NE Cedar Street and NE 6th Avenue Parking Time Limit Change Request

BACKGROUND: Terrain Wellness is a primary care doctor's office located at 403 NE 6th Avenue. Brester Dentistry shares the building space. The private lot has eight parking spaces and one ADA spot. The building has frontage to four diagonal on-street parking spaces and one ADA spot on NE Cedar St, and three parallel parking spaces on NE 6th Avenue. On-street parking is generally designated as 2-Hour Parking from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

SUMMARY: Richard Lockwood, Terrain Wellness representative, is requesting a parking time limit increase to 3 hours for the spaces adjacent to the building. He reports that a 2-hour timeframe is not enough to complete I.V. treatments and other procedures. Staff reached out to Carrie Schulstad, Executive Director of Downtown Camas Association, for additional input. She notes that the proposed change might benefit nearby businesses like the Salon and Vision Clinic.



2 Hour Parking - Request to Change Spaces to 3 Hour Parking

BENEFITS TO THE COMMUNITY: 3-hour parking may better serve some downtown businesses and their patrons that seek longer parking time limits.

POTENTIAL CHALLENGES: It is recommended that the committee discuss potential "unintended consequences" of a parking time limit change. It might be confusing to motorists to have 3-hour parking nested between 2-hour parking spaces on NE 6th Avenue.

BUDGET IMPACT: There would be a nominal cost of labor and materials from existing Street Operations budget for sign changes if the requested change is implemented.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff is seeking a recommendation from the committee.

Good Morning,

My name is Richard Lockwood, my wife (Dr. Danielle Lockwood) and myself run a boutique medical practice and wellness center on 403 NE 6th ave in Camas.

A few weeks ago, I got a parking ticket for backing into a parking spot (I was backed in so I could unload supplies for our business). Additionally, our patients have expressed concerns over the aggressive way that City of Camas enforces parking. Especially given the fact that many of our treatments go longer than 2 hours.

Making matters worse, there's a huge multi-unit development going in directly across the street from us and there's more units than parking spaces.

All of the parking around our business is either 2 hours or less, or it's disabled spots. This 2-hour time-frame doesn't give us enough time to complete IV treatments and some joint injection procedures. Patients with acute injuries are often forced to walk multiple blocks to find parking, other patients end up with parking tickets.

We're closing our SW Portland office and bringing those patients over to Camas and it's a really bad look for our high-end clientele to be greeted by a parking ticket and an orange-lighted enforcement cart circling the town like a mechanical vulture.

Key Points:

- 1: 2 hour parking in front of our medical office is too short.
- 2: Injured patients unable to walk multiple blocks.
- 3: Multi-unit project does not have enough parking, will cause material harm to our business.

Conclusion:

With the way things are going, we may choose to not renew our lease in Camas due to the untenable and inadequate parking situation and the aggressive enforcement.
