Summary: A& D Storage LLC is in the conceptual stage of potentially developing the property at the southwest corner of Borio and Renwick. The concept plan proposes the construction of over 69,000 SF of self-storage units.

The property is approximately 3.96 acres and is zoned B3. Self-storage is a special use, with regulations as outlined in Section 8.2-14, which states the facility must comply with the State self-storage act, and that fencing and landscaping shall be provided to screen view.

The proposal includes eight buildings with various storage units. The back side of the buildings frame Borio Drive, along with landscaping and fencing. The buildings run north and south; therefore, no overhead doors will front Renwick or the residential property to the south.

The applicant has provided renderings and a business overview. The business overview indicates that as new customers occupy the facility, there will be approximately 5-9 vehicles, reducing to 2-5 cars per day. The proposal includes landscaping and a faux wrought iron fence along the property.

A formal site plan has not been provided, as the applicant elected to appear before the City Council for initial feedback on the proposed special use. Should the applicant elect to proceed, they must submit a site plan, photometric, and engineering to ensure compliance with City Codes and Ordinances.

Security features and plans will be implemented to provide a secure site. The proposal includes concrete driveways throughout the site.

Recommended Council Action: If the Mayor and City Council are amenable to the land use, I would ask that you authorize to work with the petitioner to move forward to prepare a site plan and associated documents



Agenda Item: | 2023 (FY24) Rain Barrel & Composter Program

Summary: The 2023 (FY24) Rain Barrel and Composter program is now available for purchase via our partnership with The Conservation Foundation and Upcycle Products. The link to the purchase website is https://upcycle-products.com/il-programs/crst/ New this year in addition to the rain barrels we have added composters to the program.

Residents may submit an order online and Public Works staff will deliver them to the residents bi-weekly once received from Upcycle products. Reminder that The City has provided a subsidy for both the rain barrels and composters, limit 50 composters and 100 rain barrels in the amount of \$24.50 for rain barrels and \$25.50 for composters. Once 100 rain barrels and 50 composters are sold the subsidy will be removed. The resident cost is \$40.00 for rain barrels after the subsidy and \$50.00 for a stationary composter or \$140.00 for a tumbling composter after the subsidy.

Harvesting rain to capture stormwater is easy and can help conserve water usage around the home. About 40 percent of total household water use during the summer months is for watering lawns and gardens.

Rain barrels are large containers that capture stormwater that would otherwise be lost as runoff from roofs. The 55-gallon rain barrels sold by The Conservation Foundation are modern foodgrade barrels and are sealed, safe around children, and insect resistant. They are repurposed, recycled, and recyclable and come equipped with spigots, screens to prevent mosquito breeding, and overflow valves.

Setup is easy, diverting water from your downspout to fill the rain barrel. A hose spigot on the front makes the water easy to access and use for watering flowers and gardens, or washing cars, windows, and even pets.

When we compost our kitchen scraps and yard waste, we reduce the amount of material going to the landfills and instead return nutrients to the soil. The many benefits of composting include reducing

the amount of material going to landfills and adding organic matter to our garden's beds. This improves soil structure and texture, increases the soil's ability to hold both water and air, improves soil fertility, and stimulates healthy root development in plants. And it saves you money, so you don't have to buy chemical fertilizers!

The Conservation Foundation is one of the region's oldest and largest not-for-profit land and watershed conservation organizations, with more than 4,000 members. Founded in 1972, The Conservation Foundation has helped preserve more than 35,000 acres of open space, restored, and cleaned miles of rivers and streams, and educated thousands of kids by engaging them in nature and the outdoors.
