Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve a resolution and agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation for the temporary closure of state right-of-way for Camp Street Blues Festival in Crockett. Council member Johnson seconded the motion. Motion passes 5-0.

5. CONSIDER AND APPROVE TEMPORARY STREET CLOSURE OF 3RD STREET (CAMP STREET) FROM FANNIN STREET TO HOUSTON AVE. AND FANNIN STREET FROM 2ND TO 4TH STREET AND 2ND STREET FROM GOLIAD TO FANNIN FOR THE CAMP STREET BLUES FESTIVAL

Council member Johnson made a motion to approve the temporary street closure of 3rd Street (Camp Street) from Fannin Street to Houston Avenue and Fannin Street from 2nd to 4th Street and 2nd Street from Goliad Avenue to Fannin Street for the Camp Street Blues Festival. Mayor Pro Tem Marsh seconded the motion. Motion passes 5-0.

6. CONSIDER AND APPROVE THE TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF CROCKETT CODE ARTICLE IV., SECTION 15- 24 LIMITED TO THE EVENT AREA AND TIME FRAME DESCRIBED IN CAMP STREET BLUES FESTIVAL MAP

Council member Johnson made a motion to approve the temporary suspension of Crockett Code Article IV., Section 15-24 limited to the event area and time frame described in Camp Street Blues Festival map. Council member Price seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-1. Council member Ivey voted against.

7. CONSIDER AND APPROVE WHETHER TO ENTER INTO A SHARED USE AGREEMENT WITH CROCKETT EYE CLINIC FOR THE USE OF AND IMPROVEMENTS TO A CITY PARKING LOT NEAR THE PUBLIC LIBRARY

Mr. Angerstein explained that Crockett Eye Clinic had inquired about a shared use agreement with the City of Crockett regarding the parking lot near Crockett Public Library. This lot would be a benefit to elderly and disabled patients at the clinic. The clinic expressed the willingness to share some of the costs required to improve the lot to make it suitable for both library and clinic parking. Council member Hicks voiced concerns about a shared use agreement. Mr. Angerstein explained that any potential agreement between the two parties would be presented to council for approval. Mayor Pro Tem Marsh made a motion to approve entering into a shared use agreement with Crockett Eye Clinic for the use and improvements to a city parking lot near the public library. Council member Ivey seconded the motion. Motion passes 4-1. Council member Hicks voted against.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Crockett, Texas finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Crockett, Texas that the **Event Security and Lighting Enhancement through Generator Light Towers** project through the **Homeland Security Grant Program** be operated for 2026; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Crockett, Texas approves the submission of the grant application for the **Event Security and Lighting Enhancement through Generator Light Towers – Homeland Security Grant Program** to the Office of the Governor.

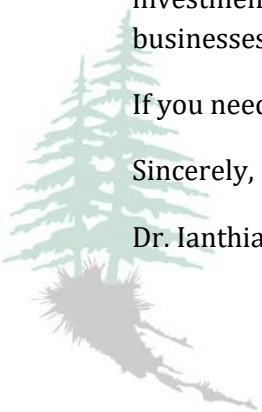
