Topic: Psilocybin Regulations 2024

Presented By: Jay Blake, Planning Manager

Informational Summary:

In November of 2020 Oregon voters approved Ballot Measure 109 known as the Psilocybin Program Initiative. The measure authorized the Oregon Health Authority to license and regulate the processing and distribution of psilocybin within the state. The measure passed in Clatsop County YES - 12,707, NO – 10,388.

In November of 2022, Clatsop County proposed a temporary moratorium for the manufacturing, processing, and distribution of psilocybin related products within unincorporated Clatsop County. The measure passed YES - 10,609, NO - 8,546.

The current moratorium will sunset on December 31, 2024. Without action, the State can issue licenses for production and distribution facilities in unincorporated Clatsop County. The Community Development Department is seeking direction from the Board of Commissioners on next steps. Staff sees three potential options:

- 1. Develop moderate Time, Place, and Manner regulations (TPM)
- 2. Develop restrictive TPM regulation
- 3. Propose a permanent moratorium to refer to Clatsop County voters
