Jamie, Julia and Council,

The agenda for the City Council Meeting tomorrow evening does not make sense.

As there are no minutes available for the 1/9/25 meeting, I re-watched the decision made at 2:31 on the recorded video by the council at the 1/9 meeting to defer items D, E, and F.

All 4 council members agreed that it was best to wait until a 5th member was sworn in to appoint positions defined in Items D, E and F.

A week later, we have agenda items B, C and D with recommended actions to nominate and appoint a mayor and vice mayor, review nominations and appointments for city council representation on regional boards and city advisory committees, and to appoint members to city advisory bodies.

However, Item 6A for tomorrow now suggests reviewing a **process** to interview candidates and suggests re-scheduling interviews to January 27th.

With Ms. Morgan unavailable to attend, it is clear the motion that passed last week cannot be executed tomorrow.

Therefore, the remaining agenda items if addressed will be in direct conflict to what the council agreed to do last week.

With the mayor position vacant, it is likely staff or the collective council set the agenda for tomorrow night.

I would like to see the council follow the established procedure for amending an agenda that is different than what was proposed and take a vote before the meeting starts to ensure they have all 4 changed their minds from last week and would like to go forward with nominations and appointments ahead of having the 5th member sworn in.

If the council has not changed their minds, can the City staff please cancel this meeting or refine the agenda to only the time sensitive appointments needed - eg. Arts and Culture commission. The public does not need to attend another poorly managed inefficient meeting.

If we have had time to reflect on last week's meeting, perhaps the first motion proposed last week to follow a swift and efficient community involved process to review applicants, create a short list to interview and appoint can also be brought back for discussion. Whoever is sworn in to this seat will have a far better chance of being successful and helpful to the community if they are not simply appointed by 4 people who are "new to all of this".

We have a lot of work to do. Let's mature this effort to be process v. people oriented, get a qualified candidate in the seat quickly, and eliminate the fodder for more "people drama".

Subject: Appointment to Vacant City Council Seat



<u>Recommended Action</u>: Receive a report regarding the interview process to fill the City Council vacancy and consider rescheduling the interviews to January 27, 2025.

<u>Background</u>: On January 3rd, Mayor Yvette Brooks announced her resignation from the City Council effective January 15, 2025. The requirements to fill a vacancy on City Council are defined by Government Code Section 36512.

Section 36512(b) states if a vacancy occurs in an elective office, the Council shall, within 60 days from the commencement of the vacancy, either call a special election to fill the vacancy or fill the vacancy by appointment.

At the January 9, 2025, meeting, the City Council declared a vacancy to fill Mayor Brooks' City Council seat. The City Council directed staff to invite the two remaining candidates from the November 5, 2024, General Municipal Election, Enrique Dolmo Jr. and Margaux Morgan, to be interviewed on January 16, 2025.

Staff reached out to both candidates. Margaux Morgan was not available to attend the January 16th interview, due to a previously scheduled conflict.

<u>Discussion</u>: Staff recommends rescheduling the interviews to January 27, 2025, at 5:00 PM (or an alternate date) to allow for participation from both candidates. Originally, City Council was scheduled to hold a strategic planning workshop from 2-6 PM that day, however, due to the vacancy, Council may wish to repurpose that meeting date.

Staff will prepare potential questions for the City Council to use in the interviews based on suggested interview questions from individual Councilmembers, best practices, and legal review. The special meeting will include an opportunity for public comment. Staff recommends Council conclude that meeting by appointing one of the two candidates by a motion and vote and schedule the swearing-in ceremony for the January 30th regularly scheduled City Council meeting.

The Council must either appoint a successor to the vacant seat or call a special election no later than 60 days from the commencement of the vacancy, pursuant to Government Code Section 36512 (b). This appointment deadline is March 14, 2025, following the commencement of the vacancy on January 15, 2025.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: There would be no fiscal impact to appoint a replacement Councilmember to fill the vacancy. The current adopted budget does not include funding for a special election. Should Council direct staff to prepare documentation for such an election, staff would work with the County Clerk to determine estimated election costs and prepare a budget amendment.

Dear Capitola City Council,

Please consider appointing one of the two other election candidates, Margaux Morgan, or Enrique Dolmo as interim Council Member. Margaux is the logical choice as she has the four years' experience on the Council and completed her term in good standing. She did a great job and there is no reason to bypass this candidate with the most votes in the recent election.

Do not delay or waste city funds on a special election (estimated \$56,000, or more). These funds are not in the budget and are desperately needed for other city expenses. It would not be fiscally responsible to proceed with a special election and waste taxpayer's money when there is an easy alternative to appoint. The City Council is allowed by law to do so and there is a viable candidate. Has to be a special election. You can not just appoint Margaux who was recently not chosen by leaps and bounds. Interesting idea appoint Kristen.



With the impending vacancy on the city council, you have been presented with a great opportunity to appoint someone who cares more about Capitola than their political future.



Open applications if no elections. Former council members should be barred to not give the impression of a fixed insider political system as Capitola is already accused of.






Yvette is also a parent to school age children as is Enrique. We at minimum want two of our councillors to be parents so this essential demographic to our long term prosperity is represented.

Dear Capitola City Council,

Regarding your January 9, 2025 meeting, Agenda Item 8C (Process to Fill a Vacant Council Seat), and Agenda Item 8D (City Council Reorganization for 2025), I respectfully offer the following suggestions for a community-based approach to filling the City Council vacancy and leadership reorganization:

1. Community Choice is Always Best:

- While I recognize holding a special election is the most democratic way to fill the vacancy, I also understand cost and logistical challenges may make this option unfeasible.
- Considering this, I urge the council to pursue a transparent, equitable, and community-centered appointment process to ensure the public's trust and involvement in selecting the right candidate.

2. Prioritize Transparency and Community Engagement:

- The process should balance timeliness with careful consideration. A
 well-thought-out process builds trust, validates the individual chosen to
 serve, and ensures the best outcome for the community.
- The council should involve residents every step of the way, ensuring all voices are heard and considered.

3. Empower Residents with a Citizens' Commission:

- Establishing a temporary citizens' commission could provide an inclusive and impartial approach.
- This body would review applications, conduct interviews, and recommend the top candidates to the council for their decision.
- To ensure accountability and public trust, the commission's meetings should comply with the **Brown Act**, California's open meetings law, which ensures transparency and public participation in government decisions.
- One way to determine the commission's composition could be for each council member to appoint one member, with a final member selected by consensus of the current four-person council. A five-member commission ensures efficient decision-making and allows for an odd number to address potential disagreements.

 The commission should be supported by city staff to provide administrative and logistical assistance throughout the process.


4. Appointee Should Serve as a Steward, Not a Candidate:

5. Postpone the Selection of Mayor and Vice Mayor:




Many residents have been unhappy with the direction of the city and this is a golden opportunity to put the city on a new path.

We are writing in support of the proposal made by Heidy Kellison to establish a process by which the Capitola community can actively participate in the selection process for the open city council seat vacated by the resignation of Yvette Brooks.

A special election would be the most democratic way to proceed in filling this open seat. Unfortunately, the expense and general election fatigue makes this option less attractive. We are very opposed to an immediate appointment by the existing four members of the city council as it's the least open and community-inclusive manner to select an individual to fill this critical position.

In our view, transparency, integrity and community involvement/oversight are the critical priorities for filling this seat. An open, efficient and community-based process is the optimal way to help the Capitola community rally around an individual of merit, purpose and commitment to fill this vacant seat.

We should not prioritize speed over transparency and community oversight. The lack of transparency and process displayed by the previous city council has left many long-term residents on the sidelines, actively questioning key governance decisions made by the previous city council that are in direct conflict with the will of Capitola's citizens, based on unequivocal election results, and simple safety concerns for the well being of current and future residents.

We need to dramatically improve our governance practices and now have the opportunity to add a new member that can work in a truly collaborative fashion with the council, city staff and community to help restore trust and help rebuild Capitola for the decades ahead of us.





First, thank you Yvette for your service to our community.



Dear City Council Members,

On your agenda for January 9, 2025 is item 8-C "Process to fill vacant Council seat". I am hopeful that when the Council discusses this item that you will be mindful of the need to have some community input as part of the section process. Normally having an election to fill this position would provide for the most direct input from the community but a special election of that type will have a cost and time delay. As it is important to have a full 5-member Council I would offer the following suggestions to include in a selection process.

The Council should have a process that allows for applications to be accepted for this 2-year term. The applicants for this appointment should be committed to serving out the remainder of Mayor Brooks term and not be a candidate in the next election in 2026. Not having the applicants be candidates in the 2026 election leaves that 2026 election process untainted. This is similar to the approach used by Governor Newsom in filling the 2-year Senate vacancy created by the death of Diane Feinstein.

There are numerous ways the Council can screen the applications but some community members should be involved in the screening process and having the process open to the public is critical.

Whatever committee is set up to evaluate the applications should use a consistent evaluation method for all applicants and have a rank scoring system. This is the only method that will allow for transparency in the ranking process.

Having this type of open process is important to assure the community that the Council has selected the best person to fill this 2-year term. It assures the public that this was not simply a politically motivated choice but shows the Council is choosing the best applicant to help Capitola move forward during the next 2 years. There are many important items which Capitola faces at this time. The mall project and City revenues are a top priority. Decisions on implementing the City's new adopted Housing Element are critical. Helping the City's businesses move through challenging times for retail in the Village and on 41st Avenue need to be addressed are a few examples.

Understandably this is a unique time for Capitola but it will be important for the Council to:

- 1. Involve the community in this selection process.
- 2. Select someone who is going to fill this position for 2 years but will not be a candidate in 2026.


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3. Make certain there is a transparent ranking system of the applicants.



Item 8C. While an election is clearly the least controversial and most democratic approach to filling the seat, the time and budget trade-offs are not insignificant. I believe this task can be managed in a democratic way that continues the momentum of improving collaboration amongst the City Staff, City Council, and Community using a transparent process versus the swift appointment of a named person.

The time required to get this done using a process that includes the community by having them involved in a committee approach or being present for application reviews, interviews, etc. will go a long way towards building trust. It will also ensure the newly appointed member can hit the ground running having been properly vetted in a public and transparent manner.

I am confident you can define a community inclusive process that doesn't have to be a huge time sink, and that the extra effort over a mere appointment will have a great payback for all constituent groups.

8D. It struck me as odd that item 8C was to define the approach to be used to select a council member, and that item 8D was to take action and appoint Mayor and Vice Mayor seats before the new member was identified. Please consider allowing the Vice Mayor to act in the Pro Tempore capacity covering the duties of the Mayoral position until a full council is seated, and postpone this action. Given the new council member will be a vetted and deemed qualified candidate, they should be a participant in selecting governing positions.

This logic may also warrant a discussion on postponing Items 8E and 8F.



Council Members,

We recognize that Vice Mayor Joe Clark is the likely Council Member to assume the vacant role of Mayor, thereby creating a vacancy of Vice Mayor on the Council. Our concern is with the possibility that Council Member Alexander Pedersen is the nominee for Vice Mayor simply due to his tenure on the Council. In an effort to provide honesty and transparency, Concerned Citizens of Capitola believes that Council Member Pedersen should be removed from consideration for the Vice Mayor position given the number of ethical issues he presents at this time. In fact, there is a growing number of residents that is considering a recall of Council Member Pedersen because of these ethical concerns, which include:

- Misuse of public funds-Two months before Council Member Pedersen's appointment to the City Council, he was awarded a \$15,000. outcome based community grant from taxpayer money for his non-profit organization Blue Circle or Fair Wages. This grant was outcome or performance based specifically for improving the health and wellness in Capitola. Council Member Pedersen cashed \$5,000. Of those funds, but then decided the money does not support his non-profit organizations mission and purpose, so he did not cash the checks for the remaining \$10,000. The question that comes to mind is if that is the case why did he take the funds in the first place? and secondly why did Council Members Kristen Brown and Margaux Morgan award him the grant? The next question is, what did he do with the \$5,000 he kept that was supposed to benefit the health & wellness of the City of Capitola? That is unknown since he has not presented the required presentation yet. Letters from Council Member Pedersen to the city disclose that he asked the City to schedule his presentation at the latest date possible in June 2025. It should be noted there is nothing on his non-profit website indicating he has done anything for Capitola.
- **Use of false City address**-Aside from having a non-profit company, Council Member Pedersen also has a handyman business. A few months prior to running for Capitola City Council, Council Member Pedersen was a resident of Aptos. However, he used a residential address on Fanmar Way in Capitola as his business address. An address that he never resided at or ran his business from.
- Intentionally violating Capitola Municipal Code-Council Member Pedersen is our representative to the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC), and in his capacity on the RTC is has voted for and approved motions that are in direct violation of Capitola Municipal Code 8.72-The Greenway code. This code was established in 2016 after Capitola residents overwhelmingly passed Measure Y. He should be removed as the City of Capitola RTC representative.
- **Stockton Bridge** In addition to intentionally violating Municipal code 8.72 on the RTC, Council Member Pedersen has also made the request to widen the historic Stockton bridge to accommodate the RTC bicycle pedestrian path, again in direct conflict of City municipal code 8.72.

• Fair Political Practice Commission (FPPC) investigation-Council Member Pedersen is currently being investigated for ethical violations by the FPPC.

Due to these ethical concerns, Concerned Citizens of Capitola respectfully request that Council Member Alexander Pedersen not be considered for the position of Vice Mayor.

In addition, since he has not kept his sworn oath to uphold Capitola City law, we believe he should also be removed from the appointment to the RTC and replaced with a Council Member that will uphold Capitola law and the will of the people.



Council Members,

We recognize that Vice Mayor Joe Clark is the likely Council Member to assume the vacant role of Mayor, thereby creating a vacancy of Vice Mayor on the Council. Our concern is with the possibility that Council Member Alexander Pedersen is the nominee for Vice Mayor simply due to his tenure on the Council. In an effort to provide honesty and transparency, Concerned Citizens of Capitola believes that Council Member Pedersen should be removed from consideration for the Vice Mayor position given the number of ethical issues he presents at this time. In fact, there is a growing number of residents that is considering a recall of Council Member Pedersen because of these ethical concerns, which include:

- Misuse of public funds-Two months before Council Member Pedersen's appointment to the City Council, he was awarded a \$15,000. outcome based community grant from taxpayer money for his non-profit organization Blue Circle or Fair Wages. This grant was outcome or performance based specifically for improving the health and wellness in Capitola. Council Member Pedersen cashed \$5,000. Of those funds, but then decided the money does not support his non-profit organizations mission and purpose, so he did not cash the checks for the remaining \$10,000. The question that comes to mind is if that is the case why did he take the funds in the first place? and secondly why did Council Members Kristen Brown and Margaux Morgan award him the grant? The next question is, what did he do with the \$5,000 he kept that was supposed to benefit the health & wellness of the City of Capitola? That is unknown since he has not presented the required presentation yet. Letters from Council Member Pedersen to the city disclose that he asked the City to schedule his presentation at the latest date possible in June 2025. It should be noted there is nothing on his non-profit website indicating he has done anything for Capitola.
- **Use of false City address**-Aside from having a non-profit company, Council Member Pedersen also has a handyman business. A few months prior to running for Capitola City Council, Council Member Pedersen was a resident of Aptos. However, he used a residential address on Fanmar Way in Capitola as his business address. An address that he never resided at or ran his business from.
- Intentionally violating Capitola Municipal Code-Council Member Pedersen is our representative to the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC), and in his capacity on the RTC is has voted for and approved motions that are in direct violation of Capitola Municipal Code 8.72-The Greenway code. This code was established in 2016 after Capitola residents overwhelmingly passed Measure Y. He should be removed as the City of Capitola RTC representative.
- **Stockton Bridge** In addition to intentionally violating Municipal code 8.72 on the RTC, Council Member Pedersen has also made the request to widen the historic Stockton bridge to accommodate the RTC bicycle pedestrian path, again in direct conflict of City municipal code 8.72.

• Fair Political Practice Commission (FPPC) investigation-Council Member Pedersen is currently being investigated for ethical violations by the FPPC.

Item 6 C.

Due to these ethical concerns, Concerned Citizens of Capitola respectfully request that Council Member Alexander Pedersen not be considered for the position of Vice Mayor.

In addition, since he has not kept his sworn oath to uphold Capitola City law, we believe he should also be removed from the appointment to the RTC and replaced with a Council Member that will uphold Capitola law and the will of the people.

Subject: City Council Appointments to City Advisory Bodies



<u>Recommended Action</u>: Appoint members of the public to the City of Capitola's Art and Cultural Commission, Commission on the Environment, Finance Advisory Committee, and Historical Museum Board; appoint a member of the public as an alternate to the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission Bicycle Advisory Committee.

<u>Background</u>: At the City Council meeting on January 9, 2025, Council continued this item due to the vacancy created by former Mayor Brooks' resignation from Council. Due to upcoming meeting schedules, staff recommends Council consider appointing representatives to City Boards and Commissions, most particularly Art and Cultural. Council could leave some appointments vacant at this time and could consider finalizing the appointment process once a replacement Councilmember is established.

Members of the public are appointed to serve in a voluntary capacity on the City's advisory bodies for terms, some of which expired in December 2024. This necessitates that the Council make reappointments or new appointments for the next term.

Applications for membership on advisory bodies are accepted year-round and are valid for one year. Members who are currently serving on advisory bodies were notified of their term expiration and invited to reapply to be reappointed.

As a part of the advisory body appointment process, staff published a regular vacancy notice on the City website and through social media, and an unscheduled vacancy notice in the Santa Cruz Sentinel.

<u>Discussion</u>: Each of the City's advisory bodies is governed by relevant bylaws, which outline information about the appointment process of the group. More information concerning each group is listed below. Attachment 1 outlines the current composition of each group, applicants seeking reappointment, new applicants, and the next meeting date for all groups with current vacancies. Attachment 2 includes a link to all applications for appointment or reappointment on file with the City Clerk's office received on or before the printing of this agenda packet.

In January, the Art and Cultural Commission is scheduled to meet on January 14 and the Commission on the Environment on January 15. The Finance Advisory Committee and Museum Board are not scheduled to meet in January.

Art and Cultural Commission: The Art and Cultural Commission (Commission) was originally established in 1997 and advises the City Council as to the allocation of public funds for the support and encouragement of existing and new programs in the arts, and for the acquisition of works of art, and to enhance the cultural climate of the City and foster public interest in the arts. Commission Bylaws (Resolution No. 3326) state that the Commission is composed of nine members: one City Council Member (Vice Mayor Clarke), one Planning Commissioner [respectively chosen by a majority vote of each body], one artist or arts organization representative, one arts professional, and five at-large members. The Bylaws state that the Commission must review applications and provide a recommendation to the City Council for appointment. There are currently fifteen applications on file. In addition to the reappointment of returning commissioners, the Commission has recommended the appointment of Roy Holmberg (artist), Tara Hunt, Jill Payonzeck Lengre, Esther Sylvan, Karin Anderson, Thomas Pederson, Kristina McCann and Helynne Nourishad.

<u>Commission on the Environment</u>: The Commission on the Environment (COE) was originally established in 2005 and provides advice and recommendations to the City Council on policy and funding matters

relating to sustainability, environmental protection, climate action plan implementation and resource enhancement which benefit the City. COE Bylaws (Resolution No. 4373) state that the COE is composed of five members: a member of the City Council and four members appointed by the four City Council members who do not serve on the COE. On December 12, 2024, the City Council appointed Melinda Orbach to serve as the City Council representative. There are currently six applications on file.

<u>Finance Advisory Committee</u>: The Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) was originally established in 2000 and advises the City Council on financial matters pertaining to the governing of the City, as well as on the use of fiscal resources. FAC Bylaws (Resolution No. 4365) state that the FAC is composed of seven or eight members: the Mayor, the Vice Mayor, three at-large members appointed by the City Council, and one or two business representatives recommended by the Chamber of Commerce and appointed by the City Council. On December 12, 2024, the City Council appointed Mayor Brooks and Councilmember Pedersen to serve as Council representatives to the FAC. There are nine applications on file.

<u>Historical Museum Board</u>: The Historical Museum Board (Board) was originally established in 1992 and promotes a program that will bring about better understanding and appreciation by the Capitola community of its history, architecture, culture, technology, and its creative and natural environments. Board Bylaws (Resolution No. 4099) state that the Board is composed of seven members. The Bylaws state that the Commission must review applications and provide a recommendation to the City Council for appointment. There is one unscheduled vacancy and there are currently two applications on file. The Board has not made any recommendations at this time.

Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) Bicycle Advisory Committee: The RTC Bicycle Advisory Committee currently has one Capitola representative on it (Paula Bradley). The RTC received an application for another Capitola resident to serve as an alternate (Attachment 3). The City Council may vote to appoint Christopher O'Connell as an alternate to the RTC Bicycle Advisory Committee.
