Special Needs: In accordance with the provisions of the American with Disabilities Act (ADA), persons in need of a special accommodation to participate in this proceeding shall within three business days prior to any proceeding, City Hall is wheelchair accessible and accessible parking spaces are available. Quasi-Judicial Hearings: Some of the matters on the agenda may be "quasi-judicial" in nature. City Commission Members are required to disclose all ex-parte communications regarding these items and are subject to voir dire (a preliminary examination of a witness or a juror by a judge or council) by any affected party regarding those communications. All witnesses testifying will be "sworn" prior to their testimony. However, the public is permitted to comment, without being sworn. An unsworn comment will be given its appropriate weight by the City Commission.

Appeal of Decision: If a person decides to appeal any decision made by the City Commission with respect to any matter considered at this meeting, he or she will need a record of the proceeding, and for that purpose, may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceeding is made, which record includes any testimony and evidence upon which the appeal will be based.

Consent Calendar: Those matters included under the Consent Calendar are typically self-explanatory, noncontroversial, and are not expected to require review or discussion. All items will be enacted by a single motion. If discussion on an item is desired, any City Commission Member, without a motion, may "pull" or remove the item to be considered separately. If any item is quasi-judicial, it may be removed from the Consent Calendar to be heard separately, by a City Commission Member, or by any member of the public desiring it to be heard, without a motion.

Audience by watch behavior






Clewiston Golf Course Monthly Report November 2025





Plan Submittal Requirements for Special Events

Upon application for a special event permit, a site plan is required. All required distances shall be indicated on the site plan. Permits shall be obtained and all requirements completed prior to a fire inspection.

1-Temporary tents and membrane structures must comply with the individual occupancy requirements for which the tent is being used (Example: mercantile, assembly, industrial, etc.)

2-All plans must include the following general items:

- O Dates and hours of the event or usage period (must be located on the site plan or the floor plan)
- o "Certificate of Fire Resistance" for the structure
- o "Certificate of Fire Resistance" or flame spread documentation for all draperies, curtains, decorations, stage scenery, etc.
- o Provide a notarized affidavit indicating that the wiring will comply with NFPA 70 and the name and license number of the electrician installing any electrical wiring in the tent.

3-All plans must include a separate FLOOR PLAN showing all, but not limited to, the following items:

- o Locations of required number of exits, and exit capacity (width) based on occupant loads calculated by square footage.
- O Dimensions of required aisles and seating row widths shall be accordance with the provisions of aisles and shall not be less than 44 inches in width. Seating row widths shall not be less than 12 inches. Rows shall be increased by 0.3 inch for every additional seat beyond 14, but the width need not be more than 22 inches. When more than 200 loose seats or folding chairs are used they shall be bonded together in groups of three or more.
- o Locations of battery back-up exit signs. Exception: Non-illuminated exit signs may be used for events held during daylight hours only.
- o Locations of emergency lighting fixtures. Exception: Emergency lighting can be omitted for events held during daylight hours only.
- o Seating arrangements for table and chairs with distances between tables (if seating arrangements are provided).
- o Location of bleacher/grandstand and their details (if bleachers are provided).

- o Stage plan (including mobile stages) and location of egress points, including stair details, ramp details, handrail and guardrail details, etc. (if stage is provided).
- o Location of fire extinguishers (1 for each 400 sq.ft. up to 1200 sq.ft., then one for each 1000 sq.ft. thereafter).
- o Location of "NO SMOKING" signs

4-All plans must include a separate SITE PLAN including the following:

- o Location of the tent in relation to all buildings or structures, roads, parking areas, storage containers, etc. (Minimum 20' separation required).
- o Location of generator if applicable (minimum 20' from tent).
- o Fire extinguishers are to have a minimum rating of 2A:10BC and be permanently mounted on a support member.

5-All plans submitted for SPARKLER SALES must also include the following:

- o State sparkler certificate.
- o Copy of state ID of applicant.

6-All cooking operations under a tent or membrane structure must comply with NFPA 1, chapter 50.

- Open or Exposed Flame-Open Flame or other devices emitting flame, fire or heat or any flammable or combustible liquid, gas, charcoal or other cooking device or any other unapproved devices shall not be permitted inside or located within 20 feet of the tent, canopy or membrane structures while open to the public unless approved by the fire department official.
- o If approved by fire department official, cooking and heating equipment shall be vented to the outside air by approved means. Cooking and heating equipment shall not be located within 10 feet of an exit or combustible material. Outdoor cooking that produces sparks or grease-laden vapors shall be at least 20 feet from tents, canopies, and membrane structures. The warming of previously prepared food is not considered to be cooking and is exempt from these requirements.
- O Class K Portable Fire Extinguishers Concession stands or vendors with cooking operations that include deep fat fryers shall provide a Class K wet chemical extinguisher. A minimum 2A:10BC fire extinguisher shall also be provided.
- 7-All Generators and power sources-Generators and other internal combustion power sources shall be separated from tents, canopies, and temporary membrane structures by a minimum of 20 feet.

8-Fire Watch-

- o All temporary assembly tents with an occupant load of greater than 300 may be required to provide Fire Watch for the duration of the event.

Special Event: An event whether indoors or outdoors, that is held on public property or streets, non-profit organization property or non-residential private property that can reasonably be expected to cause a public gathering that is not part of the normal course of business at the location.

Carnival: A mobile enterprise principally devoted to offering amusement or entertainment to the public in, upon or by means of portable amusement rides or devices or temporary structures in any number or combination, whether or not associated with other structures or forms of public attraction.

Fair: An enterprise principally devoted to the exhibition of products of agriculture or industry in connection with the operation of amusement rides or devices, or concession booths.

- A permit is required from the Fire Department to conduct a carnival or fair. NFPA 1: 1.12
- A permit is required from the Fire Department for all tents over 200 square feet or canopies over 400 square feet in size, which are used on the premises. NFPA 1: 1.12
- A permit is required from the Fire Department to conduct a parade. NFPA 1: 1.12
- Tents and canopies described above are to be in compliance with NFPA 1, Chapter 25.
- Size and location of the carnival or fair may require fire apparatus access roads. NFPA 1: 10.16.2
- Fire extinguishers shall have a minimum rating of 2-A:10-B:C. Maximum travel distance to a portable fire extinguisher shall not exceed 75 feet. All fire extinguishers shall be serviced and tagged according to the State Fire Code. NFPA 1: 10.16.5 & 10.16.10.4
- Electrical equipment and installation shall comply with the Electrical Code, and subject to approval by the Building Department. NFPA 1: 10.16.7
- Concession stands utilized for cooking shall have a minimum of 10 feet of clearance on two sides and shall not be located within 10 feet of amusement rides or devices. NFPA 1: 10.16.8

- A "K" rated dry chemical fire extinguisher shall be provided where deep-fat fryers are used. NFPA 1: 13.6.6.7.1
- Internal combustion power sources shall have fuel tanks of adequate capacity to permit uninterrupted operation during normal operating hours. Refueling shall be conducted only when the ride is not in use. NFPA 1: 10.16.10.1 & 10.16.10.2
- Internal combustion power sources shall be isolated from contact with the public by either physical guards, fencing or an enclosure. A minimum of one fire extinguisher with a rating of not less than 2-A:10-B:C shall be provided. NFPA 1: 10.16.10.3 & 10.16.10.4 (This is in addition to the normally required fire extinguishers.)
- For reviewing stands, grandstands, bleachers and folding and telescoping seating see NFPA 1, Chapter 25.

FIRE SAFETY PERMIT APPLICATION

A Fire Safety Permit is required for any gathering that takes place on public or private property, an event whether indoors or outdoors, that is held on public property or streets, non-profit organization property or non-residential private property that can reasonably be expected to cause a public gathering that is not part of the normal course of business at the location.

The Fire Safety permit application form must be completed and submitted not less than thirty (30) days in advance of the event.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Completed application and non-refundable permit fee of \$50.00.
- 2. Site plan of the event showing all temporary installations in relation to the surroundings. The site plan must show a detailed diagram of the event including the location of concession booths, portable toilets, dumpsters, public, emergency and accessible routes, parking, banners and signs, location of tents, stages, entertainment and orientation of loudspeakers, locations for electricity and water, and other relevant information.
- 3. If your event includes construction, electrical, plumbing or mechanical work, then the work must receive a final inspection prior to the commencement of the event. If the inspection must be completed after 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, over a weekend, or on a National Holiday, then the cost of each inspection will be \$60.00 per hour per inspector (minimum 2 hours, if available). Please note that the specific contractor for the applicable inspection must be on-site at time of inspection. If not, the inspection will be cancelled.

The person or designee in charge of the event must be present at the event and remain at the location for the entire duration of the event.



Title to any parts or equipment finished by the Company under the contract shall pass to Purchaser upon payment in full. Risk of loss or damage to the Purchaser's parts or equipment shall be with the Purchaser at all times.

7. Shipping Dates

Shipping and/or completion dates are approximate and are based on prompt receipt of all necessary information and approvals from the Purchaser. Unless the Purchaser stipulates on its Purchase Order that an earlier shipment is not permissible, the Company reserves the right to ship prior to the contract shipping date.

8. Force Majeure

- a. The Company shall not be liable for failure to perform or for delay in performance due to fire, flood, strike labor issue(s), act of God, act of any governmental authority or of the Purchaser, embargo, fuel or energy shortage, car shortage, faulty castings or forgings, wrecks or delay in transportation, inability to obtain necessary labor, materials or manufacturing facilities from usual sources, unanticipated, hidden or concealed site conditions, or due to any cause beyond its reasonable control.
- b. In the event of delay in performance due to any such cause, the date of delivery or time for completion will be extended by a period of time reasonably necessary to overcome the effect of such delay. AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between the City of Clewiston (hereinafter called OWNER) and Hannula Landscaping and irrigation, Inc. (hereinafter called CONTRACTOR).

OWNER and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - WORK

1.01 CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows

US 27 / Sugarland Highway Phase Six Beautification Project

ARTICLE 2 - THE PROJECT

2.01 The Project for which the Work under the Contract Documents may be the whole or only a part is generally described as follows:

Phase Six

ARTICLE 3 – LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT

3.01 The Project has been designed by JEFFEREY NAGLE, JOHNSON ENGINEERING, INC., who is hereinafter called LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT and who is to act as OWNER's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities, and have the rights and authority assigned to ENGINEER in the Contract Documents in connection with the completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 4 - CONTRACT TIMES

- 4.01 Time of the Essence
- A. All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract.
- 4.02 Days to Achieve Substantial Completion and Final Payment
- A. The Work will be substantially completed within ninety (90) calendar days after the date when the Contract Times commence to run as provided in paragraph 2.03 of the General Conditions, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with paragraph 14.07 of the General Conditions within one hundred eighty (180) calendar days after the date when the Contract Times commence to run.

4.03 Liquidated Damages

A. CONTRACTOR and OWNER recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that OWNER will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the times specified in paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with Article 12 of the General Conditions. The parties also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration proceeding the actual loss suffered by OWNER if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, OWNER and CONTRACTOR agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty), CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNERS \$500.00 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for Substantial Completion until the Work is substantially complete. After Substantial Completion, if CONTRACTOR shall neglect, refuse, or fail to complete the remaining Work within the Contract Time or any proper extension thereof granted by OWNER, CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER \$500.00 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for completion and readiness for final payment until the Work is completed and ready for final payment.

ARTICLE 5 - CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 OWNER shall pay CONTRACTOR for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents an amount in current funds equal to the sum of the amounts determined pursuant to paragraphs below:
 - A. This Section Not Used.
- B. For all Unit Price Work, an amount equal to the sum of the established unit price for each separately identified item of Unit Price Work times the estimated quantity of that item as indicated in this paragraph:

ARTICLE 6 - PAYMENT PROCEDURES

6.01 Submittal and Processing of Payments

A. CONTRACTOR shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with Article 14 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by ENGINEER as provided in the General Conditions.

6.02 Progress Payments; Retainage

- A. OWNER shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of CONTRACTOR's Applications for Payment on or about the 25th day of each month during performance of the Work as provided in paragraphs 6.02.A.1 and 6.02.A.2 below. All such payments will be measured by the schedule of values established in paragraph 2.07.A of the General Conditions (and in the case of Unit Price Work based on the number of units completed) or, in the event there is no schedule of values, as provided in the General Requirements:
 - 1. Prior to Substantial Completion, progress payments will be made in an amount equal to the percentage indicated below but, in each case, less the aggregate of payments previously made and less such amounts as ENGINEER may determine or OWNER may withhold, in accordance with paragraph 14.02 of the General Conditions:
 - a. 90% of Work completed (with the balance being retainage) as determined by the ENGINEER, and if the charter and progress of the Work have been satisfactory to OWNER and ENGINEER.
 - b. 90% of cost of the Products not incorporated in the Work (with the balance being retainage).
 - 2. Upon Substantial Completion, OWNER shall pay an amount sufficient to increase total payments to CONTRACTOR to 95% of the Work completed, less such amounts as ENGINEER shall determine in accordance with paragraph 14.02.B.5 of the General Conditions and less 100% of ENGINEER's estimate of the value of Work to be completed or corrected as shown on the tentative list of items to be completed or corrected attached to the certificate of Substantial Completion.

6.03 Final Payment

A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with paragraph 14.07 of the General Conditions, OWNER shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by ENGINEER as provided in said paragraph 14.07.

ARTICLE 7 - INTEREST

7.01 All moneys not paid when due as provided in Article 14 of the General Conditions shall bear interest at the rate of 0.00% per annum.

ARTICLE 8 - CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 8.01 In order to induce OWNER to enter into this Agreement CONTRACTOR makes the following representations:
- A. CONTRACTOR has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents and the other related data identified in the Bidding Documents.

- B. CONTRACTOR has visited the Site and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. CONTRACTOR is familiar with and is satisfied as to all federal, state, and local Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- D. CONTRACTOR has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or contiguous to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions in or relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at or contiguous to the Site (except Underground Facilities) which have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions as provided in paragraph 4.02 of the General Conditions and (2) reports and drawings of a Hazardous Environmental Condition, if any, at the Site which has been identified in the Supplementary Conditions as provided in paragraph 4.06 of the General Conditions.
- E. CONTRACTOR has obtained and carefully studied (or assumes responsibility for having done so) all additional or supplementary examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, and data concerning conditions (surface, subsurface, and Underground Facilities) at or contiguous to the Site which may affect cost, progress, or performance of the Work or which relate to any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by CONTRACTOR, including applying the specific means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction, if any, expressly required by the Contract Documents to be employed by CONTRACTOR, and safety precautions and programs incident thereto
- F. CONTRACTOR does not consider that any further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
- G. CONTRACTOR is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by OWNER and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- H. CONTRACTOR has correlated the information known to CONTRACTOR, information and observations obtained from visits to the Site, reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, and all additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, and data with the Contract Documents.
- I. CONTRACTOR has given ENGINEER written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that CONTRACTOR has discovered in the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by ENGINEER is acceptable to CONTRACTOR.
- J. The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.

 - C. There are no Contract Documents other than those listed above in this Article 9.

10.01 Terms

10.02 Assignment of Contract

A. No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, moneys that may become due and moneys that are due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

10.03 Successors and Assigns

A. OWNER and CONTRACTOR each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

10.04 Severability

A. Any provision or part of the Contract Documents held to be void or unenforceable under any Law or Regulation shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon OWNER and CONTRACTOR, who agree that the Contract Documents shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT ("First Amendment") is made effective as of this 15th day of December, 2025 (the "Effective Date") by and between CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida ("Lessor"), and CLEWISTON COUNTRY CLUB, INC., a Florida corporation ("Lessee").

RECITALS

- 1. Lessor and Lessee entered into that certain Lease Agreement (the "Lease Agreement") having an effective date of January 1, 2026, for certain property and improvements located at 1200 San Luiz Ave, Clewiston, Florida 33440 (the "Premises").
- 2. Lessor and Lessee desire to enter into this First Amendment for the purpose of specifying maintenance obligations of the Lessor and Lessee, and for other purposes set forth herein.

TERMS

NOW, THEREFORE, for Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and for the covenants and conditions of, at its expense, this First Amendment, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Landlord and Tenant agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The above recitals are true and correct and are agreed to by Landlord and Tenant as if such recitals were fully set forth herein.
- 2. <u>Terms</u>. All undefined capitalized terms herein shall have the same meanings as defined in the Lease.
- 3. Section 8 of the Lease is hereby amended as follows:

"Lessor shall be responsible for, and shall make in a timely manner, all necessary repairs to and perform routine care and maintenance on all areas, fixtures, and equipment on the exterior of the building(s) located on the Property. Such areas, fixtures, and equipment shall include the lawn, roof, exterior walls, gutters, sprinkler and irrigation system, exterior plumbing, exterior electric, air conditioning units, and any other areas and fixtures on the exterior of the building.

Lessee shall be responsible for, and shall make in a timely manner, all necessary repairs to and perform routine care and maintenance on all areas, fixtures, and equipment in the interior of the building(s) located on the Property. Such areas, fixtures, and equipment shall include interior plumbing, interior electric, interior ceilings, interior walls, doors, machinery and other equipment located within the interior of the building(s) located on the Property. WHEREAS, an extension to the Agreement is needed to provide additional time to complete the Project; and,

WHEREAS, other changes to the Agreement are necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to amend the Agreement as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

6. The following Section is hereby added to Attachment 2:

Financial Assistance and Payment of Invoices to Rural Communities or Rural Areas of Opportunity In the event that this Agreement facilitates the provision of federal or state financial assistance to a county or municipality classified as a rural community or rural area of opportunity, as defined in Section 288.0656(2), Department is authorized, in accordance with section 215.971, F.S., to process the payment of invoices to such county or municipality.

- Such payments shall be made for verified and eligible performance that has been completed in accordance with the terms and conditions stipulated in this Agreement.
- 7. Attachment 3, Grant Work Plan, is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with Attachment 3-1, Revised Grant Work Plan, as attached to this Amendment and hereby incorporated into the Agreement. All references in the Agreement to Attachment 3 shall hereinafter refer to Attachment 3-1, Revised Grant Work Plan.
- 8. Attachment 5, Special Audit Requirements, is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with Attachment 5-1, Revised Special Audit Requirements, attached hereto and made a part of the Agreement. All references in the Agreement to Attachment 5, shall hereinafter refer to Attachment 5-1, Revised Special Audit Requirements.
- 9. Exhibit A, Progress Report Form, is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with Exhibit A-1, attached hereto and made a part of the Agreement. All references in the Agreement to Exhibit A shall hereinafter refer to Exhibit A-1.
- 10. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in effect. If and to the extent that any inconsistency may appear between the Agreement and this Amendment, the provisions of this Amendment shall control.

ATTACHMENT 3-1 REVISED GRANT WORK PLAN

PROJECT TITLE: Clewiston Water System Infrastructure Improvements

PROJECT LOCATION: The Project will be located in the City of Clewiston within Hendry County; Lat/Long (26.75401, -80.96014).

PROJECT BACKGROUND: Hendry County and the City of Clewiston (Grantee) have been collaboratively planning the extension of City provided public utility services to the areas contiguous to the western boundary of the city. The Grantee commissioned an analysis by a third-party engineering firm to determine the need and scope of a potable water main extension. Their recommendation is to extend the current city potable water line to a county owned 0.5 million gallon a day water storage tank located at the airport. The water main extension will be adjacent to the right-of-way boundary of U.S. Highway 27. This will improve the water distribution needs to areas west of the current city limits, meet anticipated water flow demands, and fire protection requirements.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Grantee will complete preconstruction activities and construct approximately 13,000 linear feet of water main from a city potable water supply connection point to the intersection of Lewis Boulevard and US-27 and install fire hydrants for fire protection enhancement.

TASKS: All documentation should be submitted electronically unless otherwise indicated and should be submitted prior to the expiration of the grant agreement.

Task 1: Preconstruction Activities

Deliverables: The Grantee will complete the design of Clewiston Water System Infrastructure Improvements project and obtain all necessary permits for construction of the project. Activities necessary for design, such as surveys, geotechnical evaluations, pre-design studies, and environmental assessments are eligible under this task.

Documentation: The Grantee will submit a signed summary of activities completed for the period of work covered in the payment request, including the percentage of design complete and permitting status, using the format provided by the Department's Grant Manager. Upon request by the Department's Grant Manager, the Grantee will provide additional supporting documentation relating to this task.

For the final documentation, the Grantee will also submit a copy of the design completed with the funding provided for this task, a list of all required permits identifying issue dates and issuing authorities, and copies of any surveys, assessments, or other documents funded under this task.

Performance Standard: The Department's Grant Manager will review the documentation to verify that the deliverables have been completed as described above. Upon review and written acceptance by the Department's Grant Manager, a payment request may be processed.

Payment Request Schedule: The Grantee may submit a payment request for cost reimbursement no more frequently than monthly.

Task 2: Bidding and Contractor Selection

Deliverables: The Grantee will prepare a bid package, publish a public notice, solicit bids, conduct pre-bid meetings, and respond to bid questions in accordance with the Grantee's procurement process, to select one or more qualified and licensed contractors to complete construction of the project.

Documentation: The Grantee will submit: 1) the public notice of advertisement for the bid; 2) the bid package; and 3) written notice of selected contractor(s).

Performance Standard: The Department's Grant Manager will review the documentation to verify that the deliverables have been completed as described above. Upon review and written acceptance by the Department's Grant Manager, a payment request may be processed.

Payment Request Schedule: The Grantee may submit a payment request for cost reimbursement following the conclusion of the task.

Task 3: Project Management

Deliverables: The Grantee will perform project management related to the Clewiston Water System Infrastructure Improvements project, to include field engineering services, construction observation and inspections, site meetings with construction contractor(s) and design professionals, and overall construction coordination and supervision.

Documentation: The Grantee will submit a signed summary of activities completed for the period of work covered in the payment request, using the format provided by the Department's Grant Manager. Upon request by the Department's Grant Manager, the Grantee will provide additional supporting documentation relating to this task.

Performance Standard: The Department's Grant Manager will review the documentation to verify that the deliverables have been completed as described above. Upon review and written acceptance by the Department's Grant Manager, a payment request may be processed.

Payment Request Schedule: The Grantee may submit a payment request for cost reimbursement no more frequently than monthly.

Task 4: Construction

Deliverables: The Grantee will construct the Clewiston Water System Infrastructure Improvements project in accordance with the final design.

Documentation: The Grantee will submit a signed summary of activities completed for the period of work covered in the payment request, using the format provided by the Department's Grant Manager. Upon request by the Department's Grant Manager, the Grantee will provide additional supporting documentation relating to this task.

Performance Standard: The Department's Grant Manager will review the documentation to verify that the deliverables have been completed as described above. Upon review and written acceptance by the Department's Grant Manager, a payment request may be processed.

Payment Request Schedule: The Grantee may submit a payment request for cost reimbursement no more frequently than monthly.

Task 5: Land Acquisition

Deliverables: The Grantee will acquire fee simple or less-than-fee simple interest on properties within the Airglades International Airport and the U.S. 27 Highway project area. Costs related to pre-acquisition and acquisition will be reimbursable. The property interests will be held by the Grantee.

Documentation: The Grantee will submit: 1) copies of all appraisals; 2) the closing statement or all closing documents; 3) title exam/insurance; 4) property survey; 5) boundary map; and 6) the deed, recorded easement, or property interest.

Performance Standard: The Department's Grant Manager will review the documentation to verify that the deliverables have been completed as described above. Upon review and written acceptance by the Department's Grant Manager, a payment request may be processed.

Payment Request Schedule: The Grantee may submit a payment request for cost reimbursement at the conclusion of the task.

DIRECT PAYMENT:

For those grant agreements for which direct payment is approved, the reference to "payment" in the Payment Request Schedules shall mean submittal of invoice(s), and the Grantee shall submit invoice documentation with each payment request. Proof of payment must be submitted prior to each subsequent payment request and no later than sixty (60) calendar days following the final payment request.

PROJECT TIMELINE & BUDGET DETAIL: The tasks must be completed by the corresponding task end date. Cost reimbursable grant funding must not exceed the budget amounts as indicated below.

Note that, per Section 8 of Attachment 1 of the Agreement, authorization for continuation and completion of work and any associated payments may be rescinded, with proper notice, at the discretion of the Department if the Legislature reduces or eliminates appropriations. 

All field use is by permit only unless an exception is made by the Director of Recreation & Leisure Services. Coaches are responsible for leaving fields, dugouts, and spectators' areas clean. Extra field maintenance for any play, tournament, or special event is considered a "billable" event. It is the responsibility of the user group to maintain a clean and safe concession. The Director of Recreation & Leisure Services is to be notified of all accidents/incidents requiring medical attention. The soil must be firm and free of obstacles that could cause personal injury or field damage before play begins. Water can be broom-dried to remove puddles from infield to expedite play.

- All persons, if given permission to use a field, will abide by all and any directives from the City of Clewiston & Parks and Recreation Personnel.
- All teams and individuals given permission to use a field assume all responsibility regarding injury and/or accident and all liabilities, as per insurance requirements listed on Page 1 & 3.
- Permits must be kept with team while using field at all times.
- Teams and individuals given permission to use a field must use the field assigned.
- No exchanging field permits with another team or individual is allowed.

Rainouts Rescheduling Procedures

If you are rained out on a given night, you must contact Parks & Recreation Department within 24 hours or the next business day in order to receive a raindate. It will be added to your schedule accordingly. All attempts to schedule your rain-date for the earliest possible time will be made.

FMPA provides a multitude of services to its members, including operation of joint purchasing projects to assist members in competitively purchasing and procuring goods and services for electrical and public works projects.

City staff wishes to amend the Purchasing Procedures within the City's code to specifically and explicitly allow the City to participate in FMPA's joint purchasing projects, provided that the competitive process used by FMPA to secure such goods and services is compliant with the City's current purchasing procedures.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-09

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA AMENDING THE CLEWISTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION; AMENDING ARTICLE III, PURCHASING PROCEDURES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Clewiston is a member of the Florida Municipal Power Agency ("FMPA"), a separate governmental entity created under Florida law; and

WHEREAS, FMPA operates a joint purchasing project to assist its members in competitively purchasing and procuring goods and services; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Clewiston to clarify the ability for the City, as a member of FMPA, to avail itself of the opportunities and benefits provided by FMPA through their competitive purchasing and procurement process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1: Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and hereby made a part of this Ordinance and adopted as legislative findings.

Section 2: Amendment to the City Code. Chapter 2, Administration, Article III – Purchasing Procedures, of the City of Clewiston Code is hereby amended with the following provisions with additions depicted as <u>underlined</u> language, deletions as strikethrough, and editorial content in [bracketed italics]:

ARTICLE III. – PURCHASING PROCEDURES

Sec. 2-79. Purchasing methods/competitive bidding.

- (a) The provisions contained in F.S. § 287.055 (commonly known as the Consultant's Competitive Negotiation Act, "CCNA"), shall apply herein for the procurement of all architecture, professional engineering, landscape architecture, or registered surveying and mapping services for projects that exceed the specified statutory dollar thresholds. For projects that are less than the CCNA statutory thresholds, county staff may utilize any process they deem most appropriate, including contacting only one firm and entering into a written contract or issuing a purchase order with the firm, subject to the approval of the city commission.
- (b) Auditing services. Auditing services shall be procured in accordance with F.S. § 218.391.

(c) Emergency procurement.

- (1) In the case of emergencies that require the immediate purchase of commodities, equipment or services, the city manager shall be empowered to secure such commodities, equipment or services without competitive bidding or quotes. In this event, all measures that are reasonably possible under the circumstances shall be taken to assure the maximum cost benefit to the city of the commodities, equipment or services procured.
- (2) During a declared local state of emergency, the person or persons designated in the declaration is (are) empowered to purchase commodities, equipment or services without competitive bidding.

(d) Cooperative procurement.

- (1) The city may cooperate with other government agencies and governmental associations in the purchase of commodities, equipment and services.
- (2) When any other government agency or governmental association has competitively procured and awarded a contract for commodities, equipment or services, the city may purchase a commodity, equipment or service from the awarded vendor at the awarded price if the original bid specifications and award allow it and if the competitive procurement was conducted within the past three years. Such purchases shall be made without competitive procurement by the city and without any dollar limit provided that funding has been appropriated and approved by the city commission. Cooperative procurement is not permitted for construction services or professional services as described in the CCNA.
- (3) The City is a member of Florida Municipal Power Agency ("FMPA"), a separate governmental entity created pursuant to Florida law. FMPA operates a joint purchasing project and otherwise frequently competitively procures goods and services for itself and its members that own and operate electric utility systems. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, it is hereby expressly declared that the City may piggyback or otherwise obtain goods and services from FMPA, or contractually engage with FMPA to obtain goods and services through FMPA's vendors, suppliers, consultants, professionals, etc., where FMPA has conducted a competitive procurement process, including a competitive process meeting the requirements of CCNA, and is otherwise substantially in compliance with the requirements set forth herein.
- (e) Sole source. A contract may be awarded, except as otherwise provided for under state law, for a supply, service, material, equipment or construction item(s) without competition when the city manager certifies in writing, after conducting a good-faith review of available sources, that there is only one legally available source for the required supply, service, material, equipment or construction item(s).
- (f) Single source. A contract may be awarded, except as otherwise provided for under state law, for a supply, service, material, equipment or construction item(s) without competition when the city manager certifies in writing after conducting a good faith

review of available resources, that there is only one economically feasible source for the purchase in order to meet functional or performance requirements.

- (g) Requests for proposals.
 - (1) The request for proposals method of procurement is used when it is not practicable to specifically define the commodities or contractual services which are needed. The city can describe the project but the methods or means to accomplish the desired outcome cannot be easily defined. There may be several methods available to accomplish a task, and the city is considering all the available options.
 - (2) The city manager, in consultation with staff from other departments with expertise, shall outline needs and objectives that will make up the scope of services to be addressed by the proposers.
 - (3) Proposers shall be ranked by a selection committee and presentation may be made to the selection committee and/or the commission.
- (h) Requests for qualifications. The request for qualifications method of procurement is used in the recruitment of qualified professional services or construction management services.
 - (1) The city manager shall outline specific needs and objectives that will make up the scope of services to be addressed by the proposers. The purchasing manager shall prepare the criteria and develop the request for qualifications.
 - (2) Proposers shall be ranked by a selection committee and presentations may be made to the selection committee and/or commission for consideration.
- (i) Invitation to bid. The invitation to bid method of procurement should be utilized when the city is capable of establishing precise specifications for a commodity or defining with specificity a scope of services for the commodities or contractual services sought. Through this process, vendors are able to compete on a cost basis for like items or services. The selection will be based upon the lowest priced responsible and responsive bidder and the factors in section 2-80.
- (j) Invitation to negotiate. The invitation to negotiate method of procurement should be utilized when the scope of a project is not clearly defined and the city has determined that negotiations may be necessary to receive the best value. The invitation shall invite vendor input on the scope, schedule, and process for initiating the project. This method of procurement may be used in areas experiencing constant change in the marketplace and the city wants the opportunity to obtain current, up-to-date goods or services at the time of contracting.
- (k) Recent city competitive procurements. The city may contract for commodities and equipment with the selected vendor under a previous city competitive procurement if the competitive procurement was conducted within the past three years.
- (I) Professional services. Professional services may be acquired by an alternate process approved by the commission, in compliance with the purchasing thresholds provided in section 2-78.

Section 3: <u>Codification</u>. This Ordinance shall be incorporated into the City of Clewiston Land Development Code. The sections of this Ordinance can be renumbered or relettered to the appropriate word or phrase to accomplish codification. Omissions grammatical, and typographical errors, as well as clarifications of ambiguous wording that do not affect the intent of this Ordinance, may be authorized by the Mayor without need for a public hearing.

Section 4: <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this resolution is declared invalid or unenforceable for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this resolution, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5: Conflicts. The provisions of this article shall supersede any provisions of existing ordinances in conflict herewith to the extent of said conflict.

Section 6: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Commission.
