AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DEADWOOD AND SCHLOSSER CONSTRUCTION RE: 26 WASHINGTON STREET RETAINING WALL

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and SCHLOSSER CONSTRUCTION, with its principal place of business located at 1925 Hill Street, Sturgis, SD 57785, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR;"

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR has agreed to furnish all necessary labor, tools, materials, and equipment to complete in all detail, the removal and replacement of the retaining wall located at 26 Washington Street in strict accordance with the Contract Documents, as defined herein, within the time set forth herein; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions for which CONTRACTOR shall undertake and complete in a professional and workmanlike manner as set forth below;

WHEREAS, the CITY has accepted the bid proposal from CONTRACTOR and provides compensation in an amount of Thirty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty and 00/100 Dollars (\$38,760.00), for the services set forth above, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- 2. CONTRACTOR shall provide Reconstruction of the Retaining Wall located at 26 Washington Street;
- 3. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all applicable permitting;
- 4. CONTRACTOR shall limit use of premises to work in areas indicated and not disturb portions of site beyond areas in which the work in indicated;
- 5. CONTRACTOR shall provide access to all streets at all times and use traffic control as required;

- 6. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for locating all overhead and underground utilities in the project area and taking all necessary precautions to prevent damaging all utilities;
- 7. CITY shall be responsible for removing the light pole and any tree stumps in the project area prior to work beginning.
- 8. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for any damages to any utilities cause by his/her project operations;
- 9. Requirements for payment schedule, change order documentation and approval are responsibility of OWNER with concurrence from the CITY. Construction to be completed within 90 days of Notice of Proceed. Liquidated damages in the amount of \$100.00/day will be assessed for each day past the 90-day limit in which construction is not completed.







Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center Lightning Storm Closure Policy

Objective:

The primary objective of this policy is to ensure the safety and well-being of all patrons and staff at the indoor pool located at the Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center during lightning storms. To mitigate the risk of injury or harm caused by lightning strikes, the pool will be closed when a lightning strike is detected within a 5-mile radius of the Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center.

Policy:

1. Monitoring Lightning Activity:

a. The City of Deadwood will implement a lightning detection system or use a reliable weather monitoring service to track lightning activity in the vicinity of the Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center.

b. The lightning detection system or weather monitoring service will be set up to detect lightning strikes within a 5-mile radius of the Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center.

c. Designated staff members will be responsible for monitoring the lightning detection system or weather monitoring service during pool operating hours.

2. Lightning Warning:

a. If a lightning strike is detected within a 5-mile radius of the Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center, a lightning warning will be issued.

b. The designated staff members responsible for monitoring the system will immediately inform the pool manager or supervisor about the lightning warning.

3. Pool Closure Procedure:

a. Upon receiving the lightning warning, the pool manager/supervisor or his or her designee will take immediate action to ensure the safety of all patrons and staff.

b. All swimmers will be instructed to exit the high-risk areas (pool, pool deck, sauna, spa, and locker room showers) immediately and proceed to designated safe areas (lobby) within the recreation center.

c. Lifeguards and staff members will assist in evacuating the areas listed above and guide patrons to safe locations.

d. All pool activities, including swimming lessons, water aerobics, and other programs, will be suspended until the lightning warning is lifted.

e. The pool manager/supervisor or his or her designee will communicate the closure to all patrons and staff using appropriate means such as loudspeakers, signage, and verbal announcements.

f. Patrons and staff will be advised to remain in safe areas until the lightning warning is lifted.



g. After a lightning strike is detected within the 5-mile radius of the Deadwood Recreation and Aquatics Center, a 30-minute timer will be set before patrons will be allowed to reenter the high-risk areas. After the initial 30-minute has expired the lightning will be reevaluated. If there are still lightning strikes within the 5-mile radius, a 10-minute timer will be set. This reevaluation process will continue until the lightning in no longer in the 5-mile radius.

4. Reopening the Pool:

a. The pool manager/supervisor or his or her designee will closely monitor the lightning activity after the closure.

b. Once the lightning detection system or weather monitoring service indicates that the lightning strikes are no longer within a 5-mile radius, the pool manager/supervisor or his or her designee will assess the safety conditions.

c. The pool will reopen only when it is determined that it is safe to do so, and the lightning warning has been officially lifted.

d. The pool manager/supervisor or his or her designee will inform all patrons and staff about the reopening of the pool using appropriate communication methods.

5. Review and Training:

a. The indoor municipal pool will conduct regular reviews and updates of this policy to ensure its effectiveness and compliance with safety standards.

b. All pool staff members, including lifeguards and supervisors, will receive appropriate training on lightning safety protocols, emergency evacuation procedures, and implementation of this policy.

This policy is intended to prioritize the safety of all individuals using the indoor municipal pool during lightning storms. By adhering to this policy, we aim to create a secure environment that minimizes the risk of lightning-related incidents.

Insurance and Liability

Overview:

When city facilities are used by the general public for special events which pose a high risk of injury (e.g. outdoor recreational activities or athletic events), a signed Waiver of Liability, Indemnification, and Medical Release should be required of each participant.

The waiver form should not be significantly modified. It has been written to comply with a 1994 Supreme Court decision, which stated:

- Pre-injury releases are much more likely to be deemed valid and enforceable when they are written on a separate document--that is, not imbedded in an application, rental agreement or sign-up sheet;
- Unless the intention of the parties is expressed in unmistakable language, an exculpatory clause will not be deemed to insulate a party from liability for his own negligent acts...what the law demands is that such provisions be clear and coherent; and
- The more inherently dangerous or risky the recreational activity, the more likely that an anticipatory release will be held valid.

The form can and should be modified to specifically identify the activity involved. In the case of a particularly dangerous activity, the level of risk involved should also be stated. For example, it may not be sufficient to name the activity "motorcycle stunts." The release form should specify the level of difficulty of the stunts.

NOTE:

High risk activities warrant the use of either a Facilities Use Agreement which requires the user to carry liability coverage, or participant liability waivers, or both. The process of determining when to require insurance of the user and/or when to require signed waivers of participants can be a difficult one. Unfortunately, with the wide variety of activities, events and facilities across City government, there is no way to establish a standard policy to specifically address all cases. Please contact the City of Deadwood's Safety Director for guidance at 605-578-2082.

Facilities Use Agreement Indemnification and Insurance Clause

It is the intention of the parties that the City, and its officers, agents and employees shall not be liable or in any way responsible for injury, damage, liability, loss or expense resulting to the user and those it brings onto the premises due to accidents, mishaps, misconduct, negligence or injuries, either in person or property.

User expressly assumes full responsibility for any and all damages or injuries which may result to any person or property by reason of or in connection with the use of the facilities pursuant to this agreement and agrees to pay the City for all damages caused to the facilities resulting from user's activities hereunder.

User represents that its activities, pursuant to this agreement, will be supervised by adequately trained personnel, and that user will observe, and cause the participants in the activity to observe, all safety rules for the facility and the activity. User acknowledges that the City has no duty to and will not provide supervision of the activity.

User shall maintain occurrence based commercial general liability insurance or equivalent form with a limit of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit it shall apply separately to this Agreement or be no less than two times the occurrence limit. Five days prior to commencement of this Agreement, User shall furnish the City with properly executed Certificates of Insurance which shall clearly evidence all insurance required in this Agreement and provide that such insurance shall not be canceled, except on 30 days' prior written notice to the City. The City Commission reserves the right to require additional commercial general liability insurance necessary to protect the interests of the City.

*Building Rental Rules only apply if the event is utilizing the grandstands, crow's nest, or ticket booth.

- No nails, staples, or tacks to be put on any City property. Painter's tape (low adhesive) is allowed.
- All decorations must be flame retardant in accordance with fire code.
- All exit lights must remain uncovered and visible.
- No smoking is allowed on any city property, except designated areas. No person shall smoke or carry any lighted smoking instrument, any cigar, cigarette, pipe, electronic cigarette or other smoking equipment on city property.
- At 10:00 p.m., music must be shut off or turned down so it cannot be heard outside of the Event Complex.
- Propane usage allowed with City of Deadwood's prior consent.
- Clean up after your event, including but not limited to:
 - Sweep floors & mop spills
 - Empty trash in building & dispose of in receptacles outside
 - Sweep and mop restrooms & wipe down all counter-tops, sinks, toilets
 - Take down any and all decorations and remove tape
 - Pick up trash within the entire Event Complex
- Deposit will be returned after the Event Complex is inspected. The deposit is available for return after the inspection and no deficiencies have been reported.

NOT REQUESTING CONCESSIONAIRE

Responsibilities to and of the Concessionaire

- A. The Concessionaire shall sell quality food and beverages; schedule and provide full maintenance of the concession premises; employ, train, and supervise personnel with appropriate qualifications and experience to assist in such functions; perform or supervise employees in the performance of all other tasks related to the operation, maintenance of the concession premises; and pay for and obtain all licenses and permits necessary for the operation of the concessions granted. The Concessionaire may offer the sale of additional items from the Concession Premises but shall be limited to food and beverage and approved by the Deadwood City Commission.
- B. The Concessionaire shall not sell any alcohol. Alcohol during events held at the Deadwood Event Complex is the sole responsibility of the Event Organizer. The event organizer will have access to the coolers and the outside bars in the facility.
- C. Concessionaire shall at its own expense, at all times, keep the Concession Premises and areas within twenty-five (25) feet thereto in a neat, clean, safe, and sanitary condition; and keep the glass of all windows and doors serving such areas clean and presentable. Concessionaire shall furnish all cleaning supplies and materials needed to operate such areas in the manner prescribed in this agreement; Concessionaire shall provide or perform all necessary janitorial service to adequately maintain the inside and outside of such areas including concession seating. Concessionaire shall be responsible for keeping the areas within twenty-five (25) feet of the perimeter of such areas free of litter and clean of spills resulting from concession operations. The concessionaire shall be obligated to maintain a regular cleaning schedule, as well as a regular extermination service schedule.
- D. Garbage collection within the concession premises and within twenty-five (25) feet of the premises shall be maintained by the Concessionaire and disposed into a dumpster provided by the Event Organizer. The Concessionaire shall <u>NOT</u> pay for garbage service during events.
- E. Concessionaire shall be open for business during all special events approved by City Commission where the concession service is requested for the Deadwood Event Complex. If the event organizer is not requesting concession services, the event organizer cannot bring in other vendors to provide food and beverage for the event. The hours of operation of the concession premises shall coincide with the hours of the event scheduled and the hours of operation shall be coordinated between the Concessionaire and the Event Organizer.

A component of the facility use agreement is a guaranteed dollar amount of two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars per day to the Concessionaire when the concession is requested by the Event Organizer. If the event does not produce the two hundred and fifty (\$250) dollars per day, the event organizer shall be required to cover the shortfall to the Concessionaire. The guaranteed dollar amount shall be paid to the Concessionaire if events are canceled within 72 hours of the event as the concessionaire has at that point prepared for the event taking place. 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Alcohol Policy for Facility Rentals

No alcohol is allowed in any building or on the grounds of the City of Deadwood Event Complex including the parking area without the expressed consent of City of Deadwood. To obtain permission to serve alcoholic beverages the City Finance Office MUST be contacted, at (605) 578-2600. Alcoholic beverages are NOT permitted outside of the Event Complex.

The sale of alcoholic beverages may be allowed by acquiring a special alcoholic beverage license from the City of Deadwood per Deadwood Codified Ordinance Chapter 5.04.070 and South Dakota Codified Law Title 35. The process to obtain alcohol licenses may take up to 45 days.

If the undersigned represents a Private Party or For-Profit Organization, the serving of alcoholic beverages is allowed without a special alcoholic beverage license, provided that the event is invitation only, not open to the public, no public advertising and no money is involved (no cash bars and the cost of the alcohol cannot be hidden in an entry fee). Again, alcoholic beverages are NOT permitted outside of the Event Complex. The Finance Office MUST be contacted, at (605) 578-2600 then after review of the request for the serving of alcoholic beverages, the City Commission will approve or disapprove of the request. User will receive notification in written form from the City Finance office of the Commission action.

For those functions where consent has been given the following rules must be followed:

- At any event where alcohol is available, the renter must provide, at their expense, licensed servers unless otherwise approved by the Deadwood City Commission. A copy of the license must be provided to the City of Deadwood prior to the event.
- The renter will also, at their expense, provide adequate licensed certified security to cover the event. A copy of the license and security certification must also be provided to the City of Deadwood prior to the event. The entity can submit an "alternative" to a licensed certified security company, but the "alternative" security will generally entail having a certified police officer on site (off-duty officer is okay). The City will also need to be provided with their name & a copy of their certification, & they need to agree not to drink alcohol themselves.
- Keys for the facilities will not be issued until this information is received and confirmed.
- The renter is solely and wholly responsible to ensure all rules and regulations in regards to the serving of alcohol are followed.

- 3. The City Planner and the Building Inspector shall approve any proposed signage proposed outside of the venue near the primary entrance to the Event Complex prior to the event. Signage proposed for way finding or entrance signage between Highway 14A/85 and Crescent Street may require South Dakota Department of Transportation and/or Deadwood Planning and Zoning Commission approval, proper timing and planning will be required and is very important in regards to approval of signage outside of the Event Complex.
- 4. The installation of all signage and banners shall be presented to the City of Deadwood prior to installation to prevent damage to City Property and to ensure compliance to the City of Deadwood Codified Ordinance Chapter 15.32. Attach a written plan with quantities, sizes, and locations of all signs and banners.

City of Deadwood Equipment and Services

Limitations on the Provision of City Services; Cost and/or Fees

- A. Approval for use of the Deadwood Event Complex does not obligate or require the City to provide services, equipment, or personnel in support of an event.
- B. If the City provides services, equipment, or personnel in support of an event, the City will, charge the event organizer a cost determined by the Department Head in supervision of the services provided. The cost for use of equipment, personnel, and services is determined prior to submittal of application; additional services requested during the event will incur addition costs. ONLY the Department Head in supervision of the services provided shall approve additional services requested! Additional costs if applicable shall be mutually agreed upon prior to service and paid for prior to the service provided.
- C. Prior to submittal of this application, the applicant must meet with the proper City Department Head to determine costs and availability of services requested. A letter from the appropriate City Department stating the total costs and services available shall be submitted with the application along with payment for the services with the entire application.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST

The applicants have submitted a request for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Bed and Breakfast Establishment in the accessory building [7 Burlington] at their residence located at 5 Burlington Street. The subject property is in the Peck Garden Neighborhood and surrounded by residential homes and multi-family townhomes.

FACTUAL INFORMATION

- 1. The property is currently zoned R1 Residential.
- 2. The site was built in 1950 and was originally a gun shop known as Lock, Stock and Barrel.
- 3. The subject property has access from Burlington Street with off street parking.
- 4. The subject property is located within a R1 Residential zoning district adjacent to R2 Multi-Family zoning district.
- 5. The property is not located within a flood zone.
- 6. Adequate public facilities are available to serve the property.

STAFF DISCUSSION

The applicants have submitted a request for a Conditional Use Permit for a Bed and Breakfast establishment and City regulations permit Bed and Breakfast establishments in R1- Residential District with an approved Conditional Use Permit. The subject property was originally a gun shop, then the applicant's mothers house, and the house is now vacant. The applicants indicate they intend convert the house for their operation. According to their application, they have adequate off-street parking.

The Deadwood Zoning Code 17.08 and South Dakota Codified Law defines a Bed and Breakfast as the following:

"Bed and breakfast establishment" means:

Any building or buildings run by an operator that is used to provide accommodations for a charge to the public, with at most five rental units for up to an average of ten guests per night and in which family style meals are provided.

Jay and Pam Smith intend to rent the small house for their operation.

1. No bed and breakfast home shall be located on a lot closer than two hundred (200) feet or eight residences, whichever is greater, from any other lot containing a bed and breakfast home. However, the planning and zoning commission may waive the distance limitation if the structure is listed on the

National Register of Historic Places or eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The Deadwood building inspector shall inspect the premises to ensure compliance with the Building Code;

In this instance there are no bed and breakfasts within the two hundred feet required buffers.

2. Applicants proposing tandem parking shall be required to provide a control board for the keys of the guests. The owner/manager shall be responsible for the control board. The subject residence proposed for a bed and breakfast shall be required to provide the following: Off-street parking for four vehicles.

The Deadwood Zoning Code requires a bed and breakfast establishment to be occupied by the owner(s). The code also states a requirement of one off-street parking space per guestroom in section 17.64.060 of the ordinance book. The property does have four off street parking spaces on site.

COMPLIANCE:

- 1. The Zoning Office provided notice identifying the applicant, describing the project and its location, and giving the scheduled date of the public hearing in accordance with Section 10.10.B.
- 2. A sign was posted on the property for which the requests were filed.
- 3. Notice of the time and place was published in the designated newspaper of the City of Deadwood.

GENERAL USE STANDARDS FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS:

In reviewing any application under the authority of this chapter and as a further guide to its decision upon the facts of the case, the Commission(s) shall consider, among other things, the following facts:

A. The proposed use shall be in harmony with the general purposes, goals, objectives, and standards to the City Policy Plan, the ordinance, the district in which it is located, or any other plan, program, map, or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice by the City of Deadwood.

The City Comprehensive Plan encourages a variety of uses and a mixture of housing types. Preserve the existing stock of historic structures by working with the individuals and guiding the uses is an acceptable means. Traffic and parking should not significantly affect the neighborhood if the applicant abides by the parking requirements associated with a Bed and Breakfast. This area has a mixture of single family and townhome dwellings.

B. Whether or not a community need exists for the proposed use at the proposed location in light of existing and proposed uses of a similar nature in the area

and of the need to provide or maintain a proper mix of uses both within the city and also within the immediate area of the proposed use: (a) the proposed use in the proposed location shall not result in either a detrimental over concentration of a particular use from previously permitted uses within the city or within the immediate area of the proposed use.

The subject area is zoned R1 – Residential District and is intended to provide locations for low to medium density residential. Medium density residential is designed to provide apartment and multi-family dwellings as well as parks and recreation areas. There are no B&Bs within 200 feet of the proposed B&B.

C. The proposed use at this location shall not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvement, public sites, or rights-of-way.

If the applicant only uses off street parking and prevents any public nuisance issues that are often associated with Short-Term Rentals, the proposed use would not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, or the character of the neighborhood and the use would not alter the character of the neighborhood. There will be no change in the size of the dwelling. To support a denial of a conditional use permit on the grounds that it will cause increased traffic problems, there must be a high degree of probability that the increase would pose a substantial threat to the health and safety of the community.

D. Whether or not the proposed use increases the proliferation of nonconforming uses as well as previously approved Conditional Use Permits which are still in use, when influenced by matters pertaining to the public health, safety, and general welfare, either as they now exist or as they may in the future be developed as a result of the implementation of provisions and policies of the Policy Plan, this ordinance, or any other plan, program, map or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice, by the city or other governmental agency having jurisdiction to guide growth and development.

For any conditional use, lot and performance standards shall be the same as similar type uses located in specific districts. The character and use of buildings and structures adjoining or near the property mentioned in the application shall be considered in their entirety.

The proposed use would not increase the proliferation of non-conforming uses. The subject residence is in an area that does not have additional bed and breakfasts nearby and the new ordinance changes limited the number of Bed and Breakfast establishments through a buffer requirement. The appearance of the structure will not change; therefore, the character and use of the buildings and structures adjoining the subject property will not be adversely affected. E. Whether or not the proposed use in the proposed area will be adequately served by and will not impose an undue burden on any of the improvements, facilities, utilities, and services specified in this section.

The proposed use will not cause significant adverse impacts on water supply, fire protection, waste disposal, schools, traffic and circulation, or other services. Existing services are available onsite.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING APPLICATIONS AND PROVISIONS:

- A. Following the issuance of a conditional use permit pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, such permit may be amended, varied, or altered only pursuant to the standards and procedures established by this section for its original approval.
- B. The Board of Adjustments can revoke conditional use permits, once granted, for cause after a hearing is held before them. Complaints seeking the revocation of such permit shall be filled with the Zoning Administrator and may be initiated by the Planning and Zoning Commission OR any three (3) residents within three hundred (300) feet of the property lines of which the application has been filed. All such revocation hearings shall be conducted in the same manner as for the Conditional Use Permit application hearings.
- C. The Planning and Zoning Commission shall have the authority to review Conditional Use Permits at any time and/or on an annual basis and place additional stipulations to mitigate a problem.
- D. If the use permitted under the terms of a Conditional Use Permit has not been started within six (6) months of the date of issuance thereof, said permit shall expire and be canceled by the City Planning Department. Written notice thereof, shall be given to the person(s) affected, together with notice that further use or work as described in the canceled permit shall not proceed, unless and until a new conditional use permit has been obtained.
- E. If the use permitted under the terms of a Conditional Use Permit ceases, for whatever reason, for a period of twelve (12) months, said permit shall expire and be canceled by the City Planning Department. Written notice thereof, shall be given to the person(s) affected, together with notice that further use or work as described in the canceled permit shall not proceed, unless and until a new conditional use permit has been obtained.

If approved, staff recommendations for stipulation(s):

1. The Conditional Use Permit runs with the applicant and not the land; therefore, should the property be sold, the Conditional Use Permit is null and void.

- 2. The Bed and Breakfast Establishment must be owner occupied.
- 3. Proof of a state sales tax number shall be provided to the Planning and Zoning Office for their files.
- 4. Proof that the Building Inspector has inspected the building and it meets all the building codes.
- 5. City water and sewer rates to be changed from residential to commercial rates.

- 8. Obtain lodging license after inspection from the South Dakota Department of Health.
- 9. All parking shall be off street.

National Register of Historic Places or eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The Deadwood building inspector shall inspect the premises to ensure compliance with the Building Code;

In this instance there are no bed and breakfasts within the two hundred feet required buffers.

2. Applicants proposing tandem parking shall be required to provide a control board for the keys of the guests. The owner/manager shall be responsible for the control board. The subject residence proposed for a bed and breakfast shall be required to provide the following: Off-street parking for four vehicles.

The Deadwood Zoning Code requires a bed and breakfast establishment to be occupied by the owner(s). The code also states a requirement of one off-street parking space per guestroom in section 17.64.060 of the ordinance book. The property does have four off street parking spaces on site.

COMPLIANCE:

- 1. The Zoning Office provided notice identifying the applicant, describing the project and its location, and giving the scheduled date of the public hearing in accordance with Section 10.10.B.
- 2. A sign was posted on the property for which the requests were filed.
- 3. Notice of the time and place was published in the designated newspaper of the City of Deadwood.

GENERAL USE STANDARDS FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS:

In reviewing any application under the authority of this chapter and as a further guide to its decision upon the facts of the case, the Commission(s) shall consider, among other things, the following facts:

A. The proposed use shall be in harmony with the general purposes, goals, objectives, and standards to the City Policy Plan, the ordinance, the district in which it is located, or any other plan, program, map, or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice by the City of Deadwood.

The City Comprehensive Plan encourages a variety of uses and a mixture of housing types. Preserve the existing stock of historic structures by working with the individuals and guiding the uses is an acceptable means. Traffic and parking should not significantly affect the neighborhood if the applicant abides by the parking requirements associated with a Bed and Breakfast. This area has a mixture of single family and townhome dwellings. B. Whether or not a community need exists for the proposed use at the proposed location in light of existing and proposed uses of a similar nature in the area and of the need to provide or maintain a proper mix of uses both within the city and also within the immediate area of the proposed use: (a) the proposed use in the proposed location shall not result in either a detrimental over concentration of a particular use from previously permitted uses within the city or within the immediate area of the proposed use.

The subject area is zoned R1 – Residential District and is intended to provide locations for low to medium density residential. Medium density residential is designed to provide apartment and multi-family dwellings as well as parks and recreation areas. There are no B&Bs within 200 feet of the proposed B&B.

C. The proposed use at this location shall not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvement, public sites, or rights-of-way.

If the applicant only uses off street parking and prevents any public nuisance issues that are often associated with Short-Term Rentals, the proposed use would not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, or the character of the neighborhood and the use would not alter the character of the neighborhood. There will be no change in the size of the dwelling. To support a denial of a conditional use permit on the grounds that it will cause increased traffic problems, there must be a high degree of probability that the increase would pose a substantial threat to the health and safety of the community.

D. Whether or not the proposed use increases the proliferation of nonconforming uses as well as previously approved Conditional Use Permits which are still in use, when influenced by matters pertaining to the public health, safety, and general welfare, either as they now exist or as they may in the future be developed as a result of the implementation of provisions and policies of the Policy Plan, this ordinance, or any other plan, program, map or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice, by the city or other governmental agency having jurisdiction to guide growth and development.

For any conditional use, lot and performance standards shall be the same as similar type uses located in specific districts. The character and use of buildings and structures adjoining or near the property mentioned in the application shall be considered in their entirety.

The proposed use would not increase the proliferation of non-conforming uses. The subject residence is in an area that does not have additional bed and breakfasts nearby and the new ordinance changes limited the number of Bed and Breakfast establishments through a buffer requirement. The appearance of the structure will not change; therefore, the character and use of the buildings and structures adjoining the subject property will not be adversely affected. E. Whether or not the proposed use in the proposed area will be adequately served by and will not impose an undue burden on any of the improvements, facilities, utilities, and services specified in this section.

The proposed use will not cause significant adverse impacts on water supply, fire protection, waste disposal, schools, traffic and circulation, or other services. Existing services are available onsite.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING APPLICATIONS AND PROVISIONS:

- A. Following the issuance of a conditional use permit pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, such permit may be amended, varied, or altered only pursuant to the standards and procedures established by this section for its original approval.
- B. The Board of Adjustments can revoke conditional use permits, once granted, for cause after a hearing is held before them. Complaints seeking the revocation of such permit shall be filled with the Zoning Administrator and may be initiated by the Planning and Zoning Commission OR any three (3) residents within three hundred (300) feet of the property lines of which the application has been filed. All such revocation hearings shall be conducted in the same manner as for the Conditional Use Permit application hearings.
- C. The Planning and Zoning Commission shall have the authority to review Conditional Use Permits at any time and/or on an annual basis and place additional stipulations to mitigate a problem.
- D. If the use permitted under the terms of a Conditional Use Permit has not been started within six (6) months of the date of issuance thereof, said permit shall expire and be canceled by the City Planning Department. Written notice thereof, shall be given to the person(s) affected, together with notice that further use or work as described in the canceled permit shall not proceed, unless and until a new conditional use permit has been obtained.
- E. If the use permitted under the terms of a Conditional Use Permit ceases, for whatever reason, for a period of twelve (12) months, said permit shall expire and be canceled by the City Planning Department. Written notice thereof, shall be given to the person(s) affected, together with notice that further use or work as described in the canceled permit shall not proceed, unless and until a new conditional use permit has been obtained.

If approved, staff recommendations for stipulation(s):

1. The Conditional Use Permit runs with the applicant and not the land; therefore, should the property be sold, the Conditional Use Permit is null and void.

- 2. The Bed and Breakfast Establishment must be owner occupied.
- 3. Proof of a state sales tax number shall be provided to the Planning and Zoning Office for their files.
- 4. Proof that the Building Inspector has inspected the building and it meets all the building codes.
- 5. City water and sewer rates to be changed from residential to commercial rates.
- 6. Proper paperwork is filed with the City of Deadwood Finance Office for Business Improvement District (BID) taxes.
- 7. Proof of City of Deadwood Business License.
- 8. Obtain lodging license after inspection from the South Dakota Department of Health.
- 9. All parking shall be off street.

- 2. Approve / Deny by the Board of Adjustment.

I am proposing changes to the following ordinances.

15.01.020 Exceptions And Amendments.

Subsection "I" should indicate that only Section R302.13 not the entirety of Section R302 of the 2021 International Residential Code is not adopted in Deadwood.

15.20.010 Life Safety Code

The intent is to repeal this ordinance. The 1988 edition of NFPA 101 is outdated. The most current edition of NFPA 101 is referenced by our adopted building code and it is not necessary to adopt NFPA 101 separately.

17.60.100 Fire And Life Safety

The purpose of this amendment is to remove the reference to outdated codes and standards. The proposed amendment would require compliance with Title 15. The requirements found in Title 15 include the building code, the utility construction code, local requirements of the plumbing code, house moving, signs, wayfinding, and flood hazard protection regulations.

There is no budget impact to the City for these proposed ordinance changes.

Specifically, the City of Deadwood prohibits non-metallic sheathed cable (defined as a factory assembly of two (2) or more insulated conductors having an outer sheath of moisture-resistant, flame-retardant, nonmetallic material) specifically Types NM, NMC and NMS cables, from being used in hotels, motels, gaming establishments, commercial, mercantile, industrial, institutional, and public buildings.
- F. Any building within the city which has or needs an electrical service entrance of more than two hundred (200) amps single-phase or three-phase shall be equipped with an electrical disconnect device located on the exterior of the building in a location approved by the building inspector. Compliance with this requirement shall be required whenever a building permit is issued or whenever any major work is done on a building's electrical system.
- G. Section A101 of Appendix A of the International Property Maintenance Code 2021 is

hereby amended to read as follows: All windows and doors shall be boarded in an approved manner set forth by the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission to prevent entry by unauthorized persons and shall be an approved design set forth by said Commission that is compatible with the color scheme of the existing structure.

The city may also, at its discretion, remove the snow or ice if it deems such action appropriate. In either case, the city shall be entitled to a fifty-dollar (\$50.00) fee for the costs of arranging the removal plus the actual cost paid to the contractor or, in the event the removal is done by city employees, the sum of <u>One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00)</u>, which is listed in the city fee schedule which is set and amended by resolution. seventy-one dollars and fifty cents (\$71.50) plus material per hour for each employee. Such sums shall be recoverable by the same legal means as for the recovery of other nuisance abatements, including, but not limited to, direct billing of the property owner, assessment of the sum against the property itself, or by bringing an action against the property owner. Each day the record owner fails to remove the snow and ice, after notice as provided for in this section, shall constitute a separate violation of this chapter and shall be subject to a civil fine in an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per day for each separate violation.



Dear Mr. Kuchenbecker:

The City of Deadwood requested that the Archaeological Research Center (ARC), a program of the South Dakota State Historical Society, create a cost estimate for proposed pre-construction exploratory trenching to examine the remains of the Burlington Northern Roundhouse. This work is part of the City of Deadwood's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) public assistance project DR-4476-SD located along Whitewood Creek in Deadwood, South Dakota. The pre-construction trenching will be confined to Area 1C and will be considered Phase I, to identify the presence or absence of the former Burlington Northern Roundhouse. This document will serve as a cost estimate for the ARC to complete the trench monitoring work.

This estimate (see Table 1) includes the cost of:

- ARC staff to obtain and georeference necessary maps to pinpoint the former location of the Roundhouse within the APE
- two ARC crew members to travel to and conduct trenching monitoring, including the identification and examination of cultural resources
- ARC to subcontract with a qualified geomorphologist to examine and interpret soils
- ARC staff to compile a technical report of the trenching findings, including a record search and project maps
- ARC staff to process and catalog artifacts recovered from the proposed work
- miscellaneous administrative costs associated with logistics and invoicing

This cost estimate reflects the Phase I goal of *identification*. Additional excavation, artifact collection, or artifact cataloging may be subsumed under Phase II and require additional time and work, thus incurring additional costs. Any additional testing or site documentation will likely result in increased time needed to complete the final report.

Please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions about this estimate. We will not initiate fieldwork until we have received approval from your office.
