4. PRESENTATION - TEXAS FILM FRIENDLY CERTIFICATION FROM THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

Betty Russo, Regional Representative for the Gulf Coast/East Texas Region with the Texas Economic Development and Tourism office presented the City of Crockett with a Texas Film Friendly Certificate. She explained that this allows the city greater visibility and support for film/movie production companies to utilize the City of Crockett for film making. Liza Clark, Executive Director of the Crockett Area Chamber of Commerce, also spoke about the potential benefits of this certification.

Sealed bids were received, publicly opened, and read aloud for the above referenced project on September 12, 2023, at 2:00 P.M. at Crockett, City Hall. Only one bid was received as shown on the attached bid tabulation.

The notification and advertising process for this bid included advertisement in the local newspaper, electronic notifications to contractors and subcontractors, know to perform this type of work, and presentation of the plans and specifications on <u>www.civcastusa.com</u>.

Crockett Construction from Crockett, Texas was the only bidder and submitted bids on Scheule 1 and Schedule 2. The low bid for Schedule 2 was \$293,232.00 which is slightly lower than the available grant funds of approximately \$309,000.

From review of the information provided in the contractor's bid proposal, and prior experience with the contractor, the low bidder for Schedule 2 appears to be qualified to perform the work required and is capable of successfully completing the project.

Per the State Property Tax Code, each voting entity needs to **<u>nominate</u>** 1-5 candidates to fill the positions for the Houston County Appraisal District **Board of Directors for 2024-2025**. This needs to be completed by resolution in a regular meeting of the taxing entity.

The following is specific criteria for nominated candidates.

1. The taxing unit may nominate an employee if they are an elected official only. (other employees are not eligible)

2. Any citizen that has been a resident of the county for the preceding two years.

The presiding officer of each voting unit's governing body will need to submit the name of the nominees in writing to the Chief Appraiser before October 15,2023.

Upon receipt of the nominees, the Chief Appraiser will prepare a ballot listing the nominees and submit this list to the governing bodies *before* October 30,2023. The taxing units will need to vote on a director before December 15,2023 and submit to the Chief Appraiser.

The unit may cast all its votes for one candidate or may distribute the votes among any number of candidates. Some voting units may have enough votes to select several directors to the board. To share representation on the board, several units may wish to vote for the same candidate. A voting unit may cast its votes for a person nominated and named on the ballot. There are no provisions for write in candidates.

The Chief Appraiser will count the votes and declare the candidates who have obtained the most votes *before December 31,2023*.



PUBLIC NOTICE OF A MEETING AT WHICH THE CROCKETT CITY COUNCIL WILL CONSIDER APPROVAL OF A TAX ABATEMENT AND INCENTIVES AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Section 312.207 of the Texas Tax Code, notice is hereby given that the City Council of the City of Crockett ("City") will consider approval of a tax abatement and incentives agreement at a regularly scheduled meeting.

<u>**Time and Place of the Meeting:**</u> The City Council will consider the tax abatement and incentives agreement at its regularly scheduled meeting, beginning at 6:00 p.m. on October 2, 2023 at City Council Chambers at City Hall at 200 North 5th. Street, Crockett Texas.

Tax Abatement Agreement Information Required by Texas Tax Code Section 312.207:

- 1. Name of the Property Owner and Applicant for the Tax Abatement and Incentives Agreement: The name of the property owner and applicant for the tax abatement agreement is Stealth Vision, LLC.
- 2. Name and Location of the Reinvestment Zone: The name of the proposed reinvestment zone in which the property subject to the tax abatement will be located is Reinvestment Zone Number One of the City of Crockett, Texas, which was adopted by Ordinance O-08C-23 of the City Council on August 21, 2023.
- 3. General Description of the Nature of Improvements: The tax abatement and incentives agreement include improvements to an approximately 1,800 square-feet building to be used primarily for offices and an approximately 3,500 square-feet building to be used for manufacturing, warehousing, distribution.
- 4. Estimated Cost of the Improvements: The estimated costs of the improvements are \$250,000.

The tax abatement agreement described herein will also appear on the agenda for the City Council meeting scheduled for October 2, 2023. This notice has been given in a manner required by the Texas Open Meetings Act at least 30 days before the scheduled time of the City Council meeting described in this notice.
