

## Item Summary/Background/Prior Action

We often hear of municipalities offering incentives to attract or retain certain businesses or development. These incentives are provided based on the municipality's adopted incentive policy and in accordance with State laws. In 2016, the City adopted the Chapter 380 Economic Development Program Policies and Procedures and then again in 2020.

Corinth is dedicated to achieving the highest quality of development, infrastructure, and quality of life for its citizens, it is essential to support positive expansion of the City's economy; and sometimes, incentives play a critical role in these efforts.

The competitive nature of other communities on the local, state, and international level can necessitate incentives to attract quality investment and the right business to the community. When such efforts are necessary, City staff and CEDC/Council work diligently to negotiate win/win incentive agreements, and only after conducting an in-depth cost-benefit analysis, that ensures a fair and reasonable return on investment for our taxpayers. It is the intent of the City to utilize incentives only when necessary, and when it results in a positive return.

Based on this, the enclosed Economic Development Program Incentives Policy is all encompassing providing a comprehensive list of the potential incentives including Chapter 380 incentives. The policy includes the criteria for consideration of economic development incentives, an overview of the economic development incentives as well as the procedural guidelines.

The policy is in place to ensure that City staff and the CEDC/Council diligently negotiated the terms and fully analyzed the cost and benefits to ensure the best return on investment.
