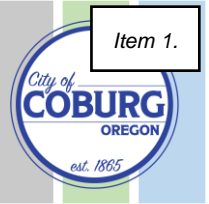

# Public Safety Support Fee

INFORMATIONAL FAQ



## 1 WHAT NEW FEE IS CITY COUNCIL CONSIDERING?

The City is considering a \$20 per month fee dedicated to supporting the existing public safety services currently provided by the City for the community of Coburg.

## 2 HOW DOES THIS FEE SUPPORT PUBLIC SAFETY IN COBURG?

The proposed dedicated fee would provide approximately \$200,000 of new revenue per year and would support approximately 20% of the total annual budget of the Coburg Police Department and Municipal Court, the City's two primary public safety services.

Coburg Rural Fire District serves Coburg and the surrounding areas with its own service district and dedicated property tax assessment and is not a part of the City of Coburg's budget.

## 3 WHEN WILL COUNCIL BE DECIDING ON THIS?

Council was presented a set of recommendations on revenue options at its December 9, 2025 meeting and will be presented with an ordinance creating the fee at its March 10, 2026 meeting. If approved, the fee amount will be set at the April 14, 2026 Council meeting with an effective date of July 1, 2026.

## 4 DON'T PROPERTY TAXES PAY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY?

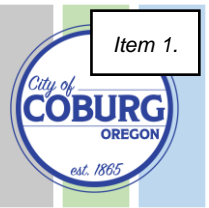
Yes, partially. The City of Coburg portion of property tax assessments (approx. 25% of the total property tax bill) provides just over \$1 million of revenue of the City's \$2 million annual General Fund. The General Fund includes Police, Municipal Court, Planning & Building, Parks and Administration/Finance. A summary of the General Fund is attached.

## 5 WHAT OTHER OPTIONS DID THE COUNCIL CONSIDER?

A Revenue Options Sub-committee studied a range of general fund revenue options including a Local Options Levy (five-year property tax assessment) and determined that the proposed service fee provides the minimum necessary revenue to maintain operations and serves as a bridge to potential longer-term solutions available at the completion of the City's Urban Renewal Agency

## 6 HAS COUNCIL AND STAFF CONSIDERED OR IMPLEMENTED COST REDUCTIONS?

Yes, Coburg Police Department staffing levels were reduced last year by one patrol officer and one-half (.50) of a Police Evidence/Property Technician, which represented a significant reduction in overall staffing from 5.0 to 3.5 total staff. Chief Larson has also initiated a number of innovative regional efforts for enhanced collaboration and cost sharing (training, certification, purchasing, technology, etc) among six small city police agencies in Lane County.

## 7 WHY AREN'T THE COST REDUCTIONS ENOUGH?

Coburg, like many cities in the region and around the State, is experiencing what is often called a “structural deficit”. This means that revenues in the general fund (separate from the water fund, street fund and sewer fund) rise each year approximately three to five percent (3%-5%) while expenses increase by approximately ten to fifteen percent (10%-15%) each year, a five to ten percent (5%-10%) annual deficit that is unsustainable over the long-term without drastic reductions in the core services that the City provides to the community or new revenues to maintain existing service levels.

## 8 WILL THIS FEE AMOUNT GO UP EVERY YEAR?

The fee will be reviewed each year in parallel with the development of the annual budget. The fee cannot be increased without a formal action of Council.

## 9 HOW DO I GET MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THIS PROPOSED FEE?

The City’s website [www.coburgoregon.gov](http://www.coburgoregon.gov) will have a page dedicated to this proposed fee, including the full set of recommendations of the Revenue Options Council Sub-Committee and the draft ordinance and resolution that will be presented for Council review, deliberation and decision.

Mayor Bell and the City Administrator will continue holding Town Hall format meetings for community members to attend, learn about the issues, ask questions and provide feedback. Dates and times will be posted at City Hall, Coburg Post Office, City website social media.

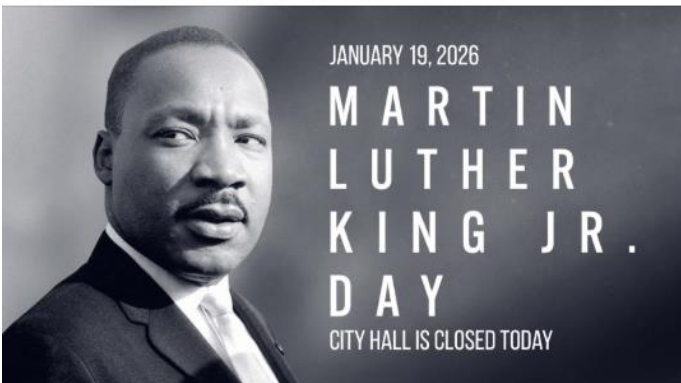
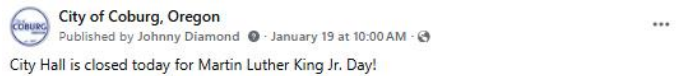

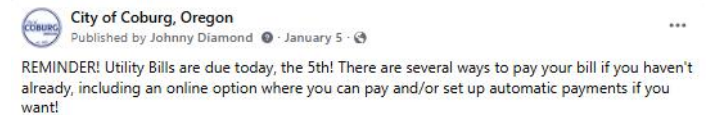

# 2026 Utility Rate Adjustments

## Coburg Utility & City Service Fees

At its January meeting, the Coburg City Council unanimously approved adjustments to the current water, sewer and transportation utility fees (TUF), in order to maintain necessary funding levels for increased operations, maintenance and capital costs to the community’s utility systems.

Utility rates will be increasing on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026, which will reflect on the May bill.

### **What will this mean for my bill?**

The April rate increase includes a 3.4% water rate increase, a 6.4% wastewater rate increase, and a 3.4% transportation utility fee (TUF) increase. For a typical, low to moderate water use residential customer, the total increase amounts to just over eight dollars (\$8.35).

City Council and Staff are fully aware of the increasing costs Coburg utility customers experience in their household and business budgets. Municipal services are impacted by these same economic conditions and the price (rates) charged for City utility services must be adjusted to maintain, repair and improve/replace the community’s utility systems.

Each utility the City owns and operates for the community is managed as a separate “business unit” with revenues and expenses for each (water, sewer, streets) independently tracked and not able to be moved from one to the other.

Property taxes do not fund utility operations as they are legally required to fund general services like Public Safety (police), Parks, Planning & Building, Municipal Court, Finance

Both Council and City staff place a high priority on meeting and exceeding both regulatory requirements and the community’s expectations in the following:

- Producing and delivering clean water to the community
- Collecting, treating and safely returning wastewater to the environment
- Maintaining a safe pedestrian and vehicle transportation system (streets, sidewalks and storm drainage)

# Proposed Revenue Enhancements

## Parks, Open Spaces and Street Tree Fees

The Coburg City Council recently conducted a review of potential new revenue options to address rising operational costs to maintain existing levels of service across all of the City’s operations and programs.

**Phase One** of the review resulted in rate adjustments for the water, wastewater and transportation (streets) utilities. These rate increases are critical in stabilizing the fund balances that ensure the ability to maintain, repair and improve the infrastructure of each of the three utilities now and into the future. *See back for February 2025 utility rate adjustment information.*

**Phase Two** of the review has recently been completed and focused on services and programs in the City’s General Fund, primarily Police, Parks, Planning, Municipal Court and City Administration.

Council has focused its revenue enhancement on the creation of a new Parks and Open Space Fee, as well as an increase to the existing Tree Fee. These fees are planned to be formally reviewed by Council and potentially be approved and implemented in July of 2025.

### Parks and Open Space Fee (\$5.00 per month)

The proposed Parks and Open Space fee of \$5.00 per month will be dedicated to maintaining the City’s current park and open space lands recently expanded to include the Pavilion Park land and restroom and the upcoming Coburg Creek new park development.

### Tree Fee Increase (From \$2 to \$4 per month)

The \$2 per month Tree Fee has not been adjusted since initially approved in 2007 and no longer covers costs associated with maintenance and removal of the impressive (and aging) street trees the City is responsible for maintaining. The proposed increase of \$2 improves the ability to better care for and mitigate risks associated with the City’s street tree inventory.

## Coburg Utility Bills

At its December meeting, the Coburg City Council unanimously approved adjustments to the current water, sewer and transportation utility fees (TUF), in order to maintain necessary funding levels for increased operations, maintenance and capital costs to the community's utility systems.

Utility rates will be increasing on February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025, however you will not see those increases until the February billing goes out in March.

### What will this mean for my bill?

The February rate increase includes a 4% water rate increase, a 6% wastewater rate increase, and a 4.9% transportation utility fee (TUF) increase. For a typical, low to moderate water use residential customer, the total increase amounts to just over eight dollars (\$8.02).

**MAYOR BELL'S DECEMBER UPDATE**

With the flip of the calendar page, the winter holidays have officially arrived! Thanks to volunteers with Coburg Make Street the vintage Christmas decorations have been installed, repaired and touched as they are brought back for the community for years to come. Thanks to all who volunteered time and talent to the Parkview Park area a water wheelabout is in place for the start of the Christmas season. Many homes and businesses are coated out with lights adding to the festive atmosphere and brightening the otherwise gloomy weather. Have you ever seen Coburg look like this?

**GLOOMY WEATHER & DARK STREETS**

Many of you may have noticed the brighter streetlights along Williams Street and on neighborhood streets in the dark winter months. In partnership with Pacifi Energy, we were able to replace aging and inefficient incandescent bulbs with energy efficient LED bulbs. This has the dual benefit of saving money as well as making a step of our intention to be more energy efficient for the city and our residents. While the bulbs were being changed to the "brighter" light emitting, they are still preserving the night scene because of the design of the streetlights in relation to the poles. If you have questions or concerns,

There are 243 cities in Oregon and 50% of them either have budget deficits (like Portland, Eugene, Springfield and Salem, to name a few) or are facing financial constraints. Some cities such as Astoria provide for rates, the only way to balance budgets is to decrease staff, reduce services, request operating fees or increase fees for most services. The services most likely to be requested by the city are general revenue and public assistance and public safety services. Rates for utilities (water and sewer) are not sufficient to cover costs, and money generated by the rates must be spent only on those utilities. This is not a good idea, it is essential for the state.

**WHAT IS COBURG DOING TO BALANCE THE BUDGET AND MAINTAIN THE SERVICES AND AMENITIES WE ALL COUNT ON?**

We have decreased staffing costs by purchasing vacant positions, set the contract staff as appropriate, limited or delayed large projects, and cut across all city's funds and established new non-recurring services and liability coverage. 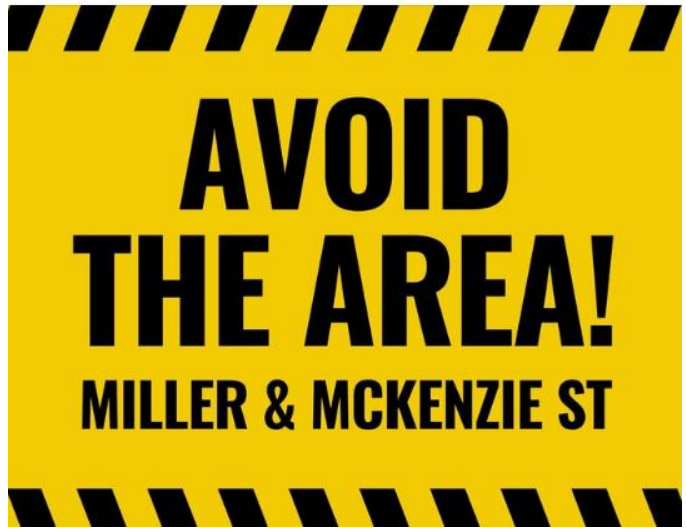

The National Weather Service has issued a Flood Watch for parts of Oregon, including the Eugene/Springfield region, beginning late Wednesday night until late Friday. Heavy rain (2-4 inches) and moderate to strong winds are in the forecast for our region.

With the incoming rain and wind, City of Coburg Public Works, Coburg Police Dept and Coburg Rural Fire District are all preparing to address localized storm related impacts, such as:

- Tree branches in roadways
- High water on roadways
- Monitor high flow levels entering the wastewater treatment plant
- Power outage related impacts to City water and wastewater (sewer) systems

Weather is supposed to be pretty cold throughout the week, with possible freezing and icy conditions. To prepare, we have provided you with some tips on how to prevent your water pipes from freezing. Please use this information and try to get ahead of the weather this winter season!

# PREVENTING FROZEN PIPES

**1** Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals up out of the reach of children.

**2** When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - helps prevent pipes from freezing.

**3** Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. By temporarily suspending the use of lower nighttime temperatures, you may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job if pipes freeze and burst.

🛵 Riders 16 year of age or younger are limited to "old school" pedal bicycles only on public streets

🛵 Not all e-bikes/scooters are the same - Different regulations apply based on design and maximum speed.

**Burglary Arrest – Use of Drone Technology Enhances Safety**

In the early morning hours of August 26, 2025, the Coburg Police Department was dispatched to a business alarm at Pomp's Tire Service, 91033 Roberts Rd, Coburg.

Upon arrival, Sergeant Miller discovered an active burglary in progress. An adult male suspect was observed loading items into a company service vehicle. Sgt. Miller immediately requested assistance, which was answered by the Oregon State Police, Lane County Sheriff's Office, and a Eugene Police Department K9 unit.

Officers placed spike strips in front of the vehicle to prevent escape. The suspect then fled on foot, hiding in nearby bushes.

At this point, a Lane County Sheriff's deputy deployed a drone, which proved critical in both clearing the building and safely locating the hiding suspect. The use of this technology greatly reduced risk, keeping officers, deputies, troopers, and the K9 partner safe from potential danger during the search.

Thanks to this coordinated response and the use of drone technology, the suspect was safely apprehended and transported to the Lane County Jail, where he was lodged on the following charges:

Burglary 2nd Degree (Felony) – ORS 164.215

Theft 1st Degree (Felony) – ORS 164.055

Criminal Trespass 2nd Degree (Misdemeanor) – ORS 164.245

Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle (Felony) – ORS 164.135

Unlawful Entry into a Motor Vehicle (Misdemeanor) – ORS 164.272

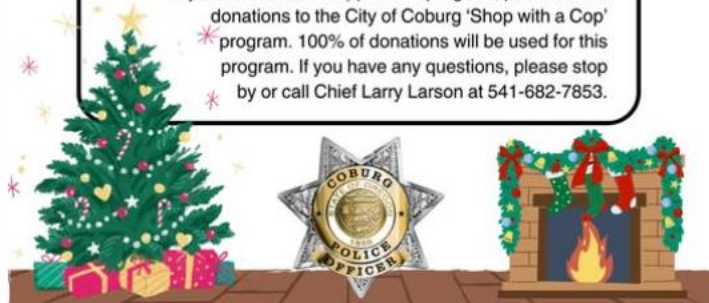
