Speakers must restrict comments to the item as it appears on the agenda and stay within a three minutes time limit. The Mayor has the discretion of limiting the total discussion time for an item.

Pursuant to Senate Bill 1100 and the City Council Norms and Procedures, any member of the public making personal, impertinent, and/or slanderous or profane remarks, or who becomes boisterous or belligerent while addressing the City Council, staff or general public, or while attending the City Council meeting and refuses to come to order at the direction of the Mayor/Presiding Officer, shall be removed from the Council Chambers or the Zoom by the sergeant-at-arms or the City Clerk and may be barred from further attendance before the Council during that meeting. Unauthorized remarks from the audience, stamping of feet, whistles, yells, and similar demonstrations shall not be permitted by the Mayor/Presiding Officer. The Mayor/Presiding Officer may direct the sergeant-at-arms to remove such offenders from the room.

WHAT IS BEING ASKED OF THE CITY COUNCIL/BOARD: The City Council is being asked to approve the designation of the City Manager as Agent to act on behalf of the City of Clearlake, a public entity under the laws of California, to provide to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for all matters pertaining to such state disaster assistance the assurances and agreements required. BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION: On September 8 th , 2024 the City of Clearlake experienced an incident known as The Boyles Fire. In order to recover costs expended by the City in various departments during the incident period and recovery phase it is necessary to apply for and manage the request to obtain financial assistance. The State of California Cal OES office is the "recipient" of federal grant funds available for this purpose and is requiring the signing of this form OES-FPD-130 prior to funds being released to the City of Clearlake who will be the "sub-recipient". This resolution, once agreed upon, will be in effect for 3 years from the date of approval for all open and future disasters/grants declared.

Cal OES Form 130 Instructions

A Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies is required of all Applicants to be eligible to receive funding. A new resolution must be submitted if a previously submitted resolution is older than three (3) years from the last date of approval, is invalid, or has not been submitted.

When completing the Cal OES Form 130, Applicants should fill in the blanks on pages 1 and 2. The blanks are to be filled in as follows:

Resolution Section:

Governing Body: This is the group responsible for appointing and approving the Authorized Agents.

Examples include: Board of Directors, City Council, Board of Supervisors, Board of Education, etc.

Name of Applicant: The public entity established under the laws of the State of California.

Examples include: School District, Office of Education, City, County or Non-profit agency that has applied for the grant, such as: City of San Diego, Sacramento County, Burbank Unified School District, Napa County Office of Education, University Southern California.

Authorized Agent: These are the individuals that are authorized by the Governing Body to engage with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services regarding grants for which they have applied. There are two ways of completing this section:

- 1. Titles Only: The titles of the Authorized Agents should be entered here, not their names. This allows the document to remain valid if an Authorized Agent leaves the position and is replaced by another individual. If "Titles Only" is the chosen method, this document must be accompanied by either a cover letter naming the Authorized Agents by name and title, or the Cal OES AA Names document. The supporting document can be completed by any authorized person within the Agency (e.g., administrative assistant, the Authorized Agent, secretary to the Director). It does not require the Governing Body's signature.
- 2. Names and Titles: If the Governing Body so chooses, the names and titles of the Authorized Agents would be listed. A new Cal OES Form 130 will be required if any of the Authorized Agents are replaced, leave the position listed on the document, or their title changes.

Checking Universal or Disaster-Specific Box: A Universal resolution is effective for all past disasters and for those declared up to three (3) years following the date of approval. Upon expiration it is no longer effective for new disasters, but it remains in effect for disasters declared prior to expiration. It remains effective until the disaster goes through closeout unless it is superseded by a newer resolution.

Governing Body Representative: These are the names and titles of the approving Board Members.

Examples include: Chairman of the Board, Director, Superintendent, etc. The names and titles **cannot** be one of the designated Authorized Agents. A minimum of three (3) approving board members must be listed. If less than three are present, meeting minutes must be attached in order to verify a quorum was met.

Certification Section:

Name and Title: This is the individual in attendance who recorded the creation and approval of this resolution.

Examples include: City Clerk, Secretary to the Board of Directors, County Clerk, etc. This person **cannot** be one of the designated Authorized Agents or Approving Board Member. If a person holds two positions (such as City Manager and Secretary to the Board) and the City Manager is to be listed as an Authorized Agent, then that person could sign the document as Secretary to the Board (not City Manager) to eliminate "Self-Certification."

WHAT IS BEING ASKED OF THE CITY COUNCIL/BOARD: The City Council is being asked to approve Resolution No. 2024-46 accepting the Oak Valley Villas Project as complete, direct staff to complete the required documents, submit all required information to the State, provide all payments and expenditures, provide the final reports and reimbursements to the State of California.				
BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:				
The City of Clearlake was awarded, through the 2017 and 2018 CDBG-DR funding as amended with County of Lake funding, a total of \$6,808,900. The City has approved one project (Danco/Oak Valley Villas) and construction a total of \$3,000,000 and the project is now complete. A total of 80 affordable units are now in place, occupied and providing housing in our community. The staff is now working with the State CDBG-DR program to complete the project, provide all required documents and make final reimbursements to the project developer.				
The City is required to accept the project as completed and provide the resolution, as provided herein, to meet these final requirements.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEARLAKE ACKNOWLEDGING THE PROJECT COMPLETION OF OAK VALLEY VILLAS, AN 80-UNIT AFFORDABLE LARGE FAMILY HOUSING COMPLEX LOCATED AT 14795 BURNS VALLEY ROAD, CLEARLAKE, CA. A PORTION OF APN NUMBERS; 010-026-290-000, 010-026-400-000, 039-481-440-000, 039-481-450-000, 039-481-570-000 AND 039-570-180-000.

WHEREAS, in response to the 2017 and 2018 wildfires, floods, and mudslides in California, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development allocated \$3,154,450.00 in Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds under Public Laws 115-254 and 116-20 to the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) to support state-wide recovery needs related to the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Major Disaster Declaration DR-4344 in October 2017 and DR-4353 in December 2017/January 2018; and

WHEREAS, from this allocation of CDBG-DR funds, HCD created the Disaster Recovery – Multifamily Housing Program (DR-MHP) and allocated up to \$6,808,900 in funds to the CITY OF CLEARLAKE as a subrecipient in their CDBG-DR Action Plan which was approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in August 2020 and as amended on May 12, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF CLEARLAKE entered into a Master Standard Agreement on June 7, 2021 with amendments on June 17, 2022 and October 24, 2022 with HCD; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF CLEARLAKE awarded Oak Valley Villas \$3,000,000 in CDBG-DR program funds on May 1, 2022 for construction related costs associated with Oak Valley Villas through a competitive Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery/Disaster Recovery – Multifamily Housing Program Notice of Funding Availability ("NOFA") released on September 7, 2021; and

WHEREAS, HCD issued the CITY OF CLEARLAKE a Notice to Proceed on May 13, 2022 for the development of the Large Family affordable housing project known as Oak Valley Villas (Project) located at 14795 Burns Valley Road, Clearlake, CA and consisting of 80 affordable units and 1 unrestricted manager's unit targeted to Large Families at or below 50% Area Median Income.

WHEREAS, the Project completed construction and was issued a Certificate of Occupancy by the City of Clearlake on December 21, 2022 and;

WHEREAS, City Council of the City of Clearlake must submit a Resolution authorizing the completion of the Oak Valley Villas project to HCD in order to comply with all of the requirements set forth in the Master Standard Agreement and Notice to Proceed and to complete the Project Closeout Checklist and submit the final financial report for

reimbursement of the remaining 10% retention of the project award.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that City Council of the City of Clearlake is hereby acknowledging the project completion of Oak Valley Villas;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Clearlake, in connection with the authorization of project completion for Oak Valley Villas, is authorized and directed to deliver a Resolution documenting project completion, and any and all other documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate to carry into effect the full intent and purpose of the above resolution, in order to evidence the City of Clearlake obligations related thereto, and HCD's security therefore; certain other documents required by the Department as security for, evidence of or pertaining to the Master Standard Agreement and Notice to Proceed, and all amendments thereto (collectively, the Oak Valley Villas CDBG-DR Grant Documents).
