City Attorney Riggins stated no changes between first and second reading. Speirs moved, Eagleson seconded to approve second reading of Ordinance #1443 Display of Merchandise. Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.

REGULAR MEETING, MARCH 2, 2026

First Reading

Attorney Riggins spoke about the ordinance, which will allow collection of special assessments in order to fund certain improvements such as water, sewer, sidewalk, curb and gutter. Resident, Pat Dringman asked for clarification on reconstruction and overlays, reasonable life expectancy. Riggins stated that would have to be defined by an engineer. Dringman also asked about reconstruction of missing paved streets without curb and gutter, may be assessed 100% to the benefitting properties owners. Riggins stated that would be if someone is seeking to put in curb and gutter under the criteria. Speirs moved, Eagleson seconded to approve first reading of Ordinance #1444 Adopting Chapter 15.02 Special Assessments. Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.

Permit

Planning, Zoning and Historic Preservation Officer Kuchenbecker spoke about the permit. Resident, Nancy Field, spoke against due to possible water drainage issues onto her property. Property owner, Frederick Conforti, stated that property is designated for residential and believes the development would help with drainage and water not contribute to it. Discussion was held concerning legal description. Resident, Christin Sjomeling, asked how many single family units could build instead of multi-family units. Kuchenbecker stated seven houses with approval could be built. Speirs moved, Eagleson seconded to Act as Board of Adjustment and deny Application for Conditional Use Permit - Oralie's Development - Multi-Family Dwelling Unit legally described as Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, Block 1 of Highland Park Addition to the City of Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota, according to the Plat recorded in Book 1 Page 135. (Approved by Planning and Zoning Commission February 4, 2026 with four (4) conditions.) Conforti asked if he could have an explanation as to why denied. Attorney Riggins stated not necessarily, if the commission does not want to they do not have to, there was a time for discussion. Conforti stated it is difficult when you go through all the proper protocol working with staff and have planning commission support to spend the time and money to get this far and not have the curiosity for an explanation. Commission President Martinisko stated she feels that the Commissioners that voted to oppose it were swayed by the residents. She hopes he will continue to work with staff on a different type of construction. Roll Call: Aye-Eagleson, Johnson, Spiers. Nay-Martinisko. Motion carried.

Exemption

Speirs moved, Johnson seconded to grant exemption from Ordinance Chapter 15.32.130(K), permitting flags and bunting to remain on display from May 15, 2026 to October 15, 2026 as part of Deadwood Sesquicentennial Celebration. Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.

Purchase

Police Chief Shafer spoke about the purchase. Johnson moved, Speirs seconded to purchase 2025 Ford Police Interceptor from Wareing Motors in an amount of \$46,135.00, which is state bid pricing. (To be paid from Police equipment line item.) Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.

Purchase

Kuchenbecker spoke about the purchase. Speirs moved, Eagleson seconded to purchase 12 Trash Receptacles from Victor Stanley including freight in the amount of \$20,465.00 (To be paid from HP Capital Assets.) Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.

Pay

Parking and Transportation Director Lux spoke about the repair. Speirs moved, Eagleson seconded to pay Inland Truck Parts & Service to replace timing chain, gears & Gaskets in trolley 4 at a price not to exceed \$6,800.00. (To be paid from Trolley repair line item.) Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.

Kuchenbecker spoke about the service. Johnson moved, Eagleson seconded to engage Wyss Associates, Inc. at a cost not to exceed \$6,500.00 for conceptual design, layout, and opinion of probable cost for Days of '76 parking lot and new campground. (TO be paid by P&T Professional Services and HP Professional Services line items.) Roll Call: Aye-All. Motion carried.


INFORMATIONAL ITEMS AND ITEMS FROM CITIZENS




