- **4.** Review Action Items from the last meeting.
  - 1. Jim will check on what standards for testing in the state are, and will talk with Lake Stewards on testing methods and if they test for Chlorophyll.
    - Jim presented the Pleasant Lake oxygen and secchi disk reports from July 2025. Jim presented an updated statement on Water Quality Testing. Chlorophyll is reportedly available on the report from Raymond Waterways, but can be difficult to test for. No readings on chlorophyll were provided on the LEA report provided in May 2025.

## **Boat Inspections (20 minutes)**

## Presented by Sarah

CBI coordinated by LEA. Grants from the state make up half the funding for CBI programs. Contacts for both LEA and state grants are documented.

## Broken in five phases:

- 1. Assessment: Document existing conditions on the lake
- 2. Planning and approval: Present findings and obtain support
- 3. Funding: Apply for grants
- 4. Implementation: Source and train inspectors
- 5. Operation and monitoring: Perform inspections, and report back to DEP, LEA, and town

### Comments from Meredith Sasser, who leads CBI for PLPPA

- Pleasant Lake is officially outside of LEA's coverage area
- PLPPA CBI program is 10 hours day on Saturday & Sunday
- PLPPA does apply and receive grants from the DEP, but they cover less than one quarter of the cost of the program for the summer
- Piloting a volunteer program to supplement for high-traffic days that are not covered by paid inspectors
- Interest in partnering with local high schools to provide community service hours for performing boat inspections
- Private boat launches (camp sites, road associations) are not inspected

## Prevention, land use ordinances (20 minutes)

## Presented by Pam

Overall goal is to ensure that our ordinances are being enforced pro-actively and that they are adequate for protecting our water quality. Initial steps should involve the creation of a task force to gather necessary stakeholders. Ordinances in scope for review are: shoreland zoning, stormwater runoff & erosion control, septic, streams & wetlands, aquifer, non-shoreland canopy maintenance. Each topic would then be subject to a multi-step process of reviewing existing ordinances, identifying shortcomings, identifying enforcement issues, implementing plans, then tracking and monitoring progress.

#### Comments:

- Casco does not have an ordinance advisory committee.
- Concern about the newly-proposed ADU ordinances in conjunction with shoreland zoning
- Planning board is currently dealing with a high volume of ordinance review

### Prevention, Watershed Stewardship (20 minutes)

## **Presented by Diane**

Overall goal is to protect, maintain, and improve the health and function of the town's watersheds. Objectives are preserving water quality, identifying sources of pollution, implementing best stewardship best practices, adapting to changing climate and weather patterns, and engaging collaboratively with stakeholders. The action plan begins with identifying organization representatives for each watershed in Casco. For each watershed, create a multi-year implementation schedule that rotates survey and planning efforts to build a complete protection strategy. Additional attention should be devoted to septic system maintenance inspection, and oversight, including an inventory of shoreline systems.

#### Comments:

- Open space committee can support watershed mapping initiatives
- To date, there has not been much discussion of rivers and streams. Action item taken to follow up with organizations who currently oversee rivers and streams
