Johnny Diamond Park



Who was John Diamond?

Pioneer Settler:

John Diamond was an Irish immigrant who settled in the Coburg area in 1847.

Diamond Lake & Diamond Peak



He is also known for seeing Diamond Lake in 1852 and for the associated Diamond Peak, both of which are named in his honor.

Immigration Route:

John Diamond was part of a group that helped open an immigration route from the Middle Fork of the Willamette River to Idaho.

How is he associated with Coburg?

City Founder: John Diamond was one of the founders of Coburg in 1847.

Original Name: The city was originally named Diamond after him, but it later changed to Coburg after a beautiful stallion named Coburg that was brought in from the Coburg District of Bavaria Germany.
