RESOLUTION NO. 2025 - 06

RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO CONTINUE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS, AND ESTABLISH RATES FOR 2019 FOR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, Business Improvement Districts Nos. 1-6 have been created and Business Improvement District Boards appointed since August of 1990 and re-appointed and continued through the current date; and

WHEREAS, such Business Improvement Districts Boards have recommended and the City Commission has accepted plans and occupation tax assessments for the calendar years 1991 through 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Business Improvement District Boards have recommended continuation of Business Improvement Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 and have recommended the amount of the Business Improvement Tax Levy; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Deadwood that the City hereby declares its intent to continue Business Improvement Districts No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 with the boundaries of the Districts as follows:

<u>Business Improvement District No. 1:</u> All lodging establishments and gaming establishments located within the city limits of Deadwood, applied to all gaming devices and lodging rooms located within the city limits of Deadwood, applied to all gaming

devices and lodging rooms located in the city limits and affiliated with or have common ownership with any gaming establishments or property.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 2</u>: All other lodging establishments located within the City of Deadwood applied to all gaming devices located in a business with common or unrestricted access within the business premises, excepting the first fifty (50) such gaming devices, including any business existing as of the date of this ordinance and any future similar businesses meeting the same criteria.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 3</u>: All lodging establishments, and short term rentals within the City of Deadwood which do not have gaming devices.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 4</u>: Each gaming establishment leasing a city slot machine as determined by sealed bid or auction conducted by the City of Deadwood.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 5</u>: Gaming establishment known as the VFW located at 10 Pine Street.

Business Improvement District No. 6: inactive

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Deadwood declares its intent to establish 2019 Occupation Tax Levies as follows:

1) The estimated monies to be raised by the Business Improvement Districts in 2025 is \$511,495.00; the estimated costs for the expenses, improvements, activities, and promotions within the Business Improvement Districts are as follows:

A. <u>Business Improvement Districts No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6</u>:

Administrative and legal expenses	\$ 15,000.00
Deadwood Chamber of Commerce and	
Visitors Bureau - Marketing	\$ 440,495.00
Contingency	\$ 56,000.00
TOTAL	\$ 511,495.00

- 2) The imposition of the General Occupation Tax for the six Districts for 2025 shall be as follows:
- A. <u>District No. 1</u>: Tax at the rate of \$125.00 per year or \$6.25 per year per square foot for 20 square feet for each gaming device, slot machine, 21 table or poker table, or video lottery machine, excepting municipal slot machines. Lodging establishments shall pay \$75.00 per year per room or \$.25 per square foot per lodging units using three hundred (300) square feet for each room.
- B. <u>District No. 2</u>: Tax at the rate of \$50.00 per year or \$2.50 per square foot on twenty (20) square feet for each gaming device, slot machine, or table game, excepting municipal slot machines which shall be applied to all gaming devices located in a business with common or unrestricted access within the business premises, excepting the first fifty (50) such gaming devices, including any business existing as of the date of this ordinance and any future similar businesses meeting the same criteria.
- C. <u>District No. 3</u>: Tax at the rate of \$75.00 per year per room or \$.25 per square foot per year for lodging establishments using three hundred (300) square feet for each room.
- D. <u>District No. 4</u>: Tax at the rate of \$2,000.00 per year or \$100.00 per square foot for

twenty (20) square feet for each city or municipal slot machine as determined by sealed bid or auction conducted by the city of Deadwood.

- E. <u>District No. 5</u>: Tax at the rate of \$75.00 per year or \$3.75 per square foot on twenty (20) square feet for each gaming device, slot machine, 21 table or poker table, or video lottery machine, excepting municipal slot machines.
- F. District No. 6: inactive.
- 3) That the levies shall be billed and collected monthly by the City Finance Officer with the annual levy to be paid in monthly installments due on the 10th day of each month beginning with the first installment due in the Finance Office on January 10, 2025 with a fifteen (15%) percent late charge to be added for all past due charges.
- 4) That the taxes as set forth in paragraph 2 above shall be determined by the number of games and video lottery machines licensed by the South Dakota Commission on Gaming and the South Dakota Lottery Commission as of the first day of January, 2025 for the first six months of 2025, and as of the first day of July, 2025, for the second six months of 2025, with adjustments to be made for the licenses added or deleted on the first day of the month following the addition or deletion.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that amounts raised from the imposition of the occupation taxes set forth above are projected to be in the amount of five hundred eleven thousand, four hundred ninety-five dollars (\$511,495.00)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that first reading of an Ordinance #1415 will be before the City Commission of the City of Deadwood, South Dakota, on January 21 2205 at 102 Sherman Street in the City of Deadwood, South Dakota, to consider the business occupation tax levy for 2025. The Deadwood Chamber of Commerce has given notice of the hearing to each occupant or user of space or property owner located in the proposed Districts.

The City Archives is requesting permission to enter into a contract with Donald Toms of Lead, South Dakota to index the Lawrence County Tax Records (1913 – 1920) as part of the 2025 ledger indexing project. In 2025, the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission allocated \$8,000.00 from the City Archives budget to index the next installment of the Lawrence County ledgers that have been microfilmed and digitized in 2022.

These tax ledgers provide a tremendous amount of insight into the families that once lived in Deadwood and Lawrence County. If approved, the City Attorney will develop a contract for this project.

The Historic Preservation Commission reviewed this request at their January 21, 2025 meeting and recommend approval.

RECOMMENDATION:

Move to enter into a contract with Donald Toms, independent contractor, to index the Lawrence County Tax Records (1913-1920) as part of the 2025 ledger indexing project. The cost for this project will not exceed the amount of \$8,000.00. This is a 2025 City Archives budgeted project.

CONTRACT BETWEEN CITY OF DEADWOOD AND INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

This Agreement, dated the _____ day of January, 2024, is between the CITY OF DEADWOOD - ARCHIVES, a department within the City of Deadwood, with its business offices at 108 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, hereinafter referred to as "ARCHIVES" or "CITY," and Donald Toms of Lead, South Dakota hereinafter referred to as "INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR" or "IC."

The purpose of this Contract is to set forth the terms and conditions of the agreement between ARCHIVES and IC for services related to the preparation of an indexed database and the transcription of Lawrence County Tax Records as related to the history of Deadwood/Lawrence County, South Dakota.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to enter into and agreement whereby IC agrees to create and provide to the City of Deadwood Archives an indexed database consisting of Lawrence County Tax Record ledgers,

WHEREAS, IC has the experience and expertise to create and prepare the indexed database and meet the other requirements and obligations of this contract.

Based on the covenants, representations and mutual understanding and agreement of the parties, ARCHIVES and IC, agree as follows:

1. The parties agree that it is the IC'S responsibility to provide his own office space and equipment and pay all necessary taxes and

insurance including Social Security and workmen's compensation insurance.

- 2. IC shall create and provide CITY with one (1) digital copy of the transcribed materials along with the original files in good working order.
- 3. IC shall submit one (1) voucher for each completed indexed ledger for payment to the ARCHIVES. All materials and vouchers shall become the property of the City of Deadwood.
- 4. CITY shall select all materials and topics.
- 5. ARCHIVES shall pay the IC at the rate of Six-Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars per completed ledger. IC shall complete ledgers by December 31, 2025 for a total not to exceed Eight Thousand (\$8,000) Dollars.
- 6. IC may not subcontract any portion of this contract or any portion of the work.
- 7. ARCHIVES may terminate this contract upon giving IC five (5) days' written notice of its intent to terminate. IC may terminate this contract for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice.
- 8. In performance of the work hereunder, IC understands and agrees it is an independent contractor and this contract shall not be construed as creating any type of relationship including but not limited to, principal and agent or employer and employee between CITY and IC. The IC shall not have authority to hire any person on behalf of ARCHIVES.
- 9. IC hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless CITY, its employees and authorized representatives from and against any and all suits, claims, actions, legal and administrative proceedings, demands, damages, liabilities, costs and expense including attorney's fees arising out of or in connection with any conduct or work of the IC or anyone acting under the IC'S direction, control or on IC'S behalf in connection with or incident to the work or otherwise.
- 10. This agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota.

11. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties on its subject. There are no other terms, conditions or understandings of any kind or nature expressed or implied.

The City Archives is requesting permission to enter into a contract with Renee Boen of Rapid City, South Dakota for professional services as related to the City's archaeological collections. Ms. Boen was the South Dakota State Archaeologist, Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) liaison and Collections Manager for the South Dakota Archaeological Research Center.

As part of this agreement, Ms. Boen will review and make recommendations concerning the City's Native American collections at the Days of 76 Museum. She would also review and make recommendations on the archaeological storage facility, aide and assist in the development of policies and procedures for the archaeological storage facility and its holdings and provide technical assistance in the long-term storage of archeological collections at City Hall. Funding for this retainer would come from the 2025 HPC Archaeology budget.

The Historic Preservation Commission reviewed this request at their January 21, 2025 meeting and recommend approval.

RECOMMENDATION:

Move to allow the City Archives to enter into a contract with Renee Boen of Rapid City, South Dakota for professional services as related to the City's Native American and archaeological collections. This retainer will not exceed \$5,000.00 and will come from the 2025 HPC Archaeology budget.

CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This AGREEMENT is made by and between the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission, a department of the City of Deadwood (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") and Renee Boen, an independent archaeological contractor, 917 9th St, Rapid City, SD, 57701, (hereinafter referred to as Independent Contractor or "IC").

I.

WHEREAS, **IC** has agreed to aide and provide professional services for the perpetual care and long-term care of the CITY'S archaeological and anthropological collections housed within the city limits of Deadwood, South Dakota.

II.

AN ORDINANCE CONTINUING BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS NOS. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 WITHIN THE CITY OF DEADWOOD AND ESTABLISHING ASSESSMENTS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Deadwood, South Dakota, as follows:

SECTION I: There has been previously created, pursuant to SDCL Chapter 9-55, as amended, six (6) business improvement districts within the City of Deadwood, South Dakota, which districts have been known as Business Improvement District No. 1, Business Improvement District No. 2, Business Improvement District No. 3, Business Improvement Business Improvement District 4, Business Improvement District No. 5 and Business Improvement District No. 6; and the City Commission of the City of Deadwood, having adopted a RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO CONTINUE BUSINESS DISTRICTS, ESTABLISH THE LEVY OF THE BUSINESS OCCUPATION TAX, AND ESTABLISH RATES FOR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS on the 21st day of January, 2025 and having given notice as required by South Dakota law of a hearing on said Resolution of Intent and holding such hearing the 5th day of November, 2018; and

SECTION II: A public hearing on the RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO CONTINUE
BUSINESS DISTRICTS, ESTABLISH THE LEVY OF THE BUSINESS OCCUPATION TAX,
AND ESTABLISH RATES FOR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS was held on the
5th day of November, 2018, at 5:00 p.m., at the City Commission meeting room located at 102
Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota; and as a result of said hearing the Resolution of
Intent adopted October 1, 2018 was approved by the City Commission of the City of Deadwood.

SECTION II: A RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO CONTINUE BUSINESS DISTRICTS, ESTABLISH THE LEVY OF THE BUSINESS OCCUPATION TAX, AND ESTABLISH RATES FOR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS was approved by the City Commission of the City of Deadwood; and

SECTION III: The estimated revenues to be raised by the Business Improvement Districts in 2019 are \$511,495.00 506,495.00 and the estimated costs for activities and promotions within the Business Improvement Districts are as follows: Business Improvement Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6:

Administrative and Legal Expenses	\$ 15,000.00

Contingency	\$ 56,000.00
TOTAL	\$ 511,495.00

<u>SECTION IV</u>: A description of the boundaries for each of the districts shall be as follows:

<u>Business Improvement District No. 1</u>: All <u>hotels, motels</u>, lodging establishments and gaming establishments located within the city limits of Deadwood, applied to all gaming devices and hotel rooms located within the city limits of Deadwood and affiliated with or have common ownership with any gaming establishment or property.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 2</u>: All <u>other hotels, motels and</u> lodging establishments located within the City of Deadwood applied to all gaming devices located in a business with common or unrestricted access within the business premises, excepting the first fifty (50) such gaming devices, including any business existing as of the date of this ordinance and any future similar businesses meeting same criteria.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 3</u>: All <u>hotels, motels,</u> lodging establishments and short term rentals <u>bed and breakfast establishments</u> within the City of Deadwood which do not have gaming devices.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 4</u>: Each gaming establishment leasing a city slot machine as determined by sealed bid or auction conducted by the City of Deadwood.

<u>Business Improvement District No. 5</u>: Gaming establishment known as the VFW located at 10 Pine Street.

Business Improvement District No. 6: inactive

<u>SECTION V</u>: The purpose of the six Business Improvement Districts is to provide funds for the purposes set forth in Section III.

SECTION VI: The general business tax shall be imposed upon all gaming businesses containing gaming devices located within the six districts licensed by the South Dakota Commission on Gaming, all hotels, motels or other businesses lodging establishments offering lodging accommodations within the city for periods of less than twenty-eight (28) consecutive days, bed and breakfast lodging units, and all businesses containing video lottery machines licensed by the South Dakota Video Lottery Commission located within the six (6) districts.

<u>SECTION VII</u>: The imposition of the General Occupation Tax for the six Districts shall be as follows:

A. District No. 1: Tax at the rate of \$125.00100.00 per year or \$6.255.00 per year per square foot for 20 square feet for each gaming device, slot machine, 21 table, poker table, video lottery machine, or other table game, excepting municipal five cent or less slot machines. Motels, hotels and bed and breakfast Lodging establishments shall pay \$75.0050.00 per year per room or \$.25167 per square foot per motel, hotel, or bed and breakfast lodging units lodging establishment using three hundred (300) square feet for each room.

B. District No. 2: Tax at the rate of \$50.0025.00 per year or \$2.501.25 per square foot for twenty (20) square feet for each gaming device, slot machine, 21 table, poker table, other table game, or video lottery machine, excepting municipal five cent machines which shall be applied to all gaming devices located in a business with common or unrestricted access within the business premises, excepting the first fifty (50) such gaming devices, including any business existing as of the date of this ordinance and any future similar businesses meeting the same criteria.

C. District No. 3: Tax at the rate of \$75.0050.00 per year per room or \$.25167 per square foot per year per motel, hotel, or bed and breakfast lodging establishments and short term rentals using three hundred (300) square feet for each room.

<u>D. District No. 4:</u> A tax at the rate of \$2,000.00 per year or \$100.00 per square foot for twenty square feet for each city or municipal slot machine as determined by sealed bid or auction conducted by the City of Deadwood.

<u>E</u>: District No. 5: Tax at the rate of \$75.0050.00 per year or \$3.752.50 per square foot on 20 square feet for each gaming device, slot machine, 21 table or poker table, other table game or video lottery machine, excepting municipal slot machines.

F. District No. 6: inactive.

SECTION VIII: Assessments as set forth above shall be determined by the number of games and video lottery machines licensed by the South Dakota Commission on Gaming and the South Dakota Lottery Commission as of the 1st day of January, for the first six (6) months of each year; and as of the 1st day of July for the second six (6) months of each year; with adjustments to be made for licenses added or deleted on the 1st day of the month following the addition or deletion.

SECTION IX: Assessments shall be billed and collected monthly by the City Finance Officer with the annual assessment to be paid in monthly installments due on the 10th day of each month beginning with the 10th day of January and like installments due on the 10th day of each following month.

SECTION X: All assessments shall be due and payable on or before the 10th day of the month following the month for which the assessment is due. All amounts not paid and received in the Finance Office by the due date will be charged a late fee in the amount of fifteen percent (15%) of the amount due which shall be added to all past due charges. Failure to pay such tax and fees shall also constitute a violation of this Ordinance which may be punishable by a fine, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), to be paid to the City of Deadwood. Additionally, any person, partnership or corporation whose duty is made by this chapter to pay any license tax and who does not pay the same shall be liable for an action for the recovery of the amount of such license tax, provided such remedy shall not be deemed as being concurrent with other remedies herein provided. An unpaid balance under this Ordinance shall constitute a lien upon the property owned by the business or user of space being taxed and shall become a lien against and shall run with the property and may be enforced and collected in the same manner as other unpaid real property taxes and assessments. In the event legal action is required to collect delinquent assessments, the establishment failing to pay will be responsible for and pay all attorney's fees and costs incurred by the City in collecting the unpaid tax. The Finance Officer shall certify all unpaid amounts or balances to the County Treasurer for collection in the same manner as general property taxes are collected. Further, the City of Deadwood shall have the ability to deny the issuance of any permits or licenses or any renewals thereof to any business or premise that fails to conform to the provisions of this Ordinance including failure to pay assessment, including, but not limited to, building permits, malt beverage licenses, and liquor licenses.

Section 10 Item a.

<u>SECTION XI</u>: The Business Improvement Districts have been established pursuant to the provisions of SDCL 9-55 as amended.

SECTION XII: The business occupation tax as stated above is hereby imposed upon the above-described businesses within the six (6) Business Improvement Districts, which tax shall be due and payable as set forth above. It is hereby made the obligation and duty of every person, partnership, firm or corporation engaged in any business or occupation within the limits of the taxing districts as provided, on which a business occupation tax is levied by this Ordinance, to pay said tax at the times provided for payment of the same herein.

SECTION XIII: The City Finance Officer of the City of Deadwood is directed to prepare and publish a Notice of Levy of the general business occupation tax, with such notice to be published pursuant to SDCL 9-55-13. The hearing will be held on the 21st day of January, 2025, at 5:00 p.m., at the City Commission chambers located at 102 Sherman Street in the City of Deadwood, South Dakota, to hear any objections or protests by businesses and users of space upon which the occupation tax is imposed.

SECTION XIV: Should any section, clause or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

To construct the trailer parking lot and trailhead at the Deadwood sign on Highway 85 south of the Lodge, the city must first acquire the property from the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT). It is in the interest of both the SDDOT and City of Deadwood to also purchase property near the US Highway 85/385 intersection where the skate park used to be. The SDDOT seeks to acquire the parcel in which the Railroad parking lot is built for the future Deadwood box culvert project.

The attached purchase agreement allows the City of Deadwood to acquire the Deadwood Hill parcels and skate park parcels needed. The purchase price is \$779,000 (approximately \$85,000 per acre). The agreement allows SDDOT to acquire the Railroad lot parcel at the appraised value. That appraisal is ongoing, and purchase would be completed within 60 days.

1. PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT.

The CITY desires to purchase parcels of real property from the STATE within the City of Deadwood, South Dakota for the construction and maintenance of one or more municipal parking lots. The STATE desires to purchase a parcel of real property from the CITY that is currently being utilized as a municipal parking lot within the City of Deadwood, South Dakota.

2. BACKGROUND

A. The STATE is the owner of real property in Deadwood, South Dakota located along Highway 85 within the city limits of Deadwood. This real property is legally described as:

These parcels of real property will be referred to as the "State Property" throughout this Agreement.

B. The CITY is the owner of real property in Deadwood, South Dakota, which is currently being maintained and operated as a municipal parking lot, and is legally described as:

Outlots 3, 4, and 5 of M.S. 38, City of Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota. EXCEPTING therefrom Lot H-1, as shown on plat filed in Plat Book 4 on Page 383; EXCEPTING therefrom Lot H-2, as shown on the plat filed in Plat Book 5 on Page 38; EXCEPTING therefrom Lot H-3, as shown on the plat filed in Plat Book 5 on Page 53.

This parcel of real property will be referred to as the "City Property" throughout this Agreement.

3. SALE OF STATE PROPERTY TO CITY

A. Offer and Acceptance

The CITY offers to purchase, and the STATE agrees to sell, at a price and upon the terms set forth in this Agreement, the STATE'S interest in the State Property described above.

B. Payment

The CITY will pay the STATE the purchase price of Seven Hundred Seventy-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$779,000.00). The CITY will submit payment to STATE on or before closing, which shall occur by February 28, 2025.

C. Possession

The STATE will maintain possession of the State Property until the STATE has received the purchase price, in full, the STATE has signed this Agreement, and this transaction is closed. The parties to this Agreement anticipate that the transaction will be closed on or before February 28, 2025.

D. Conveyance

Upon full payment of the purchase price, the STATE will convey, or caused to be conveyed, all of the STATE'S right, title, and interest in and to the State Property, if any, to the CITY by quitclaim deed, subject to any visible and recorded easements, exceptions, and reservations of record, and in accordance with the terms, conditions, and reservations contained in this Agreement. The deed from the STATE to the CITY will include the following provisions:

Grantee further understands and accepts the Real Property in an "AS IS, WHERE IS" condition and subject to all faults of every kind and nature whatsoever, whether latent or patent and whether now or hereafter existing. Grantor will not be obligated to do any restoration, repairs, removal, remediation, monitoring, or other work in

connection with the Real Property, and Grantor will not be liable for any restoration, repairs, removal, remediation, monitoring, or other work necessary to cause the Real Property to meet any applicable laws, ordinances, requirements, limitations, restrictions, rules, regulations, or codes, or be suitable for any particular use. Grantee will indemnify Grantor against any liability, claims, suits, actions, damages, penalties, fines, costs, and expenses, including attorneys' and consultants' fees, incurred or arising directly or indirectly from or in connection with any such restoration, repairs, removal, remediation, monitoring, or other work, including injury to, death of, loss of, or damage to property of Grantee or any third party. Grantee specifically assumes the risk that hazardous substances and contaminants may be present on the property, and indemnifies, holds harmless, and hereby waives, releases, and discharges forever the Grantor from any and all present or future claims or demands, and any and all damages, loss, injury, claims or costs, including fines, penalties, and judgments arising from or in any way related to the condition of the property or presence of any hazardous substances or contaminants in, on, or under the Real Property. This indemnity specifically includes the obligation of Grantee to remove, close, remediate, reimburse, or take other actions requested or required by any governmental agency concerning any hazardous substances or contaminates on the Real Property.

This Deed does not carry with it any implied covenants whatsoever, including any covenant that Grantor has good right to convey any interest in the Real Property to Grantee. Grantee understands and accepts the Real Property subject to all encumbrances, covenants, conditions, and restrictions, whether of record or not.

The provisions of this deed will be covenants running with the land binding upon and inuring to the benefit of Grantor and Grantee and their respective successors and assigns.

E. Natural Resources

The STATE reserves all rights to all deposits of coal, ores, metals, and other minerals, asphaltum, oil, gas, and other like substance, together with the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the same upon rendering compensation to the owner or lessee for all damages that may be caused by such prospecting or removal, together with the right of access at all times to exercise said right. The deed from the STATE to the CITY will contain the following provision:

It is expressly understood that the Grantor reserves all rights to all deposits of coal, ores, metals, and other minerals, asphaltum, oil, gas, and other like substance, together with the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the same upon rendering compensation to the owner or lessee for all damages that may be caused by such prospecting or removal.

4. SALE OF CITY PROPERTY TO STATE

A. Offer and Acceptance

The STATE intends to purchase, and the CITY agrees to sell, at a price and upon the terms set forth in this Agreement, the CITY'S interest in the City Property described above.

B. Payment

The Parties agree that the purchase price will equal the total appraised value of the City Property, as will be determined by an appraisal ordered by STATE. Upon full execution of this Agreement, STATE will an order the appraisal of the City Property. Upon receipt of the final appraisal report, STATE will provide a copy to the CITY. Within thirty (30) days of the receipt of the final appraisal

report, STATE will provide to CITY, in writing, whether it elects to complete the sale of the City Property. If the STATE elects to complete the sale of the City Property, the STATE will pay the CITY the purchase price within sixty (60) days from the date that the election was provided to CITY.

C. Conveyance

Upon full payment of the purchase price for the City Property, the CITY will convey, or caused to be conveyed, good and marketable title in and to the described City Property, including subsurface rights, to the STATE by warranty deed, in accordance with the terms, conditions, and reservations contained in this Agreement.

D. Possession

After the City Property is conveyed to STATE, the CITY will maintain possession of the City Property until a future date to be determined by the STATE in its sole and absolute discretion. The STATE will take possession of the City Property no sooner than January 1, 2028. The STATE will provide to the CITY notice of the selected date of transfer of possession at least 30 days prior thereto.

E. Maintenance and Repair

During the period of time in which the CITY remains in possession of the City Property, the CITY will be responsible for maintaining the City Property as a parking lot, including but not limited to, maintenance of the driving and parking surfaces, patching, crack sealing, and snow removal.

5. INDEMNIFICATION

The CITY agrees to indemnify the State of South Dakota, its officers, agents, and employees, from and against all claims or proceedings for actions, suits, damages, liabilities, other losses or equitable relief to the extent arising as a result of the CITY'S negligence, tortious acts, or intentional acts in performing services or its duties under this Agreement, including specifically any injuries or damage occurring on the City Property during the term of CITY's possession thereof. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the STATE may, in its sole discretion engage attorneys and other professionals to defend the State of South Dakota, its officers, agents, and employees, or to assist CITY in the defense. If the STATE exercises this authority and CITY is determined to be liable, then the STATE is entitled to reimbursement of its reasonable attorney fees and costs in defending the suit in proportion to the degree of liability attributed to CITY in the proceeding. This section does not require CITY to be responsible for or defend against claims or proceedings for damages, liabilities, losses or equitable relief arising solely from errors or omissions of the STATE, its officers, agents or employees.

6. TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION APPROVAL.

This Agreement is contingent upon the approval of the sale of the State Property by the South Dakota Transportation Commission. In the event the Transportation Commission does not approve said sale, the Agreement will be null and void without any force or effect.

7. BINDING AGREEMENT. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties for the sale and purchase of the subject real property and will bind and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their successors and assigns.

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- 8. EXECUTION OF DOCUMENTS. The parties each agree to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 9. PARTIAL INVALIDITY. If any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force without being impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 10. CHOICE OF LAW/FORUM. South Dakota law will govern this transaction. Any lawsuit pertaining to or affecting this Agreement will be venued in Circuit Court, Sixth Judicial Circuit, Hughes County, South Dakota.
- 11. VISUAL INSPECTION. The CITY has made a complete visual inspection of the State Property and has knowledge as to the past uses of that real property. Based upon this inspection and knowledge, the CITY is aware of the condition of the subject real property and the CITY specifically acknowledges that the CITY is purchasing the State Property in an "as-is with all faults" basis. The CITY is not relying on any representation or warranties of any kind whatsoever from the STATE as to any matters concerning the subject real property, including the physical condition of the subject real property or any defects, the presence of any hazardous substances, wastes, contaminants in, on, or under the subject real property, the condition or existence of any above ground or underground structures or improvements in, on, or under the subject real property, the condition, or any leases, easements, or other agreements affecting the property. The CITY assumes the risk that hazardous substances and contaminants may be present on the subject real property, and waives, releases, and discharges forever the STATE from any and all present or future claims or demands, and any and all damages, loss, injury, claims, or costs, including fines, penalties, and judgments arising from or in any way related to the condition of the subject real property or presence of any hazardous substances or contaminants in, on, or under the property.
- **12. AMENDMENT.** This Agreement may not be amended, except in writing, which writing will be expressly identified as a part of this Agreement and must be signed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
- **13. HEADINGS.** The headings, titles, and subtitles in this Agreement have been inserted solely for convenient reference, and will be ignored in its construction.

14. CERTIFICATION OF NO PROHIBITED STATE LEGISLATOR INTEREST

The CITY (i) understands neither a state legislator nor a business in which a state legislator has an ownership interest may be directly or indirectly interested in any contract with the State that was authorized by any law passed during the term for which that legislator was elected, or within one year thereafter, and (ii) has read South Dakota Constitution Article 3, Section 12 and has had the opportunity to seek

independent legal advice on the applicability of that provision to this Agreement. By signing this Agreement, the CITY hereby certifies that this Agreement is not made in violation of the South Dakota Constitution Article 3, Section 12.

15. AUTHORIZATION.

The CITY has designated its Mayor as the CITY'S authorized representative and has empowered the Mayor with the authority to sign this Agreement on behalf of the CITY. A copy of the CITY'S Commission or Council minutes or resolution authorizing the execution of this Agreement by the Mayor as the CITY'S authorized representative is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit "A".


