CITY OF COLUMBIA FALLS CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES HELD DECEMBER 04, 2023

Mayor Barnhart called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

<u>ROLL CALL</u>: Councilor Fisher, Councilor King, Councilor Lovering, Councilor Piper, Councilor Robinson, Councilor Shepard, and Mayor Barnhart.

Also present: City Manager Nicosia, City Clerk Staaland, City Attorney Breck and Police Chief Peters.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

<u>APPROVAL OF AGENDA</u>: Councilor Lovering motioned to approve the agenda, seconded by Councilor Shepard and the motion carried.

<u>CONSENT AGENDA</u>: Councilor Robinson made motion to approve the consent agenda noting all claims appeared to be in order, seconded by Councilor Shepard and the motion carried unanimously. Approval of Claims - December 4, 2023 - \$336,497.71 Approval of Payroll Claims - November 22, 2023 - \$152,491.25 Approval of November 20, 2023, Regular City Council Meeting Minutes

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS/PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Mayor Barnhart read the Notice of Public Hearing - HB 355 Projects and asked for a staff report from the <u>City Manager:</u>

On Monday December 4, 2023, during the 7:00 p.m. regular council meeting, the City Council of the City of Columbia Falls shall conduct a public hearing for the purpose of accepting public comment on the City's proposed House Bill (HB) 355 Projects.

Whereas the 2023 Montana Legislative Session adopted HB355 that established a statutory appropriation, known as the State Local Infrastructure Partnership Act, to the City of Columbia Falls in the amount of \$359,193 as well as requiring a 25% local cash match.

The MT Department of Commerce rolled out the HB 355 provisions on November 6, 2023, which include establishing a priority list of projects and conducting a public hearing to accept public comment on the proposed projects. The specific provisions of HB 355 will be reviewed during the public hearing.

City Manager Nicosia presented the priority list as discussed at the previous City Council meetings. Nicosia reviewed eligible projects pursuant to the bill including drinking water systems, wastewater treatment systems, fire suppression systems, streets, roads, airports, landfills, streetlights, public grounds, and buildings. Priority must be given to projects that maintain or repair publicly owned drinking water systems, publicly owned wastewater treatment systems and municipal fire suppression systems.

City Staff prepared the list according to the highest priority as requested by the Council. Total funding for projects complying with HB 355 is \$478,924 (State funding - \$359,193, local cash match \$119,731).

Wastewater Treatment/Sewer Distribution - \$380,000 (\$285,000 HB 355, Local cash match \$95,000 Sewer Fund Restricted WWTP) Cash, 5310-102230. This includes the mainline repair between 2nd St. West and 3rd St.

West (\$15,000), electrical distribution/switch gear project (\$50,000), steel grit bin replacement (\$190,000), replacing the 1983 scum pump and controls (basement of clarifier) (\$100,000), and replacing Meadow Lake Flow Meter (\$25,000).

Water - \$60,000 (\$45,000 HB 355, Local cash match - \$15,000) – water fund operating cash 5210-101000. Hydrant replacement w/auxiliary valves – 6 hydrants w/valves (includes labor, equipment, materials to replace hydrants.

Bike paths - \$50,000 (\$29,193 HB 355 balance (58%), local cash match \$20,807), Veterans' Drive bike path repaved – 9th St. W. to 11th St. W.

City Manager Nicosia said these are the priority projects that staff are bringing forward for funding. Staff requests the Council consider and accept the proposed projects to be submitted to the Montana Department of Commerce for the HB 355 funding application.

With no public comment Mayor Barnhart opened and closed the Public Hearing at 7:08 p.m.

Councilor King motioned to accept the priority project list submitted for the HB 355 application, seconded by Councilor Fisher with Council voting as follows. Ayes: Shepard, Fisher, King, Lovering, Piper, Robinson, and Barnhart.

Mayor Barnhart read the Notice of Public Hearing - Title 5 Business License Amendments and asked for the staff report:

On Monday December 4, 2023, during the 7:00 p.m. regular council meeting, the City Council of the City of Columbia Falls shall conduct a public hearing for the purpose of amending Municipal Code Title 5 Business License Regulations.

The 2023 Montana Legislative Session adopted law changes that now require the City of Columbia Falls to amend the City's Business Licensing Program into a Business Registration Program.

The reviewed Business Registration Program is not intended to require additional licensing when the state is the original issuer of a license but rather is intended to promote public health, safety, and welfare through the provisions of the Business Registration Program.

City Manager Nicosia reported that the 2023 Legislature changed the provisions for the city business licensing program so staff is recommending an update to Title 5 Business Licensing Program to provide a Business Registration Program as documented in Ordinance # 827. The Business Registration program promotes public health, safety, and welfare for the community. Nicosia reviewed the changes from the current Business License regulations to the proposed Business Registration program to comply with state statute.

Nicosia noted that city staff is requesting the Council to amend Chapter 5.01 to Business Registration replacing the current Business License program.

Mayor Barnhart asked what was the driving force behind the legislation. Nicosia replied that the Senator that carried the bill was out of Billings and during the testimony on the bill, the Whitefish fees (\$400) were cited, which are much more than the City of Columbia Falls \$40 fees.

Mayor Barnhart opened and closed the Public Hearing at 7:20 p.m. as no public comments were received.

Mayor Barnhart read the Notice of Public Hearing - Zone Change within Columbia Falls Jurisdiction -Planning Board December 12, 2023 & City Council January 2, 2024:

<u>Request to change from CR-3 (One-Family Residential to CB-2 (General Business) in the Columbia Falls</u> <u>Jurisdiction:</u>

The owner/applicant, Boys and Girls Club of Glacier Country, Inc., is requesting a zone change at 165 Veterans Drive in Columbia Falls area from the current CR-3 (One-Family Residential) to a CB-2 (General Business) designation. The property has a Commercial designation in the Columbia Falls Growth Policy and will be the future home of the Boys and Girls Club in Columbia Falls. The property is described as Lot 2, of Saint Richards Subdivision in Section 18, Township 30 North, Range 20 West, P.M.M., Flathead County

NEW BUSINESS:

Award Bid - Sidewalk and Parking Improvements Project - Knife River - \$723,000.00

City Manager Nicosia referred to the Recommendation to Award report from Morrison & Maierle. The City staff were pleased that the bids came in lower than the engineer's estimate. The staff is recommending the Council award the bid to the low bidder Knife River at \$723,000. Mayor Barnhart said it is refreshing to have a bid come in less than anticipated.

Councilor Piper motioned to award the bid to low bidder Knife River, seconded by Councilor Shepard and the motion carried.

<u>Columbia Falls Appointment - Flathead Emergency Communications Center Operations Board - Chief Clint</u> <u>Peters</u>

City Manager Nicosia reported that the Flathead County Commissioners' have requested that the Council designated a Columbia Falls representative for the Flathead Emergency Communications Center Operations Board.

Councilor Shepard motioned to appoint Chief Peters to the FECC Operations Board, seconded by Councilor Lovering and the motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCES / RESOLUTIONS:

First Reading - Ordinance # 827 Amend Title 5 Business License Regulations:

An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Columbia Falls, Montana, Amending the Title 5 Business License Regulations to Reflect the New Business Registration Program

Councilor King motioned to adopt the First Reading of Ordinance # 827, seconded by Councilor Robinson and the motion carried.

REPORTS / BUSINESS FROM MAYOR & COUNCIL

Councilor King said the Night of Lights parade was wonderful. Mayor Barnhart recognized council person elect Kathy Price.

CITY MANAGER REPORT:

Resort Tax Update-Nicosia said the City has received 3% more in collections for this time period from last year and funds are coming in as anticipated.

Nicosia reported that the City is still waiting for the final signature on the Raise Grant.

The City staff has submitted 27 pages of comments back to HDR on the WWTP project design.

Nicosia said the appraisal of the property the Northwest Community Land Trust confirmed the purchase price was appropriate. Nicosia said she is finishing up the final environmental assessment to proceed with the HOME grant reimbursement.

Nicosia met with Commissioner Abell and Dave Prunty concerning the speed studies on Hwy 2 and the North Fork Rd. The county will support the City request for a speed study, noting it will take approximately one year to have it completed.

Nicosia reported that the legislative changes that have gone into effect since adopted, some with immediate effective dates, some with October 1st effective dates and some with January 1 effective dates, supersede the City code. The City must enforce all new statutory provisions regardless of language in the City code. Nicosia noted the City will enforce the statutes and update city code in the future, there is no need to amend city code immediately.

Nicosia said Council looked at tract 3D off Railroad St. for potential housing. In order for a dedicated city park to be sold, it must go to a vote of the citizens. Nicosia noted that the council approves every sale or abandonment of property by resolution. Habitat for Humanity and Northwest Community Land Trust got together and thought they may be able to work on a project together. Nicosia asked if the Council wanted to pursue this and appoint a council committee. Councilor Fisher asked if this property was ever a platted city park. Nicosia said it was not dedicated as parkland. It was owned by DOT, and they deeded it to the City. Councilor Robinson asked if the City has developed the property. Nicosia replied the City has installed a sprinkler system. Councilor Lovering asked what the zoning is on the property and can it be used for multifamily housing. Nicosia replied yes, it could be used for multi-family housing, it is zoned CB-2. Mayor Barnhart said his only concern is where the younger children are going to play ball. Councilor Shepard suggested having the City Manager look further into the project. Councilor Piper said the baseball association may restructure to use fields that are not being used; noting there is significant green space in the community.

Dear Mayor and Council:

We are writing to confirm our mutual desire to be re-appointed as the City Attorney for the City of Columbia Falls for the two-year term starting January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2026. We at Breck Law Office, PC have been honored to serve in this position since 2009 as an extension of Eric Kaplan's service in such role beginning in January of 1995 and ending in December of 2008. As you know, pursuant to the contract between our office and the City of Columbia Falls dated January 1, 2022, we serve all the City's legal needs, including but not limited to civil advice and counsel, criminal prosecution, civil litigation on a limited basis, employment law and HR, and labor relations and negotiations. We perform these tasks with the assistance of Justin Breck (attorney), Stephanie Breck (attorney), Mark Sullivan (attorney and retired Judge), and Marcy Hall (paralegal). All of us here at Breck Law Office enjoy our work on behalf of the City and the relationships we've been able to establish as a result.

As part of our renewal, after meeting with and discussing noticeable changes in our criminal case load with our contracted prosecutor, Mark Sullivan, we agree to the 5.00% COLA increase to our contract, which will result in additional monthly funds we will use to cover prosecution related costs and to retain the high quality of prosecutorial services to which we have grown accustomed here in Columbia Falls. We, along with the City Manager, believe this increase is justified, based on the attached data, which reflects a marked increase in the number of traffic and other misdemeanor related citations since the time of our previous contract renewal in December of 2021. According to our prosecutor, our legal assistant, and our Chief of Police, these increases are due, in large part to both the recent surge in our population and to an expansion of our police force, along with a renewed vigor for enforcing the law within our jurisdiction inherent among our newer officers. These are all good metrics, from a law enforcement perspective, but are naturally accompanied by an increased need for intensified prosecution and an enlarged case load.

In addition, as all of you are keenly aware, the demands on our office from the civil side have also seen discernable increases, from the following: more contentious land use decisions; intensified to disputes over short-term rentals; upticks in personnel and employment related challenges; and, more complex and heightened contract review. As always, our aim is to provide the highest level of legal services to the City, but our attorneys and support staff require the financial backing necessary to maintain that quality. CITY OF COLUMBIA FALLS CITY ATTORNEY CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT, effective the 1st day of January 2024 by and between the City of Columbia Falls, a Municipal Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "City") and the firm of BRECK LAW OFFICE, P.C., of Columbia Falls, Flathead County, Montana (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City requires legal counsel to advise, defend, and represent the City on matters including, but not limited to, litigation; zoning, planning, development, construction, real estate transactions and other land use matters; municipal assessments; special improvement districts; bond sales, annexation, disability claims, liability claims, election law, and personnel matters; matters relating to water and sewer systems; and law enforcement issues; and

WHEREAS the City requires legal counsel to prosecute criminal matters before the City Court of Columbia Falls, the District Court of Flathead County, and the Montana Supreme Court; and

WHEREAS the City Council is authorized by the laws of the State of Montana to enter into this Contract.

WHEREAS, the City wishes to have the contract coincide with the City's fiscal year for best budgeting practices.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. **<u>Representation</u>**. Contractor shall represent the City of Columbia Falls and the City Council in all state and federal courts and all administrative hearings and agencies. Contractor is not expected to represent the City in defending liability and Worker's Compensation matters expected to be covered by existing insurance wherein the insurance contract provides other defense counsel. Contractor shall be designated the City Attorney of Columbia Falls and shall generally be responsible for all civil, criminal, and employment matters. In addition to the aforementioned areas of responsibility, Contractor shall also be responsible for all labor duties requiring the advice, guidance, or negotiation consultation of an attorney.

2. <u>**Consultation.**</u> Contractor shall participate in meetings and conferences, conduct research, and provide general consultation with the City.

3. <u>Meetings</u>. Contractor shall attend all scheduled City Council meetings and, as requested and as necessary, all workshops of the City Council.

4. **Opinions.** Contractor shall render oral or written opinions to the City Manager and City Council upon the specific request of those parties.

5. <u>**City Court**</u>. Contractor will be responsible for representation of the City before the Columbia Falls City Court or any appeals therefrom.

6. **<u>Conflicts</u>**. Contractor shall not represent any individual in any adverse hearing or in any court appearance in which the City is an adverse party.

7. **Notice of Claim.** Contractor shall promptly notify the City Manager of any claim, demand, complaint, or cause of action against the City, filed, delivered, or served on Contractor, and the City Manager of the City of Columbia Falls shall promptly notify Contractor to the same effect relative to anything filed, delivered, or served on the City Manager or the City of Columbia Falls or any City Employee in his or her official capacity.

8. **Professional Fees and Expenses.** It is understood that Contractor shall be paid as follows:

a. For the remainder of the 2024 fiscal year, January 1, 2024 – June 30, 2024, the sum of Forty-Seven Thousand Fifty-Two Dollars and 30 Cents (\$47,052.30) to be paid in equal installments of Seven Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-Two Dollars and 30 Cents (\$7,842.05) per month for services rendered hereunder for all services provided including duties resulting from the responsibilities assumed in the area of union labor advice, guidance, negotiation, and consultation. Each monthly payment is payable within five days after the regular City Council meeting where Contractor has presented a request for payment of the amount.

The fee for the 2025 fiscal year will be based on the greater of a 5% increase or the 2024 Calendar Year CPI-U.

The fee for the 2026 fiscal year will be based on the greater of a 5% increase or the 2025 Calendar Year CPI-U.

Inasmuch as Contractor shall represent the City in all actions brought by or b. against the City or officials in their official capacities, all litigation, arbitration and preparation therefor, including trial and arbitration preparation, trials, arbitrations, or appeals therefrom, and all civil non-judicial and administrative proceedings (to include real estate notice and sale foreclosures) and appeals therefrom, shall warrant additional compensation at the rate of Two Hundred Five Dollars (\$205.00) per hour. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Contractor shall not be entitled to hourly compensation for criminal prosecutions in the City Court of Columbia Falls nor shall Contractor be entitled to an hourly rate greater than its customary private practice hourly rate. With prior approval of the City Council, Contractor may be paid at the rate of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per hour on those additional occasions, if any, which the City Council deems beyond the normal and reasonable scope of the duties of the City Attorney. Contractor shall provide to the City Manager accurate and complete records of all time spent when billing the City at an hourly rate. Those out-of-pocket expenses which Contractor incurs, and which are specifically and directly attributable to City litigation / arbitration, civil non-judicial and administrative proceedings, including court costs, document filing fees, deposition fees, arbitrator fees, mediator fees, travel costs, copies, postage, and long distance telephone calls, shall be reimbursed to Contractor. Said expenses shall be reimbursed by the City in a timely manner upon presentation of appropriate documentation.

c. This contract may be amended by agreement of the parties in connection with adoption of any City budget.

9. **Expenses.** Except for the litigation, arbitration, administrative and civil nonjudicial proceeding expenses as set forth above, the City shall not be responsible for any part or portion of Contractor's day-to-day office expenses or overhead. The City shall provide one complete set of the Montana Code Annotated for use in the Attorney's office.

10. <u>Assignment</u>. With prior Council approval, Contractor may assign or subcontract any portion of this contract, including without limitation, all criminal and employment matters, to another law firm located in Flathead County, the principal(s) of which are admitted to practice in the State of Montana and are qualified, by reason of experience and/or education, to perform such duties in a professional manner and consistent with state law.

11. <u>Municipal Law</u>. The Contractor agrees to maintain a level of proficiency in the area of municipal law and other areas of the law directly affecting the City. Contractor shall attend the annual City Attorneys meeting unless the Contractor and the City Manager agree that it is unnecessary under the circumstances.

12. <u>Substitute</u>. Contractor shall be responsible for having available at no cost to the City a substitute Contractor, acceptable to the City Council, to perform its duties in its absence. Except for unforeseen and unavoidable matters such as medical emergencies, Contractor shall not be absent from the City for a period in excess of six (6) consecutive weeks without prior Council approval.

13. **Independent Contractor.** It is understood that Contractor is an independent contractor and not an employee of the City. Contractor shall submit evidence to the City of Worker's Compensation coverage or exemption therefrom.

14. **Insurance.** Contractor agrees to carry, for the duration of this agreement, professional and/or malpractice insurance in the amount of \$500,000/\$500,000. Notice shall be given to the City by Contractor not less than sixty (60) days prior to any termination or material modification of coverage.

15. **Indemnification.** Contractor shall protect, appear, defend, save harmless and indemnify the City from and against all claims, suits, actions and costs arising from negligent actions or omissions or those of its agents or employees in the performance of this Contract.

16. **Non-Discrimination in Employment and Client Services.** During the performance of this Contract, Contractor agrees that no person shall, on grounds of race, creed, color, national origin, gender, marital status, age, religion, or on the presence of any sensory, mental or physical handicap, be excluded from full employment rights with Contractor. Neither shall Contractor discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment for the above reasons; provided, however, that prohibition against discrimination in employment because of handicap shall not apply if the particular disability prevents the proper performance of the particular work involved.

17. **Non-Discrimination in Provided Services.** Contractor shall not, on the grounds of race, color, gender, religion, national origin, creed, marital status, age, or the presence of any sensory, mental or physical handicap:

a. Deny any individual services or benefits provided under this Contract;

b. Subject any individual to segregation or separate treatment in any manner related to his or her receipt of any services or other benefits provided under this Contract; or

c. Deny any individual an opportunity to participate in any program or services provided by this Contract.

18. **<u>Termination</u>**. Contractor may be removed or suspended during the term of this Contract if done so pursuant to Section 7-4-4603, M.C.A.

19. **Term of Contract.** The term of this Contract shall be two and one-half (2 1/2) years and shall expire on June 30, 2026. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Mayor, subject to approval by the City Council, shall have the discretion to reappoint or not reappoint Contractor at the end of the two (2) year appointment term ending December 31, 2025.

20. <u>Survival</u>. If any term, provision, or paragraph of this contract, or the application thereof be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this contract shall not be affected thereby and each of the remaining terms, provisions, and paragraphs of the contract shall be valid and enforceable to the extent permitted by law.

AMEND TITLE 5 BUSINESS LICENSE REGULATIONS

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA FALLS, MONTANA AMENDING THE TITLE 5 BUSINESS LICENSE REGULATIONS TO REFLECT THE NEW BUSINESS REGISTRATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, City Business Licensing Provisions, Title 5 last updated and adopted by Ordinance 790 on November 4, 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to state law changes during the 2023 Montana Legislative Session, the City is revamping its Business Licensing Program into a Business Registration Program; and

WHEREAS, the City possesses an inherent power to enact reasonable legislation for the health, safety, welfare, or morals of the public; and

WHEREAS, the City's proposed Business Registration Program is not intended to require additional licensing when the state is the original issuer of the license but rather in intended to promote public health, safety and welfare through the provision of emergency contact information , fire inspections of businesses and other entities and confirmation of state Contractor Registration and Excavation Bond, as well as to allow the City to track and collect resort tax; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing at which the proposed amendments would be considered by the City Council was published in conformity with 7-1-4147 MCA, and

WHEREAS, at a public hearing held by the City council on December 4, 2023, the City council received and considered oral and written reports by City staff, received public input, and considered the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, it will be in the best interest of the City of Columbia Falls and its inhabitants, to adopt the proposed amendments to the City's Business Licensing Provisions to reflect the proposed Business Registration Program.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbia Falls, in the State of Montana, as follows:

SECTION 1: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "Chapter 5.01 BUSINESS LICENSES GENRALLY" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

Chapter 5.01 BUSINESS LICENSES GENRALLY

AFTER AMENDMENT

Chapter 5.01 BUSINESS LICENSES GENRALLY REGISTRATION

SECTION 2: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.010 Definitions" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.010 Definitions

For the purposes of this chapter, the words, terms, or phrases shall have the following meanings:

- A. "General business license" includes all businesses and professions requiring a license other than those required to have a professional business license.
- B. "Professional business license" is a license for persons engaged in the building trades including but not limited to contractors, plumbers, electricians, excavators, landscapers, HVAC installers, and masons.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.010 Definitions

For the purposes of this chapter, the words, terms, or phrases shall have the following meanings:

- A. "General business license" includes all businesses, entities, and professions requiring a license registration other than those required to have a professional business license. registered as a contractor.
- B. "Professional business license" <u>Contractor is a license for persons engaged in the building trades including but not limited to contractors, plumbers, electricians, excavators, landscapers, HVAC installers, and masons. A person or business that builds, repairs, or installs materials or devices on new or existing commercial and residential properties in the city.</u>

SECTION 3: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.020 Required" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.020 Required

No person, partnership, company, corporation or any other entity shall conduct, operate, transact, or engage in business of any kind within the City before first submitting an application and obtaining a business license from the City unless a business or profession exempted by state law. Failure to obtain business license prior to operating a business in the City limits constitutes a violation of this chapter.

- A. Each owner of four or more rental residential or business units shall be required to have a license whether or not a rental management business manages the properties or units, either residential or business, for the property owners.
- B. A person engaged in two or more businesses at the same location will be issued one license.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.020 Required

No person, partnership, company, corporation or any other entity <u>contractor or general shall</u> <u>will</u> conduct, operate, transact, or engage in business of any kind within the City before first submitting an application and obtaining registering with a business license from the City. <u>unless a business or profession exempted by state law.</u> Failure to <u>obtain register business license</u> prior to operating a business prior to operating in the City limits constitutes a violation of this chapter.

- A. Each owner of four or more rental residential or business units shall be required to have a license whether or not a rental management business manages the properties or units, either residential or business, for the property owners.
- B. A person engaged in two or more businesses at the same location will be issued one license.

SECTION 4: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.040 License Fees" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.040 License Fees

- A. Fee Schedule: The City Council shall adopt a business license fee schedule by resolution.
- B. Except as otherwise provided, all license fees shall be payable annually in advance on or before January 1. All licenses shall expire on December 31 of each year.
- C. Seasonal businesses may be licensed for the quarter(s) of the year they are doing business.
- D. A new business may apply for an annual license with the first year license prorated on the remaining quarters of the calendar year. Thereafter annual licenses shall be issued without proration.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.040 License Registration Fees

- A. Fee Schedule: The City Council shall adopt a business <u>license registration</u> fee schedule by resolution.
- B. Except as otherwise provided, all <u>license registration</u> fees shall be payable annually in advance on or before January 1. <u>Any registration issued after July 1 of each year will be issue at one-half (1/2) the yearly fee.</u> All <u>licenses registrations</u> shall expire on December 31 of each year.
- C. Seasonal businesses may be licensed for the quarter(s) of the year they are doing business.
- D. A new business may apply for an annual license with the first year license prorated on the remaining quarters of the calendar year. Thereafter annual licenses shall be issued without proration.

SECTION 5: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.030 Application" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.030 Application

Applications for licenses shall be obtained from and filed with the City. All applications, when filed, shall be accompanied with the necessary fees and signed by the applicant. The form of the application shall be determined by the City Manager.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.030 Application

Applications for <u>licenses</u> <u>registrations</u> shall be obtained from and filed with the City. All applications, when filed, shall be accompanied with the necessary fees and signed by the applicant. The form of the application shall be determined by the City Manager.

SECTION 6: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.050 State Certificate Of Contractor Registration" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.050 State Certificate Of Contractor Registration

Persons who are engaged in a business which requires a professional business license are required to provide a copy of their current Certificate of Contractor Registration.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.050 State Certificate Of Contractor Registration

Persons who are engaged in a business which requires a <u>contractor registration professional</u> business license are required to provide a copy of their current <u>Montana</u> Certificate of Contractor Registration<u>and if applicable a copy of their bond certificate</u>.

SECTION 7: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.060 Home Occupations" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.060 Home Occupations

A general business license may be issued to a business in a residential zoning district within the City, providing said business is in compliance with the zoning regulations contained in Chapter 18.426.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.060 Home Occupations

A general business license may be issued to a business in a residential zoning district within the City, providing said business is in compliance with the zoning regulations contained in Chapter 18.426.

SECTION 8: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.070 Transferability" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.070 Transferability

No license issued is transferable to any other owner or business.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.070 Transferability

No license registration issued is transferable to any other owner or business.

SECTION 9: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.080 Refund" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.080 Refund

No licensee is entitled to a refund if he or she ceases to do business for any unexpired term for which a license was obtained.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.080 Refund

No licensee registration is entitled to a refund if he or she ceases to do business for any unexpired term for which a license registration was obtained.

SECTION 10: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.090 Exemption For Holders Of Alcoholic Beverage Licenses" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

5.01.090 Exemption For Holders Of Alcoholic Beverage Licenses

Holders of alcoholic beverage licenses within the City shall not be required to pay an additional fee for a business license as that license is included within the alcoholic beverage license itself.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.090 Exemption For Holders Of Alcoholic Beverage Licenses

Holders of alcoholic beverage licenses within the City shall not be required to pay an additional fee for a business license as that license is included within the alcoholic beverage license itself.

Holders of alcoholic beverage licenses within the City shall not be required to pay an additional fee for a business registration.

SECTION 11: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "5.01.100 Change Of Location" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

A licensee shall have the right to change the location of the licensed business while a valid license is in effect, without obtaining a new license. The licensee must notify the City in writing of the change of business location and address.

AFTER AMENDMENT

5.01.100 Change Of Location

A licensee shall have the right to change the location of the licensed business while a valid license is in effect, without obtaining a new license. The licensee <u>General registrations</u> must notify the City in writing of the change of business location and address.

SECTION 12: <u>ADOPTION</u> "5.01.110 Registration Exemption" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *added* as follows:

BEFORE ADOPTION

5.01.110 Registration Exemption (Non-existent)

AFTER ADOPTION

5.01.110 Registration Exemption(Added)

Licensed professionals by the State of Montana, including but not limited to physicians, chiropractors, nail technicians, attorneys, real estate agents, certified public accountants, and insurance professionals are exempt from business registration.

SECTION 13: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "Title 5 BUSINESS LICENSE REGULATIONS" of the Columbia Falls Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:
