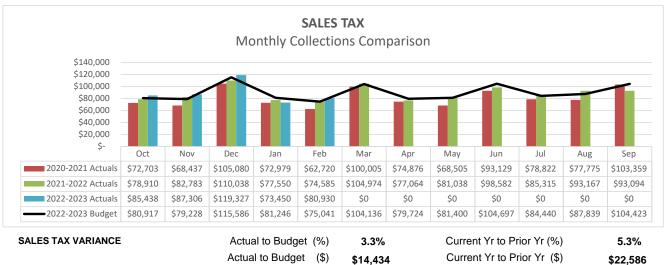

#### Item Summary/Background/Prior Action

The City of Corinth recognizes the value of a strong business community. Nationally, over 80% of employment growth in a community comes from retention and expansion of existing businesses. Existing businesses make investments in facilities, create jobs, and provide a support network that is at the heart of a strong local economy. A key element of a strong business community is a proactive, business-friendly, and supportive government.

The City of Corinth's Business Visitation Program is a part of our business retention/expansion strategy. The Program has been created to enable the Economic Development team to better understand the goals of our respective business community. This program will allow us to refer customers to suppliers, provide businesses with opportunities for growth, and act as an avenue to develop business relations with local key contacts.

Through the Business Visitation Program staff will be able to learn each individual business, explore their issues/concerns and target areas where we may be able to help. # ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Economic Development Corporation (EDC) is committed to the promotion and retention of high-quality development in all parts of the City, and to ongoing improvement in the quality of life for its citizens. The Economic Development Corporation (EDC) receives its revenue from a portion of the City's sales and use tax levied on eligible goods sold within the City of Corinth. A special election was held on November 5, 2002 for the purpose of creating a local .50% sales and use tax for Economic Development.
