Map Inventory Detail Work

Meeting Summary

The meeting focused on the progress and future steps for the Open Space Map Inventory project. Key points included the installation of fiber optic cables in Casco, with initial connections in Sebago and Naples, and the involvement of various town buildings. Zak Brohinsky, a GIS expert, presented an inventory of open space properties, detailing ownership, management, and public access. Specific properties discussed included Libby Park, Manning ball field, and a 44-acre parcel on Lake Road. The group aimed to refine the inventory, address gaps, and ensure accurate mapping and public access details for future planning.

Action Items

- Review the Libby Road property and determine the appropriate name and details to include in the inventory.
- Identify the location and ownership details for the "Manning Field" property referenced in the town website.
- Consult the town tax maps to clarify the location and boundaries of the properties discussed.
