CALL TO ORDER - ROLL CALL

CITY OFFICIAL REPORTS

Police Chief - Chief Layman dispelled rumors of three new patrol cars. We have not received any new cars.

City Administrator - He stated will break ground on Monday, October 16th for the new municipal facility. We met with the insurance representative for builders risk insurance. The price is \$6710 for 12 months. Motion made by Councilmember Ancich to approve the purchase of the builders risk insurance, Seconded by Councilmember Carlisle. Voting Yea: Councilmember Makos, Councilmember Carlisle, Councilmember Ancich, Councilmember Robinson

He stated the compost program is closed due to budget cuts. Would like to have public input to determine if citizens are willing to pay a fee to keep the program going.

Fire Chief - Two volunteers attended and passed the academy that went last month. The Firefighter 1 academy starts in January. We will have five volunteers going. One of them will get a hazmat certification. The Grays Harbor County Fire Chiefs Association and the Washington State Patrol are funding this. There is no cost to the City. EMT classes in January. We will have one person going. We did not get approved for the Firehouse Sub grant. We will try to find another way to purchase personal protective equipment. September 19th the burn ban was lifted.

Public Works Superintendent - The street lights in Paisley Creek are out. We want to retrofit them to LED. There is a TIB grant to fund this. He is asking permission to apply for the TIB grant.

Motion made by Councilmember Carlisle to give permission to apply for a grant through the TIB, Seconded by Councilmember Ancich.

Voting Yea: Councilmember Makos, Councilmember Carlisle, Councilmember Ancich, Councilmember Robinson

Section 8, ItemB.

Last Friday, they replaced culvert by the county shop. There has been flooding there every The culverts had roots from trees in them. This should be a noticeable difference.

Finance Director - Director Pope stated she and the city administrator reached out to the State Auditor's Office to discuss their LEAN services. This is free to the City. She met with the insurance agent regarding renewal. We are looking at 15-25% increase. The preliminary general fund budget is still in process. We will have a department head meeting to work on the budget. The drive through window will be closed on October 16th due to construction. Currently, 40% of our utility payments are now being processed through Xpress Bill Pay. There will be a 6:00 workshop at the next Council meeting to discuss the revenue budget.

8. MAYOR'S REPORT

We are still looking at the budget and projections. There have recently been cuts in staffing and more will be needed to remain solvent. Councilmember Wenzel resigned due to personal changes in his life. We are taking letters of interest for the position until October 13th.

9. EXECUTIVE SESSION - To discuss Current or Potential Litigation per RCW 42.30.110(1)(i)

Mayor Pauley convened the executive session at 7:26 for 10 minutes. Regular session resumed at 7:39.

Informational Items Only

Item 1) *Municipal Building Update-* Since my last report, there have been a few scheduling changes for the new Municipal Building. Here are a few milestone dates for the project:

October 13, 2023 – Groundbreaking Ceremony, Mobilization

October 16 - Mobilization

October 17,18 – Pile Driving

October 19, 2023 - January 12, Foundation Prep and Pouring

January 12, 2024 – April 19, 2024, Seasonal Shutdown

Item 2) *C Street School Zone Lights*- This project is now complete with all systems working correctly.

Item 3) *Community Foundation Grant*- We did receive a \$2,500 grant from the Community Foundation for the Light the Corridor Project.

Items Needing Action

Item 4) I Street Right of Way Vacations- There will be a Public Hearing for the potential vacating of twenty feet of right of way on I Street between First Street and Southside Levy. This would be a vacation of ten feet on both sides of I Street, reducing the overall right of way from eighty feet to sixty feet, and would not block any access to the waterfront area. All sidewalks will remain within the public right of way.

When the streets between First and Sixth Street, and A through J Streets were platted, they were set at 80 foot right of way. A standard street right of way is sixty feet. Over the last thirty plus years, (as shown on attachment Vacated Streets) several of our streets have been reduced from eighty feet to sixty feet right of way.

We have a request to vacate ten feet right of way from the landowner who owns the parcel between I and H Streets and between First Street and the Southside Levy (*see attached aerial photo* **Proposed I Street Vacation**), **parcel #031001200000**. They want to make the entrance to their property come off I Street rather than First Street, which will be much safer.


Item 5) *Utility Easement for Parcel 031001200000-* This item is related to Item 4; in that we need a 10-foot utility easement for water and sewer in what was the platted 10-foot alley for this parcel. To the best of our knowledge and the research that we have done, the City of Cosmopolis vacated the platted alley for Parcel 031001200000 sometime in the early 80's. The problem is the water and sewer mains are already located in what was the alley.


I have discussed this with the owners of the property, and we have a proposed solution that would be the most cost effective for the City. In exchange for a 10-foot easement for the water and sewer utilities, we would grant the property, Parcel 031001200000 free <u>water and sewer connection fees</u> for whenever they are ready to be installed. Currently each connection would cost \$1,000 plus expenses. This item will need approval by the City Council if we want to proceed.

Council Report 11/01/2023

At the last council meeting we reported working on a grant through the Bullet Proof Vest Partnership. We were awarded funding that will replace one vest for a full-time officer. Our reserve program needed a new vest and are now able to purchase one using the donations that were raised by Ann Peery's lemonade stand. *Thank you Ann Peery!*

We have been contacting a higher number of subjects walking the streets in the middle of the night that do not reside in Cosmopolis. We responded to an assault incident where one of the subjects involved sustained substantial injury. We are investigating a couple fraud cases that involve stolen documents and trafficking stolen property.

Our full-time officers completed their quarterly firearms training, and our reserve officers completed firearms training on 10/27.

As of 10/10/2023 Deputy Chief Miskell has been with our department for five years. He is now on his 11^{th} year in civilian law enforcement. Congratulations to Ryan for his five years of service to the city.

We assisted Airlift Northwest and CFD/AFD with a landing zone at the Elementary School, recovered a stolen vehicle, and made several arrests since we last met with the council.

We were approved for the pre-application on the LE Pursuit Technology Grant. I am continuing to work with HPD and GHCSO on this project through a multi-agency approach.

-ACTION ITEM- I am asking for authorization to begin the application process for grants through "The Spirit of Blue" organization, a possible funding source for "enhancement of officer safety and vitality throughout the LE community by promoting public awareness for their protection and fulfilling safety equipment and training needs."

We received a donation from F.C.I. Custom Police Vehicles out of North Bend, WA of 3 sets of wheels/tires that fit our PPV Tahoe's that we were in desperate need of! Reserve Officer Adam Johnson is picking them up on 10/27.

We had 216 calls for service between 09/29/2023 and 10/27/23.

Re: Contract for Garbage, Recyclables and Yard Waste Collection, Annual Rate adjustment

Dear Mayor and Council Members,

The Company is requesting the garbage and recycling rates to be adjusted effective January 1, 2024, pursuant to item 32 of the Garbage and Curbside Recycling Contract.

The Consumer Price Index for the year ending June 2023 has increased 6.85%. The contract allows 80% of the CPI for a 5.48% increase. Per contract there is also a 5% cap on the CPI, reducing the 5.48% increase to a 5% CPI increase on existing rates.

The contract also allows the pass through of any disposal increase. Effective January 1, 2024, the tip fee at the Central Transfer Station is increasing from \$121.11 to \$127.69 per ton for an increase of \$6.58 per ton.

Also, pursuant Item 32, section B, subsection 4 of the Garbage and Curbside Recycling Contract. LeMay proposes the pass through of costs due to the recent implementation of Washington's Climate Commitment Act. LeMay now faces a carbon fee on all fuel purchases. The fee will be adjusted annually with complete transparency to all Cosmopolis Residents by having a specific line item on the invoice.

The rate adjustments are detailed by level of service in the attached exhibit.
