ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT

THIS ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), made this ______ day of ______, 2025 ("Effective Date") by and between THE TOWN OF CAROLINA BEACH, a North Carolina municipal corporation ("Grantor"), and NORTH PIER CONDO ASSOCIATION, INC., a North Carolina non-profit corporation ("Grantee").

WHEREAS, Grantor owns 1810 Canal Drive, Carolina Beach, NC 28428, New Hanover County Parcel ID R08807-013-004-000 (the "Property"), which is adjacent to the lands of the Grantee and currently serves as a parking lot;

WHEREAS, Grantor has agreed to allow Grantee to use the Property for the limited purpose of maintaining a dumpster thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, Grantor for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other valuable consideration to it paid by Grantee, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant unto Grantee, the non-perpetual right to encroach upon the Property in the manner described herein pursuant to the following terms and conditions:

1. Permitted Encroachments. Grantor agrees to allow Grantee to encroach upon the Property to maintain one (1) dumpster for use of the Grantee, its successors and assigns. In consideration thereof, Grantee, its successors and assigns shall allow members of the public who utilize the parking lot to utilize the dumpster at Grantee's sole cost and expense for as long as the dumpster remains on the Property.

- 2. <u>Grantee's Sole Risk and Expense</u>. Grantee acknowledges that the use of the Property shall be at Grantee's sole risk and expense.
- 3. <u>Transferability</u>. The rights granted and retained under this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, successors, and assigns of the parties, and shall run with the land.
- 4. <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by Grantor at any time upon thirty (30) days' notice. In such instance, Grantor shall cause a termination of this Agreement to be recorded in the New Hanover County Registry.
- 5. <u>Notice</u>. Any notices and other communications required under this Agreement or relating hereto shall be in writing and delivered via personal delivery, certified United States mail (return receipt requested), or overnight delivery through a reputable carrier to:







Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan






