Crime and Crash Statistics for October 2019

Assistant Police Chief Chris Crossen presented the Crime and Crash Statistical Reports for the month of October, 2019. Assistant Chief Crossen gave a written and oral summary of the crime and crash statistics. As noted in the written summary, Assistant Chief Crossen reported the rate of Year to Date Part I crimes are down by 2.24% when compared to the same month in 2018. Chief Crossen further reported that during the month there were 136 non-private property crashes and stated injury crashes increased from September 2019.

Analysis

In the year-to-date 2019 there have been 1047 Part 1 crimes reported versus 1070 in 2018 which shows an approximate decrease of 2.15%. There have been 8 reported robberies in 2019, which is lower than the 5 year average. There have been 103 reported burglaries, which is an approximate decrease of 9.65% when compared to 2018.

There have been 85 violent crimes reported 2019 YTD compared to 92 reported violent crimes YTD 2018. Year-to-date violent crimes have shown a decrease of approximately 1.64% when compared to 2018 YTD statistics. Violent crimes in 2019 are approximately 11.46% less than the 5 year average.

Property crime numbers are approximately 12.15% lower than the average for year-to-date statistics in November based on the past five years. Year-to-date property crime numbers are the normal range based on the past five years.

Summary of Significant Events for November 2019

During the month of November 2019 there were multiple reported overdoses that appeared to have been caused by counterfeit opioids. These cases are under investigation. There was one reported robbery during this time period. There were ten reported motor vehicle thefts during November 2019. There were four aggravated assaults reported in November 2019.

19-007804 Robbery

2000 Chattanooga Rd

An employee advised a black male subject entered the store and ordered her to go to the back of the store so he could go around and get money from the register. This caused the employee to hit the panic alarm. The suspect did not get any money and left the scene prior to officers' arrival. The suspect was later stopped by GSP on the interstate. After an investigation the suspect was arrested for the incident.

19-007684 Overdose

2170 Arbordale Place

Officers were dispatched to an unresponsive female. When they arrived, they found the female unresponsive in the living room. EMS and City Fire arrived about the same time. Officers conducted a safety sweep and found a male subject at the top of the stairs unresponsive. Medical treatment was started on both. The female was pronounced dead at Hamilton Medical Center, and the male subject was revived at Hamilton Medical Center. The case is currently under investigation.

19-007702 Overdose

609 S Thornton Ave

A male subject overdosed on suspected Fentanyl in the form of counterfeit pills. Officers administered Narcan to the male and he responded to the treatment. He was then turned over to medical staff. The male subject spoke with investigators and confirmed the pills came from Chattanooga. This case is currently under investigation.

Aggravated Assault

1600 Underwood St.

A male suspect was in a highly intoxicated state when he got into an argument with the victim. During the argument the suspect pulled out a knife. The victim's son got involved and disarmed the intoxicated male. During the incident the suspect also broke a window out of the victim's vehicle. All subjects treated for minor injuries and released by EMS. The suspect was jailed on various charges without incident.

1700 Wellington Dr

Officers responded to the area in reference to a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was unlocked and the keys were inside the vehicle. The vehicle was entered into GCIC as stolen. The previous shift worked an incident of a stolen vehicle in the same area. An unlocked 2007 GMC Sierra was also entered at this residence and items were taken. This incident is similar to a pattern of entering autos and vehicle thefts earlier in the year.

The complainant reported that his Buick Enclave was entered while he and his wife were at Heritage Park. A purse containing credit cards and other items were stolen. The stolen cards were used at the Kroger on Glenwood Ave. The investigating officer obtained video from the store and was able to see a white male and white female using several different cards until one was declined and it locked down the self-checkout. The suspects then left the scene but a vehicle description could not be obtained. This case is currently active.

A male and a female were in a domestic dispute. They have been having problems and the male got upset with the female for being in another man's apartment. The male was arrested after his mother possibly had a heart attack and she was transported to Hamilton Medical Center. The male was arrested and transported to WCSO without incident.


Suspected Child Molestation

1907 Brady Dr

Chattanooga PD contacted us in reference to a report that originated from an eye doctor there. A male subject took his 6 year old daughter to the eye doctor for a suspected eye infection. The ophthalmologist conducted an eye exam and found that the daughter had pubic lice in her eyes. An investigation was conducted and no indication of abuse was discovered. The case is currently active.

November 2019 Crash Statistics

In November 2019 there were 114 non-private property crashes reported. Injury crashes decreased from October 2019, while injuries stayed the same. Rear end and angle crashes were the most prevalent during November 2019. Following too closely was the leading contributing factor in non-injury crashes. Failure to yield was the leading contributing factor for injury crashes. Chattanooga Rd and Walnut Ave were the roadways where the majority of the crashes occurred. In November 2019 approximately 21.93% of all crashes in the city occurred on Walnut Ave. In November 2019, Walnut Ave was the roadway with the most injury crashes.

I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to enter into contractual agreements for paid law enforcement services provided by or for the Department.

II. Definitions

- A. *Contract* A written promissory agreement by which two or more parties agree, upon sufficient consideration, to do or not to do a particular thing or things.
- B. Paid Law Enforcement Services Law enforcement services performed under contract. This includes, but is not limited to, general patrol activities, follow-up investigation, and the provision of support services, such as records and communications. It does not include correctional services, such as booking, incarceration, or probation.
- C. Provider Agency An agency that provides law enforcement services to another agency. Of necessity, this might also include the provision of equipment and / or supplies incidental to the service provided.
- D. Receiver Agency An agency that receives law enforcement services from another agency. Of necessity, this might also include the receipt of equipment and / or supplies incidental to the service received.

III. Needs Assessment

- A. After the effective date of this directive, no contract for paid law enforcement services shall be entered into without first conducting a needs assessment.
- B. The needs assessment shall include:
 - 1. An analysis of problems, needs, and capabilities
 - 2. An analysis of alternative methods of obtaining services to resolve the problem(s) or meet the need(s)

IV. Written Agreement / Contract

- A. A written agreement or contract shall govern paid law enforcement services provided by or for the Department.
- B. The elements of such agreements or contract shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - A statement of the specific services to be provided
 - 2. Specific language dealing with the financial agreements between the parties
 - 3. Specification of the records to be maintained concerning the performance of the services by the provider agency
 - 4. Provisions dealing with the duration, modification, and termination of the agreement or contract
 - 5. Provisions for dealing with legal contingencies
 - 6. Provisions stipulating that the provider agency maintains control over its personnel
 - 7. Specific arrangements for the use of equipment and facilities
 - 8. A procedure for review and revision, if needed, of the agreement or contract
- C. Each contract for paid law enforcement services entered into by the Department shall be reviewed and signed by the Mayor or City Administrator (City of Dalton Purchasing Policy Section 3-21).

V. Services to be Provided

- A. Contracts shall include, as precisely as possible and practical, statements that identify the nature and extent of services to be provided or received.
- B. Points to be covered may include the following:
 - 1. Equipment and facilities to be used
 - 2. Functions and activities to be performed
 - 3. Responsibilities for planning, organizing, and scheduling of services
 - 4. Local ordinance enforcement guidelines, including the authority of provider personnel to cite offenders into appropriate courts

VI. Financial Agreements

- A. Precise accounting of elements included within a contract shall be made to avoid confusion and misunderstanding among the parties.
- B. Among the specific details that may be accounted for are the following:
 - 1. Salaries and fringe benefits
 - 2. Payments of support services and overhead, if applicable
 - 3. Maintenance of cost accounting records and the issuance of financial reports
 - 4. A formula for increasing costs, if applicable
 - 5. The time and manner of payments for services
 - 6. Procedures for the disposition of revenues generated by the provider agency personnel, if applicable
 - 7. Equipment costs and depreciation, as well as any other direct and indirect costs associated with the contract

VII. Records to be Maintained

- A. Records shall be kept by the Department as to the paid services it renders as a provider agency.
- B. Specific data is dependent on the specific services contracted for.
- C. A breakdown of the actual records to be kept shall be made a part of the agreement or contract.

VIII. Control of Personnel Performing Paid Law Enforcement Services

- A. The provider agency shall be responsible for and have control over personnel assigned to perform paid law enforcement services.
- B. Specifically, the provider agency shall hire, train, assign, discipline, and dismiss any personnel who perform paid law enforcement services.
- C. This accountability function shall be specified in the contract for paid law enforcement services.

IX. <u>Use of Equipment and Facilities</u>

A. Any equipment or facilities needed to perform the services which are the subject of a contract will shall be listed in the contract.

B. The contract should shall also specify who owns, uses, and maintains said equipment and facilities and will shall also make provisions for the lease, purchase, and disposition of the same following termination of the contract.

X. General Contract Provisions

- A. Any contracts for paid law enforcement services entered into by the Department shall include provisions for:
 - 1. Effective beginning and ending dates or conditions
 - 2. Procedures for termination, renewal, or amendment

XI. Legal Counsel

All contracts shall be reviewed by the designated legal counsel, or city attorney, to address legal contingencies including, but not limited to:

- A. Agreement by all parties to mutually cooperate if one is sued due to actions related to performance of the contract
- B. Statements of mutual indemnification or hold harmless, except in cases of willful misconduct, gross negligence, or bad faith
- C. Other specific provisions, as determined by legal counsel, which that may address certain contract terms, conditions, provisions, or limitations

XII. Rights of Employees Performing Paid Law Enforcement Services

An employee participating in a contracted law enforcement service shall have the same employee rights as one who performs non-contracted law enforcement services.

I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to regulate the Department's computers and related technology and the manner in which they are used.

II. Procedure

A. Use of computers

- 1. Only the employees of the Dalton Police Department and other designated persons are authorized to use or access the Department's computers.
- 2. Employees will shall only use computer software and related equipment in the direct performance of their assigned duties, unless authorized by their Division Commanders.
- 3. Employees are required to submit a computer work order for all hardware or software problems and installations. Computer work orders are submitted through email to the City's Information Technology Department.
- 4. Any removable storage device or other files introduced into Department computers must be scanned for potential virus infection.

B. Use of software

- 1. Requests for new software will shall be made through the office of the Chief of Police or his / her designee.
- 2. No unapproved software shall be brought into the Department and installed into on the Department's computers.
- 3. No software from the Department shall be copied for personal use.

- 4. No Employees shall not use the Department's computers to develop software to be used outside the Department without prior authorization by the Chief of Police or his / her designee.
- 5. Any software developed on the Department's time is the property of the Dalton Police Department and the City of Dalton.
- All software must shall be installed and / or uninstalled by a Department approved MIS employee member of the City's IT Department and will shall be subject to review at any time.
- 7. Employees will shall comply with the copyright and licensing restrictions of all software applications.
- 8. Employees will shall not manipulate or alter current software running on Agency-owned mobile, desktop, or handheld computers or other devices unless legally authorized.

C. Use of electronic mail

- 1. Internet e-mail to and from the Dalton Police Department shall be for conducting business only. No personal messages are allowed.
- 2. All messages between mobile computers should shall be business-related and for law enforcement purposes only.
- 3. All e-mail and messages are the property of the Dalton Police Department and the City of Dalton, may be retrieved at any time, and are subject to review.

D. Use of the internet

- 1. All employees who use the City of Dalton / Dalton Police Department's internet service shall use the service for official business only.
- 2. The internet service will shall not be utilized to access any non-job-related website for personal use.
- 3. Personal use of the internet service is a privilege limited to the employee's personal time and must be pre-approved by the employee's Supervisor.
- 4. Employees should understand that sites visited, number of times visited, and total time connected to each site are maintained and are subject to review.

E. Security

1. Employees of the Dalton Police Department that need to access the Department's computers have an individual password that allows them to access the system.

- 2. An employee may shall not share or offer the use of his or her password so that anyone else may gain access to the system.
- 3. Unauthorized use of another employee's password is prohibited.
- 4. No personal computer hardware is authorized for use by employees on Department computers.

F. Expectation of privacy

- All information generated, stored, or maintained by employees within the Department computers is the property of the Dalton Police Department and is subject to review.
- 2. Employees do not have a right to privacy regarding any personal or business-related information stored in the Department computers.
- The e-mail system is the property of the Dalton Police Department and the City of Dalton. All messages are viewed as Police Department messages and not personal, confidential messages of the employee.

G. Telephone Use

- Personal use of the Department's telephones should not be excessive.
 Personal calls should be limited in frequency and duration and should not interfere with the employee's job performance.
 - a. Employees shall make long distance phone calls only when necessary and in the official performance of their duties.
 - b. Personal long distance calls shall not be charged to the Dalton Police Department.
- 2. Voicemail on all extensions may be subject to review by order of the Chief of Police or his / her designee.

H. Cellular Phone Use

- 1. Department cellular phones
 - a. Cellular phones that are the property of the Dalton Police Department are intended to be used by employees for the official performance of their duties.
 - b. If personal calls are necessary, any charges incurred are the responsibility of the employee.
 - c. Monthly cellular phone bills will be reviewed to ensure that the Department cellular phones are being used properly. If the calls

exceed the number of minutes in the cellular phone contract, the employee will be required to reimburse the Department for charges incurred for personal calls.

2. Personal cellular phone use

- a. Personal cellular phones may be used for official duties but are not required. The Department shall not be responsible for any costs associated with personal cellular phones.
- b. Personal cellular phones shall not be used while responding to calls for service.
- c. The use of personal cellular phones to conduct personal business (secondary employment) shall not be allowed during on-duty hours.
- d. The use of personal cellular phones, for personal calls, should be limited in frequency and duration and shall not interfere with the employee's job performance.
- e. An employee that is in possession of their personal cellular phone while on duty must provide the number of that phone to his / her Division Commander upon request and may be required to make available any statements, invoices, or account information concerning the use of their his / her cellular phone to the Chief of Police or his / her designee.

I. Use of Agency Material

- 1. All photographs, images, recordings, or other material captured, recorded, or secured by other means with Departmental-issued equipment or personal equipment used while on duty is the property of the Dalton Police Department.
- 2. Agency material shall only be disseminated in an official capacity and only to persons that are authorized to receive such information.
- 3. Employees are prohibited from disseminating Agency material for other than official duties without permission from the Chief of Police.

I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to ensure that illegal profiling or discrimination is not practiced by any member of the Department. This type of profiling or discrimination is legally, morally, and ethically wrong. The All members of the Dalton Police Department shall treat all citizens in an equitable, fair, and legal manner during all citizen contacts.

II. <u>Definition</u>

Bias-based Profiling – Any law enforcement activity initiated solely on a common trait of a group. This includes, but is not limited to, race, ethnic background, gender, sexual orientation, religion, economic status, age, cultural group, or any other identifiable group. This type of profiling or discrimination is legally, morally, and ethically wrong.

III. Procedure

- A. Officers shall not engage in bias-based profiling or any type of illegal discrimination practice during citizen encounters, to includeing, but not limited to during:
 - 1. Traffic contacts
 - 2. Field contacts: and
 - 3. Asset seizure and forfeiture efforts
- B. Officers may consider traits that are commonly shared within a group when making a citizen contact only when they possess reliable information that is likely to lead to the detection of an individual who is suspected of a specific crime.
- C. Officers that participate in bias-based profiling or discrimination practices are subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal. All corrective measures will shall be handled in accordance with policy GO88-2.14, Rules of Conduct. Officers that who participate in these types of activities may also face civil and

- criminal liability. Bias-based profiling or discrimination cannot and will not be tolerated.
- D. The Dalton Police Department shall provide annual training on bias-based profiling and discrimination practices, including the legal aspects of, to all sworn employees.
- E. The Support Services Division Commander shall complete a documented annual administrative review of Agency practices and citizen concerns in regards to biased-based profiling and submit his / her findings to the Chief of Police.

This policy supersedes any previous policies issued.

I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department that the Agency recognizes the employees' right to have personal web pages, or websites, and social media accounts. However, when reference is made to or about the Dalton Police Department, a review of that reference is needed to ensure that such reference does not cause a decline in public confidence in, and or respect for, in the Department or employee. It is necessary that employees use appropriate discretion in their uses of references to the Dalton Police Department and not discredit themselves or the Department. Personal expression on the internet, within well-defined limits, is permissible.

II. <u>Definition</u>

Social Networking Site – means Any internet-based website where members of that site can electronically gather to share personal profiles, along with other information and photos, with other members. Examples of these sites include MySpace.com, Facebook,.com, Flickr.com Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter, and other sites that promote or allow individuals to express themselves for personal relationships, friendships, or just penpal casual correspondences.

III. Scope

- A. This policy shall apply to all **Dalton Police** Department personnel. Personnel who violate this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination.
- B. The processes and restrictions described in this policy shall be retroactive for any currently existing sites created by an employee or third party.

IV. Privacy

Dalton Police Department Employees should be aware that information posted on social networking sites is not secure or private. The information may be viewed by any member of the public. Once information has been posted on the Internet, it is also considered to be accessible indefinitely. In the event employees choose to post information on a social networking site, they should be aware that the information could be used for fraudulent

purposes. Employees should also be aware that they are jeopardizing their personal confidentiality and that of other employees by posting photographs or personal information about themselves or other members of the Dalton Police Department. In addition, they may be jeopardizing their safety, the safety of their family, their co-workers, and on-going or future investigations. Employees are advised that in the event information has been posted on a social networking site identifying them as a Police Officer, the posting could make them ineligible for specialized positions where anonymity is required.

The process and restrictions described in this policy shall be retroactive for any currently existing sites created by an employee or third party.

V. Restrictions

- A. Employees shall not identify themselves or other employees, directly or indirectly, as a members of the Dalton Police Department.
- B. Photographs or other depictions of Dalton Police Department uniforms, badges, patches, insignia, and / or vehicles shall not be used on employee internet postings.
- C. No pictures, video, artwork, comments, or other reference depicting violent, sexual, racial, or ethnically derogatory material may be posted or associated with a Dalton Police Department employee.
- D. Employees shall not post, or be associated with, any material on the internet that brings discredit to or may adversely affect the efficiency or integrity of the Dalton Police Department.
- E. Employees shall not use the Department's computer system to access, download, or contribute to any social networking site unless he / she is they are lawfully doing so as part of their regular duties or as a part of an investigation requiring access to a social networking site.
- F. Only authorized employees with the approval of the Chief of Police or his / her designee will shall be allowed to upload any audio / video files captured on devices owned by the Dalton Police Department.
- G. Employees should consider the possible adverse consequences of internet postings, such as future employment, cross examination in criminal and civil cases, and public / private embarrassment of the employee or the Department.
- H. Employees are encouraged to seek the guidance of Supervisors regarding any posting that may adversely reflect upon either the Department or upon the professionalism or integrity of the employee.

This policy supersedes any policies previously issued.

I. Policy

It is the policy of the Dalton Police Department to utilize applicable state and federal statutes to accomplish the goals of disrupting criminal conduct by the lawful seizure and forfeiture of assets and proceeds used unlawfully or obtained through various criminal acts.

II. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to standardize the procedures used in lawfully seizing, maintaining, and moving for forfeiture of assets, as enumerated in O.C.G.A. (Official Code Georgia Annotated) 16-13-49, obtained unlawfully through various criminal acts and / or the resulting proceeds, with special emphasis on violations of the Georgia Controlled Substances Act. The Dalton Police Department's intent, by participating in asset forfeiture, is to:

- A. Provide additional tools to Law Enforcement Officers to hamper the operations of drug violators.
- B. Make it more difficult to use illegal proceeds to continue a criminal enterprise if the "leader" is incarcerated.
- C. Remove the financial incentive to participate and / or invest in the drug trade.

III. Definition

AFRC - (Asset Forfeiture Review Coordinator)-(AFRC) – The agent responsible to ensure for ensuring all reports, reviews, and processes are completed in a timely manner in accordance with this policy. The AFRC shall be appointed by the Criminal Investigations Division Commander.

IV. Types of Property Subject to Seizure

Anything with value or any interest in anything of value, including real property and any fixtures thereon, any tangible and intangible personal property, including but not limited to currency, instruments, securities, or any other kind of privilege, interest, claim or right which has been used or obtained in violation of the Georgia Controlled Substances Act (GCSA) and / or other unlawful activities listed in Appendix A of this policy.

V. Statutory Basis for Seizure

- A. Any Officer of the Dalton Police Department may seize property for forfeiture if the Agency determines there is probable cause to believe that the property falls within any of the following categories:
 - 1. All property which is, directly or indirectly, used or intended for use in any manner to facilitate a violation, as outlined in Code Section 16-13-49, or any proceeds derived or realized there from;
 - 2. All property located in this state which was, directly or indirectly, used or intended for use in any manner to facilitate a violation of any of the code sections listed in Appendix A of this policy or of the laws of the United States or any of the several states relating to any of the listed code sections in Appendix A of this policy, which is punishable by imprisonment for more than one (1) year, or any proceeds derived or realized there from;
 - 3. All weapons possessed, used, or available for use in any manner to facilitate a violation of the code sections listed in Appendix A of this policy or of the laws of the United States or any of the several states relating to the listed code sections in Appendix A of this policy, which is punishable by imprisonment for more than one (1) year;
 - 4. Any interest, security, claim, or property right, or contractual right of any kind affording a source of influence over any enterprise that a person has established, operated, controlled, conducted, or participated in the conduct of in violation of the code sections listed in Appendix A of this policy or any of the laws of the United States or any of the several states relating to the listed code sections in Appendix A of this policy, which is punishable by imprisonment for more than one (1) year, or any proceeds derived or realized there from:
 - All monies, negotiable instruments, securities, or other thing of value which
 are found in close proximity to any controlled substance or marijuana or
 other property which is subject to forfeiture under any of the code sections
 listed in Appendix A of this policy.
- B. Seizure of property subject to forfeiture may be made without prior judicial approval if there is probable cause to believe the property is subject to forfeiture under Code Section 16-13-49, or the seizure is incident to arrest or search pursuant to a search warrant or to an inspection under an inspection warrant.
- C. Property not seized pursuant to an arrest warrant, search warrant, inspection warrant, or legally recognized exception to a warrant requirement, which property is located on private premises, should be seized pursuant to a seizure warrant

issued by a Superior Court Judge in the circuit in which the property is presently located.

- D. A property interest shall not be subject to forfeiture under GCSA for a violation involving one gram of cocaine or less, or four ounces of marijuana or less, unless said property was used to facilitate a transaction in, or a purchase of or sale of, a controlled substance or marijuana.
- E. A rented or leased vehicle shall not be subject to forfeiture unless it can be established in forfeiture proceedings that the owner of the rented or leased vehicle is legally accountable for the conduct which would otherwise subject the vehicle to forfeiture, consented to the conduct, or knew, or reasonably should have known the conduct, or that it was likely to occur. O.C.G.A. 16-13-49(f) requires the rented or leased vehicle to be returned to the owner or its agent as soon as practicable.
- F. When property that was used in violation of any of the code sections listed in Appendix A of this policy has been removed from the jurisdiction of this Agency before the seizure is to take place, then the seizure should be done jointly with an Officer having jurisdiction in the area where the property is located. That Officer may then return the property over to this Agency.

VI. <u>Training</u>

All sworn Officers will shall receive annual training on lawful procedures for the seizure of property.

VII. Asset Forfeiture Review Coordinator (AFRC)

The AFRC is responsible for the following:

- A. Ensuring the strict adherence to the provisions of this policy
- B. Responsible for the Reviewing of all asset forfeiture cases
- C. Completeing an annual inspection of all asset forfeiture cases and files
- D. Maintaining a record of all asset forfeiture / seizures cases and their current status

VIII. Initial Steps for Seized Property

- A. When property is seized pursuant to the forfeiture laws of Georgia, Code Section 16-13-49, the facts of the seizure shall be reported immediately on the Asset Forfeiture Form accompanied by a copy of the Law Incident Report. The reports shall contain the following information and be forwarded to the AFRC for review:
 - 1. Time, date, and location of the offense(s) and seizure of assets
 - 2. Names of all suspects, witnesses, and other persons at the scene of the seizure
 - 3. An itemized description of the property that was seized

RESTRICTED LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA

The data contained in this manual is confidential for internal department use only, and will not be divulged outside the department without the written approval of the Chief of Police.

- 4. The legal basis for seizure(s) as outlined in Code Section 16-13-49 and / or other code sections listed in Appendix A of this policy
- 5. Type and quantity, if any, of drugs or contraband located in close proximity to the defendant and the seized property
- B. If not completed through pre-seizure planning, the AFRC or designee shall make a diligent effort to determine ownership of the seized property, including the identification of registered owner(s), title holder(s), and bona fide lien holders, if any.
- B.C. This Agency shall conduct an inventory and estimate the value of property seized and will shall forward a copy of the inventory and appraisal to the AFRC. This should be done as soon as possible so as to provide the District Attorney's Office with information needed to properly evaluate the case.
- C.D. The AFRC shall review all reports and review the basis for the each seizure of the property and, if approved, notify and provide all documentation to the District Attorney's Office within twenty (20) days of the date of seizure of the property.
- D.E. The AFRC or designee will shall evaluate the each case from all aspects, including the factual nexus with criminal activity and an the economic feasibility of proceeding with a forfeiture action. This should shall be done in consultation with the District Attorney's Office.
 - 1. All case information shall be reviewed to verify a connection to illegal activity in violation of any code sections listed in Appendix A.
 - 2. All seized property shall be evaluated for condition, value, sale, and usability. It is the decision of the District Attorney's Office to file a forfeiture action.
 - 3. All seized property shall be properly maintained and stored in order to ensure its protection and value. No seized property shall be used for any purpose prior to forfeiture.
 - 4. If the District Attorney's Office does not file a forfeiture action, then all seized property shall be promptly returned to the owner, or his / her agent, or a valid lien holder upon the District Attorney's direction.

IX. Processing Seized Property

The following procedures shall apply to the processing of seized property under the authority of code sections listed in Appendix A. All seized property shall be placed into evidence submitted to the Property and Evidence Section following established policies in accordance with policy GO88-4.10, Property and Evidence Policy and Procedure. The Officer placing the property into evidence shall fill out the Property Record / Receipt Form and the Asset Forfeiture Form. The forfeiture form shall be submitted to the AFRC by the next working day.

A. Currency

- 1. Photographs will shall be taken of all monies at the scene of the seizure and their relative proximity to contraband, if applicable. All forensic processing should be accomplished prior to moving, if feasible.
- 2. A Supervisor and two (2) Officers each will shall count the money in the presence of the others at one sitting. After each has made an individual count, the three (3) will compare results, thus identifying any possible counting errors. When there is a discrepancy in the count, recounts must be made until all counters agree on the amount of currency. During the money count process, the number of people in the immediate area, i.e., the counting room, should be minimized. Counting of currency shall always be accomplished with at least two (2) Officers and one (1) Supervisor.
- 3. Supplements, property sheets, and property envelopes listing money amounts should shall be specific, listing money by groups in which they were located, by number of bills for each denomination, and by totals for each denomination with the grand total listed.
- 4. Seized currency will shall be placed in a sealed property bag with the item number, date, and case number noted on the appropriate form along with the initials of all Officers who counted the money. Only actual counters of monies should sign the property form(s) containing those monies and only after agreeing that the amounts listed match their figures.
- 5. After completion of evidentiary tests, if any, all seized currency subject to forfeiture in the Superior Court will shall be placed in the Property and Evidence Section. All seized currency subject to federal forfeiture proceedings will shall be turned over to the appropriate federal agency.

B. Vehicles

- 1. Any seized vehicles, regardless of value or lien, shall be towed to the Agency's official impound lot or placed in a secure storage area.
- 1.2. The keys and documents related to ownership status of any seized vehicle shall be placed into evidence utilizing established policies. The vehicle shall be inventoried in accordance with Departmental policy GO91-4.7, Impounding, Towing, and Inventory of Vehicles.
- 2.3. A complete inventory of the seized property and all containers, open or closed, found therein will shall be completed at the time of the seizure or as soon as practicable after the seizure. A good faith attempt will shall be made to release to the lawful owner all personal property not being retained as evidence or for forfeiture that was seized with items impounded items, pursuant to the Georgia Civil Practice Act and not being retained as evidence or for forfeiture. If the owner is unknown, has been arrested, or is otherwise unavailable to take possession of the property, such items shall will be placed in the Property and Evidence Section to be released to the owner at a later date. Perishable foods may be released to

- responsible person or have to be destroyed, for example, milk, meat, etc., and should not be left in a car that may be stored for several weeks an extended period of time, i.e. milk, meat, etc.
- 3.4. Any personal property seized as evidence will shall be packaged, stored separately from the vehicles, and handled in accordance with established procedures for the processing of evidence policy GO88-4.10, Property and Evidence Policy and Procedure.
- 4.5. Reasonable attempts shall be made to maintain the property in the same condition as at the time of seizure. Seized items will shall not be used for any purpose until the property forfeited and all the rights, interests, and title are transferred pursuant to a court order. This section does not prohibit use or operation reasonably necessary for the proper maintenance of seized property.
- 5.6. The Vehicles and all contraband or evidence should be photographed in the positions in which they were found, if possible.
- 6.7. All paperwork related to the seizure of the vehicle will shall be forwarded to the AFRC immediately.

C. Miscellaneous Property

- All other seized property, including jewelry, furniture, tools, electronics, and other personal property, shall be placed into the Property and Evidence Section following established policies and handled in accordance with established procedures in accordance with policy GO88-4.10, Property and Evidence Policy and Procedure.
- 4.2. The seizing Officer will shall complete the forfeiture form and submit the Asset Forfeiture Form and a copy of the report to the AFRC immediately.
- 2.3. Reasonable attempts will shall be made to maintain the property in the same condition as at the same time of seizure. Seized items will shall not be used for any purpose until the property is forfeited and all rights, interest, and title to the seized property are transferred to the State pursuant to court order. This policy does not prohibit use or operations reasonably necessary for the proper maintenance of seized property.
- D. Real Property The standard procedure for preserving real estate prior to forfeiture will shall be by the filing by the District Attorney filing of a forfeiture lien against the real property in the Superior Court of the Conasauga Judicial Circuit and the possible execution of any occupancy agreement. Only in rare circumstances, for good cause shown and with the approval of the District Attorney, will shall real property be seized prior to forfeiture.
- E. Substituted or Derived Assets Because of the uniqueness, special needs, and legal complexities of such property, any consideration or contemplation of seizure of such property shall require consultation with the District Attorney's Office.

F. Firearms - All firearms will shall be placed into evidence following established policies procedures outlined in directive GO88-4.10, Property and Evidence Policy and Procedure. The seizing Officer shall run the serial number of the weapon through NCIC and shall include a hard copy of the result with the Property Record / Receipt Form.

X. Release of Seized Property

- A. If, at the conclusion of the forfeiture process, the claimant prevails, the seized property shall be released to the owner(s) immediately upon the presentation of an order from a Superior Court, unless it is also evidence in an active criminal case. Under no circumstances will there be towing charges, storage fees, administrative costs, or maintenance costs assessed against the claimant, unless such costs are included in a court order.
- B. If the State declines to initiate forfeiture proceedings, the property must be released to the owner upon request, unless the property is being held as evidence. The Department may require the owner to pay any cost associated with handling or storing the property.

XI. Ethical Considerations

- A. No sworn Law Enforcement Officer's employment or salary shall be made to depend upon the level of seizures or forfeitures the Officer achieves.
- B. Any forfeited property retained by the Agency for official law enforcement use is subject to all internal controls applicable to property acquired through the normal appropriations process.
- C. Forfeiture proceeds shall be maintained in a separate fund or account subject to appropriate accounting controls and annual financial audits of all deposits and expenditures.
- D. This Agency shall avoid any appearance of impropriety in the sale or acquisition of forfeited property.

XII. Reporting

- A. The Chief of Police shall complete an itemized annual report of all property received through court-ordered forfeiture and all goods and services procured from the proceeds of such court-ordered forfeitures.
 - 1. The Chief of Police shall submit a copy of the annual asset forfeiture report to the finance committee as part of the annual budget process.
 - 2. The Chief of Police shall cause a copy of the annual asset forfeiture report to be uploaded electronically to the Tax and Expenditure Data website maintained by the Carl Vinson Institute of Georgia (CVIOG).
- B. The AFRC will shall submit an itemized monthly report to the Chief of Police listing any property which has been seized and its pending disposition.

C. The Chief of Police will shall submit an annual report listing all property received through federal forfeiture statues through the U.S. Department of Justice and / or Treasury Department. The report will shall include a renewal of the Department's agreement to abide by all portions of the Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement as prescribed by federal statute.

This policy supersedes any policies previously issued.

Training Division Monthly Report November 2019

Overview

Recruit Class 2019-01 concluded on November 8th when 4 candidates challenged state and national certification exams for Firefighter 1 and Firefighter 2. Annual physical agility testing was completed for all certified firefighters. A refresher course on fire cause determination and evidence preservation was delivered to all suppression personnel at the acquired structures on Underwood Circle. The department hosted Georgia Smoke Diver Class 58 during the week of November 11th. The class began with 42 candidates and graduated 16. Monthly training included territory familiarization, pre-fire training, core competency check-offs, special operations training, and company level drills chosen by company officers. Training hours during the month of November totaled 4,070.

Outside Schools

4 firefighters attended Intermediate and Advanced Incident Command courses hosted by Whitfield County Emergency Management.

1 chief officer attended a symposium on human trafficking at Georgia Public Safety Training Center.

2 firefighters attended The Company Officer Academy delivered by Chiefs Rick Lasky and John Salka hosted by Roswell/Alpharetta Public Safety Training Center.

One member of the Fire Prevention Division attended a 54-hour course entitled Plans Review for Fire and Life Safety at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

- 164 hours were spent completing apparatus checks and equipment replenishment
- Cleaning and maintenance activities accounted for 487 hours in November
- 3 hours were dedicated to fire investigation and related activities
- Fall hydrant maintenance accounted for 108 work hours

Title: Rapid Intervention Teams/Crews (RIT/RIC)

Reference: NFPA 1407, Standard for Training Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews, 2015 ed.

NFPA 1500, Standard on Fire Department Occupational Safety and Health Program, 2013 ed.

NFPA 1710, Standard for the Organization and Deployment of Fire Suppression Operations, Emergency Medical Operations, and Special Operations to the Public by Career Fire Departments, 2016 ed.

OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134(g)(4), Personal Protective Equipment; Respiratory Protection

Scope: All personnel

Purpose: Operations at hazardous incidents require a backup team to be in place at the incident site. This team's responsibility is to be available to rescue any responders in need of aid at the incident should that need arise.

Procedure:

The Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) shall be assigned as soon as possible on any incident where personnel are operating in a hazardous area. If the incident covers a large geographic area, more than one RIT may be required.

The initial stages of an incident shall encompass the tasks undertaken by the first arriving companies with only one entry team assigned or operating in the hazardous area. During these initial stages, the rapid intervention crew(s) shall be either:

- (a) On-scene members designated and dedicated as rapid intervention crew(s).
- (b) On-scene personnel performing command or safety functions but ready to re-deploy to perform rapid intervention crew functions.

The initial RIT shall consist of a minimum of two fully equipped members with the necessary rescue tools. These tools may include forcible entry tools, search ropes, thermal imaging camera, cribbing, spare air packs, saws, etc. and should be tailored to occupancy and construction type. The RIT will report directly to the Incident Commander.

When a second entry team is assigned or operating in the hazardous area, the incident shall no longer be considered in the initial stages and at least one company of a minimum of three personnel shall be assigned as RIT.

The RIT Leader shall perform a 360-degree size-up of the structure to identify the structural layout, operating areas, potential hazards, and possible means of access and egress. Additional 360s shall be conducted throughout the incident to monitor for changing conditions.

The RIT shall monitor tactical radio channels to maintain contact with command and have an accurate understanding of operations and changing conditions. The RIT may perform exterior support functions (e.g., secure utilities, throw ladders for egress, etc.) but must remain prepared to deploy and perform RIT duties.

The IC shall evaluate the situation and the risks to operating crews and shall provide one or more RITs based on the needs of the situation (e.g., large commercial occupancy, health care facility, etc.). Nothing in this guideline is meant to preclude firefighters from performing rescue activities before an entire team has been assembled if there are fewer than three team members available and an individual inside the burning structure must be rescued immediately.

Whenever personnel are operating in positions or performing functions (including special operations) that would subject them to immediate danger, at least one rapid intervention crew shall be standing by with equipment to provide assistance or rescue.

Termination of RIT shall be at the discretion of the Incident Commander.

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
