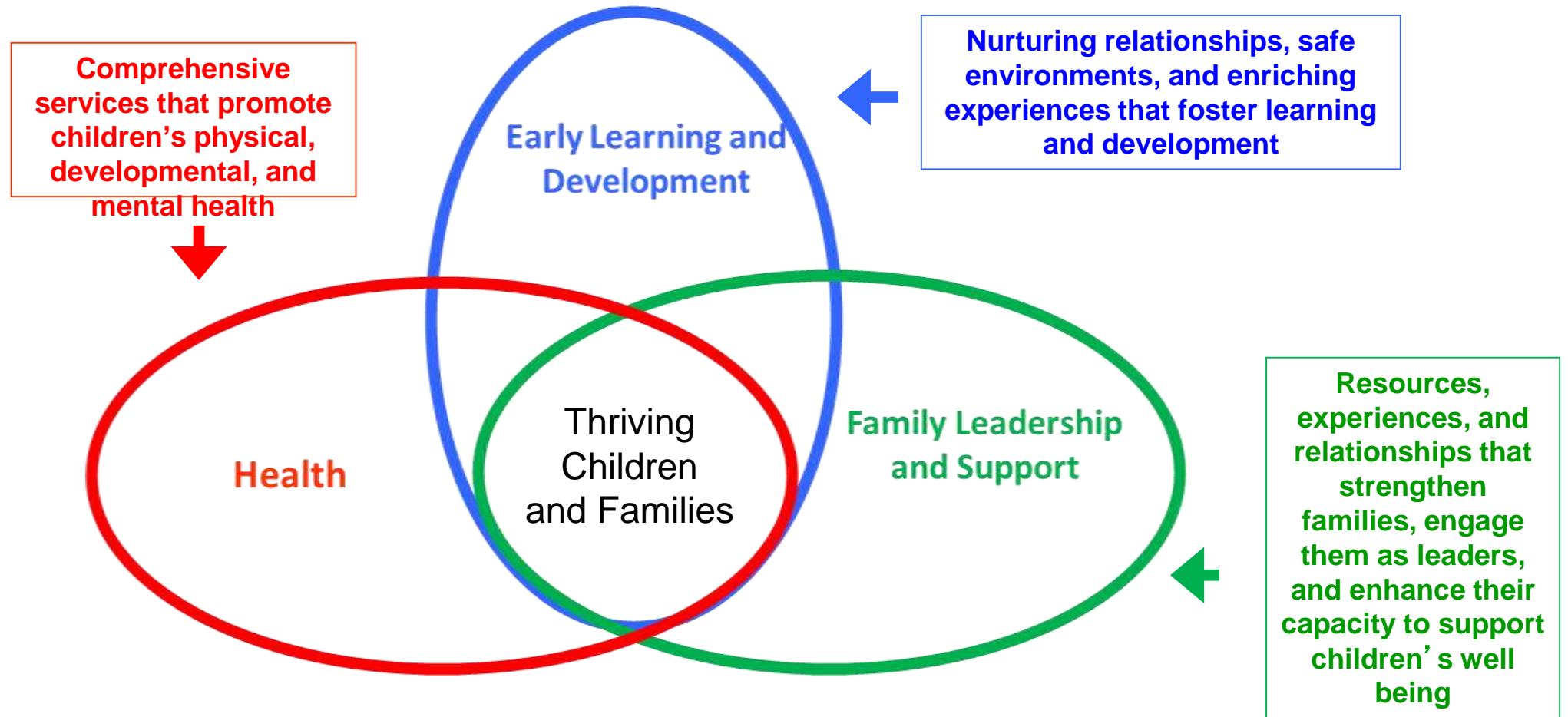

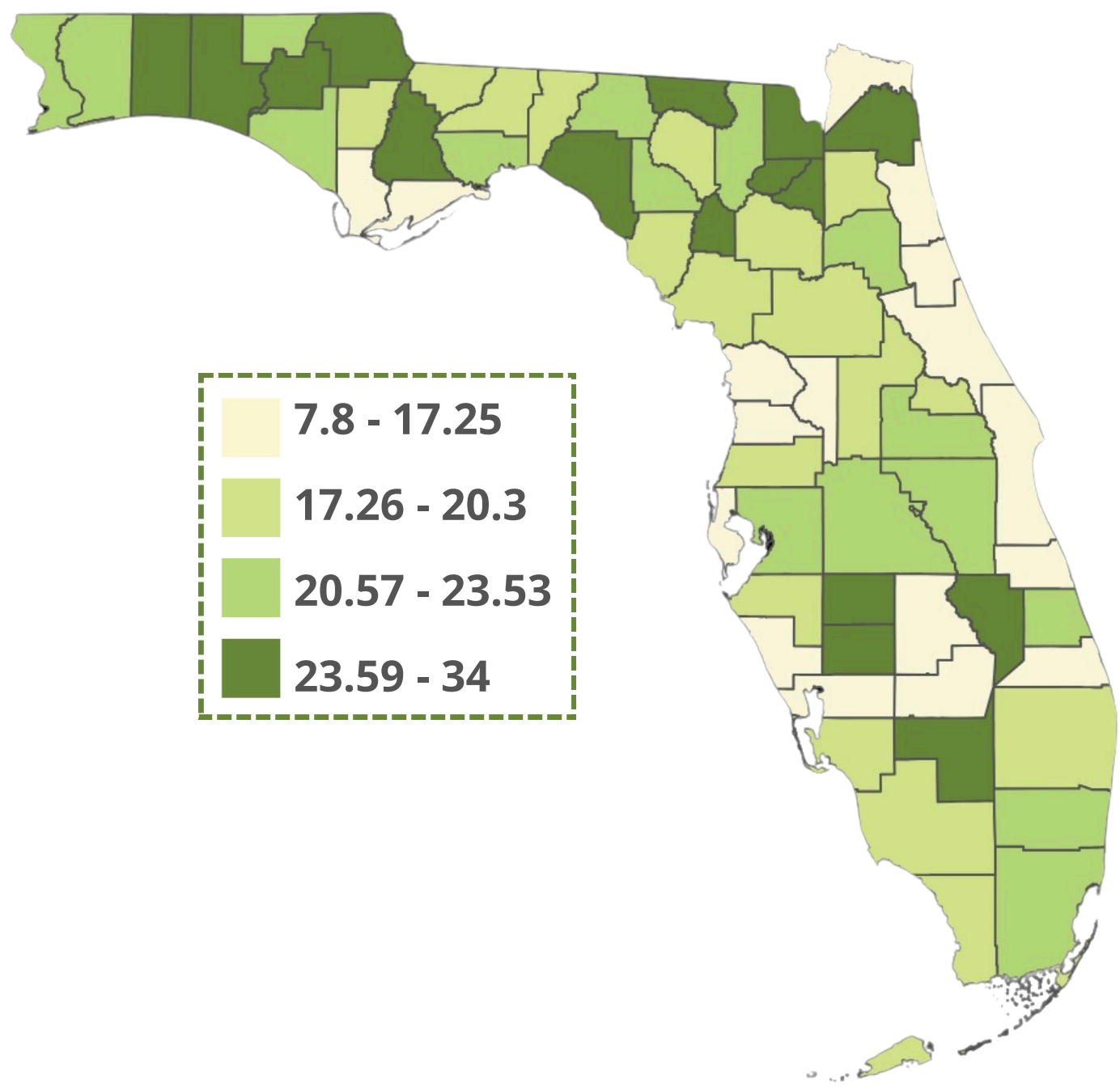
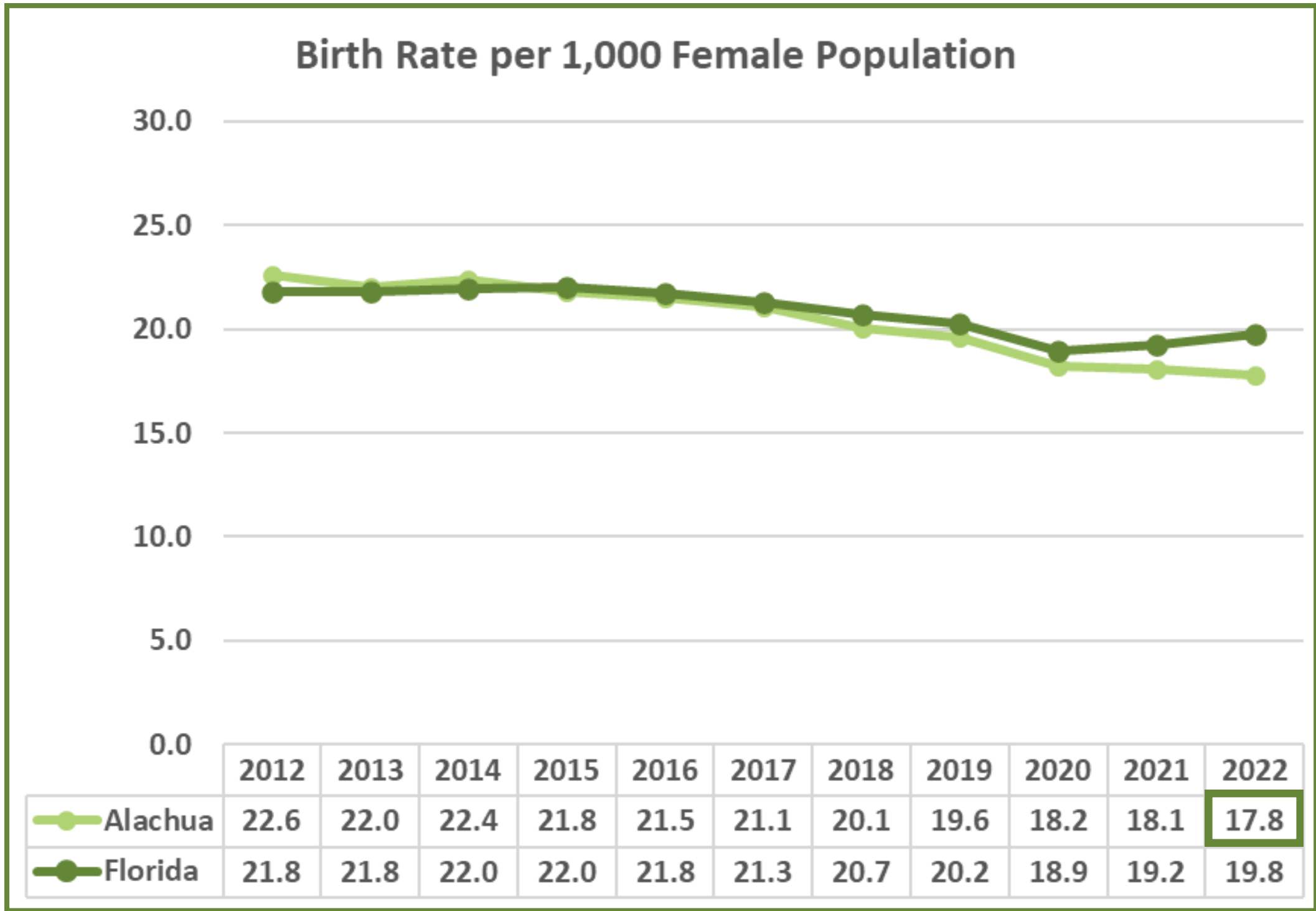

BIRTH RATES BY MOTHER'S AGE & INTERPREGNANCY INTERVALS

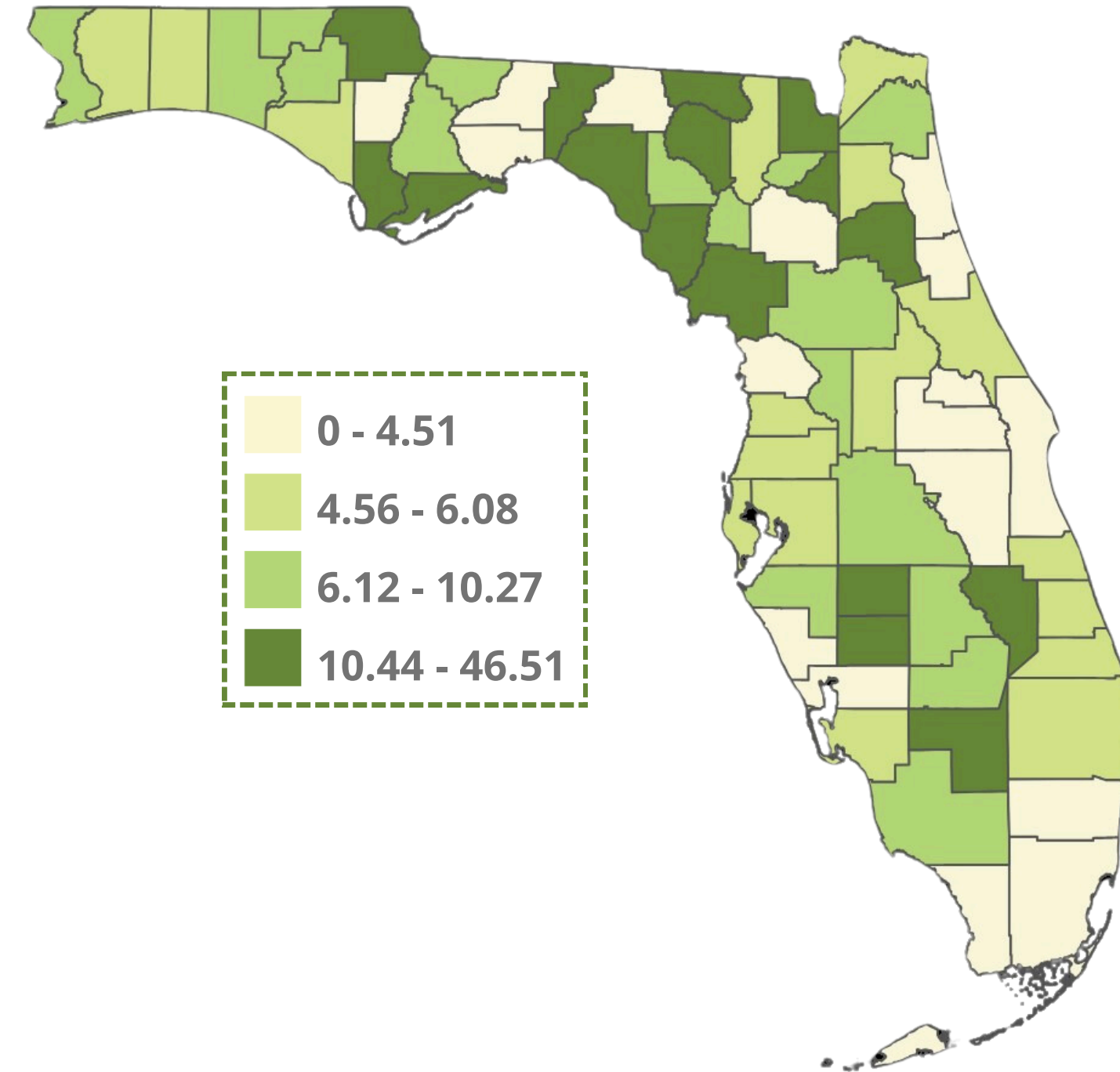
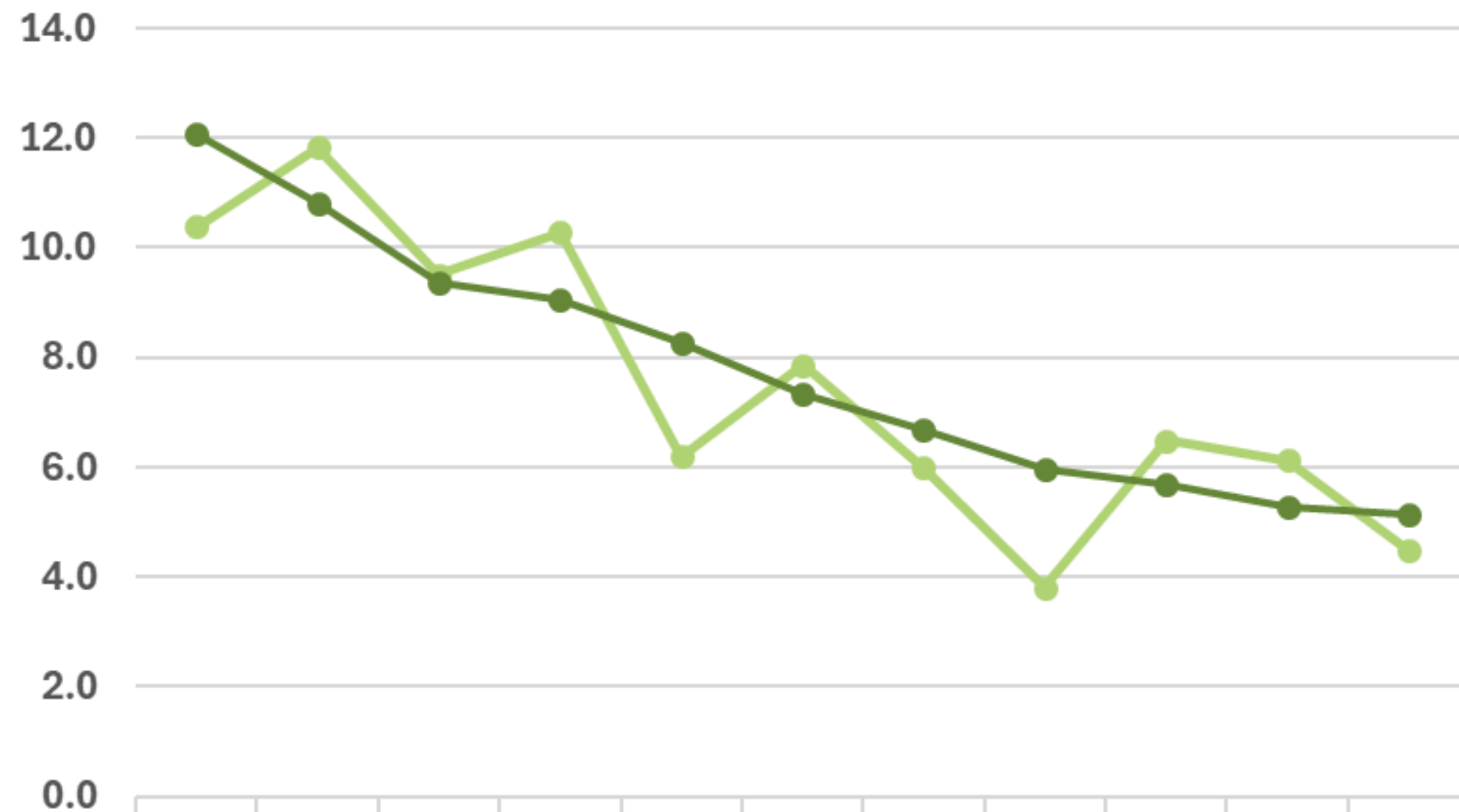

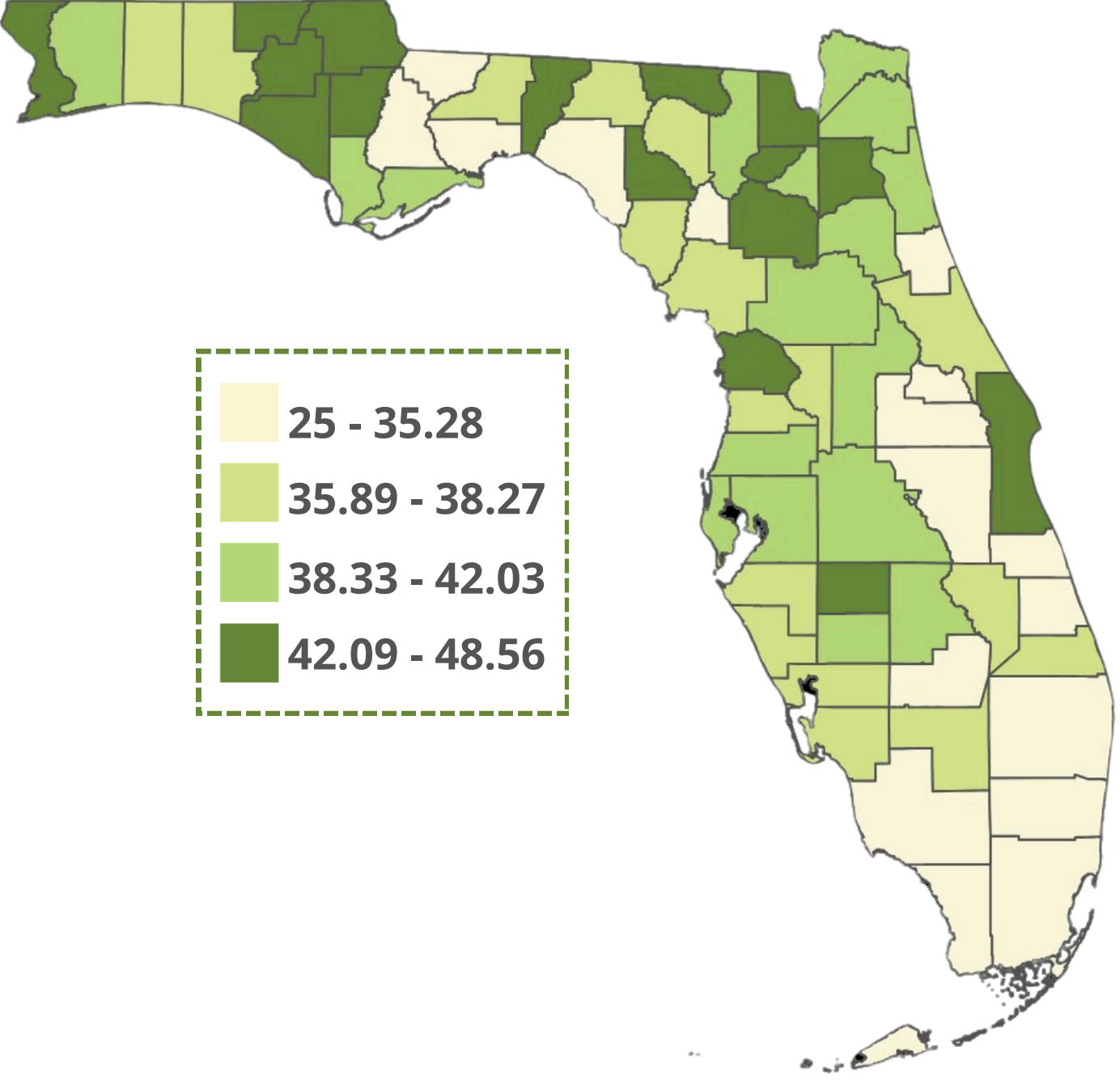
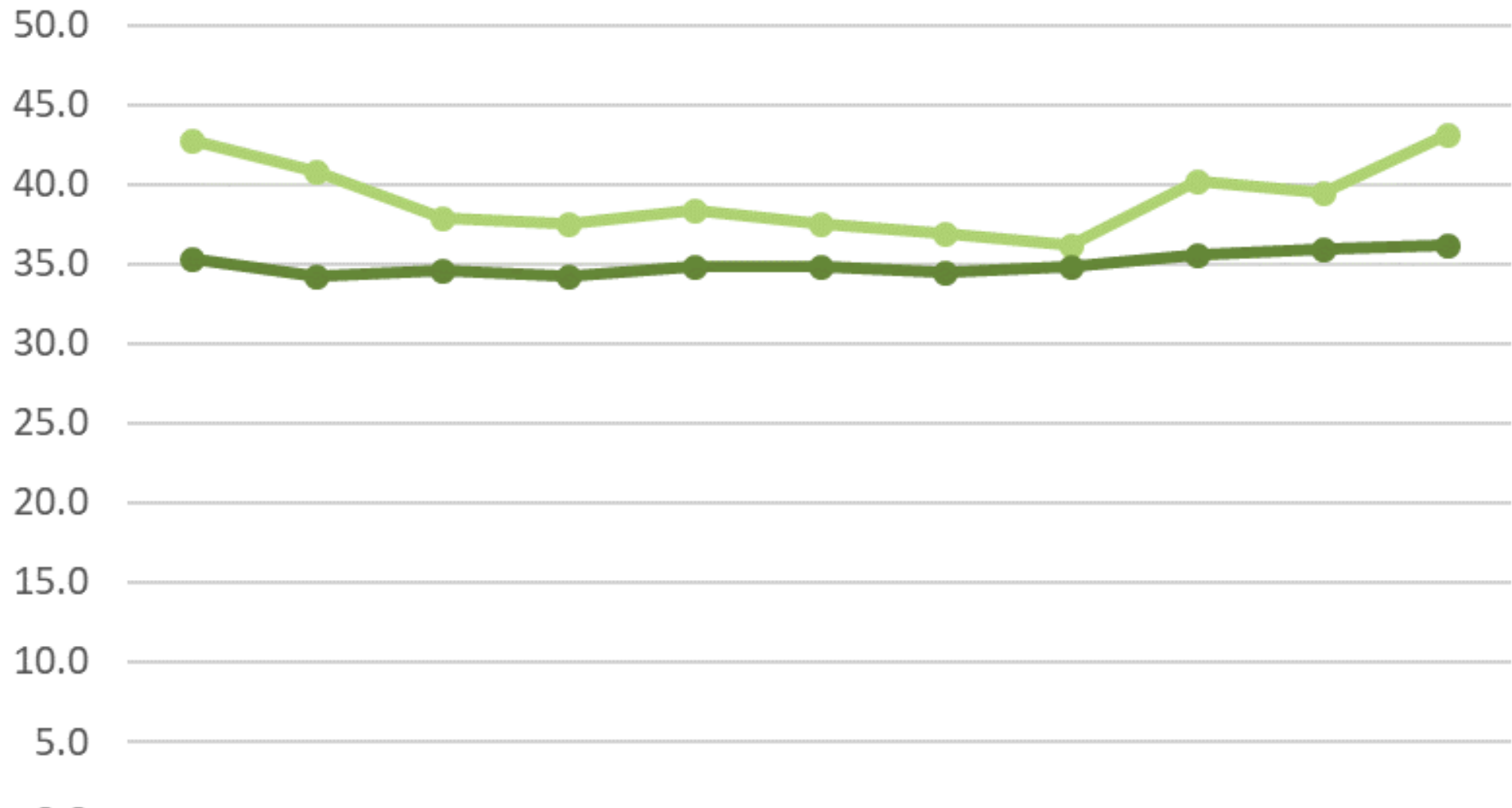
BIRTHS TO MOTHERS AGES 35-50

Births with Inter-Pregnancy Interval < 18 Months



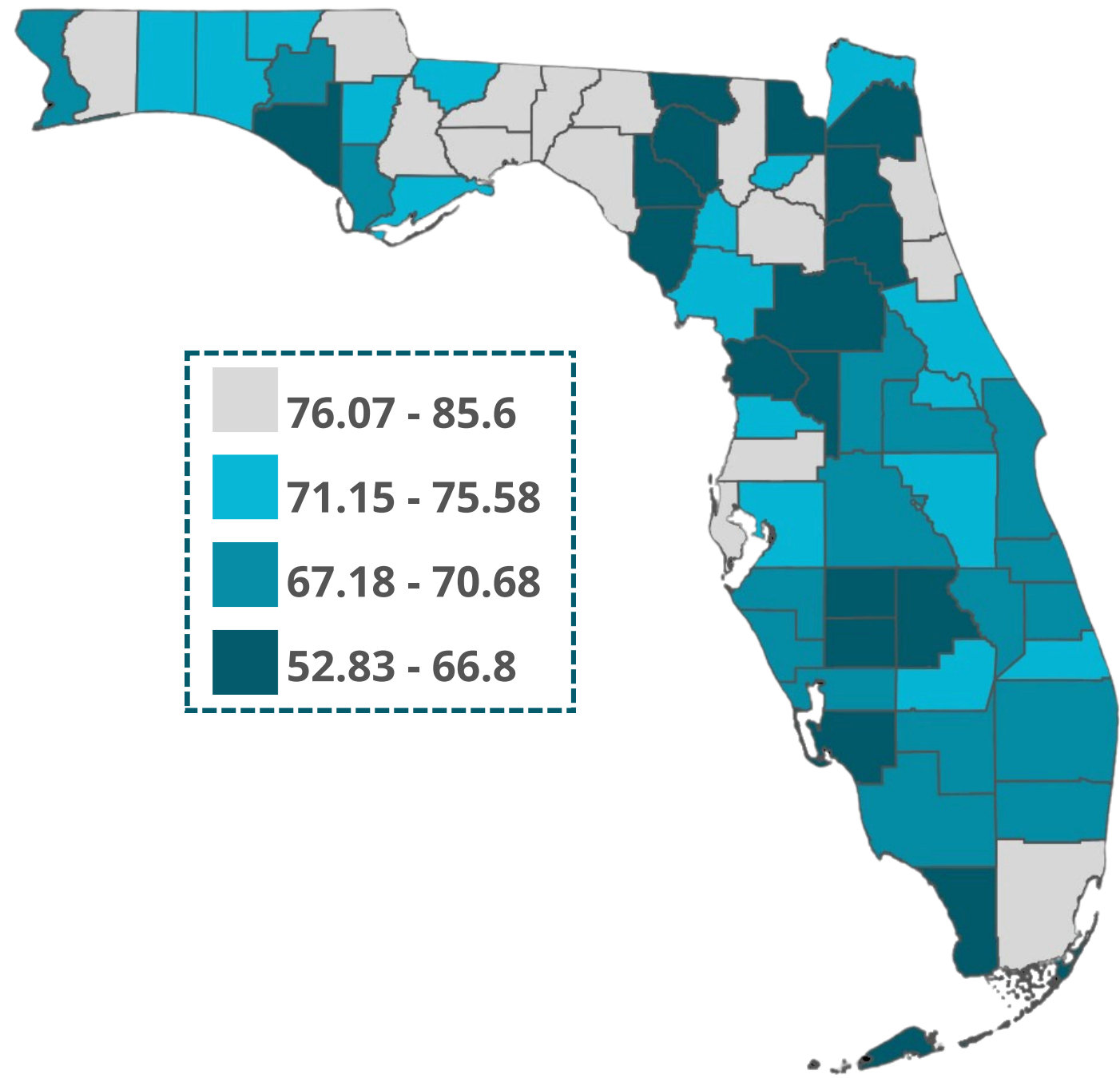
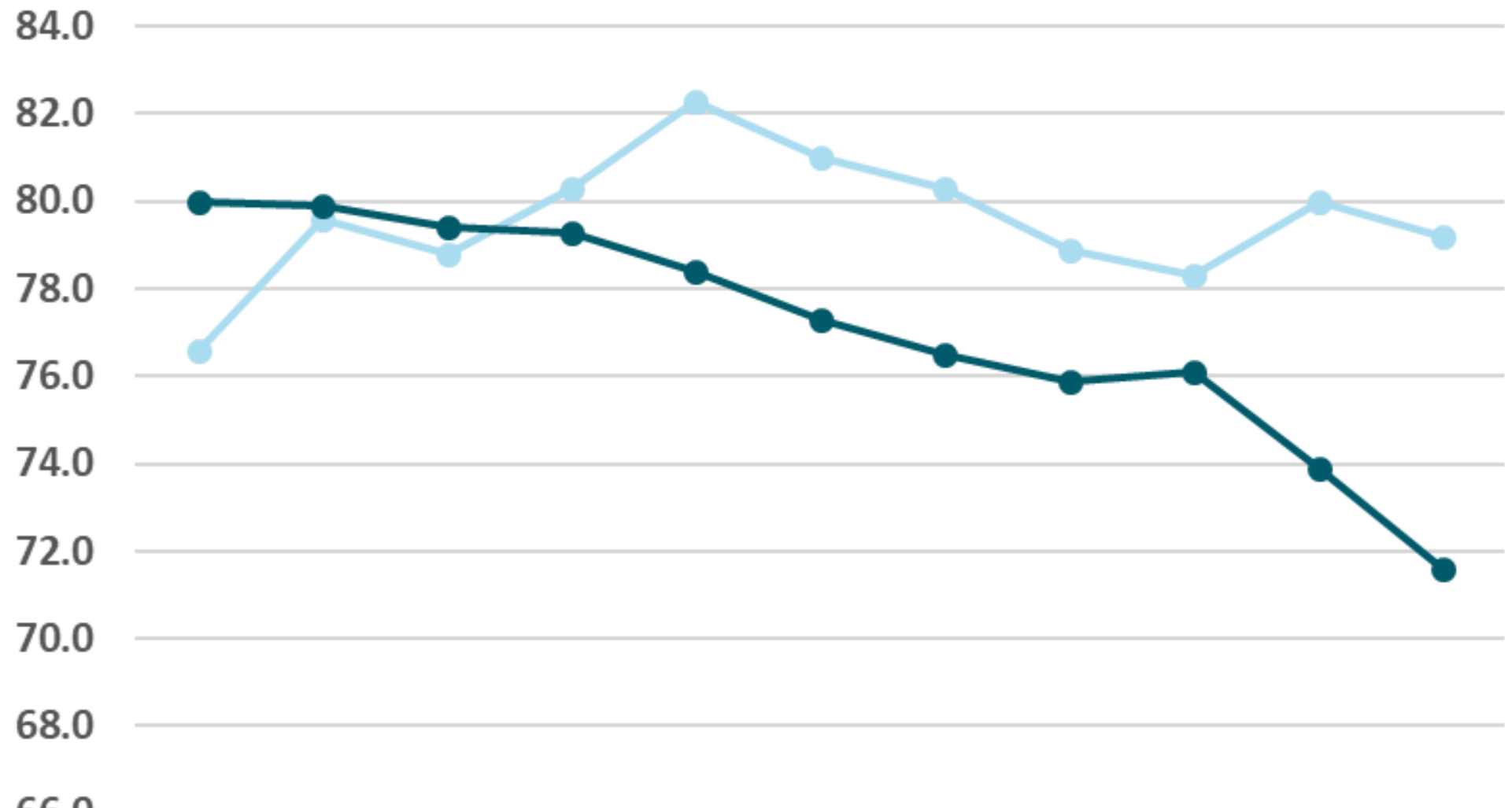

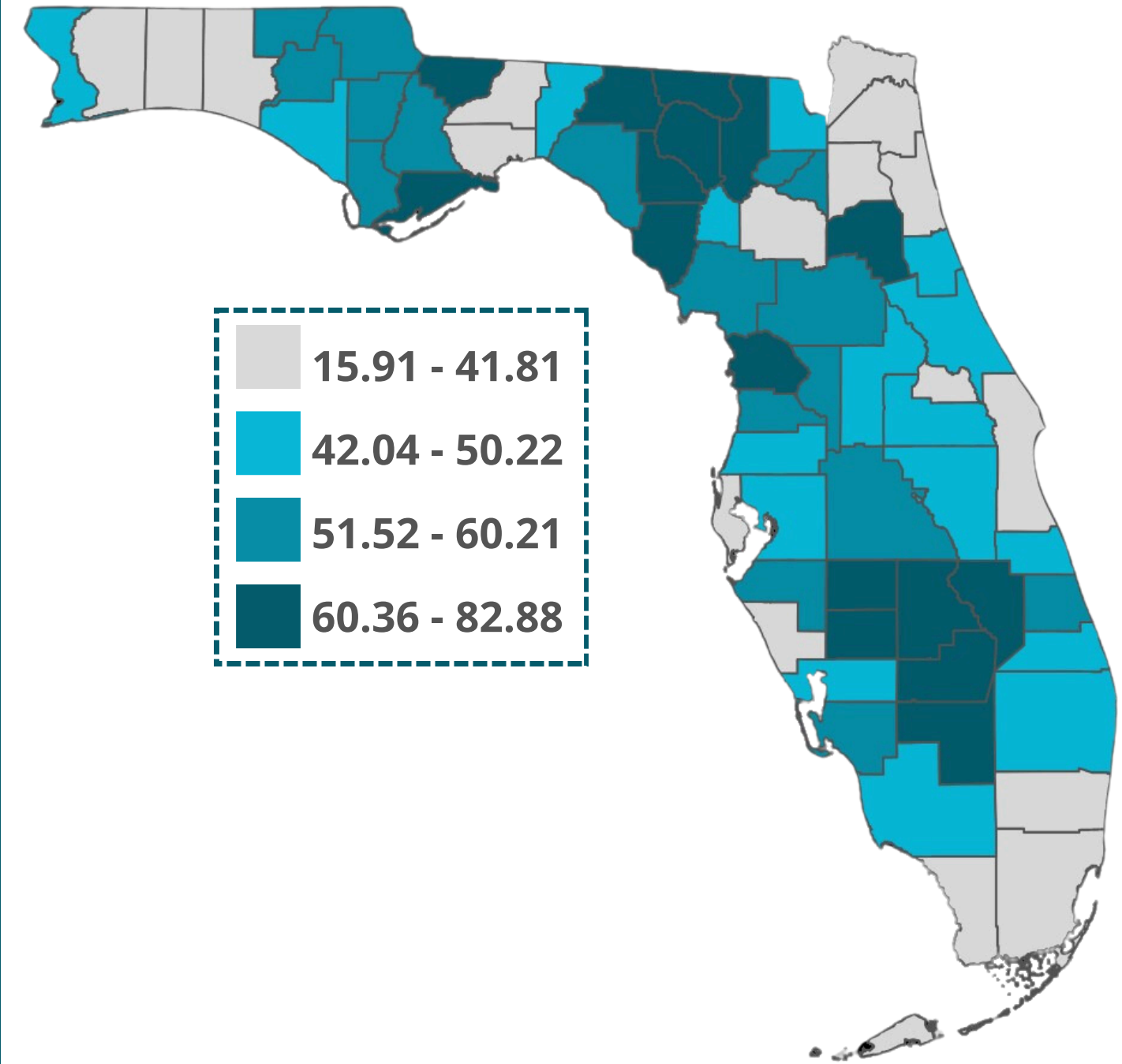
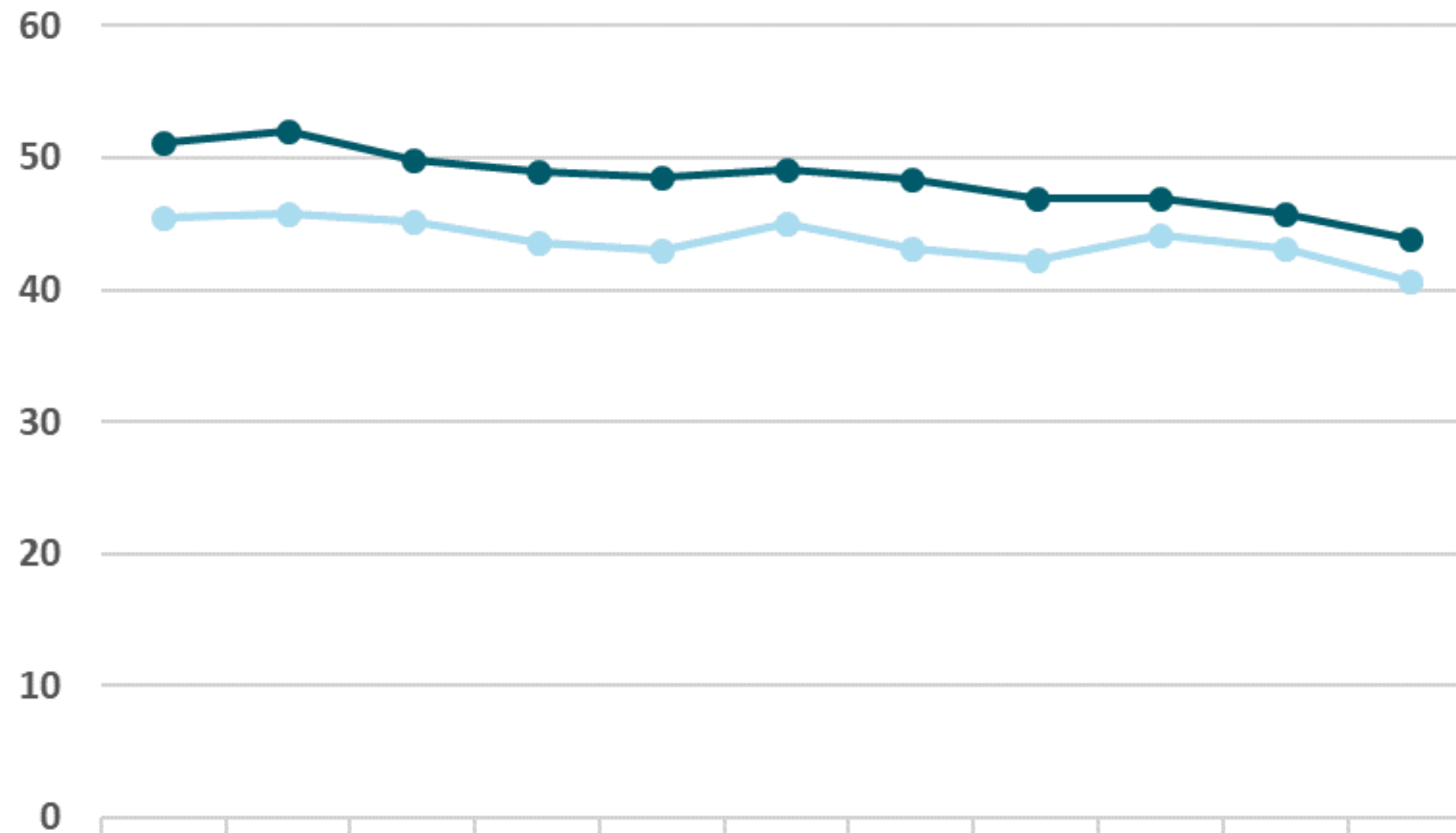


EMERGENCY MEDICAID COVERAGE



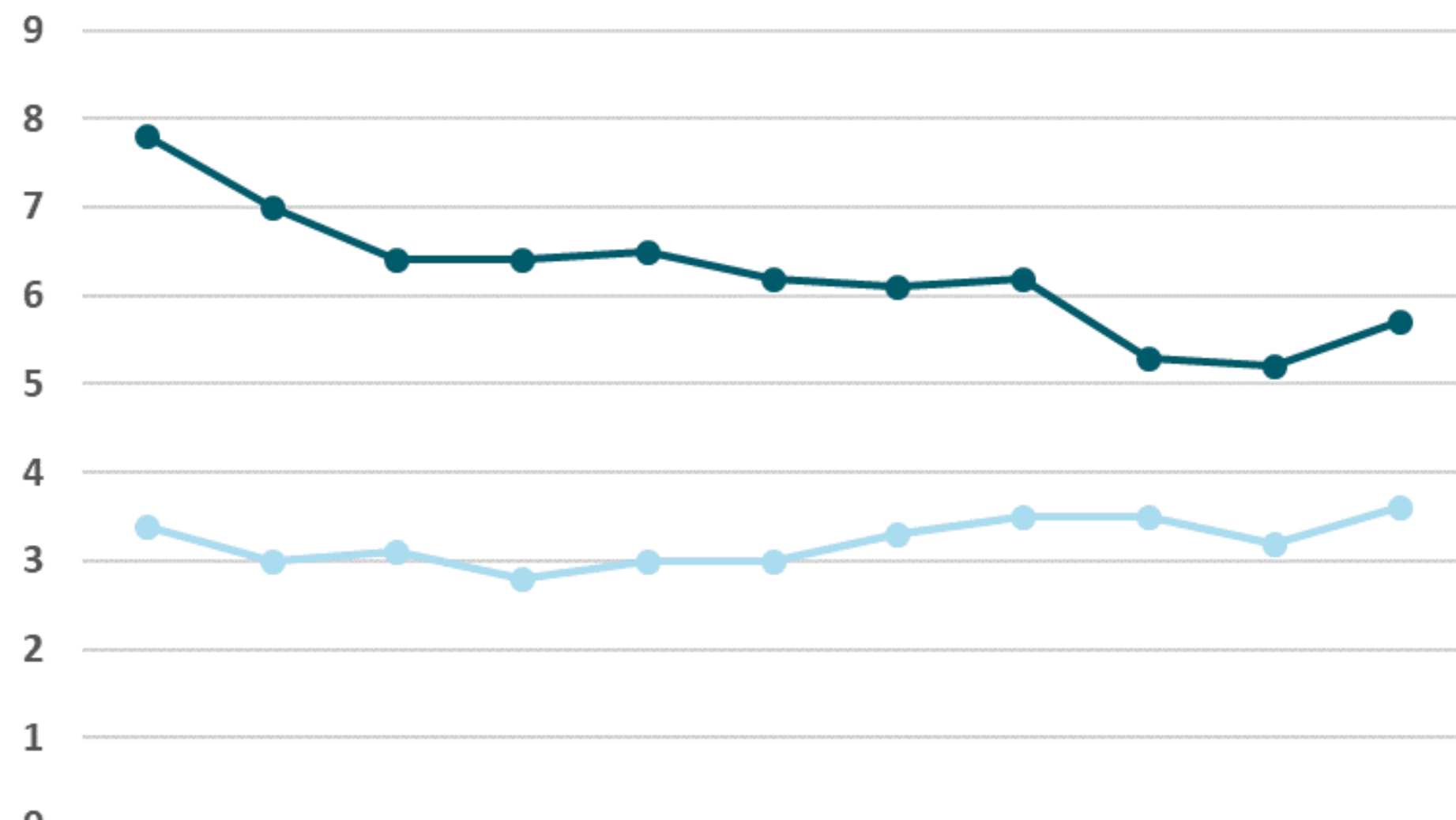
BIRTHS COVERED BY MEDICAID

Births Covered by Medicaid

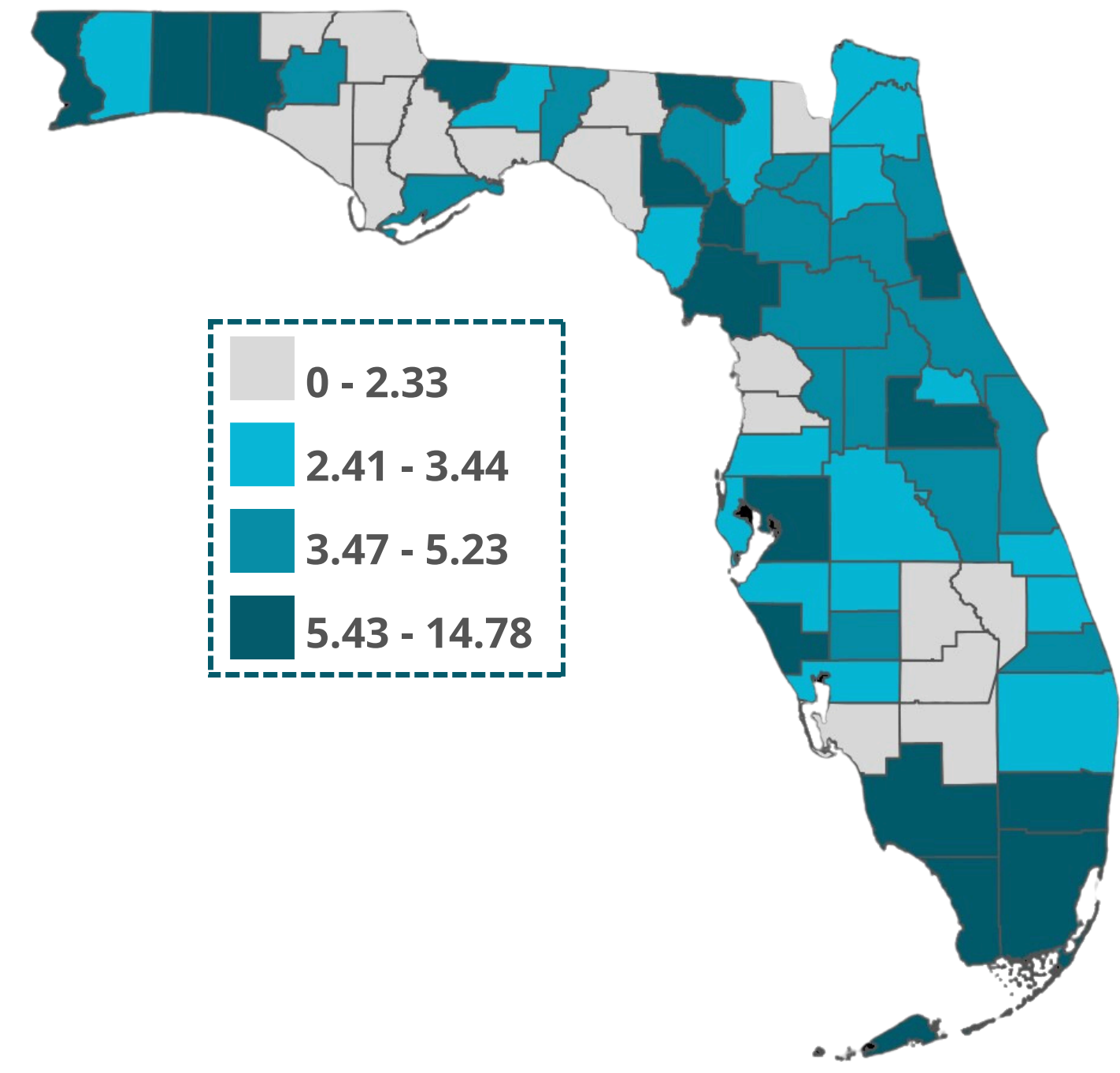

SMOKED DURING PREGNANCY

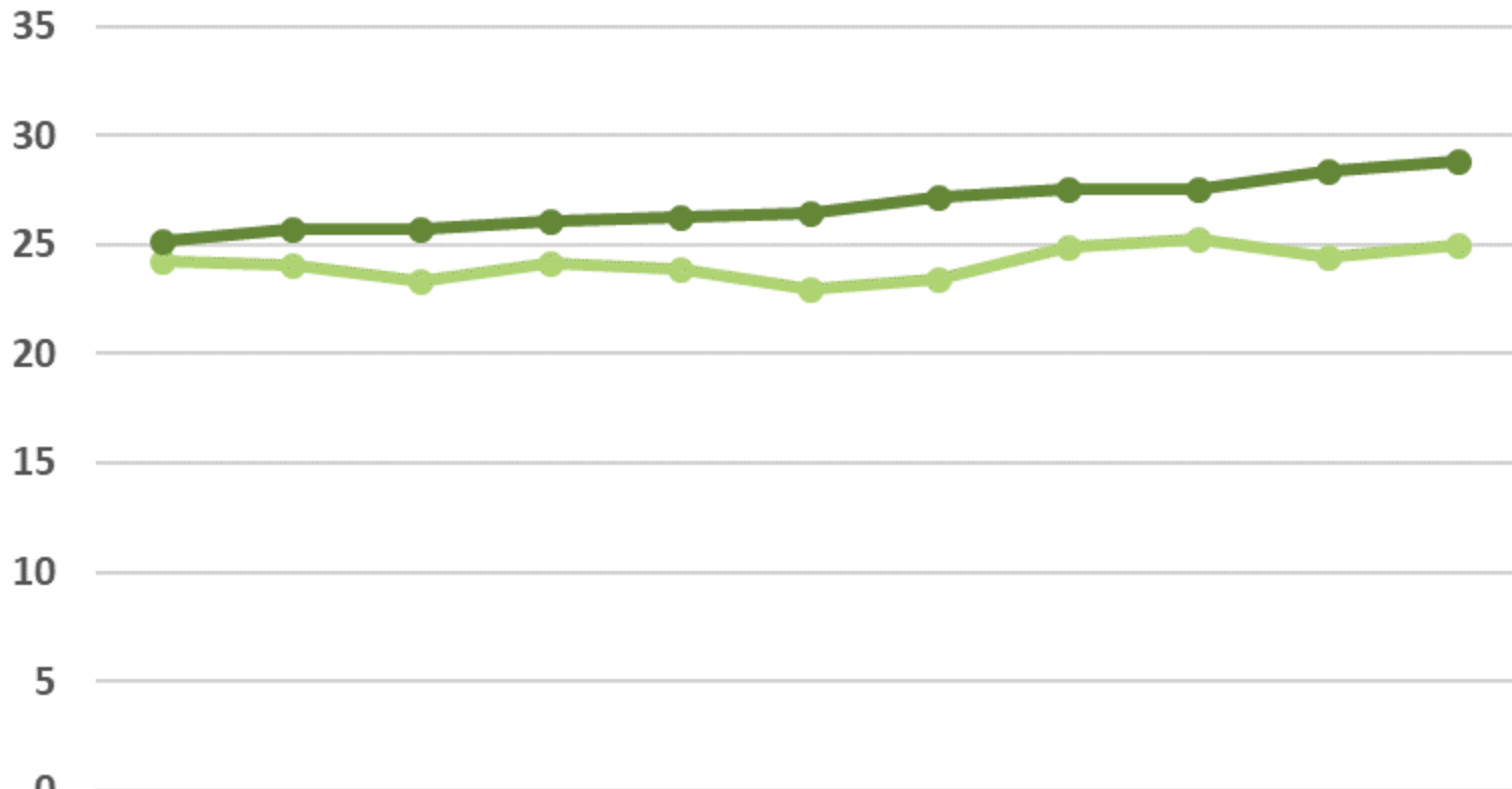

Mothers Who Were Obese at Time Pregnancy Occurred



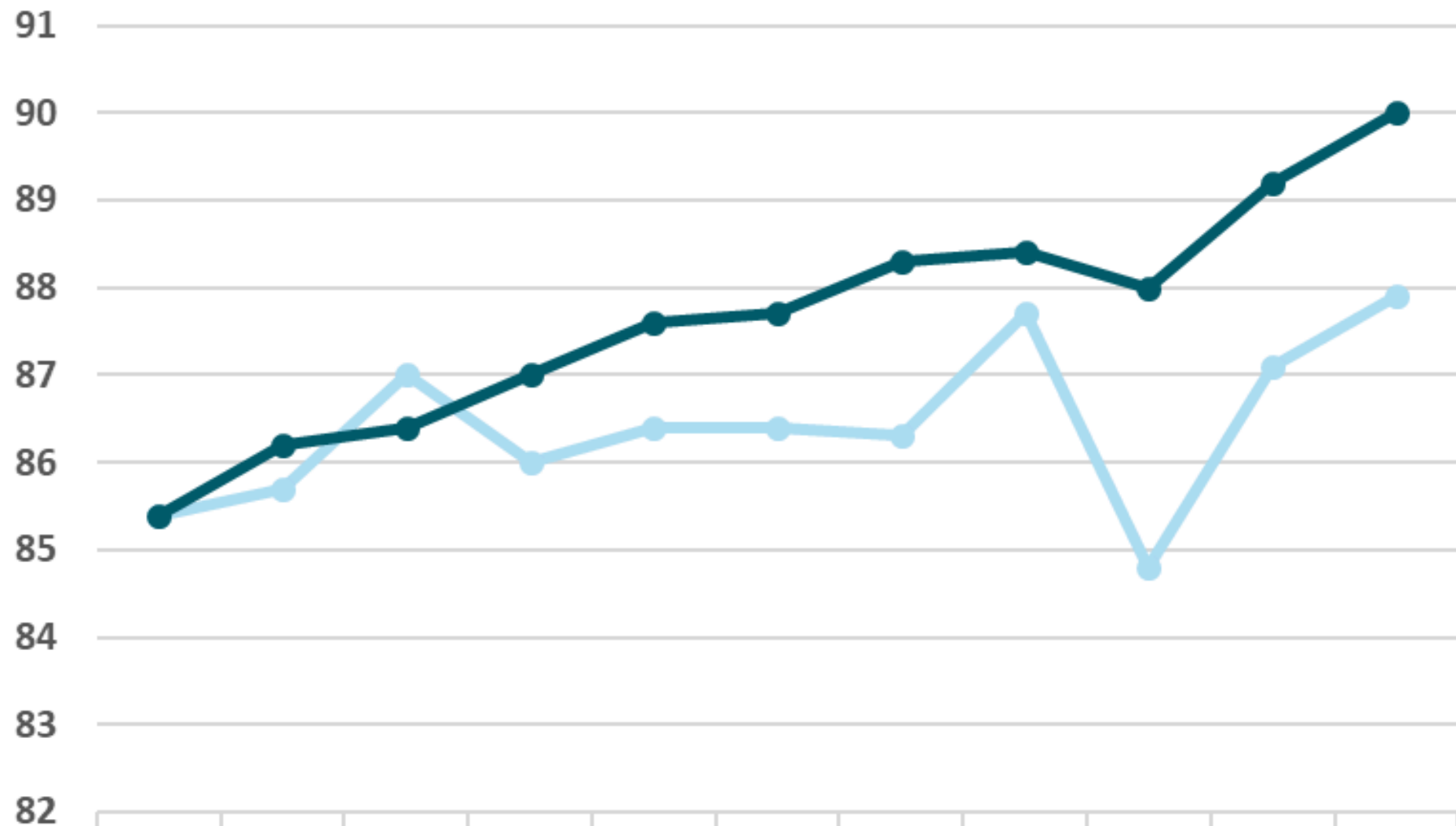

Families with Female Householder (No Spouse Present) Below Poverty Level with Related Children (Ages 0-4)

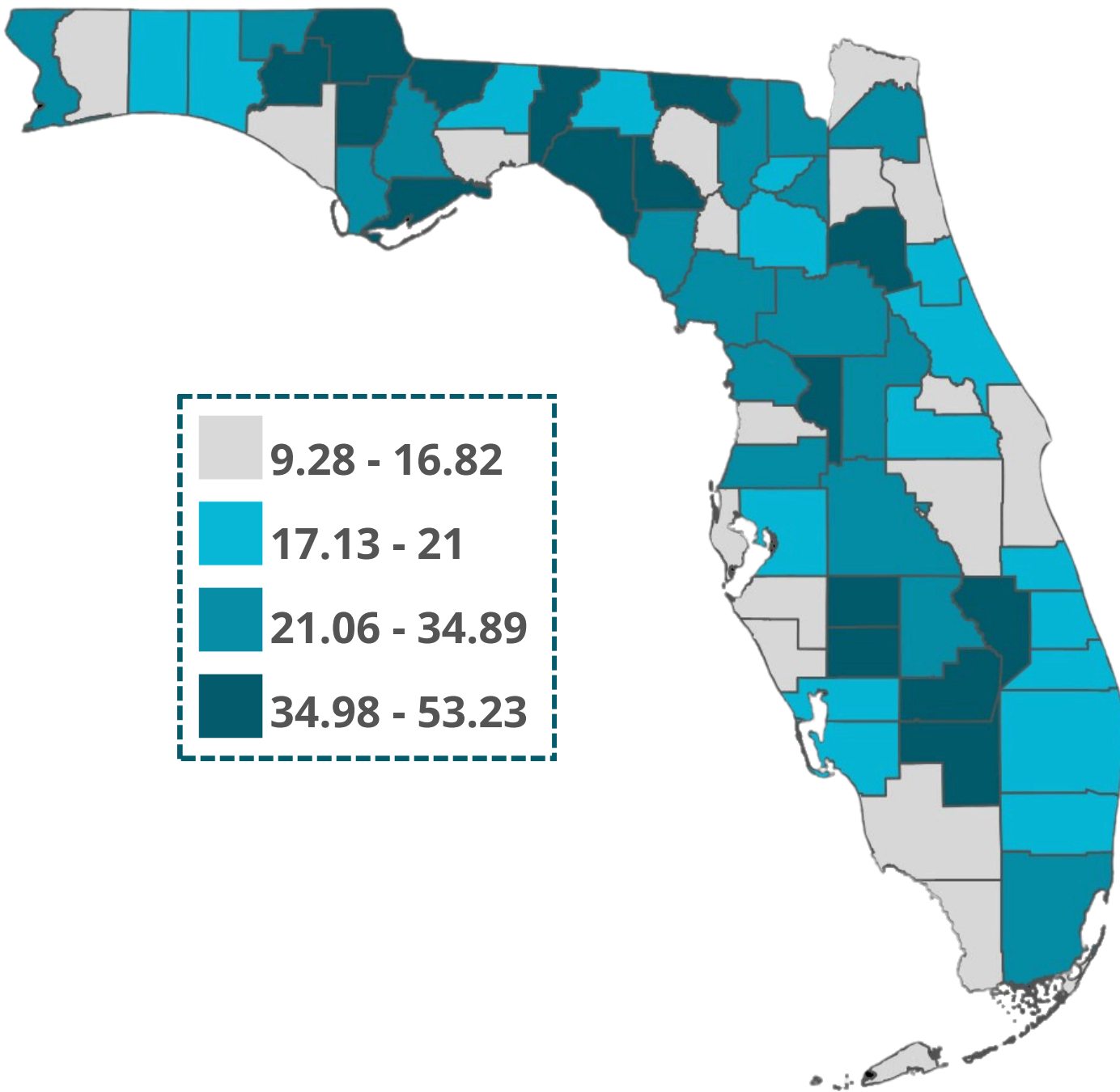
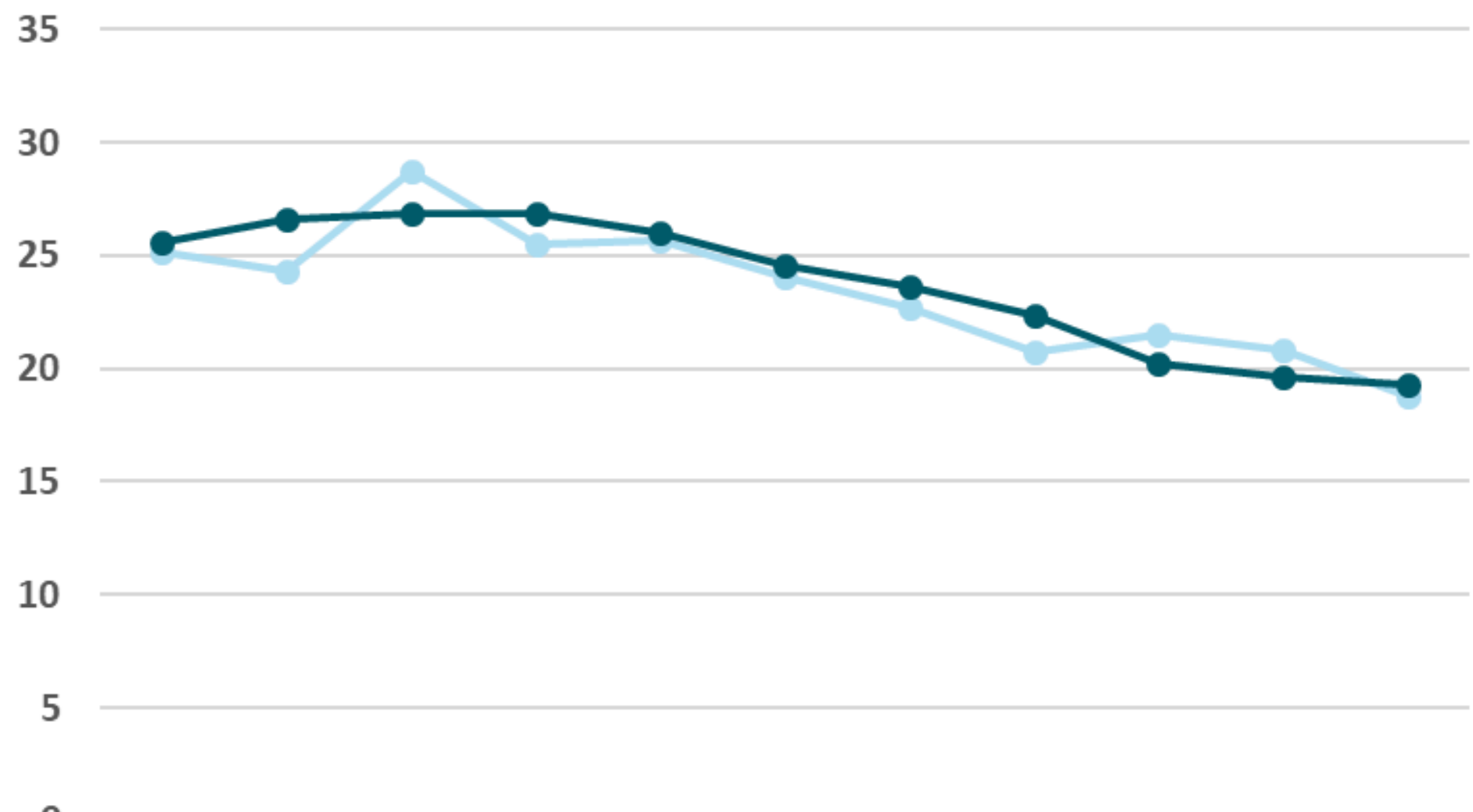

Children Living Below the Poverty Level, Ages 0-4

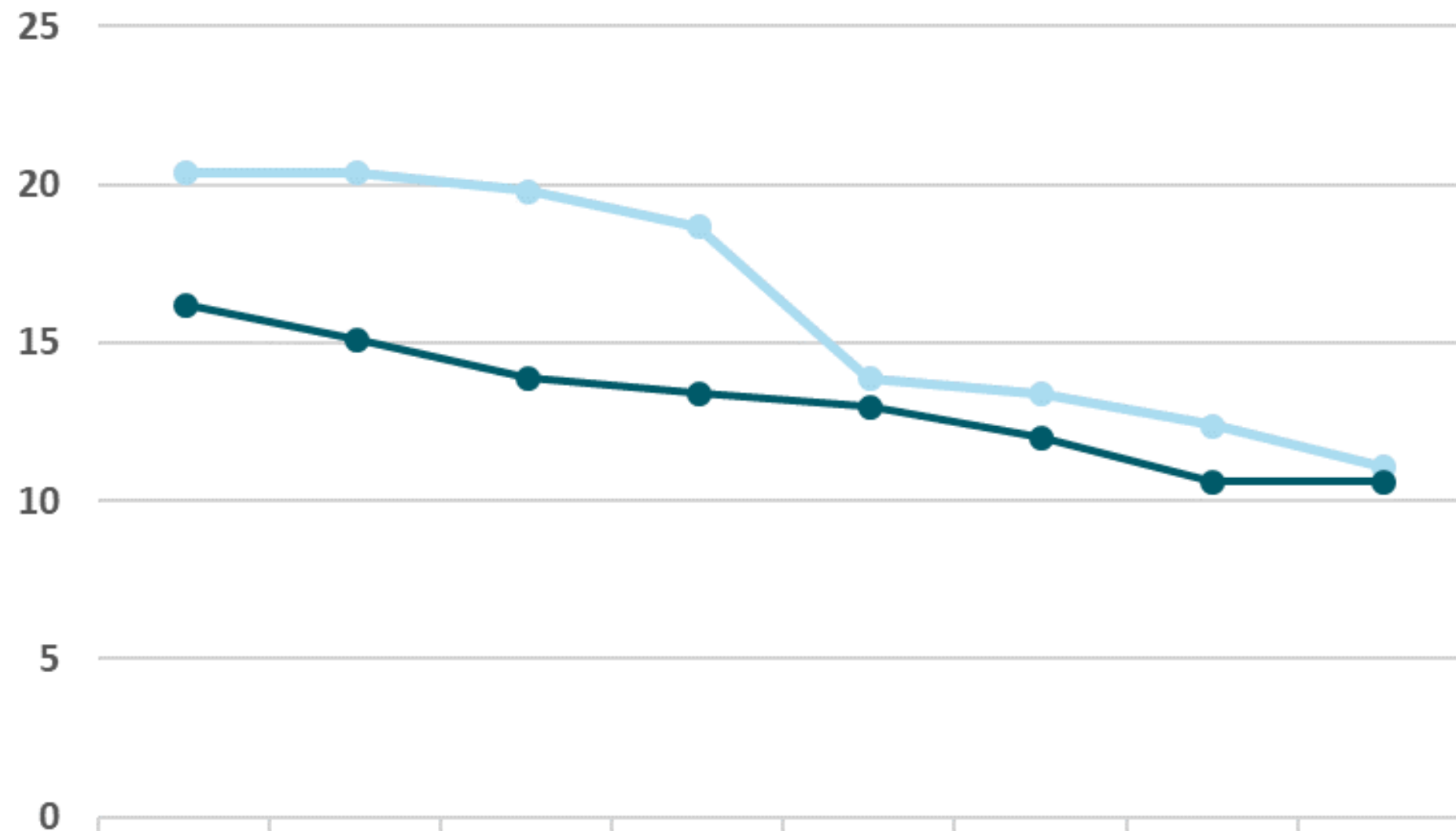

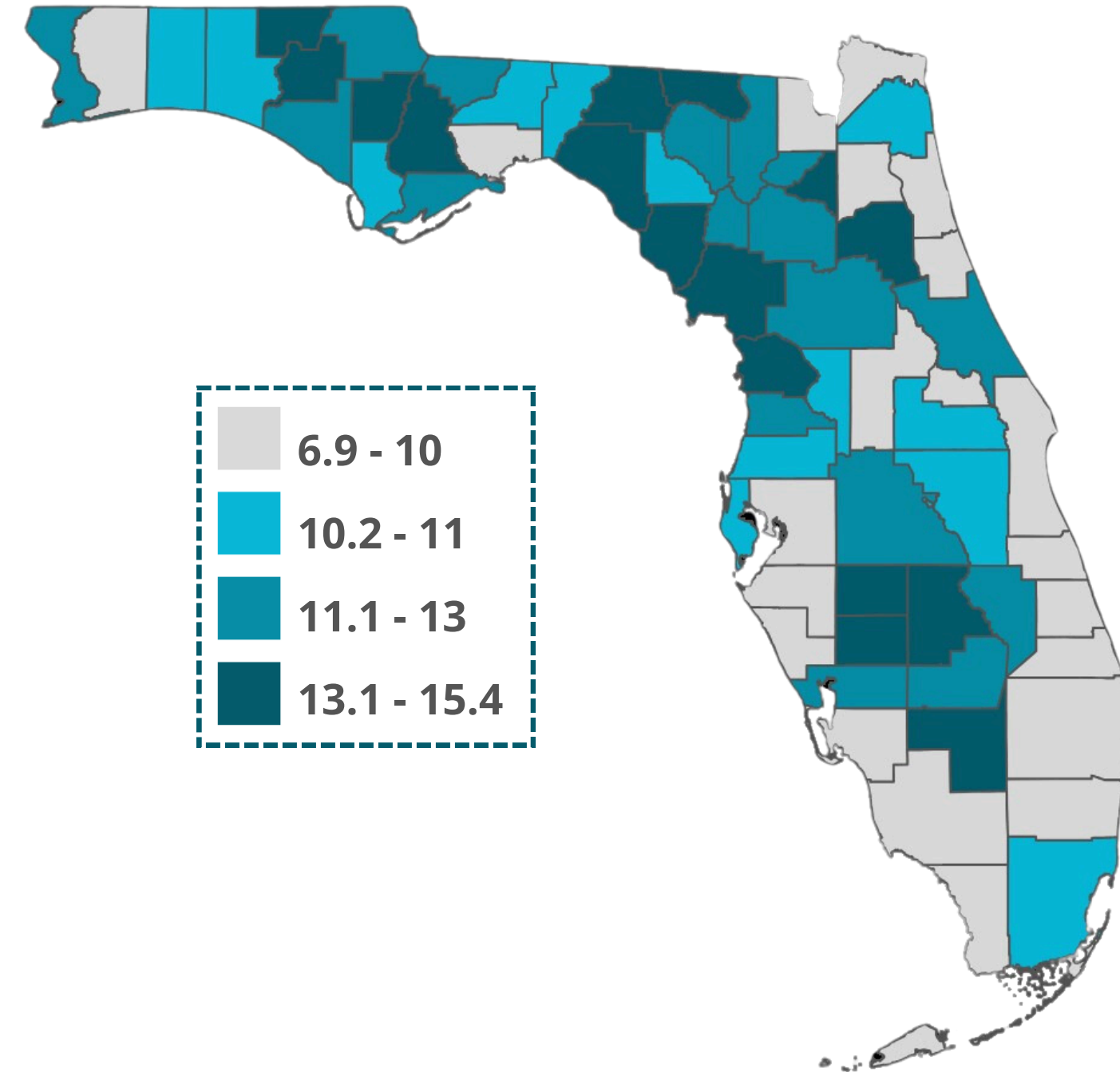

Food Insecurity Rate

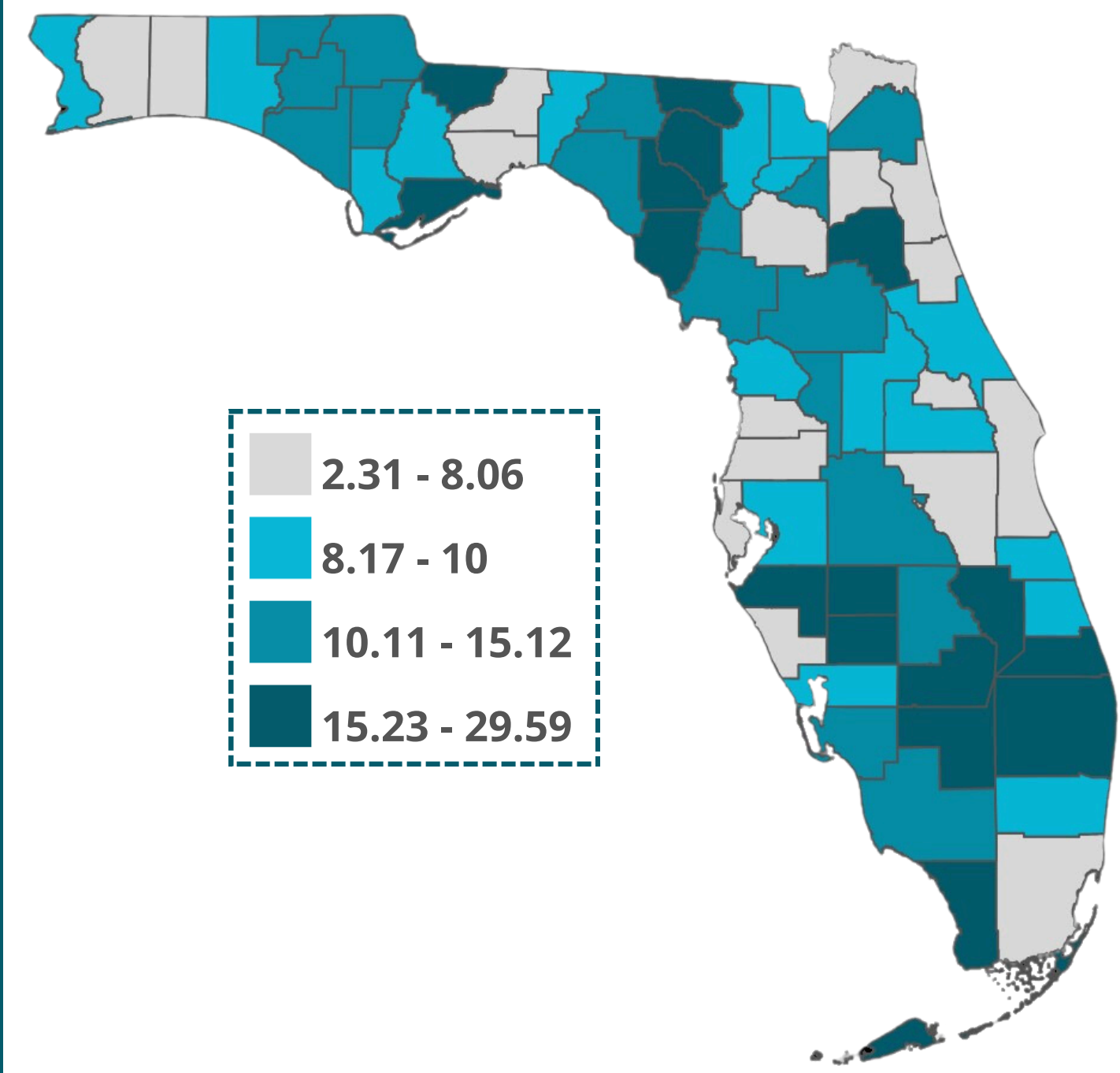
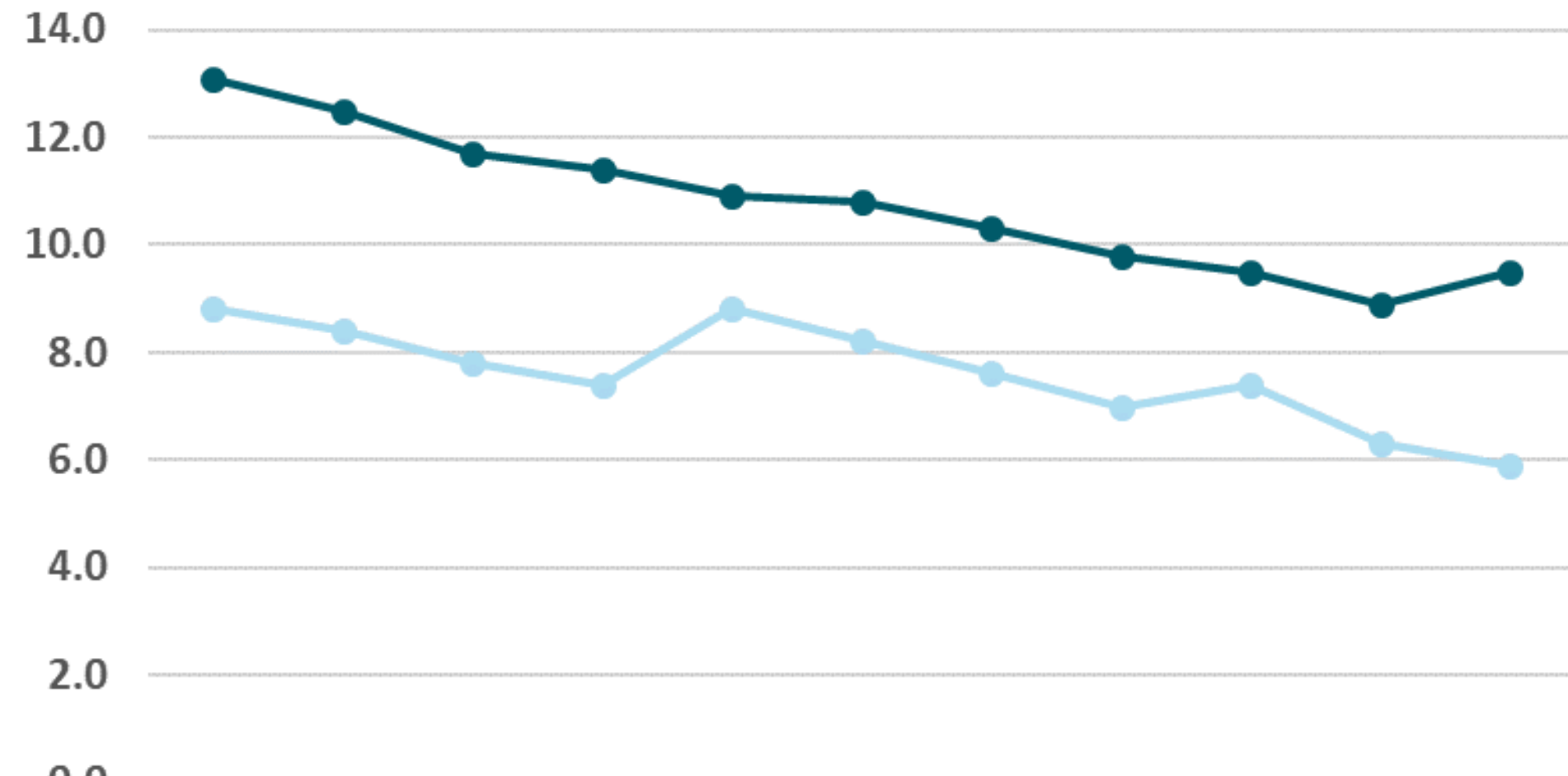

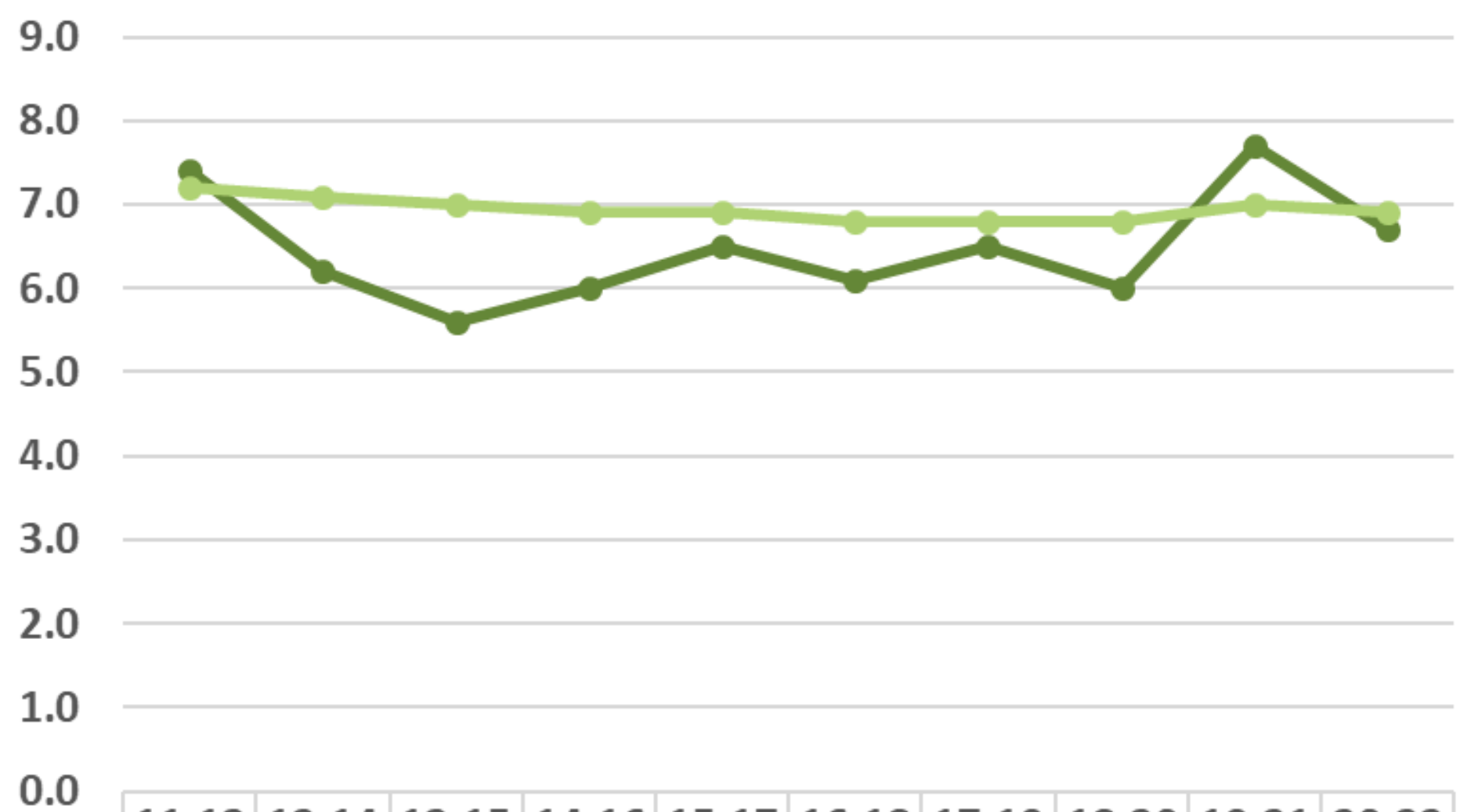


Fetal Deaths, Rate per 1,000 Deliveries, 2022

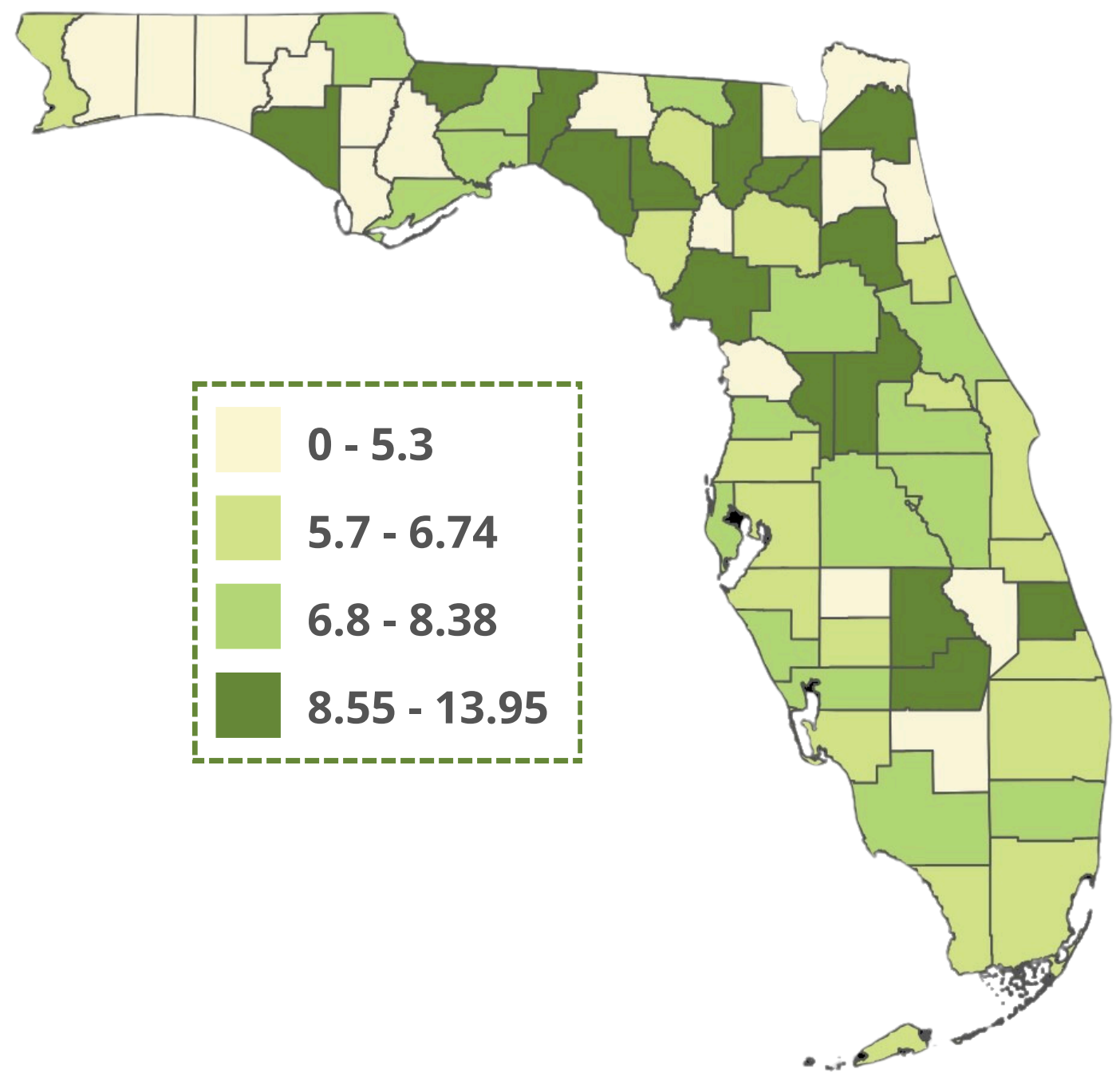

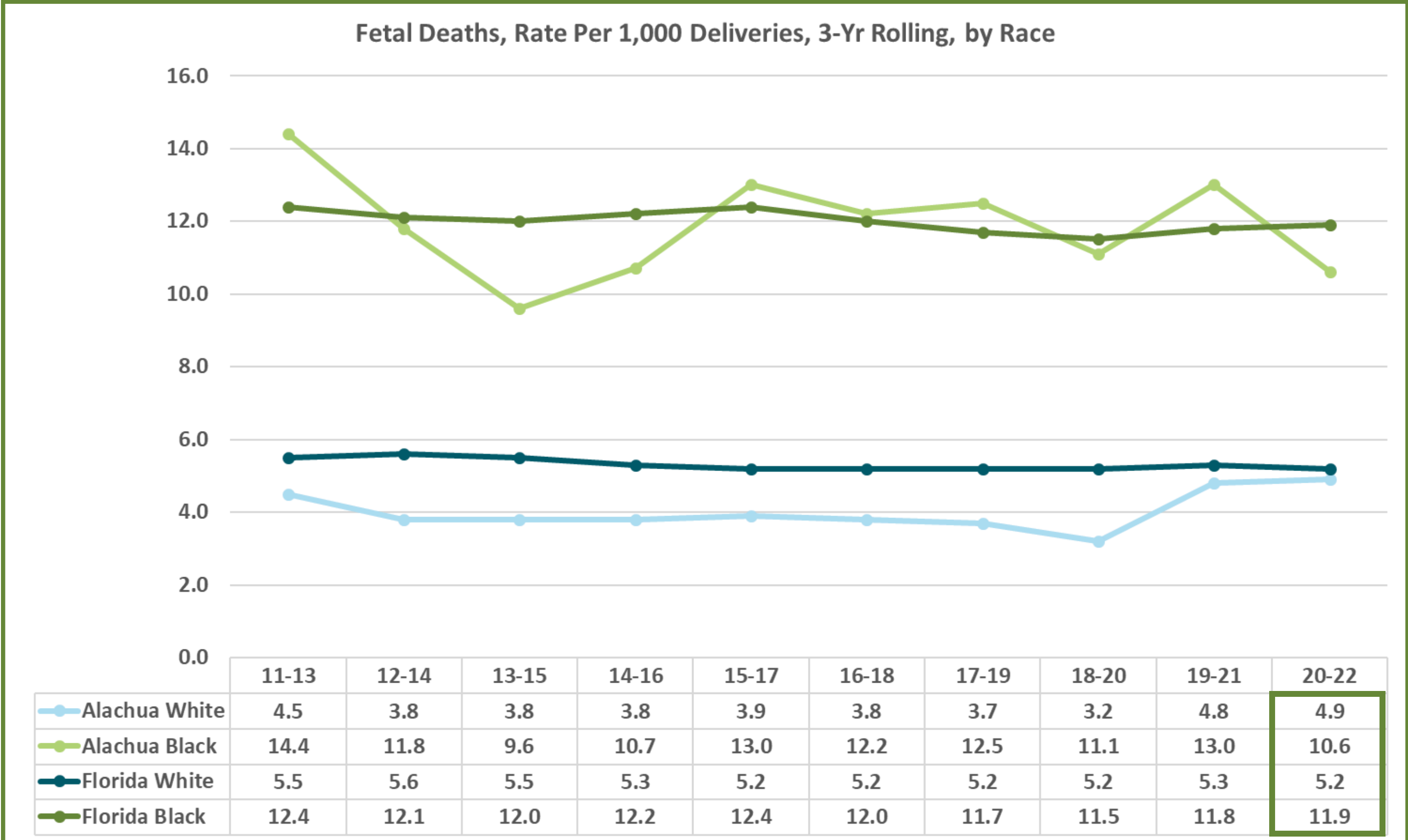
Fetal Deaths, Rate per 1,000 Deliveries, 3-Yr Rolling Avg

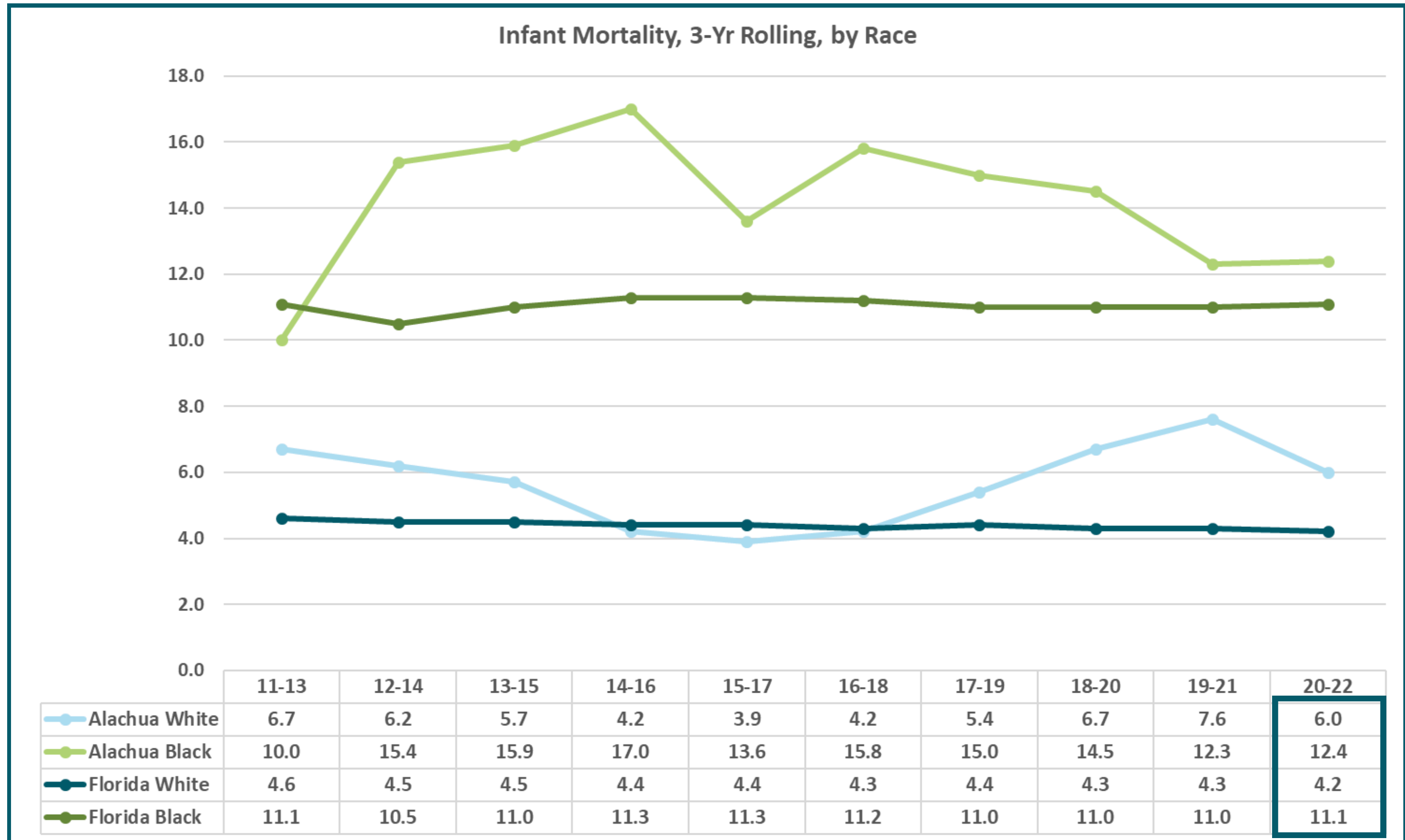


Infant Deaths, 2020-2022 (3-Yr Rolling)

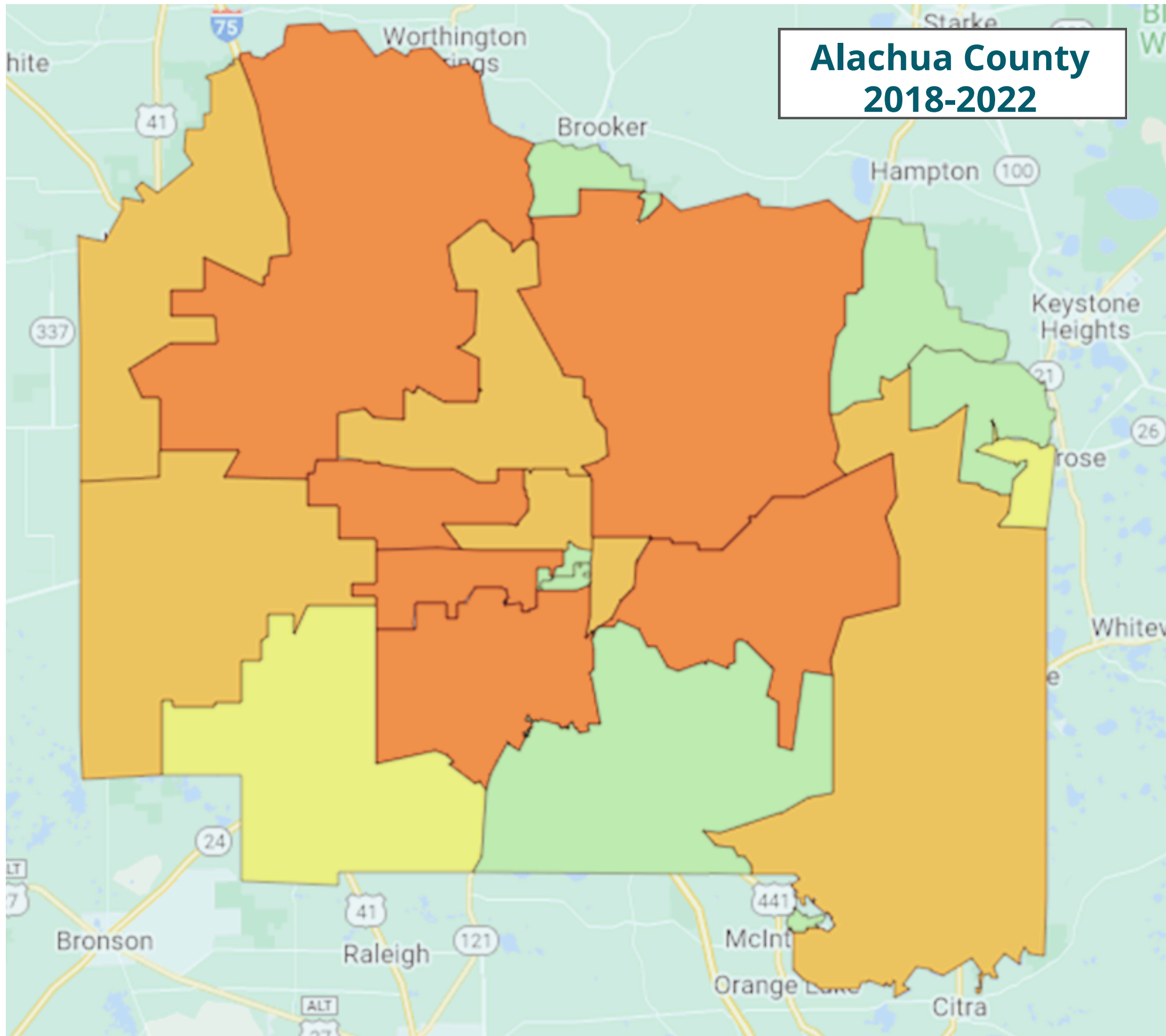

Postneonatal Mortality (Aged 28-364 Days) per 1,000 Live Births

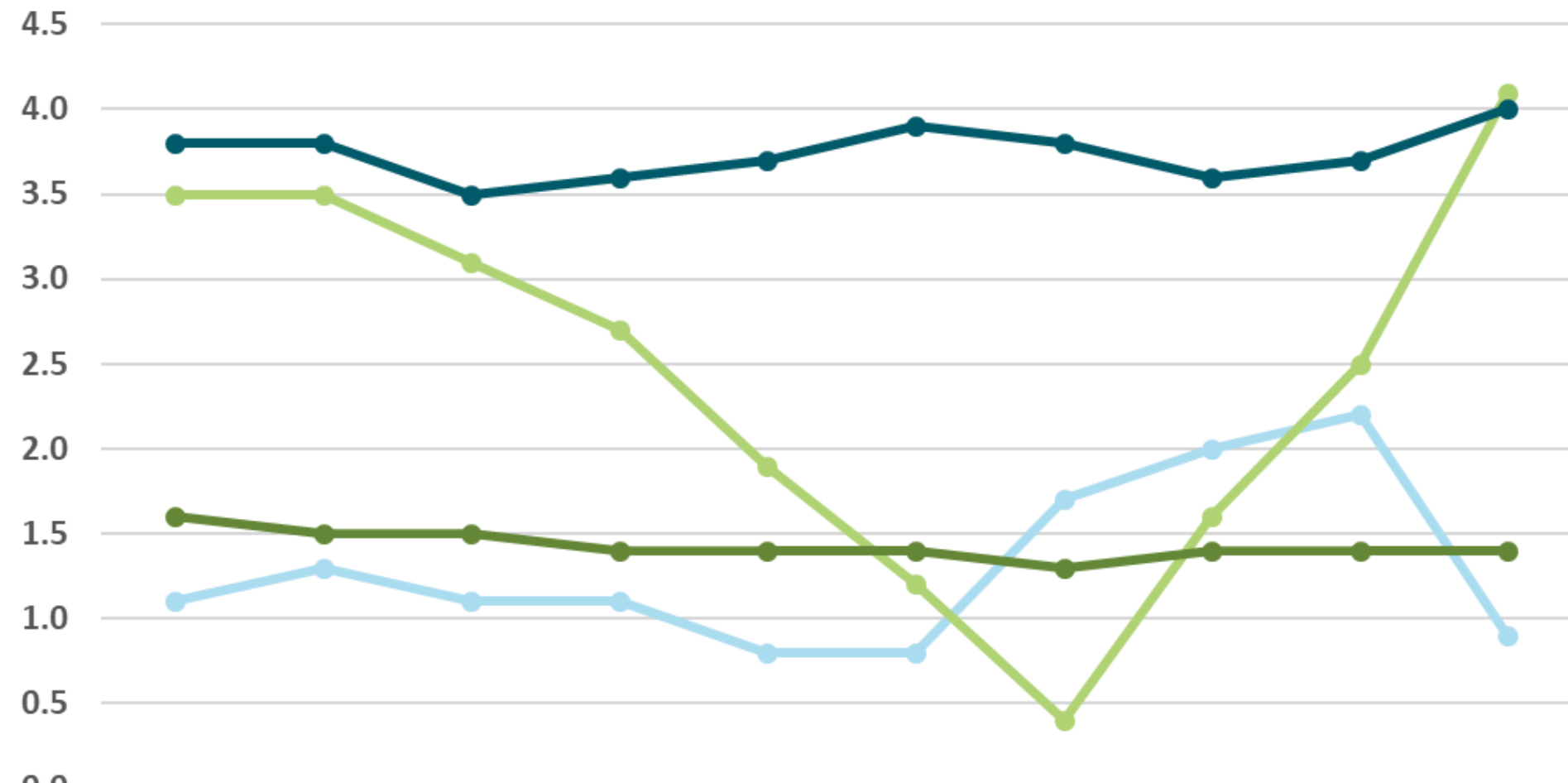

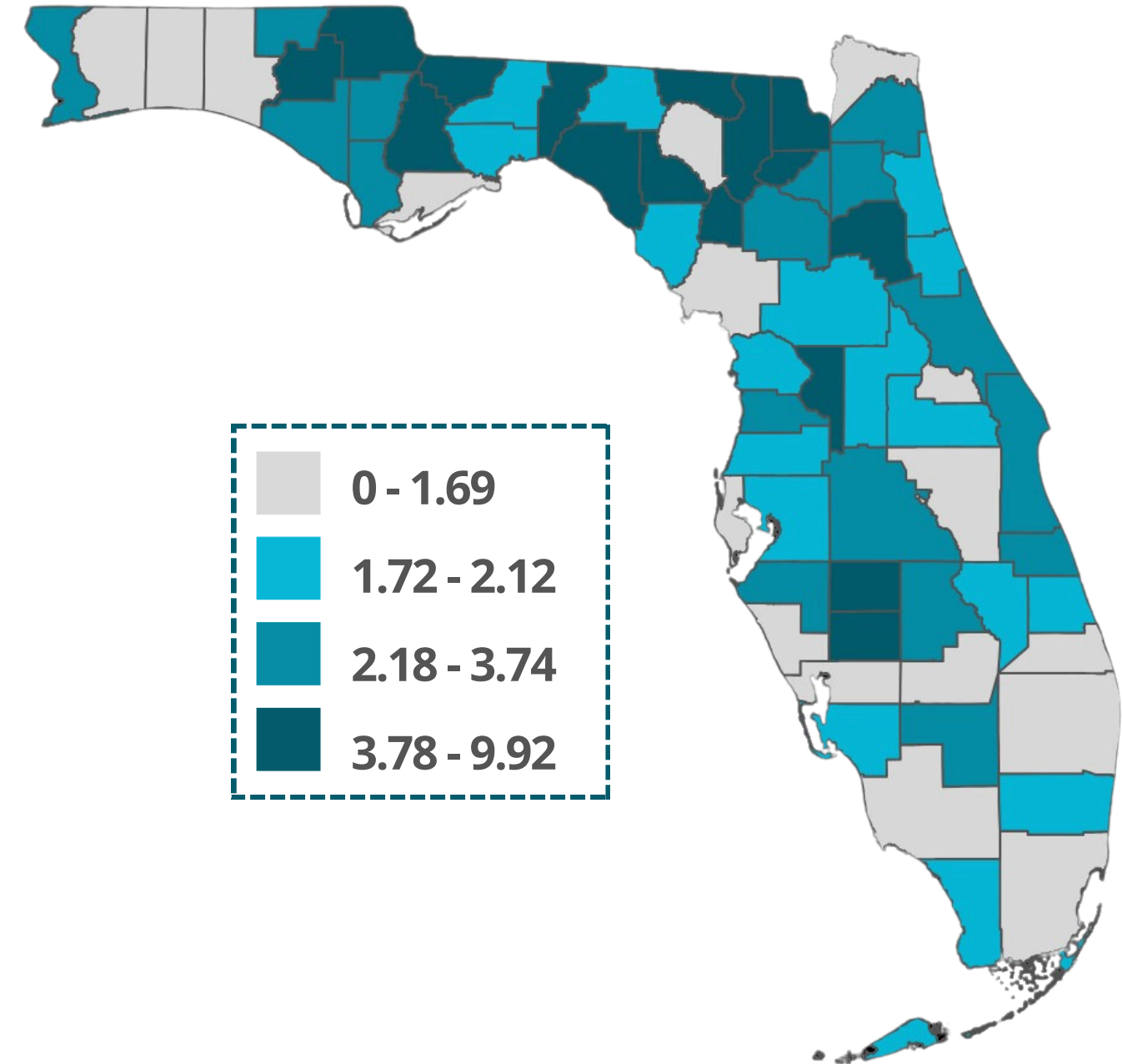

Postneonatal Mortality, 3-Yr Rolling, by Race

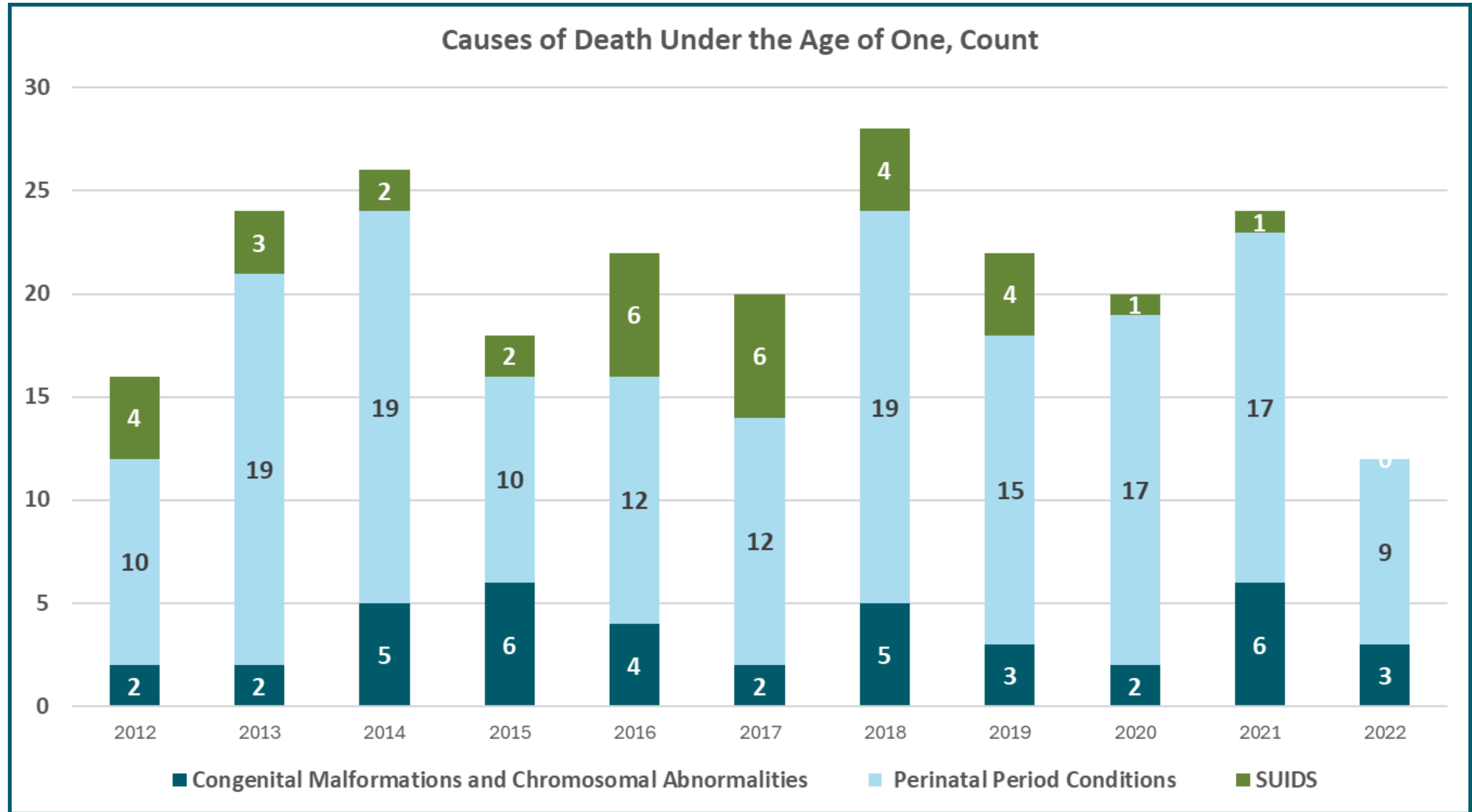

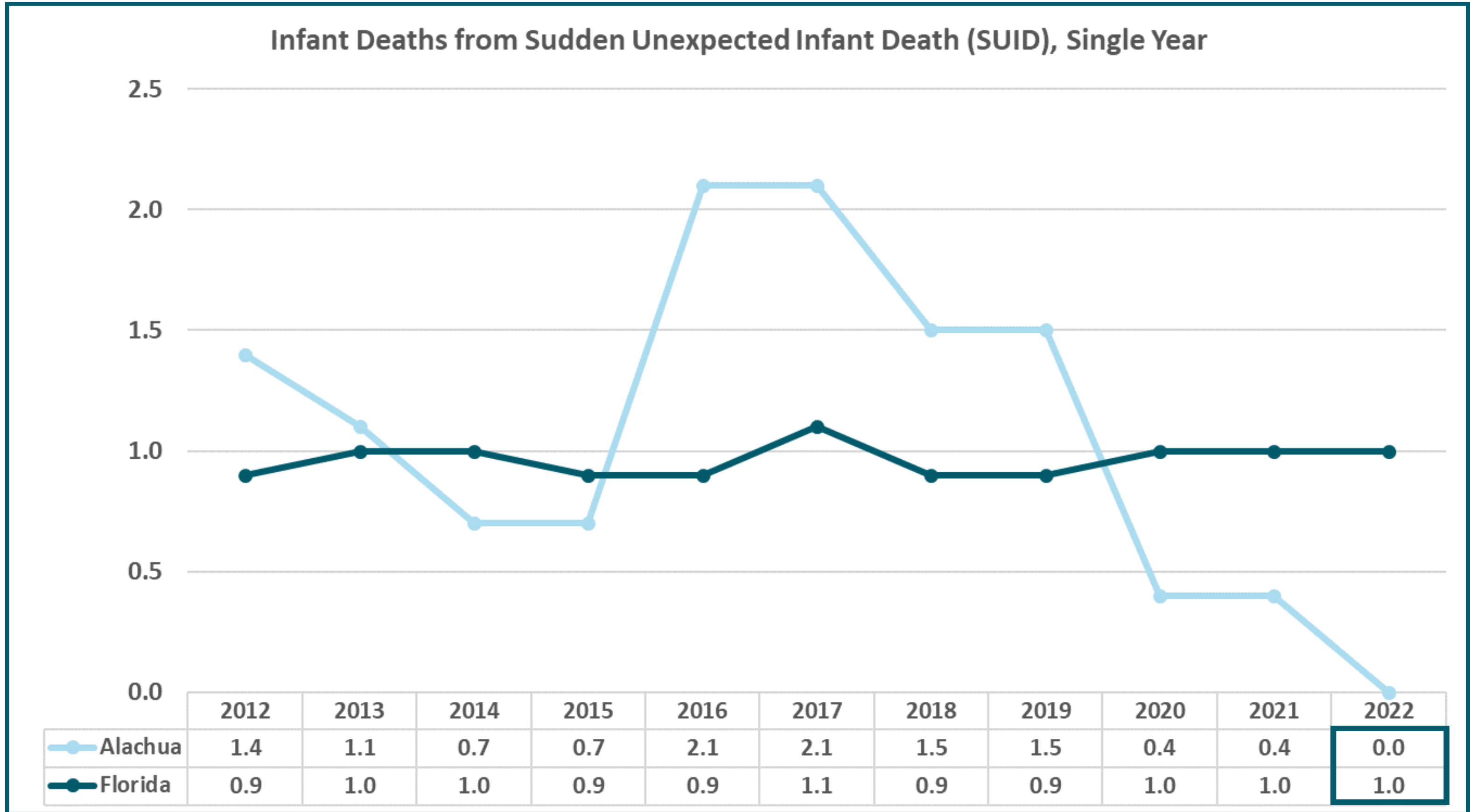

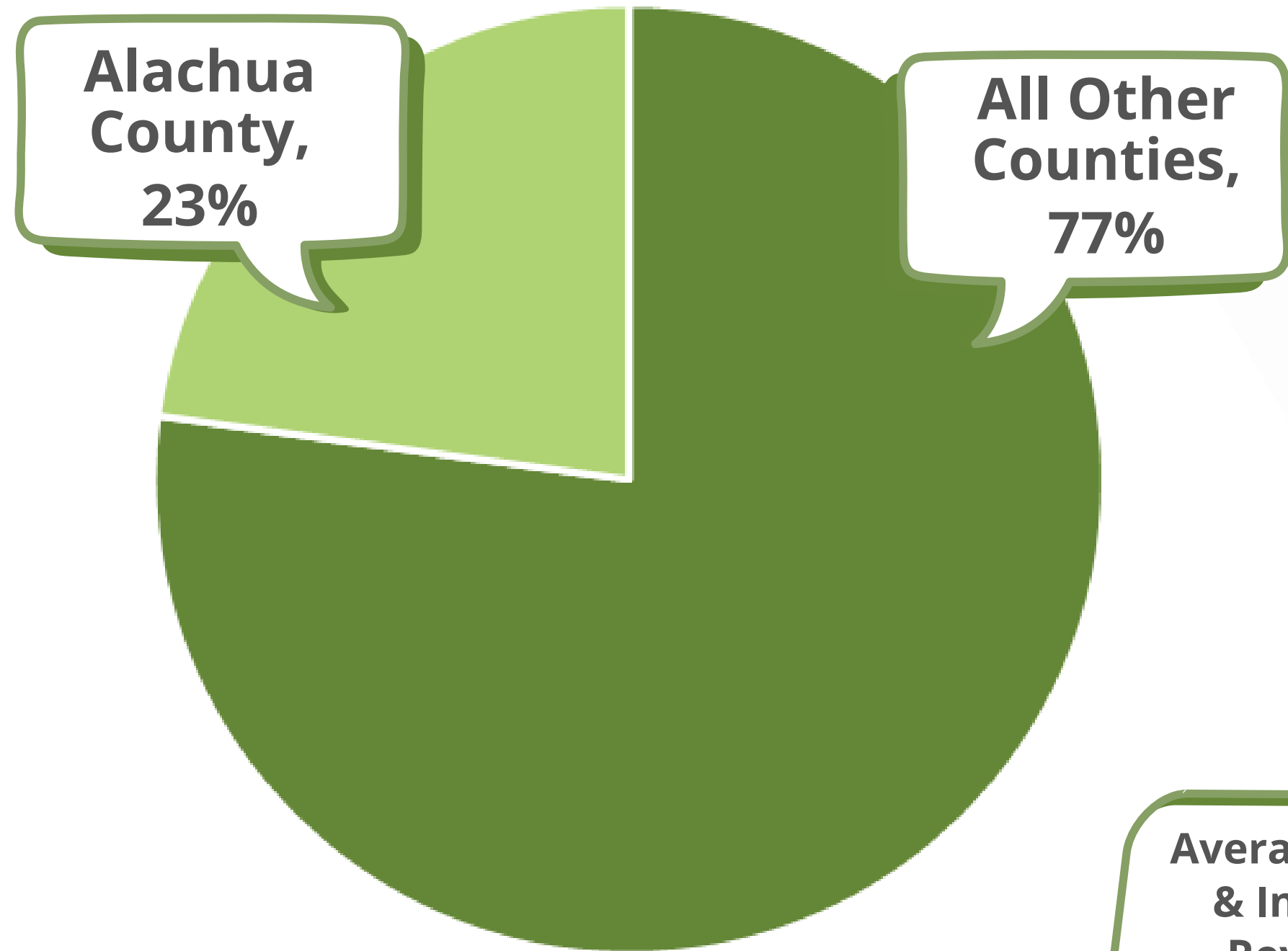

Alachua Fetal & Infant Deaths February 2023 - June 2024



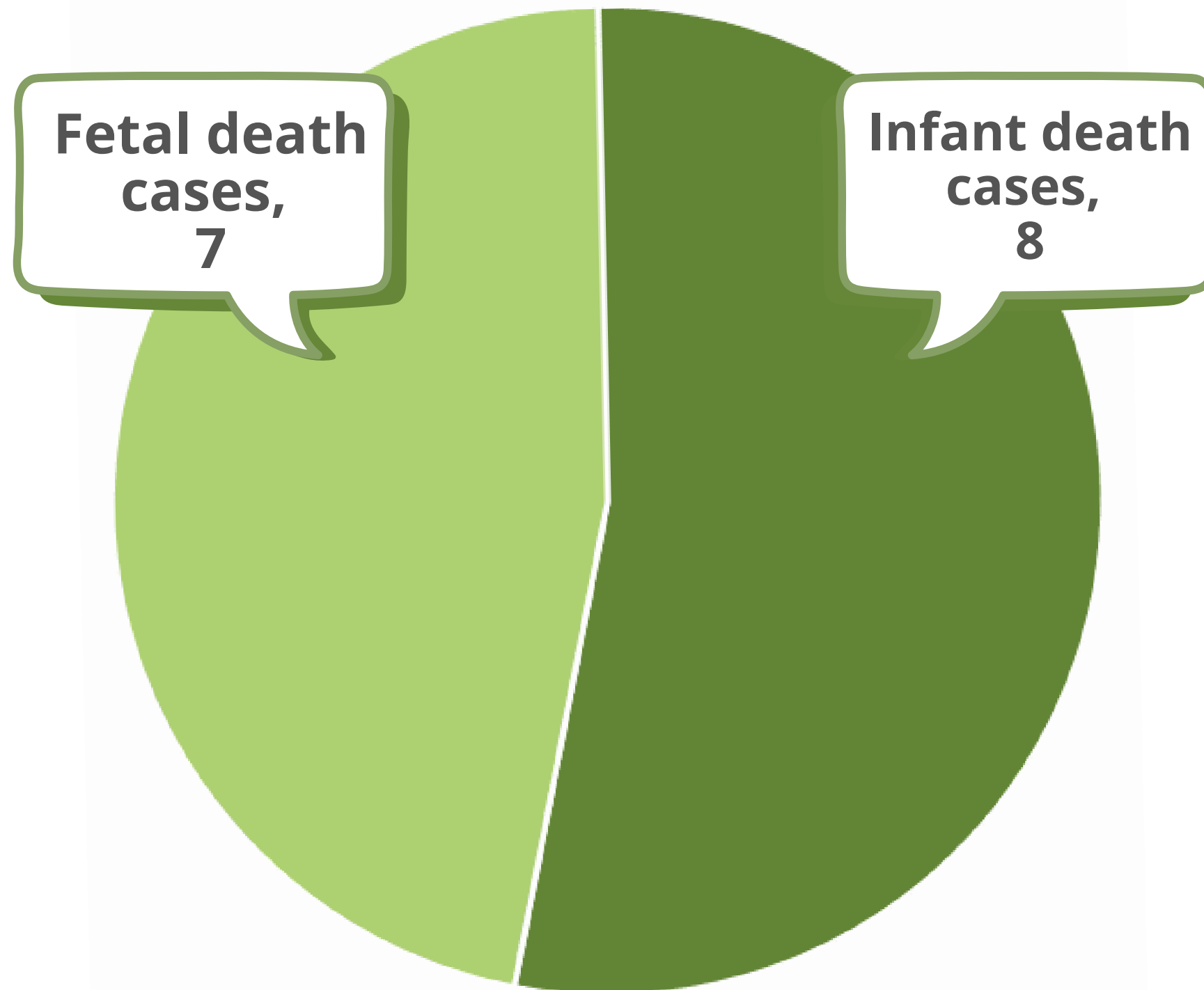
Average Number of Alachua County Fetal & Infant Death Cases Reviewed Annually, 9

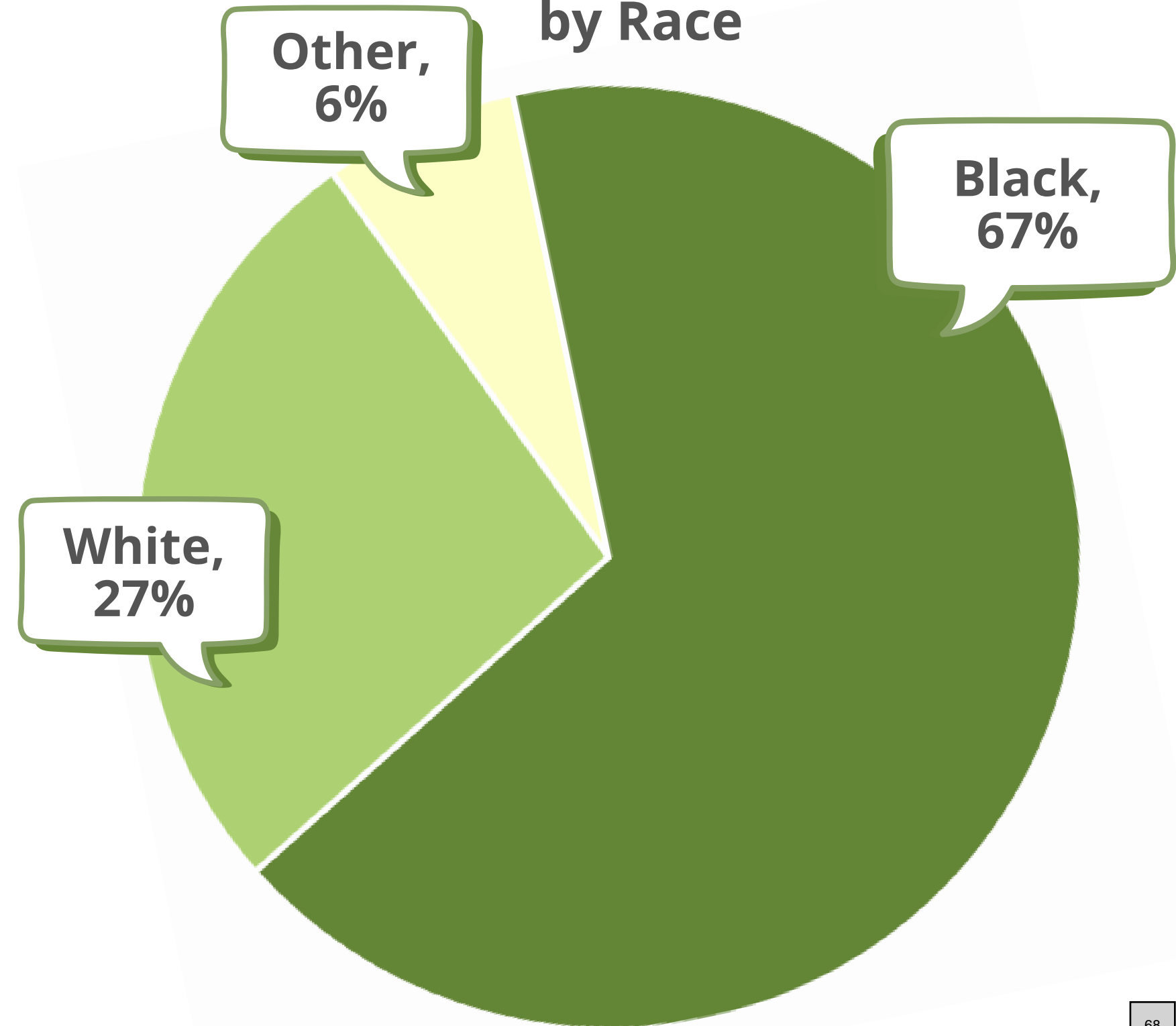

February 2023 - June 2024

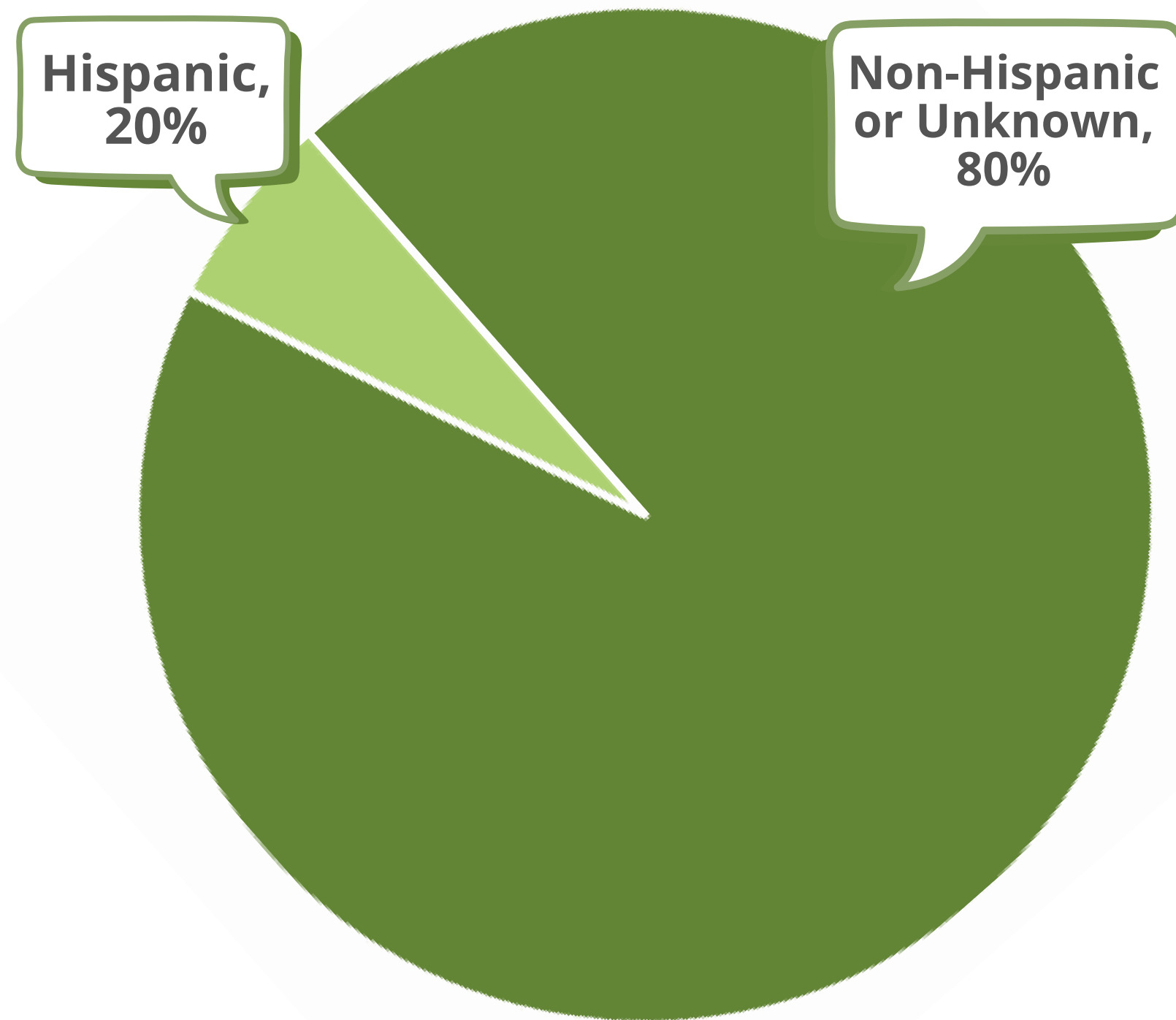


Alachua Fetal & Infant Deaths
by Race

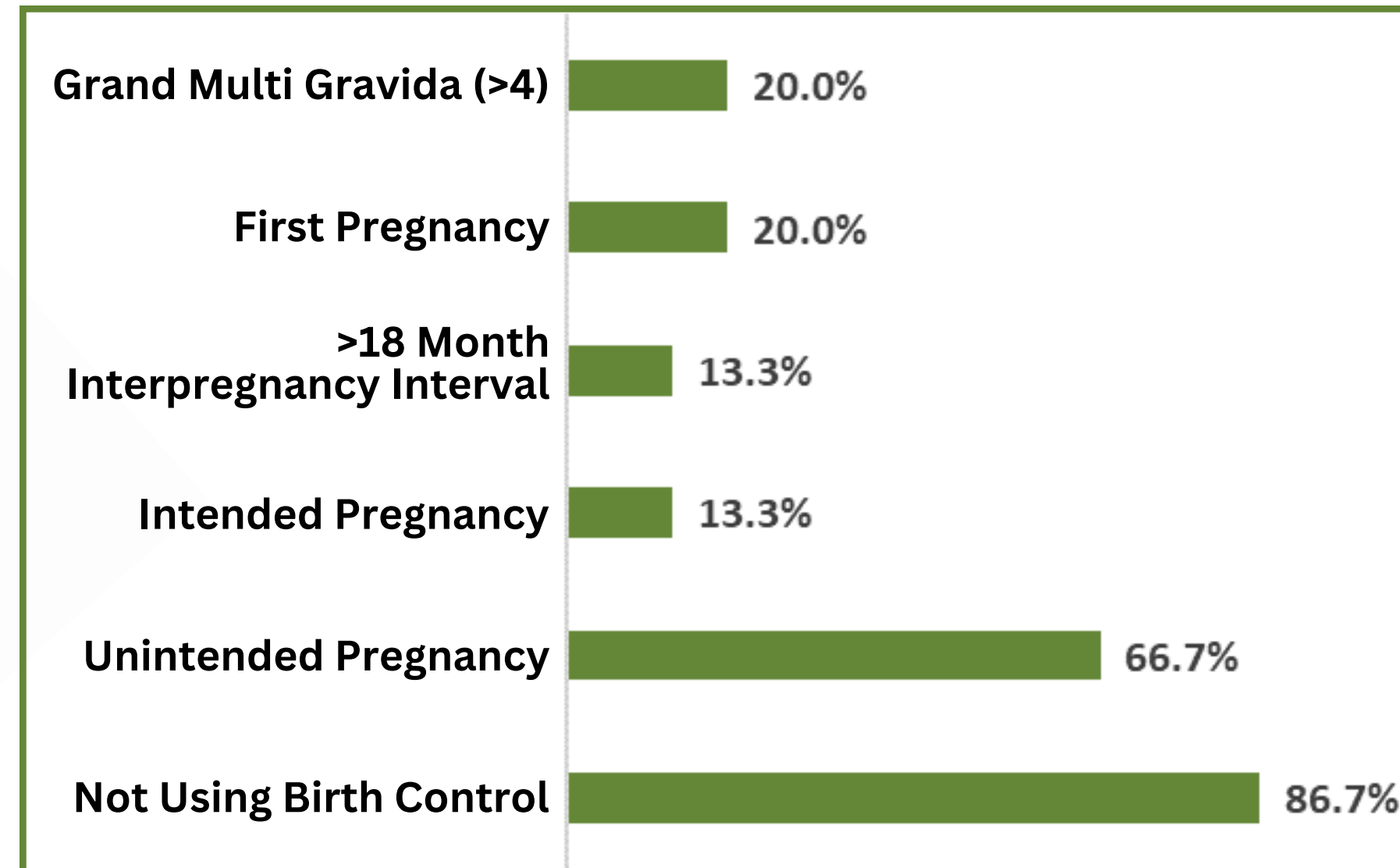

Alachua Fetal & Infant Deaths by Ethnicity



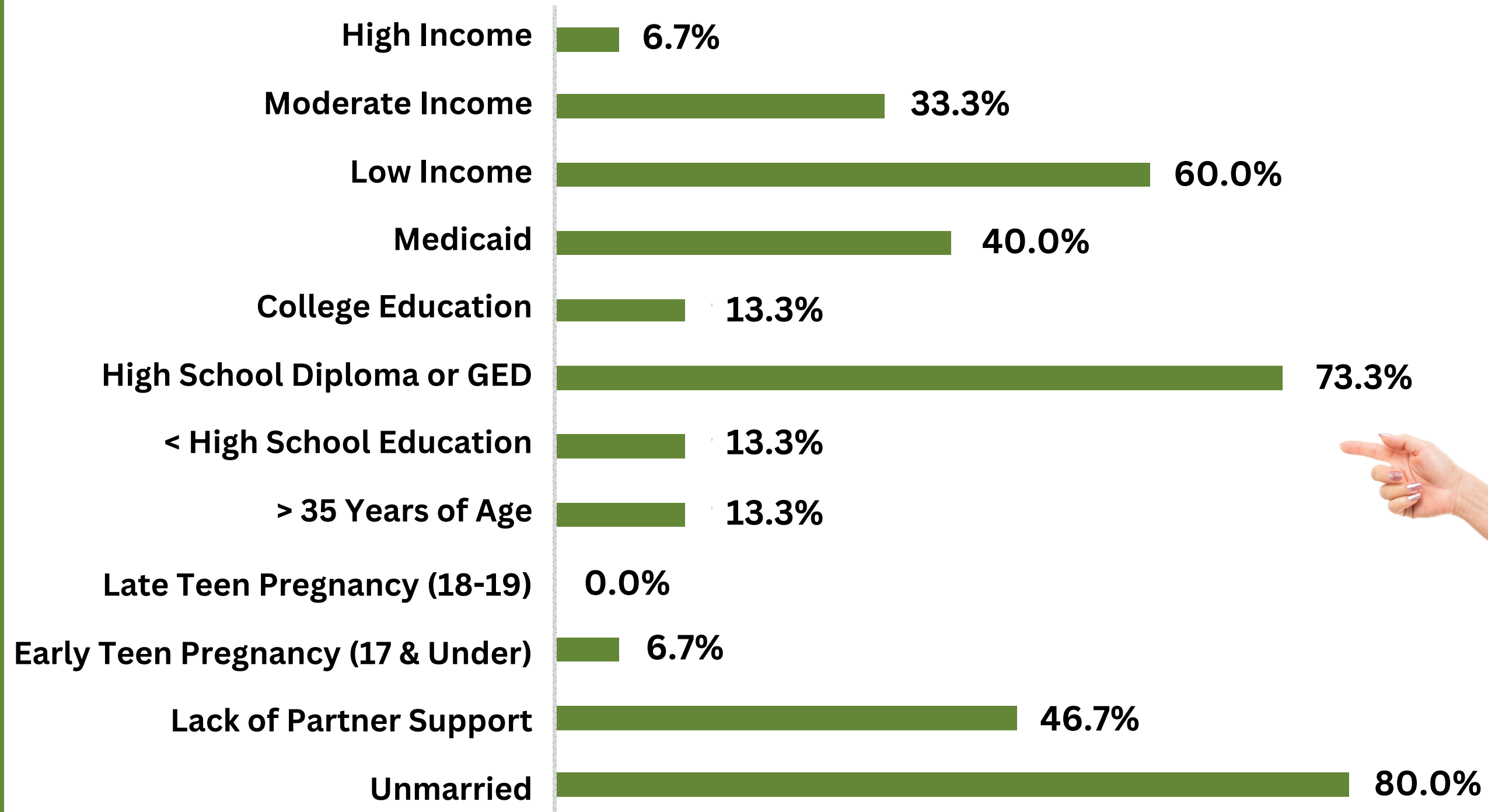

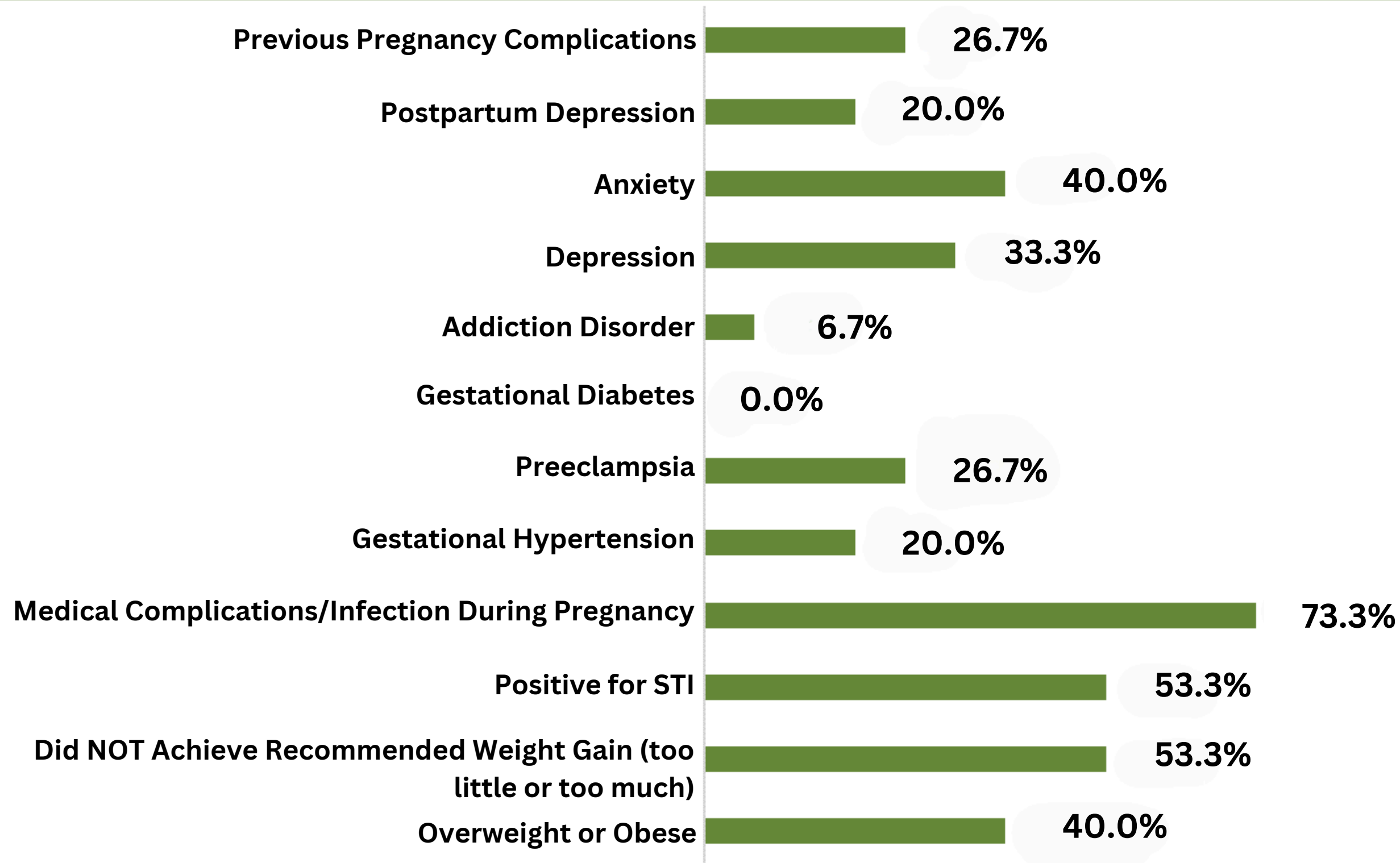
Characteristics of Childbearing Parent

Of the cases reviewed, 93.3% of them were eligible for home visiting services but were not participating.

Key Takeaways

- In 20% of the the cases reviewed, the child bearing parent smoked during the pregnancy.
- In 13.3% of the cases reviewed, the child bearing parent used marijuana during the pregnancy.
- In 62.5% of the cases reviewed, the infant was never breastfed.*
- In 26.7% of the cases reviewed, the newborn had to stay in the NICU for more than a day.
- In 25.0% of the cases reviewed, the infant was in an unsafe sleep location.*
- In 25.0% of the cases reviewed, there were objects found in the infant's sleep environment.*

*The denominator used was 8 for the number of infant deaths reviewed.

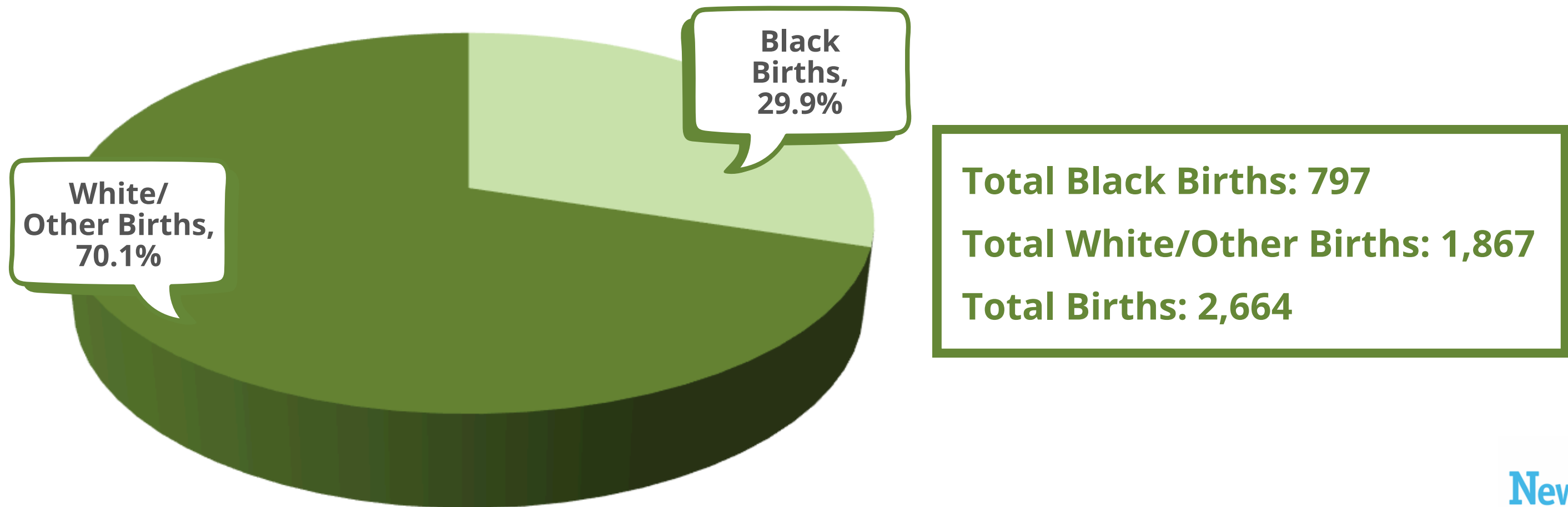

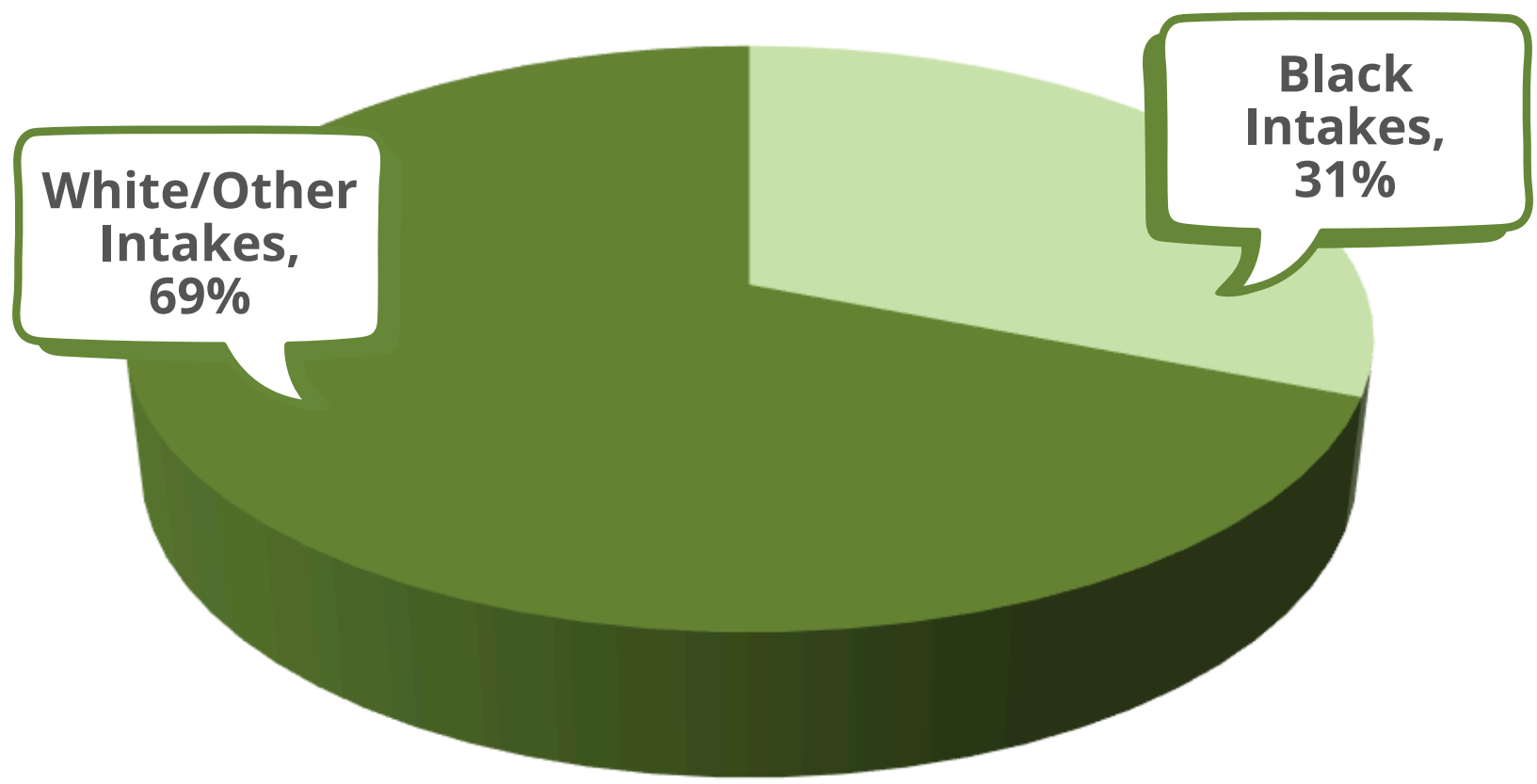

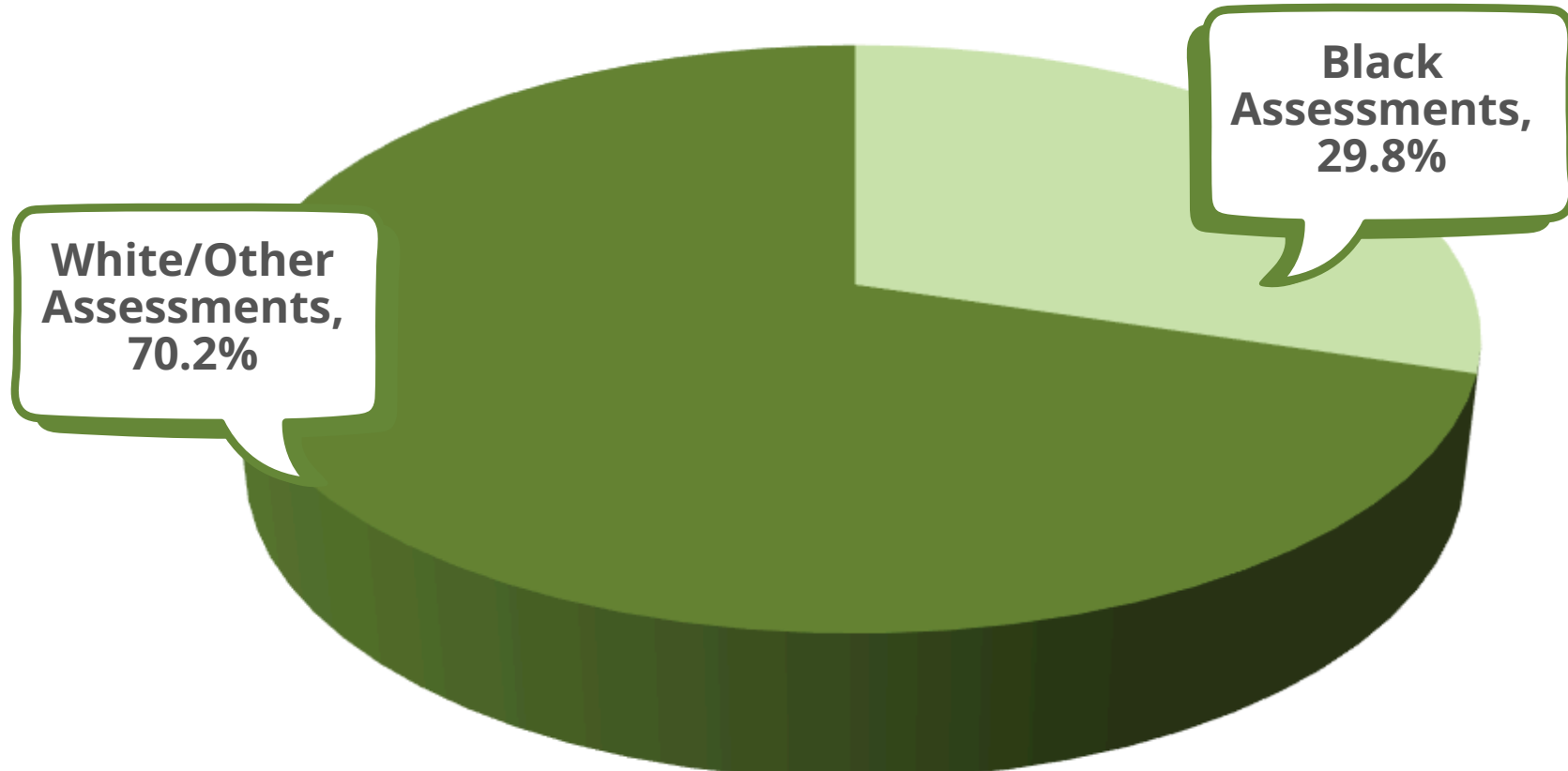
