OLD BUSINESS

2. Whole Blood Pilot Program – Chief Mike Gerken – **DISCUSSION ITEM**

A whole blood pilot program was originally discussed at the February 11, 2025, meeting. CONFIRE Interim Deputy Executive Director, Chief Joe Barna, addressed the topic noting that all agencies would like to provide blood, but not all can. Certain agencies would not be able to overcome the obstacles that carrying whole blood entails. At the February 11, 2025, meeting a subgroup was established consisting of Carly Cripe, Pam Martinez, Josh Stapleton, and Art Andres. Interim Deputy Executive Director Barna asked the subgroup to resume talks on the subject and bring back a workable recommendation to the August 11th meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

3. AB660 Data Sharing – Interim Deputy Executive Director, Chief Joe Barna – **DISCUSSION ITEM**

Interim Deputy Executive Director Joe Barna updated the EMS Subcommittee regarding the California Data Exchange Framework Data Sharing Agreement requirement, actions already taken by CONFIRE, and the anticipated EMSA/HCAI pathway for EMS data exchange.

After receiving information from ICEMA and reviewing the issue with legal counsel, CONFIRE moved forward with execution of the HCAI Data Sharing Agreement and notified the County Fire/EMS group of the potential actions their agencies may need to take.

No formal action is requested, this report out is intended to keep the EMS Subcommittee informed of the requirement, the actions already taken by CONFIRE, and the State's ongoing work to establish an EMSA intermediary pathway for EMS data exchange.

Staff will continue to monitor guidance from ICEMA, EMSA, and HCAI and will provide updates as implementation progresses.

Report was received and filed. No action required.

4. Public Agency PM Student Internships – Captain Josh Stapleton (EMS Implementation Team) – **DISCUSSION ITEM**

Approximately 60 local students from Crafton Hills, Victor Valley, and Mt. SAC will be out in the fall seeking internship. Captain Stapleton believes that CONFIRE can step up and provide the internship opportunities needed. Due to the ambulance deployment, there would be a brief pause 3-5 days before and 3-5 days after the Oct. 1st deployment date. CONFIRE will be sensitive to their requirements and do our best not to disrupt their internship time.

Informational discussion only, no formal action required.

5. Mutual Aid RFQ Process – Interim Deputy Executive Director, Chief Joe Barna – **ACTION ITEM**

CONFIRE has a need to preserve interfacility transport (IFT) and critical care transport (CCT) system resiliency while protecting the 911 system, CONFIRE's County ambulance service obligations, hospital relationships, and EMS system performance. Staff and legal counsel developed the attached policy to establish a formal process for identifying and approving private ambulance providers that may be eligible to provide IFT/CCT mutual aid support when appropriate.

There is no direct fiscal impact associated with the adoption of the policy or the development of the RFQ. Any future fiscal impact would depend on the terms of individual mutual aid agreements and would return through CONFIRE's approval process before activation.

Motion to recommend that the CONFIRE Administrative Committee adopt the IFT/CCT Mutual Aid Partner Policy as presented and authorize staff to develop the annual Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process for private ambulance providers seeking consideration as IFT/CCT mutual aid partners.

SUBJECT: ICEMA POLICY 4100 RESPONSE STANDARDS

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Receive and file this informational report on implementation of ICEMA Policy 4100 and the Code 2 and Code 3 ambulance response standards at contract go-live. No formal action is requested.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- On implementation of the Ground Ambulance Service Contract on October 1, 2026, CONFIRE will incorporate ICEMA Policy 4100 and its determinant-level assignments into the ambulance deployment and dispatch plan.
- Emergency Medical Dispatch will determine two separate elements: clinical resource level and response mode. Unit type establishes clinical capability; Code 2 or Code 3 establishes the response method and contract time standard.
- ALS will no longer automatically mean Code 3. Under the contract, Code 3 ambulance responses are ALS; Code 2 responses may use ALS or BLS and operate without lights and siren.
- Both Code 2 and Code 3 require immediate dispatch. The longer Code 2 standard is a performance benchmark, not permission to hold or delay the call.
- This replaces the decades-long all-Code-3 model and implements the RFP commitment to send the right resource to the right patient at the right time.

BACKGROUND

The current system has historically defaulted emergency ambulance calls to Code 3 ALS and measured performance against the ALS response-time standard. That model does not fully use patient-acuity information obtained through the Medical Priority Dispatch System.

The RFP called for a modernized system using Medical Priority Dispatch and appropriate ALS or BLS response. The agreement authorizes BLS use under ICEMA Emergency Medical Dispatch requirements, establishes separate Code 2 and Code 3 standards, and requires BLS responses to conform to Policy 4100. Policy 4100 assigns responses by determinant and directs first-response and ambulance resources to follow Emergency Medical Dispatch instructions to upgrade, cancel, or reduce response mode.

RESPONSE STANDARD ON OCTOBER 1, 2026

At implementation, the approved Emergency Medical Dispatch determinant will control the initial assignment. The Resource level and response mode are separate decisions.

- ALS-first or BLS-first identifies the minimum clinical capability and the resource assigned to the call.

- Code 3 means immediate dispatch with lights and siren. Code 2 means immediate dispatch without lights and siren.
- The assigned unit follows the response mode established for the call. An ALS unit may respond Code 2. BLS use remains limited to the determinants authorized by ICEMA Policy 4100.
- Fire first-response and ambulance resources follow the Emergency Medical Dispatch-directed mode and subsequent instructions to upgrade, reduce, or cancel the response as new information is received.
- Code 2 is not a delayed response. It is an immediate response using normal traffic operations and a separate contract performance standard.

CONTRACT RESPONSE-TIME STANDARDS

The agreement measures ambulance performance at the 90th percentile by Exclusive Operating Area, response area, and response level:

Response Level	Urban	Suburban	Rural	Wilderness
Code 3 ALS	9:59	14:59	29:59	59:59
Code 2 ALS/BLS	15:59	22:59	44:59	99:59

Operational note: These values are compliance thresholds. They do not change the requirement for immediate dispatch.

IMPLEMENTATION AND OVERSIGHT

Staff is incorporating this model into the CAD and ProQA configuration, ambulance deployment plan, training, and go-live validation. Implementation includes:

- validating the determinant matrix and response recommendations with ICEMA;
- training dispatch personnel and ambulance crews, and coordinating expectations with first-response agencies; and
- monitoring early performance by response level, Exclusive Operating Area, and response area, including upgrades, reductions, extended responses, and operational exceptions.

Staff will report material findings or recommended adjustments to the EMS Subcommittee as implementation progresses.

DISCUSSION

This is a material operating-model change. It ends the assumption that an ALS designation requires Code 3, preserves immediate dispatch and ALS response for higher-acuity calls, and allows lower-acuity calls to receive the appropriate response without unnecessary Code 3 travel.

Clearly communicating this change before implementation is critical to prevent confusion and misunderstandings. This report places the standard on the record and establishes a common operating expectation for the EMS Subcommittee, member agencies, dispatch personnel, first responders, ambulance crews, and ICEMA.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no separate fiscal impact associated with receiving and filing this report.

MEDICAL PRIORITY DISPATCH MINIMUM RESPONSE ASSIGNMENTS FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL DISPATCH (EMD) CATEGORIES

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to establish approved Medical Priority Dispatch System (MPDS) response and mode assignments for use by authorized Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) Centers.

II. POLICY

- EMD Centers shall dispatch EMS resources to medical emergencies and manage their response in accordance with the response level established by this policy.
- First responder and ambulance resources shall comply with instructions from an authorized EMD Center to upgrade, cancel, or reduce their response mode.
- ICEMA approved MPDS response and mode assignments for use by authorized EMD Centers are as follows:
