

Item Summary/Background/Prior Action

The City of Corinth issued a Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) for professional services to prepare a comprehensive master plan for Corinth Community Park. Twelve proposals were received, and Dunaway Associates, L.L.C., was selected to lead the project and approved by Council on August 21, 2025.

The purpose of the Master Plan is to develop a conceptual planning document with phased cost estimates and implementation strategies to guide future investment and support grant funding opportunities.

Dunaway's scope of work includes:

- **Data Gathering & Site Analysis:** Review of existing City data, preparation of base maps, site visits, and analysis of opportunities and constraints.
- **Community Input & Program Development:** Public meetings, stakeholder engagement, surveys, and coordination with the City's grant consultant.
- **Conceptual Development:** Up to three concept plan alternatives, community and staff feedback, and a recorded presentation for online participation.
- **Preliminary Master Plan:** Draft master plan exhibit, budget projections, funding strategy, and presentations to staff, Park Board, and Council.
- **Final Master Plan:** Final document and budget projections.

To date Dunaway has completed the data gathering and site analysis. They also had a booth at the Howl-O-Ween, hosted a stakeholders meeting on November 4 and a community meeting on November 12. Staff placed signs with QR codes in the park that linked to a survey and the survey link was also shared on social media.






• Amphitheater: Open-air, semicircular venues built into hillsides for various performances, seating thousands.

• Theatre's were an irreplaceable element of everyday life in ancient Greece.

• They were the center of politics, social, and religious life.

• A circular or semicircular seating layout with different tiered heights.

• Unimpeded view and excellent acoustics




Greek Gods and Theatre Research Cont.

- Dionysus: Considered the god of theatre.
- Honored in several annual festivals in ancient Greece.
- City of Dionysia devoted 5 days to drama
- The first purpose-built theatre bears his name
- The Muses: 9 sister goddesses associated with liberal arts (poetry, music, dancing, plays), science, history.
- Apollo: God of prophecy and oracles, music, song, and poetry, etc.
- His temple at Delphi is overlooked by Delphi's amphitheater.



Beyond Ancient Corinth's prosperous harbor and port trade, the city was renowned for its art and culture. The

Photo-Corinthian/Corinthian pottery style (c. 725 – c. 600 BCE) was known for its animal, human, and mythological motifs. The famous black-figure pottery technique was also found in Corinth around c. 700 BCE. Architecture was another significant aspect of art, with the Corinthian order column style being the last and most ornate of the Greek/Roman principal styles in classical architecture.

I am a Painting and Drawing major.


I grew up in a small town in East Texas.








Connection to Corinth

Concept...

Though, My details within my mural will have deeper, more rendered additions to bring light, color, tone, and overall vibrancy to this piece, I would like to highlight the primary factors that relate to the theme of downtown-life.

- The bench in which I plan to paint this mural on would make most sense on the small Faye Bench towards the front of the area of which these benches are located.
- My concept is mostly connected to the idea of creating a memory and its connection to the lighting found in the center of the event, therefore, would look best closer to the lights and the stage.
- The shape of the bench creates a wave like movement, connecting to the dancing of the lights.
- The exposure of the sunlight enhances the vibrance of the color projected from the Glow-in-the-Dark paint.



My work is rooted in the nostalgia of childhood, shaped by small moments of wonder, curiosity, and close encounters with the quiet surrealism of the natural world. I am drawn to the space where memory and imagination blur and how those moments influence the way we understand and experience the physical world around us.

Through sculpture, I aim to give form to feelings that are often fleeting or intangible, creating work that invites closeness and curiosity. I encourage viewers to bring their own memories and stories to the experience, fostering a personal connection and a renewed way of seeing the world.

PREVIOUS WORK









RED THREAD OF FATE (FIRST PROPOSAL)

The Red Thread of Fate is an East Asian legend that says an invisible red string connects people who are destined to meet, no matter the time, place, or circumstance.

While it does not come from Greek culture, the idea closely relates to Greek beliefs about fate, or moira, which shaped every person's life.

In Greek mythology, the three Fates, known as the Moirai, controlled the thread of each human life: one spun it, one measured it, and one cut it.


Both stories use the image of a thread to show how unseen forces connect people and determine the paths their lives will take.

PROPOSAL.

"The Red Thread" is a mural for the Corinth community celebrating connection, belonging, and shared stories. Inspired by the Red Thread of Fate and the Greek moira, or, it shows hands of different skin tones holding a single red thread winding across a cloudy Texas sky. The thread spells 'Nexus' a single word reflecting the community through its meaning: A place or component that is central to something, A series of interconnected things, while the other side spells out Agora in the same fashion.

As people sit on the bench, they become part of the work. Inside, a painted night sky evokes the calm of stargazing in daylight. Like the ancient Greek agora, the mural turns a simple bench into a space for unity and reflection, reminding Corinth residents of their enduring ties to one another.

GREEK COLUMNS AND SYMBOLIS (SECOND PROPOSAL)

Corinthian columns are known for their elegance and detailed designs, often decorated with carved acanthus leaves that symbolize growth, beauty, and endurance. They first appeared in ancient Greece and show a sense of balance and refinement in architecture.


The Greek meander, or key pattern, is another common design found on pottery and buildings, with its repeating, connected lines representing infinity, unity, and the flow of life.

Together, these designs show the Greek focus on harmony, order, and the lasting connections that shape human experience.

PROPOSAL


Inspired by classical Greek design and community connection, this mural for the city of Corinth will transform a scooped bench into a space of beauty and reflection. Corinthian columns and acanthus leaves will frame the sides, symbolizing growth, endurance, and grace, while a Greek meander pattern outlines the bench to represent unity and the flow of life.

Inside, soft scroll details and a painted Texas sky evoke the calm of a shared sunset, blending classical motifs with a local sense of place. The bench becomes both functional and contemplative, a spot for gathering and pause.



This design follows a symetrical balance.

Consider the column, scrolls, and meander pateern to be reflected.


MYTHOUGHTS ON INTERACTION


<u>Interaction with these murals is a vital part of my concepts</u>, because each bench acts as a living canvas, its story shaped by every person who sits on it.


