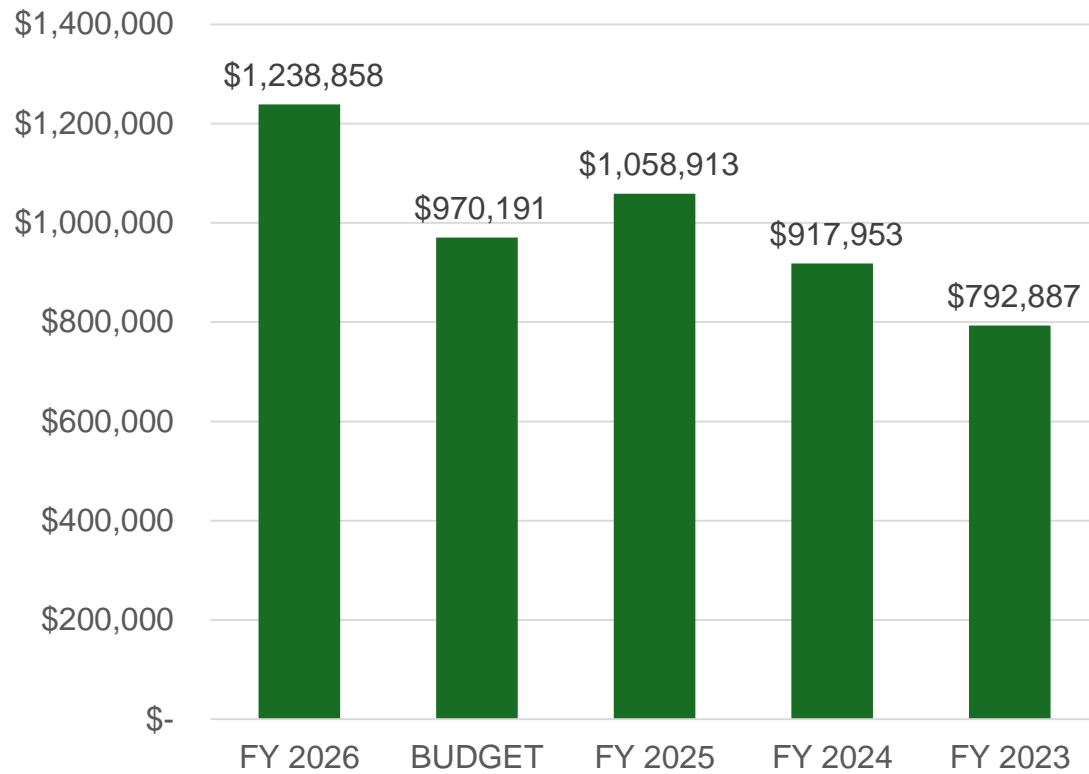

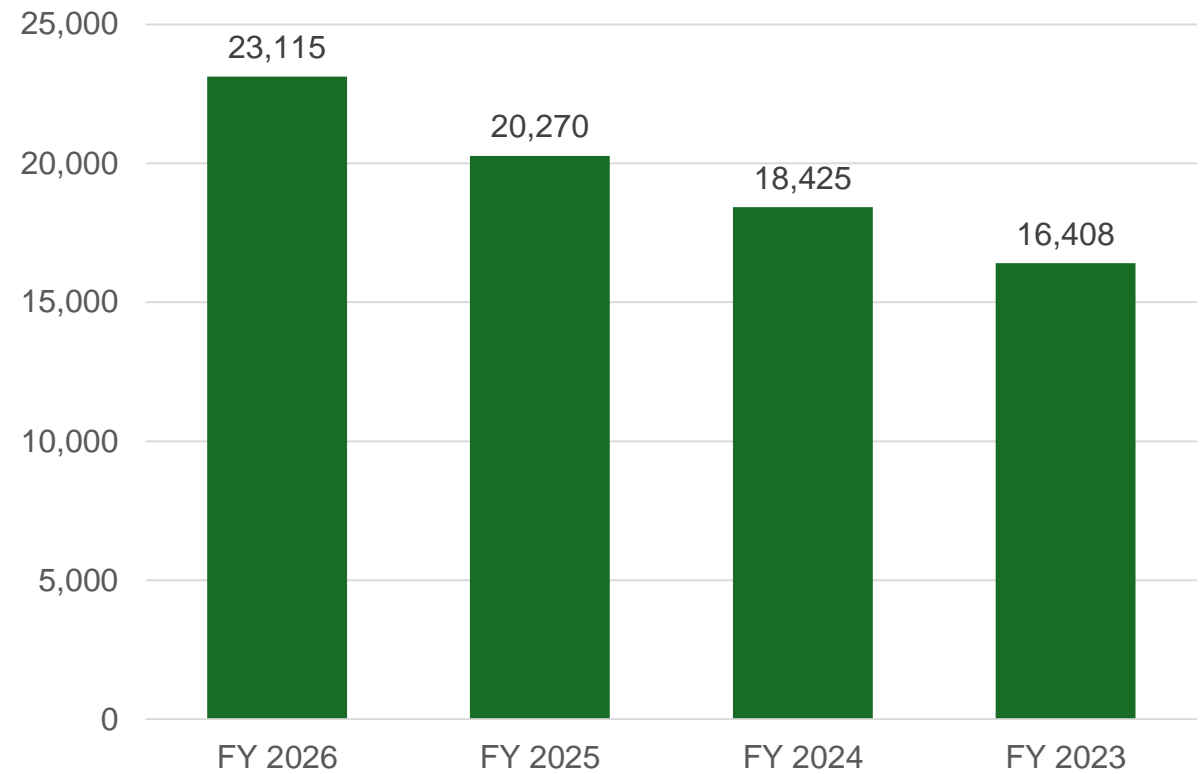


Hidden Creek Golf Course- Year to Date

Rounds Played YTD October- March

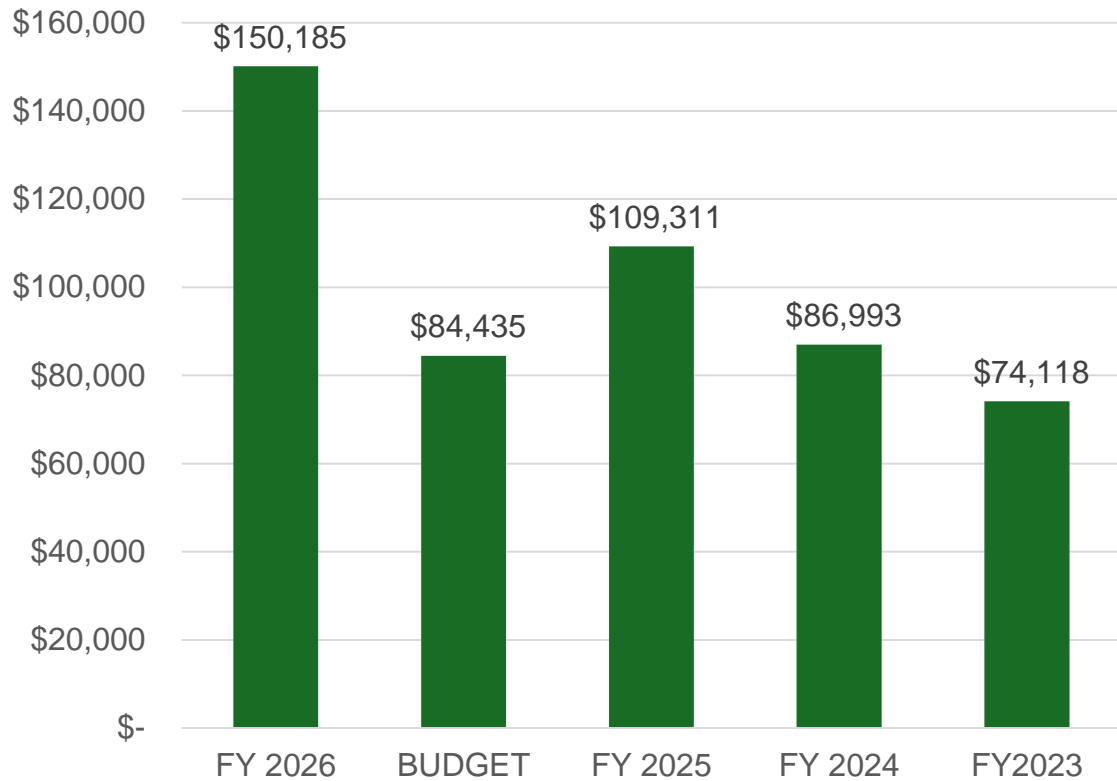

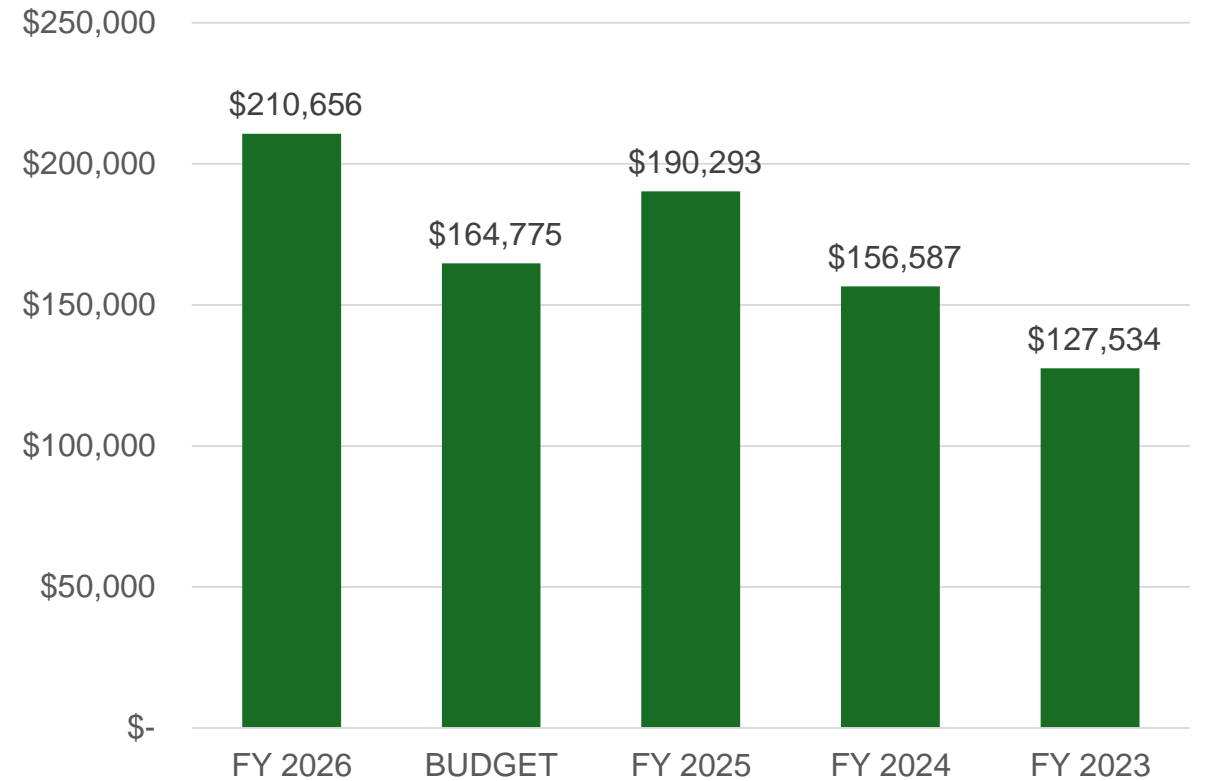

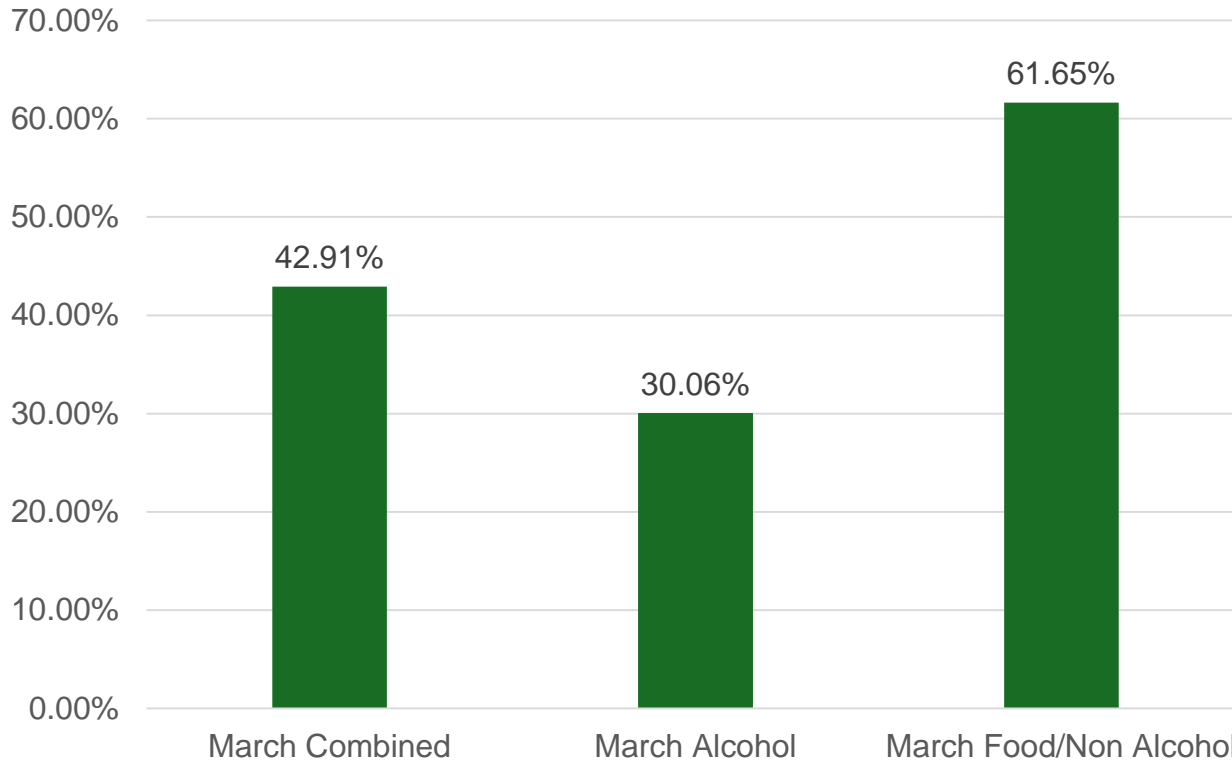


Hidden Creek Golf Course- Food and Beverage Cost of Sales Percentages

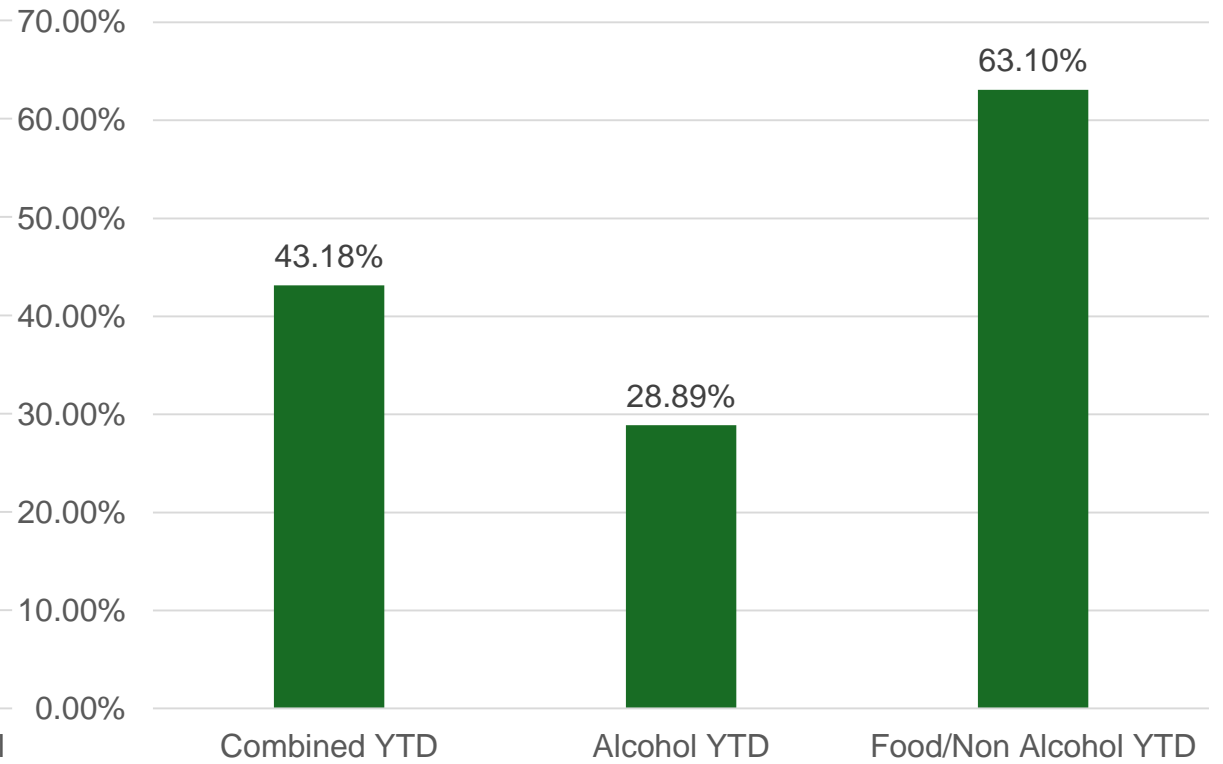

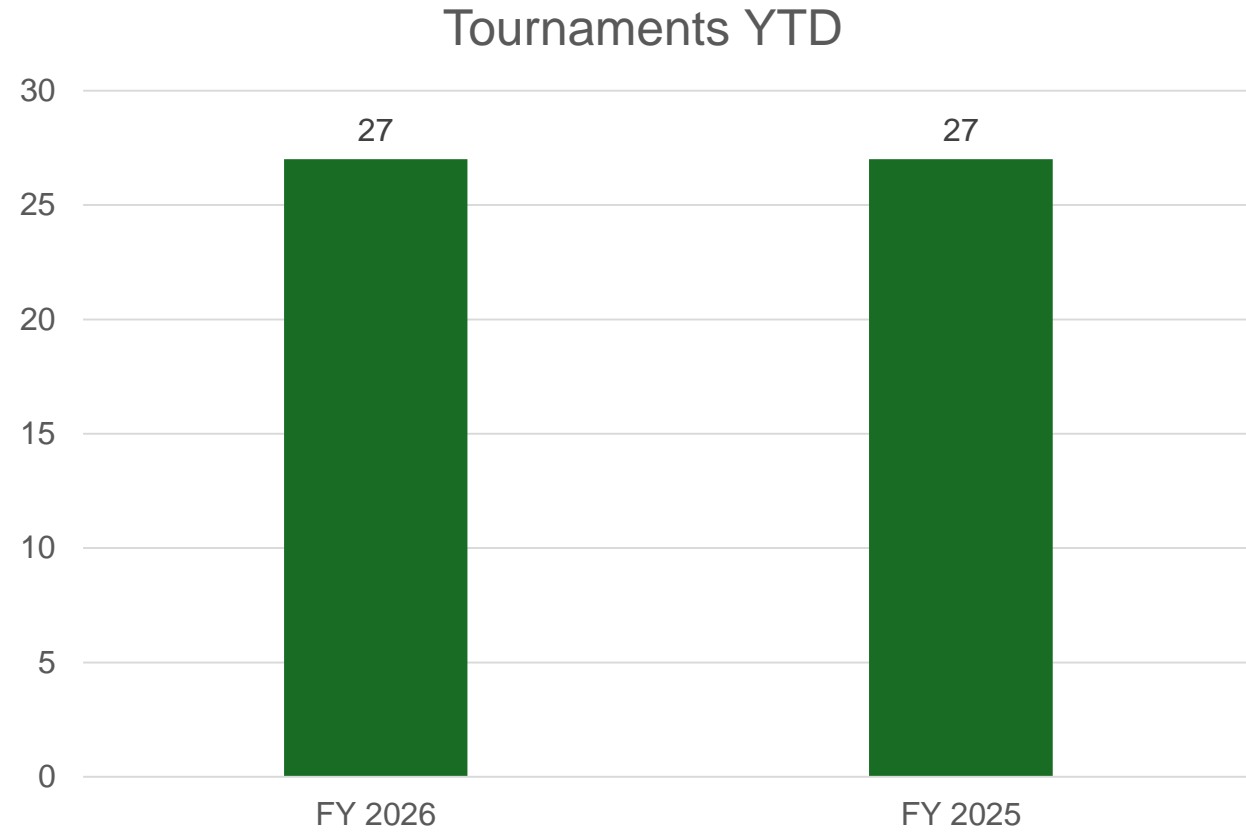
March Cost of Sales%



Food and Beverage Cost of Sales YTD



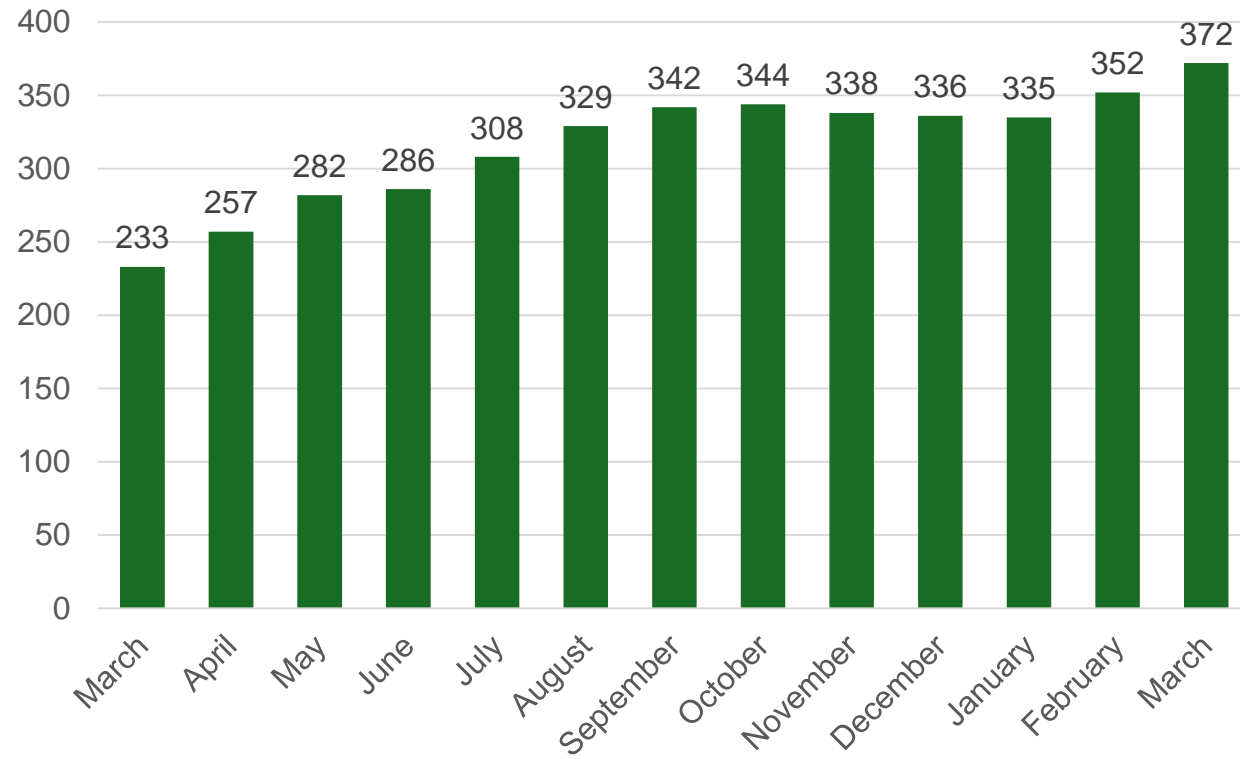
