MINUTES OF THE CROCKETT CITY COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THE $5^{\rm th}$ DAY OF SEPTEMBER 2023 IN THE CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS, LOCATED AT 200 NORTH FIFTH IN THE CITY OF CROCKETT, HOUSTON COUNTY TEXAS AT 6:00 P.M.

THE COUNCIL MET IN SPECIAL SESSION WITH THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS PRESENT: IANTHIA FISHER, DENNIS IVEY, ERNEST JACKSON, MARQUITA BEASLEY & MIKE MARSH. CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: CITY ADMINISTRATOR JOHN ANGERSTEIN, CITY SECRETARY MITZI STEFKA, POLICE CHIEF CLAYTON SMITH, AND FIRE CHIEF JASON FRIZZELL. DARRELL JONES WAS ABSENT.

OPEN MEETING WITH INVOCATION AND PLEDGE

Mayor Fisher called the formal session open; Council member Jackson gave the invocation, and all joined in the pledge.

RECOGNITION OF VISITORS

Mayor Fisher recognized all visitors present.

- 1. REGULAR MEETING: AUGUST 21, 2023

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 21, 2023 Regular session. Council member Beasley seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

2. CONSIDER AND APPROVE AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CROCKETT, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER 10, GARBAGE AND TRASH OF THE CROCKETT CODE; AMENDING SECTION 10-29, RATES, TO CHANGE THE RATES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; CONTAINING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve an Ordinance of the City of Crockett, Texas amending Chapter 10, Garbage and Trash of the Crockett Code; amending Section 10-29, Rates, to change the rates; providing a severability clause; containing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

3. CONSIDER AND APPROVE APPOINTMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TO SERVE ON BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR DEEP EAST TEXAS COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS.

Council member Beasley made a motion to approve the appointment of Mayor Fisher to serve on the Board of Directors for Deep East Texas Council of Governments. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

4. AWARD BID: BANK DEPOSITORY SERVICES

Mr. Angerstein informed the council that the city had received one (1) response to the Request for Proposals. Council member Beasley made a motion to award the bid for bank and depository services to Prosperity Bank. Council member Ivey seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

5. AWARD BID: GASOLINE & DIESEL FUEL

Mr. Angerstein informed the council that the city had received two (2) responses to the Request for Proposals.

Mr. Angerstein explained that while Crockett Farm & Fuel had the higher bid, their willingness to provide emergency fuel supplies on short notice and their location within the city limits were very important to city services. Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to award the bid for gasoline and diesel fuel to Crockett Farm & Fuel. Council member Beasley seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

6. CONSIDER AND APPROVE AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CROCKETT, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 13, LICENSED AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, ARTICLE I, SECTION 13-1 OF THE CROCKETT CODE TO PROVIDE EXTENDED HOURS FOR THE SALE OF MIXED BEVERAGES AND MALT BEVERAGES FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; CONTAINING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve an ordinance of the City of Crockett, Texas, amending Chapter 13, Licensed and Business Regulations, Article I, Section 13-1 of the Crockett Code to provide extended hours for the sale of mixed beverages and malt beverages for on-premises consumption; providing a severability clause; containing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date. Council member Beasley seconded the motion. Motion passes 3-1. Council member Ivey opposed the motion.

7. CONSIDER AND APPROVE AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CROCKETT, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 13, LICENSES AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, ARTICLE I, OF THE CROCKETT CODE TO ADD SECTION 13-2 TO PROVIDE EXTENDED HOURS FOR PRIVATE CLUBS FOR THE ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; CONTAINING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Council member Beasley made a motion to approve an ordinance of the City of Crockett, Texas, amending Chapter 13, Licenses and Business Regulation, Article I, of the Crockett Code to add Section 13-2 to provide extended hours for private clubs for the on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages; providing a severability clause; containing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 3-1. Council member Ivey opposed the motion.

8. CONSIDER AND APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR AMENDMENTS TO FISCAL YEAR 2023 CROCKETT ECONOMIC & INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION BUDGET

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve the Resolution for amendments to Fiscal Year 2023 Crockett Economic and Industrial Development Corporation budget. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

 CONSIDER AND APPROVE 2023-2024 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET FOR THE CROCKETT ECONOMIC & INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Council member Ivey made a motion to approve the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year budget for the Crockett Economic and Industrial Development Corporation. Mayor Pro Tem Marsh seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

10. CONSIDER AND APPROVE PAYMENT OF INVOICES FROM CROCKETT ECONOMIC AND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve payment of invoices from Crockett Economic and Industrial Development Corporation. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

11. DISCUSSION REGARDING FIRE ENGINE AND LADDER TRUCK AND AUTHORIZING FIRE CHIEF TO SEEK PROPOSALS

Chief Frizzell informed council that the Crockett Fire Department ladder truck was out of service for its intended purpose after a recent inspection found several defects in various systems on the truck. The truck has been in service with the City for 23 years. The cost of repairing the defects would be approximately \$100,000. The cost of a frame-off refurbishment would be approximately \$600,000 - \$700,000. The cost of replacing the truck is approximately \$1,300,000. Chief Frizzell recommends the refurbishment option which should allow the city to get another 20+ years of service from the truck. Council member Ivey made a motion to give Chief Frizzell the authority to request proposals for

the refurbishment of the ladder truck. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

Chief Frizzell also informed council members that he was requesting quotes for replacing our 30-year-old fire engine. Council member Ivey amended his previous motion to include requesting quotes for replacing the fire engine. Council member Jackson seconded the amended motion. Motion passes 4-0.

12. DISCUSSION REGARDING POLICE VEHICLE FLEET AND AUTHORIZING POLICE CHIEF TO SEEK PROPOSALS

Chief Smith informed the council that the current police vehicles are reaching the end of their useful life and experiencing more downtime due to increased wear and tear. He asked council for approval to seek bids for two (2) new police vehicles. Council member Beasley made a motion to authorize Chief Smith to seek proposals for two (2) new vehicles. Council member Jackson seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-0.

13. DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF EXTENSION AND INSTALLATION OF WATER AND SEWER LINES FOR RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISION

Mr. Eldon Monk presented his proposal to build a new residential subdivision called "The Lakes" on the north side of Loop 304 within the City of Crockett roughly located between Highway 19 and the Consolidated Water offices. The development would consist of approximately 120-150 residential lots. Mr. Angerstein explained the need for council to consider sharing the cost of water and sewer line upgrades to serve this area. Mr. Angerstein estimated that the subdivision would produce approximately \$155,000 in additional utility revenue and approximately \$250,000 in additional ad-valorem tax revenue once fully developed. Chapter 212 of the Tax Code allows cities to subsidize up to 30 percent of the cost of public improvements in residential developments if funding is available and local ordinances are amended. The city's share of utility improvements would be approximately \$380,000 and the city's share of constructing public improvements would cost approximately \$800,000 if council approved the full 30% share. The City Council was united in their support for this project and directed Mr. Angerstein to move forward with research into ordinance amendments and allocation of funding for the development.

Christmas in Crockett 2023

PURPOSE: Below is a comprehensive list of modifications being implemented for the 41st Annual Christmas in Crockett to be held in November of 2023. The Crockett Area Chamber of Commerce organizers of the event are taking all necessary steps to ensure the safety and well-being of the participants and volunteers involved.

EVENT DESCRIPTION: Christmas in Crockett is an outdoor arts and crafts festival to be held Saturday, November 18, 2023. Vendor booths are placed around the downtown square and on Goliad and Houston Avenue. The event will open from 10 am until 4 pm with vendor set-up November 17 after 6 pm and at 6 am on November 18. All event activities will take place outdoors. NO indoor activities. A Food Court will be placed at Farmers Market Park with vendors leading to it from 5th street.

FRIDAY SET-UP: On Friday, Nov 17th, participant vendors are given the opportunity to find their booth spaces. Volunteers will guide the vendors to their booth spaces on the Square only after 6 pm. in the City Market Park.

SATURDAY SET-UP: Those vendors who arrive Saturday, Nov 18th, will be guided to their booth spaces by volunteers at two locations.

BREAK-DOWN: The festival will end at 4 pm and egress will be through Goliad, Houston and 4th street. Tables and seating will be cleaned and disinfected by volunteers throughout the day and Chamber volunteers will be in charge of specified areas to ensure guidelines are followed. Hand sanitizer and masks will be available for attendees and vendors, as well as hand washing stations. (see attached)


Vendor Booths


2023 Festival Map Downtown

AGREEMENT FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF STATE RIGHT OF WAY



In the event the local government does not remedy the breach to the satisfaction of the State, the local government shall be liable to the State for the costs of remedying the breach and any additional costs occasioned by the State.

Article 6. DISPUTES

Should disputes arise as to the parties' responsibilities or additional work under this agreement, the State's decision shall be final and binding.

Article 7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

The State and the Local Government agree that neither party is an agent, servant, or employee of the other party and each party agrees it is responsible for its individual acts and deeds as well as the acts and deeds of its contractors, employees, representatives, and agents.

Article 8. INSURANCE

A. Prior to beginning any work upon the State's right of way, the local government and/or its contractors shall furnish to the State a completed "Certificate of Insurance" (TxDOT Form 1560, latest edition) and shall maintain the insurance in full force and effect during the period Traffic_Closure Incorporated (TEA30A)

that the local government and/or its contractors are encroaching upon the State right of way. **B.** In the event the local government is a self-insured entity, the local government shall provide the State proof of its self-insurance. The local government agrees to pay any and all claims and damages that may occur during the period of this closing of the highway in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

Article 9. AMENDMENTS

Any changes in the time frame, character, agreement provisions or obligations of the parties hereto shall be enacted by written amendment executed by both the local government and the State.

Article 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The local government shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local environmental laws, regulations, ordinances and any conditions or restrictions required by the State to protect the natural environment and cultural resources of the State's right of way.

Article 11. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

Article 12. NOTICES

All notices to either party by the other required under this agreement shall be delivered personally or sent by certified U.S. mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such party at the following respective addresses:

All notices shall be deemed given on the date so delivered or so deposited in the mail, unless otherwise provided herein. Either party hereto may change the above address by sending written notice of such change to the other in the manner provided herein.

Article 13. SOLE AGREEMENT

This agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements respecting the within subject matter.





RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CROCKETT, TEXAS REQUESTING THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO REDESIGNATE TEXAS STATE HIGHWAYS 7, 19, AND 21 AND U.S. HIGHWAY 287 SO THEY RUN CONCURRENTLY WITH TX-LOOP 304 AND REDESIGNATE THE ORIGINAL FOOTPRINTS OF TEXAS HIGHWAYS 7, 19, AND 21 AND U.S. HIGHWAY 287 INSIDE TX-LOOP 304 BE DESIGNATED AS BUSINESS HIGHWAYS 7, 19, 21 AND 287

WHEREAS, Crockett is the county seat of Houston County, the first county established in the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Houston County courthouse is in the middle of a one-way courthouse circle in the center of downtown Crockett; and

WHEREAS, a unique feature of Crockett is that four highly trafficked major highways have routes that go through Crockett, resulting in a saying that "all roads lead to Crockett"; and

WHEREAS, those four highways are:

- 1. State Highway 7 east and west, which runs from Interstate 35 south of Waco, Texas, to U.S. Hwy 84 near the Texas-Louisiana state line;
- 2. State Highway 21, which runs from the Texas-Louisianan boundary east of San Augustine to San Marcos in east and central Texas;
- 3. State Highway 19, which runs from Huntsville, Texas, to Paris Texas
- 4. U.S. Hwy 287, which runs north and south from Port Arthur, Texas through Fort Worth and Amarillo into Oklahoma, Colorado, Wyoming, and Montana; and

WHEREAS, the existing routes for State Highways 7, 19, and 21 and U.S. Highway 287 run concurrently and intersect with local streets inside TX-Loop 304, including the one-way downtown courthouse circle; and

WHEREAS, semi-truck traffic and other excessive thru traffic on streets inside Loop 304 is detrimental to the safety of pedestrians and other drivers, especially around the courthouse square where drivers unfamiliar with the circle traffic pattern often drive the wrong way on the one-way circle and fail to yield to pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, rerouting State Highways 7, 19, and 21 and U.S. Highway 287 will improve traffic safety and allow traffic to move more efficiently through the City of Crockett.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: by the Crockett City Council that a request is made to the Texas Department of Transportation that State Highways 7, 19, and 21 and U.S. Highway 287 be redesignated to run concurrent with TX-Loop 304 and the existing routes of State Highways 7, 19, and 21 and U.S. Highway 287 inside TX-Loop 304 be designated as Business State Highways 7, 19, and 21 and Business U.S. Highway 287.
