CITIZEN'S COMMENTS

Oscar Morones states that when he invested in purchasing his manufactured mobile home in 2009 there were no restrictions in regards to mobile homes and now that he plans to build a new home Ordinance No. 781 restricts him from renting his mobile home. He asks Council to reconsider Ordinance No. 781 and allow manufactured mobile

homes to be rented. Mr. Morones also states his concerns regarding the square footage of dwellings in Ordinance. No. 797 and asks Council to reconsider lowering the size of a dwelling.

Juan Chavarria also states that his son owns a manufactured mobile home and is ready to build a new home, but the ordinance restricts him from renting the manufactured mobile home. Mr. Chavarria asks Council to reconsider the ordinance to allow his son to rent his manufactured mobile home.

Nadia Rodriguez asks Council to reconsider the ordinance and allow manufactured mobile homes to be rented.

Rachel Chavarria states that she would like meetings to be live streamed. Ms. Chavarria states her concerns in regards to the square footage of dwellings on Ordinance No. 797.

2. DISCUSSION AND APPROPRIATE ACTION IN REGARDS TO KELLY BALDERAS REQUEST FOR A NON-CONFORMING VARIANCE PERMIT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PLACING A (DOUBLE WIDE) MANUFACTURED HOME IN AN R-1 ZONE PROPERTY, SAID PROPERTY IS LOCATED AT 1611 LEE STREET, CS-LINDA VISTA ADDN, BLOCK 2A, LOT 7, CITY OF CARRIZO SPRINGS, DIMMIT COUNTY TEXAS

7. MUNICIPAL COURT

Municipal Judge Francisco R. Ponce presented Council with the Municipal Court quarterly report.

DIMMIT COUNTY INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT(S)

8. DISCUSSION AND APPROPRIATE ACTION TO APPROVE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT TO CONSTRUCT SOCCER FIELDS AND/OR PRACTICE BASEBALL FIELDS A THE LIONS PARK TO BE MAINTAINED BY THE CITY OF CARRIZO SPRINGS AND DIMMIT COUNTY

Dimmit County Judge Francisco Ponce states that the county would like to construct soccer fields and/or practice baseball fields and build new restrooms at the Lions Park. The county would like to join the city to maintain the Lions Park and help pay the water bill.

County Judge Francisco Ponce would like to review the lease to see how many years the lease is with the Lions Park before proceeding with the project. Mayor Oscar E. Puente states that he will look into the lease to start the project soon to benefit the community. County Judge Francisco Ponce states that the interlocal agreement must state the obligations and responsibilities for the city and the county. The county will pay all the expenses for the projects.

Motion made by Councilor Mario Ruiz, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Sofia Morones to authorize City Manager Chris A. Castaneda to meet with County Judge Francisco Ponce to negotiate an interlocal agreement to construct soccer fields and/or practice baseball fields at the Lions Park to be maintained by the City of Carrizo Springs and Dimmit County.

9. DISCUSSION AND APPROPRIATE ACTION TO NEGOTIATE AN AGREEMENT FOR THE CONVEYANCE OF THE CITY OF CARRIZO SPRINGS OLD WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT TO DIMMIT COUNTY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF BASEBALL FIELDS AND PLAYGROUND/PARK

County Judge Francisco Ponce states that Commissioner Juan Carmona has been wanting to build baseball fields and playgrounds for years but states that the county needed to finish some in house projects and is now able to start a new project to work with the city to develop the Old Wastewater Treatment Plant land.

County Judge Francisco Ponce states that Mayor Pro Tem Sofia Morones approached him to consider constructing a Splashpad on the property but states that the splashpad is a liability and would not recommend it.

County Judge Francisco Ponce comes before the Council to negotiate an agreement for the conveyance of the Wastewater Treatment Plant land and suggests forgiving the debt of the law enforcement agreement or buying a piece of equipment for the city as consideration for the property and to include providing the gray water to maintain the grass on the fields.

Motion made by Mayor Pro Tem Sofia Morones, seconded by Councilor Mario Ruiz to direct City Manager Chris A. Castaneda to meet with County Judge Francisco Ponce to negotiate an agreement for the conveyance of the Wastewater Treatment Plant land to Dimmit County

Update on Migrant Release

Border Patrol has not started releasing any immigrants in the are and the immigrants are still being transported to Eagle Pass, Texas and being released to Non-Governmental Organization.

House Fire – Damaged Structures

The owners of the burned houses are requesting assistance from the city and county to clean up the burned down structures.

Restroom Project at the Veterans Park

The construction continues at the Veterans Park Restroom Project, the cement slab has been poured and the framing is going up.

Gas Department

City Manager Chris A. Castaneda along with the Avelardo Puente, Gas Dept. Supervisor met with Simon R. Pena, pipeline consultant to discuss the Carrizo Springs Distribution Integrity Management Program (DIMP). The replacement program requires a minimum of 8% of the pipeline segments or facilities posing the greatest risk in the system to be replaced and be in compliance with the Railroad Commission. The project needs to be including in next year's budget.
