CALL TO ORDER

Chair, Marissa Doyle called the meeting of the Coburg Heritage Committee to order at 6:01 pm.

SPECIAL GUESTS – Coburg Community Foundation

The Coburg Community Foundation guests, Jeanne Schapper and Nanci McKibben, said that believe to have a common initiative as the Heritage Committee. They mentioned that they've done a few interviews, and they have a grant for that project, so they proposed the idea of combining resources with the committee to continue this project and get more oral history on Coburg.

The committee liked the idea of collaborating on this project, however Ms. Winner stated that they are still in the very early stages and have not conducted any interviews yet. The committee also received the CLG grant for Historic Districts, and Ms. Winner does not know exactly how those would interact. One of the committee's ideas was to document as much of Ronald Spores

stories as possible, and also to do a narrated walking tour of Coburg to accompany other Coburg maps and brochures that are already available.

The committee and the community foundation agreed on having the audio recordings and stories available for the public to access and listen to. Ms. McKibben did mention that they would want to do this fairly quickly, before they lose a generation filled with knowledge and stories. They brainstormed some ideas for this process.

- 1. Seek CLG funding for projects including oral history documentation and continuation of the historic preservation award plaques
- 2. Community presentations and engagement such as guest speakers
- 3. Inventory and store existing artifacts (boxes at City Hall)
- 4. Conduct community survey to gauge attitudes and interests related to historic preservation
- 5. Review of and recommendations for Ordinance A-226 which establishes the Heritage Committee
- 6. Research other historic preservation codes and regulations
- 7. Collaborate with Coburg Community Charter School about Coburg Heritage
- 8. Increase committee involvement in CLG Network and training opportunities
