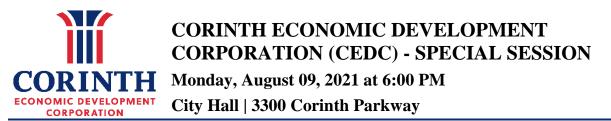

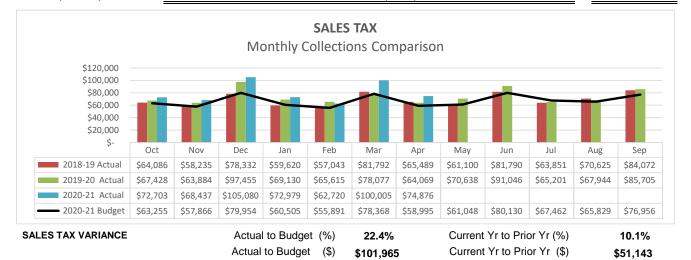

Item Summary/Background/Prior Action

The Original Chapter 380 Economic Development Incentive Agreement was approved on April 18, 2019; the First Amended and Restated Agreement was approved on June 6, 2019; followed by the Second Amended and Restated Agreement on October 22, 2020.
