CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Bogue called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He stated that notice of the time, place, and agenda of the meeting had been posted at the Delta City Complex, on the Delta City website, and on the Utah Public Notice website and had been provided to the Millard County Chronicle-Progress, LLC and each member of the City Council at least 24 hours before the meeting. Mayor Bogue conducted a roll call. Council Members Kelly Carter, Nick Killpack, Brian Huber, Nathan Taylor, and Natalie Stefanoff were present.

Council Member Natalie Stefanoff offered the opening remarks.

1. Minutes Approval Special City Council Work Meeting 2026-02-10

The minutes of the Special City Council Work Meeting held by the appointed Celebrations Committee on 02/10/2026 were presented for approval. Council Member Carter MOVED to approve the Special City Council Meeting minutes held on 02/10/2026 at 8:30 a.m. Council Member Killpack SECONDED the motion. Mayor Bogue asked if there were any other questions or comments regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote.

Council Member Carter MOVED to approve the disbursed payments dated 03/04/2026 for \$143,862.12. Council Member Stefanoff SECONDED the motion. Mayor Bogue asked if there were any further questions or comments regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote.

4. Rhett and Anne Peterson; Just Serve
Discussion/Consideration for approval

Rhett and Anne Peterson with JustServe presented Mayor Bogue and the City of Delta with a plaque and welcome to the JustServe Community.

5. Sherri Westbrook, Recorder and Keiza Mauzy, Treasurer; Administrative Update
Discussion Only

Sherri Westbrook, Delta City Recorder, and Keiza Mauzy, Delta City Treasurer, addressed the Mayor and Council with an administrative update. Discussed separation of duties and responsibilities held by each department.

6. Darlene Webb; Concern about street signs and speed limit signs
Action: Discussion only

Darlene Webb addressed the Mayor and Council with concerns about street signs and speed limit signs around Delta City.

Webb shared that street signs near her home and neighborhood are in need of replacement. Mayor Bogue stated that an audit could be done and replacements made, as needed. Webb was also concerned that there are no speed limit signs in her neighborhood. She requested a Dead End sign on Days Avenue where the road has not been developed; the dirt road is being used as a roadway up to 750 N.

Council and Mayor stated that they can get a Sheriff Department flashing sign trailer to park in a couple of spots by middle school and then move over to Days Avenue/Mobile Home Zone.

Public Works Director, Justin Asbhy, stated that Public Works will put up speed limit signs wherever council would like them to be put.

7. Mayor KC Bogue; Employee phone allowances
Action: Discussion/Consideration for approval

Mayor KC Bogue addressed the Council for a discussion on employee phone allowances.

Bogue requested that all full-time employees and Council Members be provided with a phone allowance per pay period. Council Member Carter asked about state parameters and it was found that there are two separate amounts: \$30.00 voice only or data only, and up to \$50.00 per pay period for voice & data plans that are combined.

Council Members Killpack and Taylor stated that Council Members should be excluded, but were both in agreement with Delta City full-time employees having this allowance.

Council Member Carter MOVED to approve a phone allowance in the amount of \$45.00 per pay period for the Mayor and all full-time employees of Delta City. Council Member Killpack SECONDED the motion. Mayor Bogue asked if there were any questions or comments regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote.

Motion made by Council Member Carter, Seconded by Council Member Killpack.

8. Mayor KC Bogue; Planning & Zoning Commission compensation
Action: Discussion/Consideration for approval

Mayor KC Bogue addressed the Council for a discussion on compensation for Planning & Zoning Commission Members. Currently, each member of the Commission is compensated \$50.00 per meeting and Mayor Bogue would like to double this to \$100.00 per meeting due to the increasing demands being placed on the commission.

Council Member Taylor MOVED to approve an increase in compensation for Planning & Zoning Commission Members from \$50.00 per meeting to \$100.00 per meeting. Council Member Killpack SECONDED the motion. Mayor Bogue asked if there were any questions or comments regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote.

Motion made by Council Member Taylor, Seconded by Council Member Killpack.

9. Council Member Updates
Action: Discussion/Consideration for approval

Kelly Carter: Planning & Zoning Commission will be discussing mid-block street development and subdividing. Council Member Taylor asked about some code changes that he was approached about and Carter stated to ask individuals to submit an application to appear before the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Nick Killpack: Continuing work with Jones & DeMille on an Annexation Plan for Delta City. One update with this is that they will be adding more South and East for economic development, not just focusing on North and East. Cooperation and collaboration between Delta City and the County continues to be improved upon. Killpack and Public Works Director Justin Ashby met with UDOT Regional Director, Kirk

Thornock about the stoplight on main street and ideas on beautification of main and how to reduce it's expansiveness. They also discussed issues with the sidewalk on the overpass and inquired about responsibility: Delta City or UDOT. Ashby stated that he met with Adam Pace with UDOT and that these things have been moved forward. The Council agreed that the intersection of Highways 6 & 50 also needs reworked and with further development, could also use a stoplight.

Nathan Taylor: Reminder that R6 Regional Council Summit will be the evening of Wednesday, May 6th. Mayor Bogue stated that Council Meeting that week would be moved to Tuesday, May 5th to encourage attendance at this event. Celebration budget numbers are getting lined up for the upcoming budget amendment meeting. Taylor and Huber asked about adding a message on Delta City's website inviting servicemen and women to participate in 4th of July festivities; they will send information to Angie Dewsnup.

Brian Huber: Currently working with Jess Peterson of R6 on available grant for the shooting range. Huber asked about advertisements for Easter and if any information is being shared. Rebecca Peterson stated that she has a flyer for the Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 4th and that is being distributed; however, anything additional would need to come from the Celebrations Committee. Council Member Taylor added that Cal-Maine will donate eggs for the egg-drop on Saturday; and Huber stated that the Health Dept will help with prizes for egg drop and also the glow-in-the-dark egg hunt for the older youth on Friday evening.

Natalie Stefanoff: Working on finalizing a Scholarship for Youth City Council; she will bring this specifically to the 2026-2027 Budget Meeting this Spring so that it is funded for Fall participation. Stefanoff asked about having a community member overseeing the Youth City Council, or she would be willing to do so. Stefanoff asked about putting information on the city's electronic sign and whether community news items could be on it. Currently, it falls at the Mayor's discretion as to what is put on the sign. Confirmation was also given that Miss Delta applicants must currently be in 8th – 11th grade and be residents of Delta City.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS

Utah State University's Delta Wellbeing Survey officially launched March 1st and goes for 3 weeks. This has been posted in both English & Spanish to social media, the City Website, businesses around town, and the Sign at the Community Center. Banners will be posted in the park this week, and it will be advertised in the Chronicle Progress for the next two weeks.

Mayor Bogue shared a letter of appreciation from Central Utah Food Sharing for the donation made by Delta City.

Sound Unlimited was awarded the contract for a sound system and the Patriotic Program for Delta City's 4th of July Celebration.

Council Member Carter MOVED to adjourn the meeting at 8:08 p.m. Council Member Killpack SECONDED the motion. Mayor Bogue asked if there were any questions or comments regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote.
