#### Crime and Crash Statistics for April 2019

# General

There were 90 Part 1 crimes reported in May 2019 versus 82 in May of 2018. May 2019 had approximately 26% more larcenies than the same time in 2018. There were approximately 47% less burglaries in May 2019 when compared to May 2018. In April 2019 there were five more aggravated assaults than in 2018. Year-to-date Part 1 crimes are down 6.09% from 2018.

# Analysis

In the year-to-date 2019 there have been 463 Part 1 crimes reported versus 493 in 2018 which shows an approximate decrease of 6.09%. There have been 2 robberies reported YTD, which is a decrease of approximately 75.00% when compared to 2019. There have been 7 reported rapes, which is higher than 2018, but on average with previous years.

There have been 34 violent crimes reported 2019 YTD compared to 28 reported violent crimes YTD 2018. Year-to-date property crimes have shown a decrease of approximately 7.74% when compared to 2018 YTD statistics.

Based on the statistics from the previous 5 years, property crime numbers are lower than the normal range for year-to-date statistics in May based on the past five years. Year-to-date violent crime numbers are in the normal range based on the past five years.

# Summary of Significant Events for May 2019

During the month of May 2019 there were multiple thefts and damage to vacant apartments owned by Hamilton Medical Center in the area of Applewood Dr. There were five reports of stolen vehicles during the month. There were nine burglaries reported during this time frame. There were eleven reported aggravated assaults.

19-003643 **Entering** Auto 708 Hackney Dr The complainant reported the theft of credit cards and a work laptop from an unlocked vehicle in the driveway. The cards were used shortly after the theft. Detectives were able to get a suspect from surveillance footage. Upon further investigation three arrests were made for multiple fraud related incidents stemming from this theft. 19-003004 Burglary 181 Grace St. The complainant reported a burglary to the business and several tools were taken. There was not enough evidence to develop leads in this case. 19-003035 DUI W. Emery St / Georgian Pl The driver was traveling eastbound on Emery St approaching Georgian Pl when his vehicle left the side of the roadway. He then traveled approximately 200 feet through the grass and then continued eastbound. The driver struck and destroyed approximately 10 grave markers. Officers requested that the driver perform field sobriety and he agreed, but performed poorly. The driver was placed under arrest for DUI and read the new implied consent warning and he refused testing. He was transported to WCSO and charged with failure to maintain lane and DUI. 19-003048 Aggravated Assault 900 Autumn Ct The victim reported that her boyfriend choked her, held a screwdriver to her neck, and bit her on the face during an altercation at her residence. Warrants were taken and the suspect was later arrested for the charges of aggravated assault and battery.

19-003051Aggravated Assault (FV)300 Robinwood DrOfficers responded to a domestic dispute called in by a 13 year old child at the residence. The victim reportedthat her husband struck her in the head with a potted plant, which caused a large knot to appear on herforehead. EMS was called to the scene to check the victim. The suspect was charged and transported to WCSOwithout incident.

19-003134Sex Offense1212 Broadrick DrA patient of the assisted living home reported that she had been sexually assaulted with in the last few weeks.The manager of the home had already notified a social worker who was looking into the complaint.

19-003273 **Entering** Auto 815 Shugart Rd The complainant reported that she left her purse in the front seat of her car and forgot to lock the door to her vehicle. When she returned the purse was gone. The only camera that focused on that area was not working.

19-003357 Burglary 801 Chattanooga Ave The complainant reported a burglary to her apartment. The key to her apartment was left under the door mat. The items taken belonged to the school. The items were later found in the lobby of the apartments under a bench.

19-003379 Aggravated Battery 515 N Selvidge St Officers responded to a physical domestic and located a female who had been severely beaten by her husband. He had struck her numerous times in the face and head, bit off part of her eyelid, and choked her because his dinner was cold. He also struck their four year old in the face causing injury to her nose. The victims were transported to HMC for treatment. The suspect was arrested and charged with multiple family violence offenses.

19-003396 **Recovered Vehicle** 905 West Bridge Officers were flagged down at the Comfort Inn by the desk clerk in reference to a subject who they believed to be intoxicated that had just came in and left in a vehicle. The vehicle pulled up behind the officer and contact was made with the driver. She was not intoxicated, but was acting very suspicious. It was determined after further investigation that the driver had stolen the vehicle from a gas station in Chattanooga about 40 mins prior. The vehicle was confirmed stolen. The driver was arrested and the vehicle was turned over to the owner.

19-003463 & 19-003464 **Stolen Vehicles** 330 N Tibbs; Civitan Park Two vehicles were stolen from Civitan Park. One of the owners left his cell phone in the vehicle and was able to track the vehicle's direction. The suspects traveled to Chattanooga, TN. Chattanooga Police Department located the vehicles. One subject was located by Chattanooga Police and arrested. Detectives were called in and responded to Chattanooga to question the suspects. Both vehicles were recovered and returned to the owners. The case is currently active.

19-003499 2212 Mount Haven Burglary The complainant reported that several items were stolen from inside the residence including a 50" television, a fireproof safe, and an HP laptop. The case is currently active.



# I. Policy

Inspections of the Department shall be conducted on a regular basis to ensure that the Department is operating efficiently and in compliance with established professional standards, and to promote the Dalton Police Department mission, maintain standards of ethical behavior, and ensure that critical services provided by the Agency meet community expectations. Inspections enable the Department to assess its ability to perform its mission, and provide the necessary information to plan for improvements.

# II. Definitions

- A. *Line Inspection* The process by which any Supervisor can review and observe an employee's activity to ensure the proper compliance with Departmental procedures, rules, and regulations. These inspections are not limited to persons, but also include all facility components used by the Department.
- B. Staff Inspection An in-depth examination of a specific operational, administrative, or facility component of the Department.
- C. *Facility Components* The physical structure of the Police Services Center and all Department owned equipment and furnishings.

# III. Line Inspections

- A. All Department Supervisors are responsible for inspecting the general condition of personnel and facility components on a daily basis.
  - 1. Supervisors shall conduct inspections by observing assigned personnel during the Supervisor's scheduled work period. He / she shall ensure that the agency uniform, civilian attire, and appearance standards are maintained. As necessary, the Supervisor will take corrective actions.
  - 2. Supervisors will also observe their assigned facilities and office areas to ensure overall cleanliness, order, and the presence of necessary equipment and supplies. As necessary, the Supervisor will take corrective actions.

- B. At least once each quarter, Supervisors will be responsible for ensuring that a documented inspection of the personal appearance of all personnel under their command is conducted. This inspection of personal appearance will include an inspection of the uniform / civilian attire and personal equipment.
- C. Any Supervisor discovering a deficiency that could not be immediately corrected will follow-up to ensure that corrective action is taken within a reasonable length of time.

# IV. Staff Inspections

Staff inspections will be conducted at the discretion of the Chief of Police.

A. Inspection Teams

All inspection teams will consist of a Department Supervisor and an adequate number of personnel to complete the examination of the component or function in question. It is recommended that inspection teams consist of members assigned to a division separate from the one being inspected.

During the inspection, the inspectors will be granted the necessary access to all facilities, records, reports, files and personnel. This process may include on-site inspections, interviews, records research or other observations required to obtain information upon which a factual report can be based.

B. Areas Subject to Inspection

Staff inspections will be conducted within all organizational components at least once every three years. All Department functions and facility components will be subject to inspection at the discretion of the Chief of Police. Inspections may include, but are not limited to, one or more of the following areas:

- 1. Effectiveness of Departmental organization, i.e. functioning of command and supervision structure
- 2. Compliance with Certification / Accreditation Standards
- 3. Compliance with local, state, and federal regulations
- 4. Adequate use of resources
- 5. Proper preparation and maintenance of reports and computer records
- 6. Adequate intradepartmental communication
- 7. Uniform application of Department policies throughout the organization
- 8. Adequate Recruitment and Selection Procedures
- 9. Accuracy and timeliness of written reports
- 10. Effectiveness of investigative procedures and case handling
- 11. Effective administration of Department training programs
- 12. Proper use and maintenance of facility components and equipment

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# C. Inspection Reports

The Supervisor of the inspection team shall prepare a written report of the inspection finding and submit the report to the Chief of Police. The report shall identify deficiencies and make recommendations for their improvement and / or correction. The report shall also include the positive aspects of the area being inspected.

All functions or components found to be deficient during the inspection shall be corrected. A follow-up written report for noted deficiencies that cannot be immediately corrected shall be completed. In some instances, the Chief of Police may direct a component or function to be re-inspected after corrections are made.

This policy supersedes any previous policies issued.

# I. Policy

The City of Dalton Police Department maintains a "Zero Tolerance Policy" toward drug or alcohol use or possession of any prohibited substance as defined in this policy.

# II. Definition

# A. "CITY and DEPARTMENT"

- 1. The term "City" as used in this policy shall mean the City of Dalton, Georgia, its departments, bureaus, or other management subdivisions, its directors, managers, supervisors, elected and appointed officials, and agents acting in its behalf.
- 2. The term "Department" means the City of Dalton Police Department, its Chief, superior officers, managers, supervisors and employees, including both sworn and non-sworn officers and civilian employees.

# B. "CITY PREMISES"

The term "City premises" as used in this policy includes: all property, facilities, land, platforms, buildings, surfaces, fixtures, installations, parking lots, automobiles, and any other vehicle, whether owned leased or used by the City, or its departments, divisions, officers, managers, supervisors, employees, or other agents. This definition also includes locations other than the City's administration buildings or departmental headquarters, police stations, or departmental offices or premises including all locations where City employees are performing their public job functions, all locations of City-sponsored recreational, social, or educational events, and any place where such a City employee is located while traveling to or from such locations in the course and scope of his duties on behalf of the City, including when the employee is in the employee's own vehicle while the vehicle is being used on City business, or when the vehicle is parked on City property.

This definition shall not be interpreted to imply that either the City or its Police Department assumes or accepts responsibility for any wrongful, tortuous, negligent or criminal acts of any person whom it employs when such persons are not acting pursuant to Department or City instructions in furtherance of the City's business ends on official Department business, nor shall it be interpreted as a waiver of any immunity which the City might have under federal, state or local laws or ordinances.

### C. "ILLICIT CHEMICAL SUBSTANCE"

The term "illicit chemical substance" shall mean any measurable amount of any drugs, controlled substances such as amphetamines, cannabinoids, cocaine, phencyclidine (PCP), methadone, methagualene, opiates, barbiturates. benzodiazepines, propoxyphene, or other drugs made unlawful under federal or state laws, including O.C.G.A. §16-13-25, 16-13-26, 16-13-27, 16-13-28, 16-13-29 (but the term "illicit chemical substances" shall not include those substances included in O.C.G.A. §16-13-27.1 or 16-13-29.1), or a metabolite of any such substances, "look-alikes", "designer drugs" having the same or similar psychotropic effects, unauthorized alcoholic beverages, marijuana, hallucinogens (whether derived from natural or synthetic manufactured sources), unauthorized prescription drugs, or authorized drugs which are not prescribed for a verifiable medical condition and/or used in strict accordance with this policy and with the prescribing physician's instructions, or any other substance that is mood altering, mind or consciousness affecting, or which is likely to have any affect upon a person's perceptions, sensations, thought processes, self-awareness, emotions, or other mental or physiological or psychological reactions or behavior. It also includes urinaid or any other substance of a similar nature or purpose designed or used to alter a urine specimen or to conceal such illicit chemical substances or their metabolites in an initial screening test.

This policy shall not include prescription medicines authorized by a physician for a verifiable medical condition, when such medicines are utilized in strict accord with the prescribing physician's instructions and Department policies.

Notwithstanding any contrary provision contained in this Policy, this policy shall not prohibit or otherwise apply to those substances, which would otherwise be included within the definition of "illicit chemical substance" where an employee lawfully possesses such substances in the line of duty for the sole purposes of law enforcement and administration of justice.

#### D. "UNAUTHORIZED ITEMS"

As used in this policy, the term "unauthorized item" shall refer to: unauthorized firearms, weapons, explosives, ammunition, any stolen property, and any drug paraphernalia such as syringes (other than those needed for the employee's own medical condition such as diabetes) or such other items as included in O.C.G.A. §16-13-1, including but not limited to bongs, cocaine pipes, roach clips, or other items commonly associated with unauthorized drug use, where there are signs

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that such paraphernalia has been used for drug ingestion in violation of this policy.

Notwithstanding any contrary provision contained in this Policy, this policy shall not prohibit or otherwise apply to those items, which would otherwise be included within the definition of "unauthorized items" where an employee lawfully possesses them in the line of duty solely for the purpose of law enforcement and administration of justice.

#### E. "PERSON"

As used in this policy, the term "person" shall refer to: all employees, job candidates, agents, and contractors of the City of Dalton Police Department, including sworn and non-sworn employees, officers, managers, supervisors, and civilian employees.

This policy shall be applied to all such persons except where otherwise officially authorized by law or Department policy.

#### F. "ALCOHOL"

"Alcohol" means ethyl alcohol, hydrated oxide of ethyl or spirits of wine, from whatever source or by whatever process produced.

#### G. "POSITIVE TEST RESULTS"

As used in this policy, "positive test results" means a written report from the NIDA or other HHS-certified laboratory of a confirmation test on a particular employee's specimen revealing the presence of alcohol, drugs, or other illicit chemical substances or their metabolites within the specimen.

#### H. "CHAIN OF CUSTODY"

As used in this policy, "chain of custody" means the methodology of tracking specified materials, specimens, or substances for the purpose of maintaining control and accountability from initial collection to final disposition for all such materials, specimens or substances and for providing for accountability at each stage of handling, testing and storing materials and reporting test results.

# I. "CONFIRMATION TEST"

As used in this policy "confirmation test," "confirmed test," or "confirmed substance abuse test" is a second analytical procedure used after an initial screening test to identify the presence of a threshold detection level of a specific drug or metabolite in a specimen. A confirmation test must be different in scientific principal from that of the initial screening test procedure. This confirmation method must be capable of providing requisite specificity, sensitivity, and quantitative accuracy that is at least as accurate as the gas chromatography/mass spectrometry (GC/MS) method.

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# J. "INITIAL SCREENING TEST"

As used in this policy, an "initial test" or "initial screening test" is a sensitive, rapid and reliable procedure to identify negative and presumptive positive specimens. All initial tests shall use an immunoassay procedure or an equivalent procedure or shall use a more accurate scientifically acceptable method approved by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), as such more accurate technology becomes available in a cost effective form.

#### K. "JOB CANDIDATE"

As used in this policy a "job candidate" means a person who has applied for a position with the Department and who has been offered employment, conditioned upon successfully passing a substance abuse test, and may include such persons who have begun work pending the results of the substance abuse test.

# L. "THRESHOLD DETECTION LEVEL"

As used in this policy the "threshold detection level" means the level at which the presence of alcohol, a drug or other illicit chemical substance, or their metabolites, can be reasonably expected to be detected by an initial screening test and a confirmation test performed by a laboratory meeting the standards specified in this policy and in Article 34 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated. The threshold detection level indicates the level at which a valid conclusion can be drawn that the alcohol, drug or other illicit chemical substance is present in the individual's specimen.

# M. "EMPLOYEE"

As used in this policy "employee" means any person who works for salary, wages, or other compensation for the City of Dalton Police Department.

# N. "EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM"

As used in this policy, "Employee Assistance Program" or "EAP" means a program designed to assist in the identification and resolution of job performance problems associated with employees impaired by personal concerns. The department's Employee Assistance Plan includes a list maintained by the Human Resources Director for the City of Dalton of professionals and organizations providing counseling, consultation, training, and professional, confidential, appropriate, and timely problem assessment services for persons dealing with problems of and related to addiction to alcohol or illegal substances, which shall include short-term problem resolution, referrals for appropriate diagnosis, treatment, and assistance, follow-up and monitoring, employee education, and quality assurance. Nothing in this Policy shall require the City of Dalton or its Police Department to provide or pay for services other than the providing of information about such resources for assessment and counseling of employees concerning their problems relating to substance abuse or other personal problems which impact their jobs.

#### O. "EMPLOYER"

As used in the policy "employer" means the City of Dalton, its Police Department, its Chief, Division Commanders, Captains, Lieutenants, Sergeants (collectively referred to as "Superior Officers"), and its Commissioners, Public Safety Commission and its members, and the Mayor, and other elected and appointed officials of the City of Dalton.

#### P. "NON-PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION"

As used in the policy "non-prescription medication" means a drug or medication authorized pursuant to federal or state law for general distribution and use without a prescription in the treatment of human disease, ailments, or injuries.

#### Q. "REASONABLE SUSPICION TESTING"

"Reasonable suspicion testing" means substance abuse testing based on a belief that an employee is using or has used drugs or alcohol in violation of the employer's policy, drawn from specific, objective, and articulable facts and reasonable inferences drawn from those facts in light of experience. Among other things, such facts and inferences may be based upon but are not limited to, observable phenomena while at work such as those behaviors as described in Section VIII of the Standard Practice Instruction. Reasonable suspicion testing may also include testing after an employee is involved in an accident which causes damage to property or injury when, in the judgment of the employee's superior, the circumstances surrounding the accident or injury suggest that such testing may be appropriate, or pursuant to Departmental Regulations or Orders.

#### R. "REHABILITATION PROGRAM"

As used in the policy, "rehabilitation program" means an established program capable of providing expert identification, assessment, and resolution of employee drug or alcohol abuse in a confidential and timely service. This service shall in all cases be provided by persons licensed or appropriately certified as health professionals to provide drug or alcohol rehabilitative services.

#### S. "SPECIMEN"

"Specimen" as used in the policy means tissue, blood, breath, urine, or other product of the human body capable of revealing the presence of drugs or their metabolites or of alcohol.

#### T. "SUBSTANCE"

"Substance" means drug or alcohol.

### U. "SUBSTANCE ABUSE TEST" OR "TEST"

As used in the policy "substance abuse test" or "test" means any chemical, biological, or physical instrumental analysis administered for the purpose of determining the presence or absence of a drug or its metabolites or of alcohol.

V. "CHIEF"

As used in the policy "Chief" refers to the Chief of Police of the City of Dalton, or his designee.

#### III. Procedures

- A. Unless otherwise required by federal or state law, the City of Dalton Police Department does not discriminate against persons on the basis of an individual's medical history of addiction to either drugs or alcohol, so long as there is no evidence or indication of the individual's current abuse of such substances, nor of the individual's violation of this policy, nor any history of criminal activity involving such use. This non-discrimination policy shall not apply to any refusal to hire, or other discrimination against any individual who has been convicted of any crime.
- B. Except as otherwise permitted in this Policy, the use, possession, concealment, transportation, promotion, or sale of any drugs, unauthorized alcoholic beverages, or other illicit or chemical substances or of any unauthorized items by any person on City premises is strictly prohibited. Because of the medical difficulty of determining the precise amount of any chemical substance which may cause intoxication or impair a person's mental, sensory, or emotional faculties, any use of drugs or illicit chemical substances away from City premises on a person's off duty time shall be treated as a violation of this policy if it leaves any detectable amounts of the substance within the person's bodily fluids when that individual is on City premises on duty. Persons found with such substances in their bodily fluids shall be considered unfit for duty and shall be removed from City premises.
- C. All managers, supervisors and employees shall have the duty to take whatever lawful steps are necessary in order to ensure the compliance with this policy by all persons who are on City premises. Any person who knowingly permits another person to violate this policy without informing a superior officer, manager, or supervisor, or without taking other action to prevent such a violation shall be subject to discipline including termination.
- D. Prescription drugs may be utilized by persons on City premises only under the following conditions:

- 1. All prescription medicines must be stored in their original pharmacy container. No person may possess a prescription drug that is more than one year old. Employees, whose medical conditions require the use of a syringe for the administration of insulin, or other medically required substances, must comply with the notification provisions set forth in subparagraph C. 2.
- 2. All persons using prescription drugs which are mood altering, mind or consciousness-affecting, or which are likely to have any affect upon the individual's perceptions, sensations, thought processes, self-awareness, emotions, or other mental, or physical reactions or behavior while working shall inform their Division Commander, the Chief or the Department's Medical Review Officer of the name of the drug, the name of the prescribing physician, the date of the prescription, and the condition for which the medicine was prescribed, and shall execute, upon request, a release permitting the prescribing physician to release to the Department's Medical Review Officer such information as is required to confirm that the employee is fit for duty and is in compliance with this policy.
- 3. The Department reserves the right at all times to require that such person submit to an examination by the Department's Medical Review Officer, and to rely upon the advice, findings, or conclusions of the Medical Review Officer in determining whether the individual is fit for duty.
- E. No drug test shall be administered to a candidate until after a job offer has been made to the candidate. No candidate to whom a job offer has been made shall be permitted to begin working until the candidate has taken and has passed a drug and alcohol-screening test. All candidates shall be tested through urinalysis or other means for presence of alcohol, drugs or other illicit chemical substances in their bodily fluids. Any candidate who refuses to submit to such a test, or whose tests reveal the presence of such chemical substances shall not be considered for employment.
- F. No test of any specimen found to be positive (i.e., indicating the presence of alcohol, drugs, or an illicit chemical substance) or which is suspected of having been adulterated, tampered with in the initial test, shall be considered conclusive unless it is first subjected to a second confirming test or analytic procedure used to identify the alcohol, drug or specific metabolite, using a different scientific principle from that employed in the initial test procedure. The confirming test shall be performed by a NIDA or other federal Health and Human Services Department-certified laboratory, and must be made using the gas chromatography/mass spectrometry (GC / MS) method, or an equivalent test method which must provide the requisite specificity sensitivity and quantitative accuracy which is at least equal to that of the GC/MS method, and must also be approved by NIDA or the federal Health and Human Services Department, as such testing technology becomes available.

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- G. Except as otherwise permitted in this Policy, any person found to be in possession of drugs, alcohol, or other illicit chemical substances (other than in the person's bodily fluids) while on City premises, shall be terminated, if employed by the Department.
- H. The Department reserves the right at all times on City premises, where it concludes circumstances which warrant such action, to conduct searches and inspections of employees and other persons for the purpose of determining whether such persons are in possession of, using, transporting, or concealing any of the prohibited substances or items covered by this policy; this shall include employees' lockers, baggage, desks, work areas, lunch boxes, brief cases, clothing, and vehicles (whether owned by the City or by the employee when the vehicle is located on City premises) using supervisors, managers, or authorized search and inspection specialists. Any evidence revealed in such a search will be utilized only for purposes of enforcing this Policy, and will not be used by the Department in any criminal prosecution of the employee.
- I. A search and inspection as defined in this policy may also include the requirement that employees and others submit to an unannounced urine drug screen test or blood plasma test, and also may include testing the individual's urine, breath, or blood for the presence of alcohol. These tests may be utilized in the following circumstances:
  - 1. In employment medical examination (before a candidate to whom an offer of employment has been extended begins working);
  - 2. As part of an overall search and inspection of an employee's working area, department or work location as part of the Department's enforcement of this Policy, or as part of a random drug testing program as set forth in this Policy (for persons whose job duties subject them to this requirement);
  - 3. When an employee's supervisor has reasonable suspicion or cause to suspect that an employee is using, or has used drugs, alcohol or other prohibited substances in violation of this policy, or is under the influence of drugs, alcohol or other illicit chemical substances, based on objective and describable facts which would lead a reasonably prudent supervisor to believe that the employee is under the influence of an illicit chemical substance, or that the employee has otherwise violated this policy;
  - 4. When a person is found to be in possession of suspected illicit chemical substances, or when any of these substances or unauthorized items are found in an area which is controlled or used exclusively by the person;
  - 5. Following a serious accident, a serious work quality error apparently due to an employee's inattentiveness or serious judgment or perception error, an incident where safety precautions were violated, or whenever an employee has caused, contributed to the cause, or suffered an injury requiring medical attention or lost working time for any person, or where

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damage to property has resulted from an employee's job performance.

- 6. As part of a routinely scheduled employee fitness-for-duty medical examination that is part of the Department's established policy or which may be scheduled routinely for all members of an employment classification or group. (See paragraphs 3 and 4 of Form 1, entitled: Employee Acknowledgment of Substance Abuse Policy) or as part of follow-up fitness for duty drug screening following reinstatement of an employee to duty following treatment of substance or alcohol abuse;
- 7. An employee who submits to a drug screening test is entitled upon request, and at his sole expense, to have a portion of the specimen submitted for testing to any other NIDA or other federal Health and Human Services Department-certified laboratory which the Department recognizes as having the competence, reliability, and expertise needed to perform an accurate analysis to determine the presence of such illicit chemical substances and to preserve and document the custody of the sample. The employee must make the request for the independent test not later than five working days after receipt of the written report of the test results, pursuant to subparagraph H.8, below.
- 8. An employee will be notified in writing within five (5) working days of the Department's (or its Medical Review Officer's) receipt of a written report revealing a positive test result. The employee will also be notified, not later than five (5) working days of his receipt of the written positive test result notification, of his right to contest or explain the positive results to the Department's Medical Review Officer or the Medical Review Officer provided to the Department through the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police. If requested by an employee or job candidate, the Department will provide a copy of the test results to the Employee. The employee will be reminded that if the sample he provided for the testing was sufficient, he may, at his own expense, request a second confirmation test of a portion of the remaining sample by an NIDA- or other federal Health and Human Services Department-approved laboratory of the employee's choosing (provided the Department recognizes the laboratory as equally competent with the laboratories it ordinarily uses for such tests).
- 9. Both the initial screen test and the first confirmation test will be made at the Department's sole expense.
- J. Searches (including urine or other bodily fluid drug screening or blood and plasma sampling) and inspections by investigative specialists or Department supervisors may be conducted from time to time without prior notice to the employee. However, due consideration will be shown for the privacy interests of persons on City premises, subject to the objectives, and within the parameters of this Policy. Evidence revealed in such searches (including drug screening or blood plasma sampling) will be utilized solely for purposes of enforcing this Drug Free Work Place Policy, and will not be used in any criminal proceeding against the employee.

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- K. No person's body shall be searched, nor will any urine or other bodily fluid, or blood and plasma drug-screening test be administered without the written consent of the person being searched or tested. Any employee who refuses to provide such consent when requested, or to submit to a urine or blood plasma drug screening test, or to a search, or who is found to be in possession of such illicit chemical substances or unauthorized items shall be subject to termination. Any other person who refuses to submit to a search or a urine or blood and plasma drug screening when requested pursuant to this Policy will be barred from employment by the Department, or from conducting business with the Department and, where appropriate may be excluded or removed from Department premises and will not be permitted to return.
- L. Voluntary Self-Referral to EAP: The ultimate responsibility for eliminating addiction or chemical dependency is solely that of the person affected by it. Nevertheless, the Department's policy shall be to encourage employees with addictive disorders or chemical dependency to seek proper medical and/or psychological treatment for the disease. It shall cooperate with the employee in obtaining such treatment, to the extent possible and within the limits of the City's medical insurance policy, medical leave of absence policy, and other benefit policies, (including any Employee Assistance Program that the Department may maintain). The Human Resources Director shall be responsible for informing such an addicted employee of the programs, resources and benefits which are currently available for treatment for such a condition.

No employee shall be terminated, disciplined, nor suffer any adverse employment action solely because he has sought referral to a Departmentprovided benefit program for treatment of alcohol or substance abuse, or otherwise for having identified himself or herself as having a chemical addition or dependence, provided that the employee seeks the assistance in obtaining proper treatment for such addiction or dependency before either testing positive and before the employee is involved in an accident (e.g. an accident or other behavior suggesting reasonable cause for suspecting the employee is impaired) which would ordinarily result in a search or testing under this policy. No employee who identifies himself as being in need of such assistance before an incident leading to detection occurs shall suffer any discrimination in any term or condition of employment, including promotion and transfer opportunities solely because of his disclosure of such a condition, so long as the employee seeks such assistance and adheres to the treatment plan prescribed by his or her physician or other competent medical, psychological, or addiction counselor, and remains free of the illicit chemical substance, and so long as the employee is otherwise eligible, qualified, and entitled to the position. No employee who has successfully completed a drug or alcohol addiction treatment program shall be subject to any adverse or discriminatory treatment solely for having participated in such program so long as the individual remains drug and alcohol-free and otherwise complies with all the terms and conditions of this policy. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any individual to whom the provisions of Section M, Mandatory Referral to EAP, applies.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, the requirement that an employee who has returned to duty following completion of a drug or alcohol addiction treatment program submit to more frequent unscheduled drug screening tests as a means of ensuring the employee's continued compliance with this program shall not be considered "adverse" or "discriminatory" treatment.

M. Mandatory Referral to EAP in Lieu of Termination: The provisions of this Section M shall apply only to persons who are already Department employees. It shall not apply to any candidate failing the post-employment offer, pre-employment drug screening test, or any persons who have resigned or retired from City employment.

If any urine or other bodily fluid, or blood and plasma drug-screening test reveals the presence of an illicit chemical substance in an employee's bodily fluids, the Chief shall have the option (but not the obligation) in the first instance of such an occurrence, to refer the employee to the Department's Employee Assistance Program for assessment and treatment, if needed. Such EAP referral shall be available only one time on a "last chance" basis. Any subsequent incident involving the use or possession of illicit chemical substances or materials under this policy will result in the employee's termination.

To be eligible for such mandatory referral, the employee shall be required to execute a consent and release permitting the Chief or his Designee to monitor the employee's participation and progress in any treatment or therapy program recommended by the EAP counselors.

If the employee refuses to enter into such a program, or having once entered, fails to complete the program as directed by the addiction counselor, psychologist, or physician, the employee shall be terminated.

If the employee successfully completes the treatment program and returns to work, he shall be subject to such further unannounced drug screening tests not less than annually, as the Chief determines is advisable under all the circumstances for a period of not less than two (2) years.

The record of the particular incident which led to the drug screening test shall not be used against the employee in a future decision if the employee successfully completes the treatment prescribed and maintains drug free status thereafter, and does not violate this policy.

No person shall receive the benefits of this Section more than one time, nor be excused from discipline or termination under the Department's behavior and performance standards and policies merely because the employee's behavior or performance problem was caused by the employee's illicit chemical substance abuse.

N. All records of drug and alcohol screening test results, all referrals to or participation in the Employee Assistance Program, and of any treatment for addictive disorders or diseases shall be maintained as strictly confidential

employee personnel information which shall not be revealed to any person other than the Chief, and those managers or supervisors having the need to know such information, the Department's attorneys, and the appropriate EAP counselor.

Such information shall not be revealed under any circumstances to any other persons, employers, or prospective employers in any employment reference checks, nor to any other agencies, persons, or organizations unless the Department is compelled, by statute, regulation, or court order to reveal such information to such persons or organizations, or to defend itself in an action growing out of its enforcement of this policy.

- O. Authorized Use of Alcohol: Although the City of Dalton Police Department does not encourage or condone the use of alcohol, moderate use of authorized alcoholic beverages (as defined above) during an individual's non-working hours, in strict compliance with this policy and with all state and local laws and ordinances, and in a manner which ensures both that the individual will not be impaired when driving a City vehicle, nor when reporting to work, and that the individual is in compliance with prudent safety practices, will not be considered a violation of this policy.
- P. Education Program:
  - 1. Employees: On not less than an annual basis, every employee shall receive at least one hour of training on substance abuse in general, and its effects in the workplace including, but not limited to, the following:
    - a. The explanation of the disease model of addiction for alcohol and drugs;
    - b. The effects and dangers of commonly abused substances in the workplace; and
    - c. The Department's policies and procedures regarding substance abuse affecting the workplace, including how employees can obtain treatment for substance abuse.
  - 2. Supervisors: In addition to the education provided to employees, all supervisors will receive at least one hour of training, which shall include, but shall not be limited to the following:
    - a. How to recognize signs of employee substance abuse;
    - b. How to document and corroborate signs of employee substance abuse; and
    - c. How to refer substance-abusing employees to the proper treatment providers through the Department's Employee Assistance Program.

Q. Severability: If any of the provisions of the City of Dalton Police Department Policies and Procedures on Substance Abuse, Contraband Articles, and Employee Assistance shall be held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions.

This policy supersedes any policies previously issued.

#### EMPLOYEE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE POLICY

1. I acknowledge and certify that I have been provided with a summary of, have read, and fully understand the City of Dalton Police Department's ("Department") Drug-Free Workplace Policy on Substance Abuse, Contraband Articles, and Employee Assistance. I am presently employed by, or have applied for and have been offered a position with the Department.

I am aware that the Department's Drug-Free Workplace Policy is a "zero tolerance" policy which forbids any person from entering or remaining on City property, or working anywhere in behalf of the City while possessing or under the influence of any measurable amount (including any trace amount irrespective of the quantity) of any illegal drugs, such as:

- A. Amphetamines, cannabinoids or marijuana, cocaine, phencyclidine (PCP) methadone, methaqualone, opiates, barbiturates, benzodiazepines, propoxyphene, or a metabolite of any such substance; or
- B. Any other unlawful or controlled substances as referred to in O.C.G.A. § 16-13-26, 16-13-27, 16-13-28, or 16-13-29, unauthorized prescription drugs, or authorized prescription or non-prescription drugs which are used in a manner other than in strict accordance with the Department's policy and with the prescribing physician's instructions for a verifiable medical condition, or any other substance that is mood altering, mind or consciousness affecting, or which is likely to have any affect upon a person's perceptions, sensations, thought processes, self-awareness, emotions or other mental, physiological or psychological reactions or behavior;
- *C.* Any "look-alike drugs", or "designer drugs" with psychotropic effect similar to those produced by illegal drugs, hallucinogens (whether derived from natural or synthetic manufactured sources); and,
- D. Any over-the-counter medicines which may affect my consciousness, mood, or mental state, and any prescription drugs which are not used in strict accord with the prescribing physician's instructions and this policy
- 2. I am aware that as a condition of becoming or remaining employed by the City of Dalton Police Department, I may be required to submit to a drug screening test at any time, and to consent to a search of my work area, personal property, clothing, and vehicle when parked on City premises. I am aware that the drug screening test will include an Enzyme Immunoassay (EMIT) test of a specimen that I will provide, and if such test is positive (revealing the presence of a prohibited substance or metabolite), a confirmation test of my specimen will be made using the gas chromatography/mass spectrometry (GC/MS) method, or its equivalent by a laboratory certified to perform such tests by the National Institute of Drug Abuse (NIDA), or other agency specified by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.
- 3. I am aware that such tests will be conducted after I am hired wherever the Department has a reasonable suspicion that I have violated its substance abuse policy, if I have caused or contributed to an on-the-job injury resulting in the loss of work time, as a follow- up test if I enter an Employee Assistance Program or rehabilitation program as a result of a positive drug test, as part of any routinely scheduled fitness for duty medical examination, and unannounced "random" testing of employees.
- 4. I am aware that the information revealed in any test results, or in any search of my work area, personal effects, or person, will be used only for purposes of making employment decisions about me and will not be used against me in any criminal proceeding.
- 5. I am aware that if my test results are "positive," indicating I have violated the Substance Abuse Policy, or, if I refuse or fail to consent to such testing or search, or, if I interfere with or tamper with such test or specimen, I may be terminated. I understand that I am not to consider any request that I submit to said testing to be an implication or accusation that I have violated this policy in any manner.

#### RESTRICTED LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA

6. I am aware that all information revealed by any such tests will be revealed to me and to the Medical Review Officer of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police, the Chief, and any superior officer or other department manager or supervisor who has a legitimate need for such information. However, I understand that such information will remain confidential and will not be revealed to any other person unless I have voluntarily consented to such disclosure in writing, or unless such release is compelled by a state agency or a court order. I understand that such information will not be used or released in any criminal proceeding against me, but that they may be used in disciplinary proceedings against me, including proceedings as may lead to my termination.

I understand that if my test is confirmed as positive, I may contest or explain the result to the Chief and Medical Review Officer within five working days after I receive written notification of the positive test result.

- 7. I understand that the Substance Abuse Policy is subject to the provisions in the Act No. 558, Amending the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, Title 33, Chapter 9, Section 40.2 and that the Department's request is in strict compliance with the Drug-free Workplace Act and the Georgia Workers Compensation Statutes.
- 8. I have been informed that the Department maintains an Employee Assistance Plan, and of the policies and procedures for utilizing the resources of the plan.

### I. Policy

It shall be the policy of the Dalton Police Department to obtain maximum input into management of the Department through development of unit-level short-term and long-term goals and objectives.

#### II. Goals and Objectives

- A. At least annually, as part of the budget process, the Chief of Police will request that each Division develop goals and objectives that will be reviewed and incorporated into the annual goals and objectives for the Department.
- B. A staffing analysis will be completed periodically, at the direction of the Chief of Police, to determine if changes are needed in the number of personnel assigned to each division and to sufficiently to meet organizational goals and objectives.
- C. Supervisors will conduct staff meetings to solicit input from members of the Division in developing their goals and objectives.
- D. Once compiled, the goals and objectives will be made available to all personnel on a Dalton Police Department publishing venue.
- E. Documentation shall be kept to help determine progress made toward attaining Division goals and objectives.
- F. At the Quarterly Combined Command Staff Meeting, each Division shall present its progress toward meeting its annual goals and objectives Division and Departmental Goals.
- G. The Department will establish a long-range plan, which includes the following:
  - 1. Goals and operational objectives;
  - 2. Anticipated workload and population trends;
  - 3. Anticipated personnel levels;
  - 4. Anticipated capital improvements and equipment needs; and
  - 5. Provisions for review and revisions as needed.

# III. Planning Function

RESTRICTED LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA

Overall planning responsibility for the Department, including budgeting and strategic planning, shall be the duty of the Chief of Police.

Members of the Agency involved in any planning function shall have direct access to the Chief of Police, as well as feedback from the Chief of Police on their recommendations. Planning shall be generally done in conjunction with the budget preparation process; however, special assignments may be assigned made by the Chief of Police as needed.

Although all employees in the Agency may be involved in the planning function, the following specific planning responsibilities are assigned to the following functions:

- A. Support Services Division Commander is responsible for the planning of inventory control, form development, facility management and security, Property and Evidence function, records management, information technology, training, budgeting, and strategic plan implementation.
- B. Criminal Investigation Division Commander is responsible for the planning of departmental criminal investigations, narcotics, vice, and organized crime investigations, investigative techniques, strategic and district plan implementation, budgeting, intelligence analysis, and crime prevention.
- C. Patrol Division Commander is responsible for the planning of departmental patrol and manpower allocation, planning of equipment and uniforms, strategic and district plan implementation, budgeting, and crime prevention.
- D. Administration Division Commander is responsible for the activities directly associated with the Administrative Division, which includesing planning and research, purchasing, accreditation, and public relations, and intelligence analysis.

#### IV. Research Function

Overall research responsibility for the Department shall be the duty of the Chief of Police.

Members of the Agency involved in any research function shall have direct access to the Chief of Police, as well as feedback from the Chief of Police on their recommendations.

Although all employees in the Agency may be involved in the research function, the Planning and Research Manager shall have the primary responsibility to coordinate research efforts.

# I. Policy

The responsibility for crime prevention and **good** effective community relations is shared by all members of the Dalton Police Department. The Agency is committed to the concept of reducing crime through proactive crime prevention programs. Although most law enforcement activities consist of reactive policing, no less legitimate is the pursuit of prevention of crime. By analyzing crime data and requests from the community, programs can be targeted where they will most benefit the citizens in the community. Preventing crime demands a coordinated Agency response, as well as input and participation from the community.

#### II. Organization

The Crime Prevention and Community Relations components are made up of every employee in the Agency.

#### III. Objectives and Priorities

- A. To encourage community involvement in crime prevention.
- B. To target programs by crime type and geographic area on the basis of an analysis of local crime data.
- C. To target programs to address community perception or misperception of crime.
- D. To maintain liaison with citizen crime prevention groups.

### IV. <u>Crime Prevention</u>

A. Intelligence Led Policing

Research and data suggest that Intelligence Led Policing (ILP) is the most effective method of crime prevention. This process involves a Department-wide philosophy that aims to achieve crime reduction and prevention and to disrupt offender activity. ILP combines crime analysis and criminal intelligence to objectively direct Department resources decisions, and focuses enforcement on prolific and serious offenders, and targets problematic geographic locations.

#### RESTRICTED LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA

- 1. <u>Crime Intelligence</u>, in the context of ILP, is defined as: analyzed information that blends data from analysis of crime patterns and intelligence drawn from the behavior of offenders, the developed knowledge of Officers and investigators, and knowledge gained from other sources.
- 2. <u>Crime Analysis</u>, in the context of ILP, is defined as: the process of evaluating reported activity and the resulting formulation of observable patterns as it relates to persons, locations, time, crime type, and offender behavior.
- B. Neighborhood Associations or Groups

The police are more effective when citizens and businesses become actively involved in monitoring their environment. When citizens become engaged in making their neighborhoods more secure, the result is that the Police Department gains many more eyes and ears aimed at preventing crime. Officers should endeavor to engage the groups and associations, whenever possible, in order to inform them of the Department's mission, extend the full range of services the Department offers, and inform them of how they can participate in creating a safer Dalton.

- C. The Department participates in Crime Prevention Programs to include, but not limited to:
  - 1. Drug Awareness Presentations
  - 2. How not to be a Victim Presentations
  - 3. Gang Awareness Presentations
  - 4. Extra Patrol Initiative
  - 5. Rape, Aggression, Defense (RAD) Self-defense Program
  - 6. Neighborhood Police Officer Initiative
  - **7.** 6. Citizens' Police Academy
  - 7. Fatal Vision Program

# V. <u>Community Involvement</u>

The objectives of effective community relations are is to establish direct contact with the community, through such means as the local school systems, community and business groups, and civic and professional organizations, in order to gain community support of law enforcement activities.

A. Although all members of the Agency are responsible for maintaining good effective community relations, the Support Services Operations Supervisor Recruiting /

Community Involvement Officer shall be responsible for coordinating the Department's community involvement activities. He / she shall be responsible for:

- 1. Establishing liaison with existing community organizations.
- 2. Assisting in the development of community involvement policies.
- 3. Ensuring that Agency objectives, community problems, and successes are publicized.
- 4. Conveying information transmitted from citizens' organizations to the Agency.
- 5. Improving Agency practices bearing on affecting law enforcement-community relations.
- B. The Patrol Special Operations Supervisor or the Patrol Division Commander's designee shall submit a quarterly report to the Chief of Police that includes, at a minimum, the following:
  - 1. A description of current concerns voiced by the community.
  - 2. A description of potential problems that have a bearing on law enforcement activities within the community.
  - 3. A statement of recommended actions that address previously identified concerns and problems.
  - 4. A statement of progress made toward addressing previously identified concerns and problems.

When a member of the Department becomes aware of a current concern voiced by a member of the community or potential problems that may have a bearing on law enforcement activities within the community, he / she shall forward the information to the Patrol Special Operations Supervisor.

#### VI. Responsibilities

- A. Sworn Personnel
  - 1. Courteously accept and record any reasonable recommendation or suggestion received from citizens regarding departmental policies or recommendations procedures.
  - 2. Be communicative with the public whenever an opportunity exists. Take time to explain actions in situations that are not emergencies.
  - 3. Officers should make a point of getting out of the patrol car while on patrol to permit persons on the beat to see the Officers and get to know the Officers as another members of the community.

- 4. Be responsive to the sensitivities of the various groups in the community.
- B. Non-Sworn Personnel
  - 1. Be courteous when dealing interacting with the public.
  - 2. Accept any complaints, suggestions, or information from citizens and forward to appropriate personnel.

#### VII. Crime Prevention Review

Once every three years, a documented evaluation of the crime prevention programs utilized by the Department shall be conducted by the Support Services Operations Supervisor.

### VIII. Citizen Survey

A documented survey of citizen attitudes and opinions shall be conducted at least once every three years relating to, but not limited to:

- A. Overall Agency performance
- B. Overall competence of Agency employees
- C. Citizens' perception of Officers' attitudes and behaviors
- D. Community concern over safety and security within the Agency's service area
- E. Citizen's recommendations and suggestions for improvements

The results of the survey shall be compiled and a written summary provided to the Chief of Police.

This policy supersedes any previous policies issued.

# I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to maintain a fleet of vehicles that is safe and operational at all times.

# II. <u>Procedure</u>

- A. Repairs, modifications, or adjustments shall first be requested on a Dalton Police Department work order.
- B. All work completed and all expenses incurred shall be recorded on the work order.
- C. All receipts and invoices shall be attached to the yellow copy of the work order and shall be given to a the Property and Evidence custodian Technician (PET) for entry into the computer Department's RMS system.
- D. All work completed on each vehicle shall be entered into the computer by a property and evidence custodian PET.

E. All invoices, receipts, or and bills shall be submitted to the Purchasing Agent for payment.

# III. Requests for Repair

- A. When any member of the Department detects a problem with any vehicle, they he / she shall complete a work order stating specifically what the problem is perceived to be. (If safety is an issue, tow or park the vehicle at the designated location.)
- B. The work order shall be placed in the vehicle on the driver side dash, and the vehicle shall be locked and parked at a designated location for the mechanic. For Patrol Division vehicles, the car number and required repairs shall be listed on the whiteboard in the Patrol Division roll call room.
- C. If any emergency repairs are necessary during the off-duty hours of the property and evidence custodian PETs or mechanic, the repairs shall be approved by a Supervisor. A work order shall be completed and submitted to the a property and evidence custodian PET with a detailed description of the problem and the repairs

made. Any invoice or bill shall also be attached.

- D. Any work performed by the Department mechanic, not initially listed on the work order, shall be added.
- E. Any work performed by an outside vendor shall also be accompanied by a Dalton Police Department work order.

# IV. Fuel Log

- A. Fuel consumption will be recorded by entering the appropriate information into the fuel pumps at the City of Dalton Public Works facility.
- B. Any fuel or other fluids added while away from the City of Dalton shall be recorded on a credit card receipt, along with the vehicle mileage, and turned in to a property and evidence custodian PET.
- C. The fleet maintenance property and evidence custodian PET will retrieve fuel consumption information from Dalton Public Works each month and maintain that information in our the Department's RMS system.

# V. Preventive Maintenance

- A. At the beginning of each tour of duty, and whenever refueling the a vehicle, the driver of said vehicle shall:
  - 1. Check the service sticker and complete a work order if service is required.
  - 2. Check for body damage to the vehicle.
  - 3. Check all fluid levels, including:
    - a. Oil
    - b. Radiator fluid
    - c. Transmission fluid
    - d. Windshield washer fluid
  - 4. Check for interior damage to the vehicle, including radio, seats, flashlights, etc.
  - 5. Check all tires.
  - 6. Check the interior for contraband and possible weapons
- B. Washing of Vehicles
  - 1. Vehicles not assigned to one person shall be kept free of trash and washed at the designated location on an as needed basis.

- 2. Vehicles assigned to one person shall be kept free of trash and shall be washed at least once weekly at the designated location.
- C. Replacement of Tires

Tires shall be replaced when:

- 1. The tread wear reaches 3/32" depth.
- 2. A defect or damage is observed to the tread or the sidewall which makes the tire unsafe.

#### I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to maintain a volunteer-based program to assist Officers with community tasks and other duties.

#### II. Objectives

The mission of the volunteer program is to serve as a volunteer support service to the Dalton Police Department, enhancing their effectiveness of community policing through the provision of administrative, patrol, and support services when requested or required by the Department. The objectives and purposes of the volunteers shall be:

- A. To provide the Dalton Police Department with professional assistance in aspects of community policing efforts.
- B. To assist the Officers of the Dalton Police Department with non-enforcement functions and the completion of their duties, subject to specific guidelines of conduct and responsibilities.

#### III. Qualifications of Volunteers

- A. Qualifications for volunteers shall include the following, at a minimum:
  - 1. Explorer Program

See directive GO93-4.18, Ride-Along Program - Explorers and the Explorer Program Standard Operating Procedure

2. Chaplain<del>s</del> Program

See directive GO88-3.13, Chaplain Program

- 3. All Other Volunteer Positions
  - a. Have obtained a minimum age of twenty-one (21).

- b. Have completed an application for the volunteer program and have passed a background check.
- c. Have completed the minimum forty (40) hour ride along with a PTO or Supervisor within one (1) year.
- d. Have completed GCIC Security and Integrity training.
- e. Have completed any additional training assigned in relation to volunteer assignment.
- f. Possess a high school diploma or GED.

# IV. Admissions Procedure

A qualified applicant for admission shall complete an application form prescribed by the Chief of Police, disclosing their qualifications and reasons for participation in the program. After a completed background check, the volunteer's application package will be forwarded to the Chief of Police for review. The Chief of Police will then accept or reject the services of the prospective volunteer.

# V. Guidelines of Conduct

- A. The volunteer shall at all times recognize that the volunteer is not a sworn Officer and is serving in a support role for the Dalton Police Department. The volunteer and does not assume any legal authority beyond those granted to any citizen.
- B. The volunteer shall adhere to a strict policy of non-physical contact with any suspected violator of public laws, except in the event of an emergency situation where immediate action must be taken to ensure the public's or an Officer's safety.
- C. The volunteer shall not carry weapons, lethal or non-lethal, nor display any evidence of assumed authority, excluding equipment that may be specifically assigned or provided by the Dalton Police Department.
- D. Volunteers, from time to time, may receive confidential information at the discretion of the Dalton Police Department, including but not limited to: the progress of an investigation, a known or reported law violation, or the condition against which action is to be taken at a future time, or any proposed law enforcement operation. Such information shall be held in confidence and not provided to any other non-authorized party.
- E. No volunteer shall belong to or support any organization whose goals and objectives may be in conflict with the generally recognized duties and responsibilities of the Dalton Police Department in assuring public safety.
- F. No volunteer shall conduct himself or herself in a manner which would bring discredit to himself or herself, members of the Dalton Police Department volunteer Organization program, or the City of Dalton.

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G. No volunteer shall publicly criticize any official action of the Dalton Police Department or any of its members.

### VI. Identification

- A. Volunteers will be issued a photo identification card by the Dalton Police Department. This Identification card is to be prominently displayed at all times while the volunteer is engaged in official activities.
- B. Volunteers shall coordinate any efforts with the Supervisor in charge of their respective assignment before they enter into any official action on behalf of the Dalton Police Department.
- C. The official uniform or identifying apparel shall not be worn in public unless the volunteer is operating in an official capacity as a volunteer.

#### I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to provide crime analysis and traffic analysis information to the appropriate personnel within the Dalton Police Department to assist in meeting crime prevention and traffic safety objectives and departmental goals.

#### II. Purpose

Crime analysis and traffic analysis provides a system to collect, collate, analyze, and disseminate crime data for the purpose of supporting the Dalton Police Department in management and operational activities. In addition, through crime analysis and traffic analysis, estimates of future crime trends and traffic patterns may be based on inferences derived from crime and traffic data.

Analysis of regularly collected information of on crime activity is a very useful tool in the prevention and suppression of crime and the apprehension of criminal offenders. Analysis of regularly collected information on traffic activity is also beneficial for targeting traffic-related issues and reducing injuries and fatalities caused by motor vehicle collisions. All personnel of the Dalton Police Department will assist in this function by gathering complete and accurate data to be used by the Crime Analysis / Traffic Analysis function.

#### III. Procedures

#### A. Development of Crime Analysis Data

The Spillman Records Management System (RMS) shall be the primary tool used to obtain data on current or and past crime trends.

1. This data is obtained through querying of the law incident tables in the RMS, including the law incident, field interview, non-custody arrest, names, and vehicles tables, allowing records to be sorted by date, time, beat number, nature of offense, etc.

RESTRICTED LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA

- Crystal reports are available which will to automatically query the records from the RMS based on the established parameters created by the GIS Analyst.
- 3. The reports are viewed, accessed, and printed using Crystal reports compatible viewing software.
- 4. The GIS Analyst City of Dalton's Information Technology Department will be responsible for maintaining the integrity of these reports, fixing correcting any errors they may contain, and creating new reports as needed.
- B. Development of Traffic Analysis Data
  - 1. The Georgia Electronic Accident Reporting System (GEARS) shall be the primary tool used to obtain data on current and past motor vehicle collision trends.
    - a. This data is obtained through querying of pre-established reports within the GEARS program, allowing records to be sorted by dayof-week, time, location, etc.
    - b. The GEARS program provides advanced search and analytics features that allow the creation of charts, graphs, and maps.
    - c. The GEARS program is owned and maintained by Georgia Department of Transportation. GEARS is responsible for correcting any errors within their system and creating new reports as needed.
  - 2. The Traffic Enforcement Unit shall be responsible for collecting, analyzing, and disseminating data pertaining to traffic violations, including the rates of safety belt usage, speeding vehicles, and distracted driving.
- B.C. District Planning

By utilizing the Crystal reports and GEARS, the District Commanders will develop plans to address the issues and / or problems that have been revealed any crime or traffic trends that have been identified in each district of the city. These This plans will may cover the following areas:

- 1. Present crime trends and problems;
- 2. Present traffic issues or concentrations of motor vehicle collisions;
- **2.3**. Suspects and persons of interest;
- **3.4**. Plans for investigation, disruption, or arrest of offenders; and
- **4.5**. Task assignments for specific officers, detectives, etc.

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**C.**D. District Planning Meetings

The District Meetings shall be used to evaluate the effectiveness of previous strategies to determine if there were any modifications or additions needed to the District Plans.

The District Meetings shall also be used to discuss current trends and problems identified from analysis of data and the strategies/plans to be implemented to combat the issues in each district. These meetings will be regularly scheduled in advance and conducted regularly.

D.E. Dissemination of District Plans

District Plans will be disseminated to:

- 1. All Sworn Supervisors
- 2. Command Staff Officers
- 3. GIS Analyst
- **4.3**. Accreditation / Certification Manager
- 5.4. Intelligence Analyst
- E.F. Specialized Requests for Information

The Intelligence Analyst shall, upon request, provide detailed crime analysis and traffic analysis information, including maps, graphs, charts, and bulletins. The GIS Analyst shall, upon request, provide maps using mapping software to further supplement the crime analysis function.

The GIS Analyst and Intelligence Analyst shall also disseminate specialized information to the Chief of Police, Command Staff Officers, District Commanders, and others as necessary. This shall be accomplished using a combination of PDF files of crime maps, email, paper copies of crime maps, and electronic or digital copies of crime bulletins.

F.G. Evaluation of Process

In order to ensure feedback from vested parties, Agency personnel shall provide feedback to District Commanders and the Intelligence Analysts. This feedback will be utilized to adjust District Plans, change existing reporting methods, add new Crystal and GEARS reports, and to evaluate the overall effectiveness of the Crime Analysis / Traffic Analysis function.

G.H. Briefing Agency Chief Executive Officer

On a weekly basis, the Patrol Division Commander or his / her designee shall brief the Chief of Police on crime patterns, crime and trends, traffic patterns and trends, and plans implemented in each district.

This policy supersedes any policies previously issued.

# Training Division Monthly Report May 2019

## **Overview**

The department was proud to host Jason Brezler and Gabe Angemi for an officer training seminar titled Leadership Under Fire. This course was held in the newly renovated Memorial Hall at Dalton State College and drew over 100 fire officers from numerous departments. The Training Division delivered the final week of a 120-hour Rope Rescue Technician course to 14 new members of the department's technical rescue team. Subsequently, these personnel completed a 40-hour Confined Space Rescue Technician course and tested for national certifications in both rescue disciplines. All suppression personnel not involved in technician level training received NFPA 1670 compliant training at the awareness level for confined space rescue incidents. Monthly training included territory familiarization, pre-fire training, core competency check-offs, special operations training, and company level drills chosen by company officers. Training hours during the month of May totaled 4,453.

## **Outside Schools**

Numerous personnel attended classes at Metro Atlanta Firefighter's Conference in Marietta, Georgia.

## **Support Functions**

- 179 hours were spent completing apparatus checks and equipment replenishment
- Cleaning and maintenance activities accounted for 628 hours in May

- SCBA maintenance consumed 32 hours during the month
- 345 hours were committed to spring hydrant detail





Title: On Duty Injury / Workers' Compensation Procedures

Scope: All Personnel

# **Policy:**

While you are actively at work, you are covered (with limited exceptions) under the city's workers compensation policy. This policy is designed to cover you should you become injured on the job. If you should become injured in any way, report the injury to your supervisor as soon as possible, but no longer than 24 hours after the occurrence.

Personnel should refer to the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation Official Notice posted in all locations for a list of approved physicians.

# **PROCEDURE:**

# **Responsibilities of the injured employee**

# **Immediate advanced treatment required**

- If needed, contact 911 for an ambulance. •
- Notify your supervisor immediately.
- An Authorization for Treatment form shall be filled out and taken to the medical facility by the employee or a supervisor.

# Advanced treatment is not immediately required

- Notify your supervisor immediately.
- Treat the injury.

- Complete the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 and submit to your supervisor as soon as possible after the injury. All injuries must be reported within 24 hours. If the employee is unable to complete the form due to the injury, the supervisor shall complete the form.
- If medical treatment is needed at a later date, contact the Administrative Assistant administration for further assistance.

#### **Responsibilities of the Supervisor**

#### Immediate advanced treatment required:

- Evaluate and provide first aid.
- Notify 911 for an ambulance if necessary.
- Notify the Shift Commander of the injury.
- Complete the An Authorization for Treatment form (if not done so by the employee) that must be filled out and taken to the medical facility by the employee or a supervisor.
- Complete the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 (if not done so by the employee) and submit to the Administrative Assistant administration within 24 hours of the incident.

#### Advanced treatment is not immediately required:

- Treat the injury.
- Ensure the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 has been completed and submitted to the Administrative Assistant administration within 24 hours of the incident.
- Notify the Shift Commander

#### Follow Up Physician and Rehabilitation

- It is the responsibility of the employee to schedule follow up and rehabilitation appointments. Do not pay for any treatment with your health insurance when being treated for a workers compensation claim.
- Professional Pharmacy accepts and files with Collins and Co. for Workers' Compensation prescriptions. This is at no cost to the employee. Your pharmacy may not file and you may be required to pay any prescription cost and submit for reimbursement to the Administrative Assistant administration.

Title: On Duty Injury / Workers' Compensation Procedures

Scope: All Personnel

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While you are actively at work, you are covered (with limited exceptions) under the city's workers compensation policy. This policy is designed to cover you should you become injured on the job. If you should become injured in any way, report the injury to your supervisor as soon as possible, but no longer than 24 hours after the occurrence.

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- Notify your supervisor immediately.
- An Authorization for Treatment form shall be filled out and taken to the medical facility by the employee or a supervisor.
- Complete Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 and submit to your supervisor as soon as possible after the injury. All injuries must be reported within 24 hours. If the employee is unable to complete the form due to the injury, the supervisor shall complete the form.

# Advanced treatment is not immediately required

- Notify your supervisor immediately.
- Treat the injury.

- Complete the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 and submit to your supervisor as soon as possible after the injury. All injuries must be reported within 24 hours. If the employee is unable to complete the form due to the injury, the supervisor shall complete the form.
- If medical treatment is needed at a later date, contact administration for further assistance.

#### **Responsibilities of the Supervisor**

#### Immediate advanced treatment required:

- Evaluate and provide first aid.
- Notify 911 for an ambulance if necessary.
- Notify the Shift Commander of the injury.
- Complete the An Authorization for Treatment form (if not done so by the employee) that must be filled out and taken to the medical facility by the employee or a supervisor.
- Complete the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 (if not done so by the employee) and submit to administration within 24 hours of the incident.

#### Advanced treatment is not immediately required:

- Treat the injury.
- Ensure the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation form WC-1 has been completed and submitted to administration within 24 hours of the incident.
- Notify the Shift Commander

#### Follow Up Physician and Rehabilitation

- It is the responsibility of the employee to schedule follow up and rehabilitation appointments. Do not pay for any treatment with your health insurance when being treated for a workers compensation claim.

Policy: Radio Check

Scope: All Personnel

# **PROCEDURE:**

- 1. Station Radios
  - a. Station radios will be tested daily at 07:30. Dispatch will send the alert tones for each station and personnel from each station shall acknowledge the alert indicating receipt of the alert.
  - b. Any station radio found inoperable or defective will be checked and turned in for repair immediately.
  - c. After any repair or modification a check of the radio will be made by activating the station alert and confirming receipt of the alert.
- 2. Apparatus Radios
  - a. All first out and reserve apparatus radios shall be tested every Friday with the testing of the station radios.
  - b. Any apparatus radio found inoperable or defective will be checked and turned in for repair immediately.
  - c. After any repair or modification a check of the radio will be made by requesting a clarity check from the dispatch center.

**NOTE:** Portables are the responsibility of the person assigned. They should be checked daily for operation and battery condition. An example would be turning the radio on and keying it up ensures that it will transmit and receive.

**Title:** Enforcement of Fire Lane Violations

**Scope:** All personnel

# **POLICY:**

This policy was created to establish a procedure for enforcement actions directed to violators of City Ordinance, Article VI, 114-396 through 114-407 titled "Fire Lanes" and to establish guidance in all other enforcement actions by the City of Dalton Fire Department.

It will be the policy of the City of Dalton Fire Department to ensure the safety of our citizens in areas of congestion due to traffic and other means by effectively policing those areas to provide for at least the minimum ingress and egress required for emergency vehicles at all times. This will be accomplished by citation to Municipal Court, where necessary, by designated officials of the City of Dalton Fire Department or uniformed officers of Dalton Police Department. This action is in conjunction with the authority listed in 114-407.

The officer engaged in the enforcement of the minimum standards acceptable shall evaluate the circumstance and make a determination if the property in question is listed in the ordinance 114-397 (c) for designation as a fire lane. Then a decision will be made as to what form of enforcement shall be effective to render a more safe condition. The officer anticipating enforcement actions shall notify the dispatcher by radio of his/her location and reason for possible corrective actions anticipated.

The following personnel have authority designated by the Fire Chief to enter into enforcement actions where needed:

- On-duty Battalion Chiefs
- All personnel assigned to the Fire Prevention Division for the purpose of code enforcement
- Deputy Fire Chief
- Fire Chief

#### Verbal communication with the violator

Should contact be made with the operator of a vehicle, the officer will be professional in their approach and utilize a courteous manner. The officer shall identify themselves and the department he/she represents. The officer will then inquire if there is any justifiable reason for the violation committed. The officer will then notify the violator of the action to be taken. The officer will educate the violator as to why action will be taken and how to avoid future citations.

In the event a violator becomes confrontational, the officer shall remove himself/herself to a safe location (vehicle most likely) at the earliest possible time whereby he/she may summon assistance from uniformed police officers and/or supervisors with Dalton Fire Department. Officer safety is of utmost importance and should not be jeopardized under any circumstance.

#### Written Warnings

The City of Dalton Fire Department generated form(s) pursuant to 14-261 shall indicate in the appropriate location whether a warning or citation is issued. Warning stickers may be utilized separate from a Citation/Warning ticket at the officer's discretion. The department or the court does not require that a Citation/Warning ticket be completed in conjunction with the orange warning sticker.

Should there be any doubt as to what action to take, the officer will educate the operator of the vehicle and a warning sticker issued without a citation/warning being completed. Upon exiting, the officer will thank them for their attention to this matter.

#### Citations

Citations to Municipal Court as listed in 114-407 may be issued to the vehicle and it is not necessary for the driver/operator to be present. If the operator is not present, the citation may be left with the vehicle. In the event a citation to Municipal Court is issued, the vehicle shall be photographed and the photograph shall be printed and attached to the citation. The proper forms will be forwarded to an officer of the court for processing and disposition either by forfeiture or the fine amount listed during court hearing.

Issuance of citations is an adversarial situation and should be handled in a manner to promote officer safety at all times. In the event an unlicensed operator or an operator becomes hostile/belligerent, dispatch shall be notified via radio requesting Dalton Police Department who will take all necessary enforcement action upon their arrival.

Title: Enforcement of False/Nuisance Alarms

Scope: All personnel

# **POLICY:**

This policy exists to govern fire alarm systems intended to summon fire department personnel by implementation of City Ordinance 46-30, allowing for assessment of fees for excessive false alarms and nuisance fire alarms, and providing for the severability of the parts hereof if declared invalid.

### False/Nuisance alarms are defined as follows:

<u>False Alarm</u> The willful and knowing initiation or transmission of a signal, message, or other notification of an event of fire when no such danger exists.

<u>Nuisance Alarm</u> An alarm caused by mechanical failure, malfunction, improper installation or lack of proper maintenance, or an alarm activated by a cause that cannot be determined.

# Examples of alarms that are enforceable within this policy:

- An alarm caused by improper installation or maintenance of the fire alarm system. This includes missing backup batteries, loose connections, smoke detectors mounted near air vents, or otherwise overly sensitive detectors
- An alarm caused by a power outage or storm, as long as there is no evidence that lightning hit the structure or traveled in on power or telephone lines
- An alarm caused by the alarm user or alarm company working on the system or testing the system
- A false alarm activated by the alarm user or an employee
- The occupant conducting a fire drill without notifying the fire alarm company

- An alarm caused by an employee of a business or a family member of a resident smoking near a detector
- An alarm caused by normal cooking where the alarm user could relocate a detector or provide better ventilation
- An alarm caused by dust from construction/demolition
- A burglar alarm reported by the alarm company
- An alarm for which there is no explanation. If a cause for the alarm cannot be identified, (no pull station was activated, smoke was not present, etc.), the alarm system will be assumed to have malfunctioned and the ordinance applies.

### Examples of alarms that are <u>not</u> enforceable within this policy:

- An activation of the alarm caused by a fire, potential fire, or hazardous situation (e.g., smoke from an overheated stove producing a potential fire situation)
- A test by the fire department or other regulatory agency
- An alarm caused by someone who is not an employee of the alarm user smoking near a detector, unless the alarm user has not attempted to control smoking
- A malicious activation of a pull station by someone who is not an employee of the alarm user, unless management could relocate the pull station or provide protective covers to prevent easy activation
- An alarm caused by unauthorized tampering with an alarm system by someone other than an employee of a business or member of the family occupying a residence where the alarm activates
- A burglar alarm or elevator alarm that is reported as a fire alarm by an occupant. If an alarm company reports a burglar alarm as a fire alarm, the response qualifies under the policy
- A beeping smoke detector in a residence that the occupant wishes the fire department to check

# **Occupant Negligence**

In cases where someone's negligence causes a fire alarm to activate, it is important to determine who caused the alarm and his/her relationship to the alarm user. If an alarm is caused by a fire alarm user or an agent or employee, the policy applies. These would include the property manager and his/her staff, employees of the business occupying the building, and persons using the building under contract with the business. Occupants of a residence where an alarm occurs also qualify. This policy does not apply if the alarm is caused by someone who is not the alarm user or an agent or an employee unless the alarm user could have taken reasonable measures to prevent the false alarm.

# **Incident Commander Responsibilities**

This policy is intended to reduce the number of false alarm responses within city limits. Upon response to a false alarm, it will be the responsibility of the Incident Commander to determine (1) if the cause of the false alarm fits the definition of a false/nuisance alarm as defined above, (2) to see that the fire incident report is completed accurately with regard to the response so that proper warnings and/or citations can be issued, (3) to provide the Fire Safety Division with applicable incident reports for the calendar year (January 1 – December 31).

When deciding whether the policy applies to a false/nuisance alarm, the basic question to be answered is, "Could the alarm user (e.g., owner, occupant, or manager) have reasonably prevented the false alarm from occurring?" If the answer is yes, then the policy applies.

Reasonable prevention of false/nuisance alarms includes but is not limited to:

- having the system installed and maintained properly
- prohibiting smoking near detectors
- providing protective guards over pull stations that are prone to malicious alarms
- ensuring that smoke from normal cooking activities is ventilated
- ensuring that contractors working in a building take steps to prevent dust from setting off detectors
- notifying monitors of potential work/maintenance and instruction to disallow transmission of alarm notification until returned to active status when complete

#### **Documenting False/Nuisance Alarms**

When a false/nuisance alarm fits the definitions listed above, it must be recorded as such. The Incident Commander should provide a brief description of what appears to have caused the alarm in the narrative section of the incident report. To ensure proper identification of the person(s) responsible for the fire alarm and the correct location of the alarm activation, it is important to include the owner/occupant name(s) in the incident report. In cases where there are several buildings at the same address, the specific building and business name must also be identified in the report.

#### **Review of Incident Reports**

Incident reports will be reviewed regularly to identify recurring false alarms as defined by the code. When two false alarms have occurred at the same location within a calendar year, a certified letter with return receipt will be sent by the fire department to the alarm user informing him or her of the responses and of the code. This will be repeated after the third response. After the fourth response and any additional responses within the calendar year, the appropriate actions will be taken by Fire Safety Division.
