Updates on road projects:

- Pine Hill
 - site visit 4/21 with GPCOG
 - Consult Ryan Barnes (5/20) to develop process to apply Safe Streets Policy for this project (and then for other projects going forward)
 - One sheet of concerns (Amy)
 - Rae to email Ryan to confirm 5/20 and ask to bring any info he has on this project, and send the Safe Street Policy to review prior to meeting
 - Q/s for Ryan: What's the timeline? Are we behind? What other roads can we use this process for?
- North + South of 121
 - No update from Gorrill Palmer, has not gone out to bid yet.

Updates on other priorities:

- P&K
 - Next meeting P&K will put in an application for a contract zone.
- Rt 302 in S. Casco Village Area
- Casco Village crosswalk
 - Approval of proposed cw in the immediate future. RFP will be issued upon approval. Looking to get flashing beacons and get grant funding for it.
- Seasonal Maintenance schedule
 - The Town's spring road work program is underway, with several infrastructure improvements and maintenance efforts in progress. Contractors are currently ditching and repairing Johnson Hill Road, continuing ditching work along the remainder of Mayberry Hill Road, and completing repairs to a catch basin failure on Birch Terrace.
 - Public Works crews are actively assessing road damage caused by spring frost conditions to identify additional repair needs and help inform the FY27 budget. Roadway striping is being coordinated in partnership with the Town of Raymond, as both communities utilize the same vendor. Casco is scheduled to have eight roadways striped as part of this effort.
 - Seasonal maintenance has already begun, with Public Works crews sweeping Town roads using a broom attachment on the backhoe and supplementing efforts with

the rental of Raymond's sweeper. If operational demands interfere with this work, a contractor is on standby to assist as needed.

- Looking ahead, additional FY27 projects—while not comprehensive—include the installation of a temporary speed hump in mid-June, scheduled for removal by September 1, and coordination of roadside mowing activities in July.
