CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Niles called this Delta City Council Work Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

CONSENT AGENDA

BUSINESS – Any such business as may come before the Council.

1. Sunrise Engineering; Sewer Project Action: Discussion only

Robert Worley from Sunrise Engineering was hired as an engineer to write up a sewer plan and to help acquire funding for Delta City. Worley was there to discuss what the City Council wanted to get funding for, which improvements to look at, and how much money they were seeking.

The Division of Water Quality will be receiving ARPA money, which hasn't been released yet, so the amount is unknown. There will be a lot of competition for this money, and their highest priority will be water quality. The Governor is trying to push this money to be spent on rural and small communities.

Sunrise Engineering presented some options based on costs and what their projected rates would be. Current rates are \$28. Option one is to fix the critical pipe based on Val Kotter's video. This option would cost about \$8 million dollars based on today's rates. 80 percent would be fixed through slip lining. Option two would be 60 percent slip line. Option three would be to fix clay and concrete pipes as well. Option four would be to replace everything as open trench.

Public Works Director Kirkland suggested that at a minimum Delta City should go with option one. Council Member Bunker suggested a minimum be option two. Council Member Western asked if it would be possible to get awarded grants from the Division of Water Quality and USDA both. Sunrise Engineering said that sometimes they work together, and that there is more funding than there was a few years ago.

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Delta City was ranked 6th for sewer and 9th for storm drains in Millard County this year.

Delta City would like to apply with option three and see what kind of grants versus loans there are available, and scale back to option two if needed.
