2. POLICE DEPARTMENT MANPOWER & CRIMINAL INCIDENT REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 2024

Chief Smith reported for the month of February 2024: 16 total manpower, 1,966 total manpower hours, 409 total calls and 12 total accidents. A breakdown of the criminal report is included in the packet.

3. FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY ACTIVITY & STATUS REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 2024

Fire Chief Frizzell reported for the month of February 2024 the following: 34 calls. A breakdown is included in the packet.

#### **BUSINESS**

4. PRESENTATION / DISCUSSION / ACCEPTANCE OF FISCAL YEAR 2023 FINANCIAL AUDIT

Molly Abele from the accounting firm of Axley & Rode presented the preliminary audit report. Ms. Abele stated they were issuing an unmodified opinion, which is the highest they can give and which states that everything is presented fairly in all material respects. She continued that city revenues increased slightly, about \$200,000, with the majority coming from property taxes and sales tax. City spending was also slightly above the previous year, but under the projected budget. Ms. Abele explained that the Crockett Economic and Industrial Development Corporation audit report shows revenues tied to sales tax increased slightly and expenditures were affected by an increase in legal fees. Ms. Abele noted the overall change was a small variance. Council member Ivey made a motion to accept the Fiscal Year 2023 Financial Audit. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 5-0.

5. CONSIDER AND APPROVE A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF CROCKETT, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOR THE DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to authorize the submission of a Texas Community Development Block Grant Program application to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the Downtown Revitalization Program. Council member Ivey seconded the motion. Motion passes 5-0.

6. CONSIDER AND APPROVE A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CROCKETT, TEXAS, DETERMINING THAT AN AREA OF THE CITY CONTAINS CONDITIONS WHICH ARE DETRIMENTAL TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY AND CONSTITUTES A BLIGHTED AREA

Mr. Angerstein noted that the boundaries of the blighted areas are as follows: North: Milam Avenue, South: E. Goliad Avenue, East: N. 6<sup>th</sup> Street, West: N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. Council member Beasley made a motion to approve a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Crockett, Texas, determining that an area of the City contains conditions which are detrimental to the public health, safety and welfare of the community and constitutes a blighted area. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 5-0.

7. CONSIDER AND APPROVE A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CROCKETT, TEXAS, SELECTING A GRANT WRITER / ADMINISTRATOR TO ASSIST THE CITY WITH THE SUBMITTAL OF AN APPLICATION FOR FUNDING AND ADMINISTRATION OF A CONTRACT, IF AWARDED, FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (TDA) FOR THE TEXAS COMMUNITY BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM – DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION PROGRAM FUND (CDBG-DRP)

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Crockett, Texas, selecting Traylor & Associates as a grant writer / administrator to assist the City with the submittal of an application for funding and administration of a contract, if awarded, from the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) for the Texas Community Block Grant Program – Downtown Revitalization Program Fund (CDBG-DRP).   existing buildings, location of existing streets, and location of driveway access to the mobile
  home (a survey plat identifying all of this information may substitute for the drawing); and
- \$100 fee to cover costs of application review and processing (cash, check or money order made out to City of Crockett, or credit card).







Sealed bids were received, publicly opened, and read aloud on the above referenced project on March 21, 2024, at 2:00 pm at Crockett City Hall. Only one bid was received as shown on the attached bid tabulation.

The notification and advertising process for this bid included advertisement in the local newspaper, electronic notifications to contractors and subcontractors, know to perform this type of work, and presentation of the plans and specifications on <a href="https://www.civastusa.com">www.civastusa.com</a>.

Crockett Construction from Crockett, Texas was the only bidder and submitted bids on all schedules. The low bid for all schedules was \$6,596,083.45 which is higher than the allowable funds available for construction on the project. Therefore, we recommend reducing the total bid amount by removing the water and street construction cost for Clark Street and North 10<sup>th</sup> Street. The reduction in construction cost yields a total project cost and award recommendation of \$5,524,786.45.

From review of the information provided in the contractor's bid proposal, and prior experience with the contractor, Crockett Construction appears to be qualified to perform the work and is capable of successfully completing the project.
