The Hendry County Library Cooperative Board was called to order by Toni Couse at the Florida B. Thomas Library. A vote to accept the minutes from the August meeting was motioned by Patrick Bridwell and seconded by Carol Rushing. The motion was carried.

### **Director's Report**

• State Aid was submitted on September 30<sup>th</sup> for the first deadline. Cooperative Director is working on gathering the statistics needed for the second deadline which is December 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### **Old Business**

• Insignia Migration-this process is underway. There were a few roadblocks as it pertains to pulling reports as it has limited our circulation staff to only check ins/outs. There is of course a learning curve when it comes to learning a new software and Cooperative Director simply asks for staffs understanding and patience during this transition as we were with TLC for over 10 years. It will take time to work out all the bugs, but Director remains hopeful of the new system and looks forward to spending the additional funds that are now available to us due to the savings from changing vendors.
