	<ul> <li>There was a meeting on Monday to do a cost analysis- looking promising</li> <li>Meeting with state to understand licensing requirements.</li> <li>15 bed facility</li> </ul>	
	Legislative	
	<ul> <li>AOCMP- not expecting to get additional funds. However, this can change.</li> <li>Workforce Funds <ul> <li>May not receive dollars for things like stipends or paid internship program, or incentives for recruitment.</li> <li>Instead, it may look more like higher ed working with us to fast track programs or ease up on state requirements for licensure.</li> <li>Why is there a shortfall?</li> <li>Patti noted that Oregon has the highest taxed state. Was grateful that Measure 118 didn't pass as that would have raised prices.</li> <li>Employee healthcare costs have gone up 29% last year. This could also be happening at the state level.</li> <li>With Behavioral Health being 1/3 of the county, when these costs go up, it's in the millions of dollars. This is all a huge cost contributing to the shortfall.</li> <li>County wise we are really trying to cut back.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Patti Adair noted that 225K was allotted for a plan with Shepherds house to buy a house for women and children. <ul> <li>They plan to do smaller facilities which has shown better success rates.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The veteran's housing has been waiting for the new bathrooms to be approved. Commissioner Adair is hoping this is approved soon.</li> <li>40 veterans that have moved on to permanent housing and seem happy and comfortable. Thank you to COVO for running that.</li> </ul>

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1:15PM – 1:30PM	<ul> <li>Community Outreach Presentation <ul> <li>Lorelei and Julie and a meeting about what it should look like moving forward- Had different ideas of what it should be. They came up with 3 ideas of what it could be: <ul> <li>Community Outreach with a table at a fair, handing out brochures (rack cards).</li> </ul> </li> <li>Going into the community to invite people into BHAB for very brief informational sessions (15 minutes) to learn about other departments. We don't want to go back to 45 minutes presentations.</li> <li>Outreach where someone from the committee sets up a monthly or every other month tour at other sites and anyone from the group is welcome to go. Then, one of them brings back a 5 -10-minute presentation on what they learned at the next meeting.</li> <li>This is the option that Lorelei and Julie liked best and decided on.</li> <li>They could visit places like The Drop, Stabilization Center, etc.</li> <li>This would be optional to join.</li> <li>You can always reach out to Julie with ideas and feedback.
