### Background Information:

On September 2, 2021, the BOC awarded a contract to Federal Engineering. On July 7, 2022, the BOC approved the 700/800 MHz trunked system draft plans from Federal Engineering for the project. The estimated cost from Federal Engineering was \$10,000,000 - \$13,500,000. On December 15, 2022, the BOC approved to utilize \$3,000,000 of SPLOST VII funds for the project.

### Current Information:

Federal Engineering finalized the specifications per the BOC direction and the RFP for the construction services for the radio system upgrade was released on December 27, 2022. The RFP opened on April 27, 2023, receiving 2 proposals; Communications International for \$17,150,085.22 and Motorola Solutions at \$9,296,495. Request for Clarifications from both proposers continued through September 20, 2023. Negotiations with Motorola began on September 28, 2023, and completed around November 3, 2023. This included revised scope of work for towers, site work, equipment, the location of the E911/EOC building tower and pricing. The final negotiated price is \$9,843,873. The county is requesting a 10% county-controlled contingency of \$984,387.30 (not to be part of the Motorola contract). The total project not-to-exceed cost is \$10,828,260.30.

# Background

- ❖ During the February 2021 Work and Voting Sessions, the topic of an update to the current radio system was discussed.
- ❖ The Board of Commissioners directed the then Public Works Director/SPLOST Coordinator to determine the cost of contracting with a systems expert consultant.
- ❖ After the completion of an RFI, the Board of Commissioners voted to approve a professional exemption for and enter into an agreement with Federal Engineering to design both a P25 portable VHF and 800 MHz plan.
- ❖ The BOC approved the RFP for the radio system upgrade to be released on July 7, 2022. This was released on December 27, 2022 and opened on April 27, 2023.



# SCOPE COMPLIANCE MATRIX

- ❖ Federal Engineering developed a compliance matrix to be answered and adhered to by each proposer which consisted of approximately 135 points. These points are listed within 6 major sections:
  - Project Scope/Standards & Guidelines/Network Security Requirements
  - Project 25 Trunked Radio System
  - Microwave Backhaul System
  - Site Development
  - System Implementation, Test and Acceptance
  - Warranty.
- ❖ Motorola Solutions is in compliance with all points and exceeds requirements in 8 instances in the following areas:

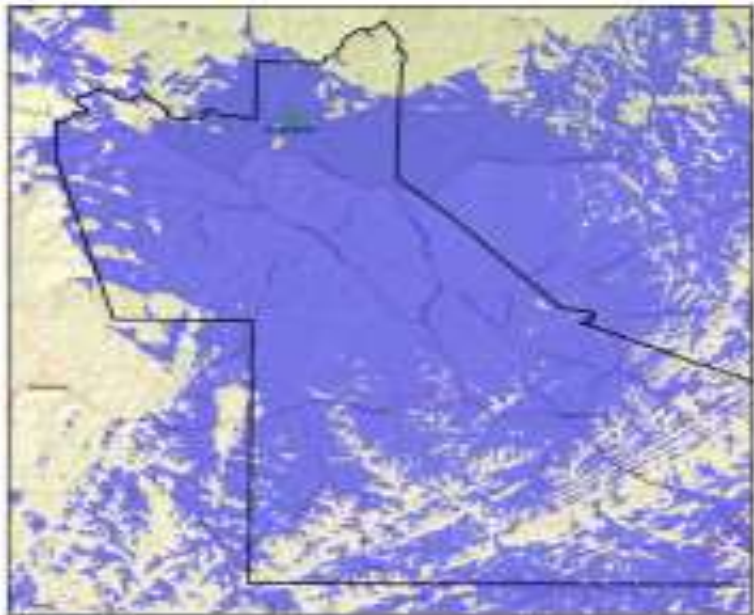

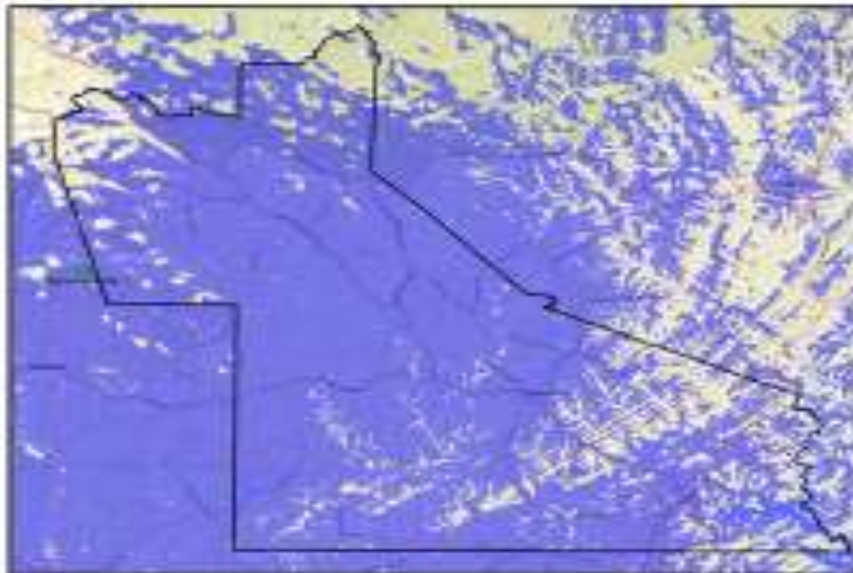

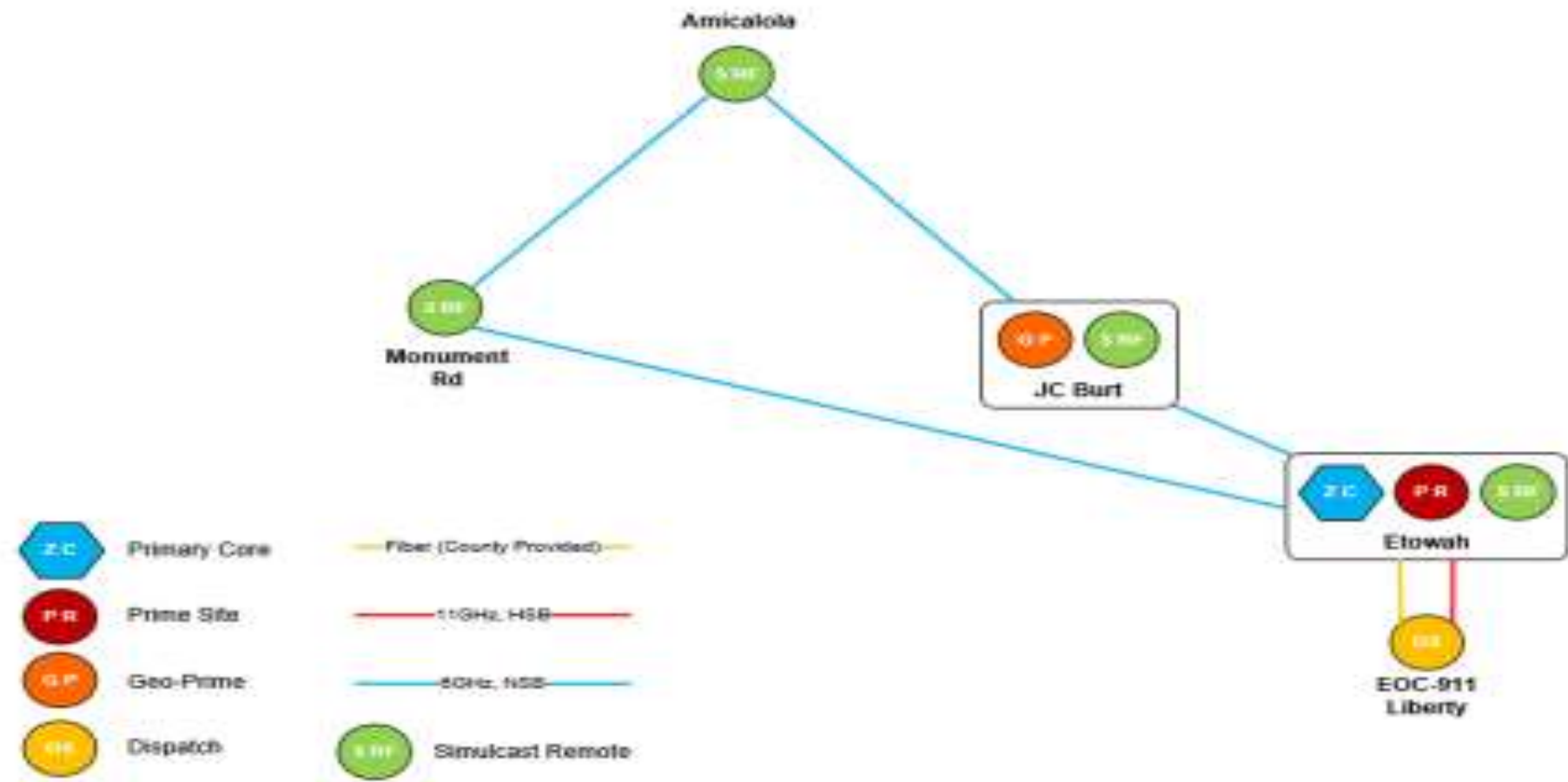
