The developer is requesting the creation of a new PD with a base zoning district of MX-C (Mixed-Use Commercial) for the purpose of constructing a mixed-use development. Staff will provide an overview of the proposed concept plan.

Consider and act on an Ordinance of the City Council canvassing and declaring the results of the Special Election held on November 4, 2025, for the purpose of continuing the City of Corinth Fire Control, Prevention, and Emergency Medical Services District for a period of ten (10) years, and the continuation of a sales and use tax for the District at a rate of one-fourth of one percent; providing confirmation of voting tabulation; and providing an effective date.

Item Summary/Background/Prior Action

On November 4, 2025, the City's Special Election was held under the provisions of the Local Government Code, Chapter 344 and the Election Code for the continuation of the Fire Control, Prevention, and Emergency Medical Services District and the continuation of a sales and use tax for the District at a rate of one-fourth of one percent. State law requires that the governing body of the City of Corinth canvass all elections. The return of the Special Election, including the returns of the early voting ballots, duly and legally made.

Denton County Elections will provide the final election results on Monday, May 17, 2025. The Ordinance will reflect the final election results.

Staff Recommendation/Motion

Staff recommends approval of the Ordinance canvassing the final results of the Special Election.

CITY OF CORINTH, TEXAS ORDINANCE NO. 25-11-17-XX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORINTH, TEXAS, CANVASSING AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE JOINT SPECIAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 4, 2025, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS A BALLOT PROPOSITION FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE CITY OF CORINTH FIRE CONTROL, PREVENTION, AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DISTRICT, ("DISTRICT") FOR A PERIOD OF TEN (10) YEARS, AND CONTINUATION OF A SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE DISTRICT AT A RATE OF ONE-FOURTH OF ONE PERCENT FOR A PERIOD OF TEN (10) YEARS; PROVIDING FOR THE INCORPORATION OF PREMISES; PROVIDING FOR CONFIRMATION OF VOTE TABULATION AND CANVASS; PROVIDING THE CANVASS OF A JOINT SPECIAL ELECTION AS EXHIBIT "A" AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF ELECTION; PROVIDING REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on November 4, 2025, the City's Joint Special Election was held in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter and the Texas Election Code for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters a ballot proposition for the continuation of the City of Corinth Fire Control, Prevention, and Emergency Medical Services District, ("District") for a period of ten (10) years, and continuation of a sales and use tax for the District at a rate of one-fourth of one percent for a period of ten (10) years; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Election Code requires that the governing body of the City of Corinth canvass all elections, and Section 344.259 of the Texas Local Government Code governs the canvass of the election returns for the District and requires that election results be canvassed in accordance with the Election Code; and

WHEREAS, section 67.003 of the Texas Election Code provides that each local canvassing authority shall convene not earlier than the third (3rd) day or later than the eleventh (11th) day after election day for the purpose of canvassing the election results; and

WHEREAS, section 67.004(a) of the Texas Election Code also provides that only two members of City Council are needed and constitute a quorum for the purpose of canvassing election results; and

WHEREAS, the official returns, including returns of early voting ballots cast, of the presiding judges of the Joint Special Election have been presented and delivered; and the City Council acting in capacity as the Canvassing Board, met on November 17, 2025, and duly canvassed such returns in accordance with the law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORINTH, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Premises

The findings set forth above are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. Election Properly Ordered and Held

The City Council officially finds and determines that a Joint Special Election on a measure was duly ordered to be held in the City of Corinth, Texas on the 4th day of November 2025 the for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters a ballot proposition for the continuation of the City of Corinth Fire Control, Prevention, and Emergency Medical Services District, for a period of ten (10) years, and continuation of a sales and use tax for the District at a rate of one-fourth of one percent for a period of ten (10) years (the "Election"); that proper notice of the Election was duly given; that proper Election officers were duly appointed prior to the Election; that the Election has been held and results have been made and delivered; and that the City Council has duly canvassed the Election returns all in accordance with law.

SECTION 3. Confirmation of Vote Tabulation

The City Council officially finds and determines that only qualified resident voters of the City were allowed to vote at the Election, and that the following votes were cast at the Joint Special Election, and that the canvass of the votes cast in the Election and returns thereof were made in accordance with the law.

The City Council officially finds that the returns of the Joint Special Election, including the returns of the early voting ballots, duly and legally made were as follows, and that the measure considered at the Election received the following votes:

SECTION 4. Canvass

SECTION 5. Certification of Canvass

That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the certification of the Canvass of the Joint Special Election for the continuation of the District and the continuation of the sales tax for the District, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit "A"** and which includes the tally of returns set forth in **Exhibit A-1** attached thereto, in accordance with the election laws of the State of Texas.

SECTION 6. Open Meeting

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and public notice of the time place, and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by Article 551.041, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 7. Severability

Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Corinth hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 8. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and it is so resolved.
