1. Notice of Intent to Award Contract for the Negus Transfer Station Improvements Project

Chad Centola, Director of Solid Waste, discussed the bids on the Negus Transfer Station Improvements Project in Redmond. Kirby Nagelhout is recommended as the lowest responsible bidder. Their bid came in at \$16,859,428, which was below the \$18 million forecasted cost. The project will be financed by bonds, which will be paid off by tip fees for the landfill. 2. STIF/STF Consolidation Bylaws and Advisory Committee Roster Modifications

Andrea Breault, COIC Transportation Director, and Derek Hofbauer, COIC Outreach and Engagement Administrator, presented the revised bylaws and committee roster modifications, from the consolidation of two ODOT programs. ODOT's legislatively adopted budget merged the Statewide Transportation Improvement Funds (STIF) and the Special Transportation Fund (STF) into one public transit program. These funds will support public transit benefitting seniors and persons with disabilities. Derek said that the proposed minor modifications to the bylaws will place less burden on the county and increase efficiency. All of the work will now be funneled through one program.

OTHER ITEMS:

- Commissioner DeBone proposed a Proclamation for Labor Day 2022, in support of apprenticeship projects in Deschutes County. He asked for edits from Commissioners Chang and Adair. Commissioner Chang was supportive of the Proclamation but may want to pull the building trades clause out of the Proclamation, as a means to generalize the Proclamation and recognize all working people in the community.
- Commissioner Adair suggested considering a Proclamation for the cutting horse competition, to be held at the Deschutes County Fair and Expo Center in September. Commissioners Chang and DeBone both support acknowledging the event, but shared the view that it may not rise to the level of a Proclamation, as Proclamations are to bring attention to a community cause. Event organizers will be marketing the event.
- Deputy County Administrator Erik Kropp shared that some China Hat Road residents have again voiced their concerns about the houseless populations residing off China Hat Road, as it relates to wildfire risk. Erik will communicate with the Deschutes County Sheriff's Office after drafting a unified statement on behalf of the Board.
 - Commissioner Adair voiced concern over the potential challenges of evacuating people from the area in the event of a wildfire.
 - Commissioner Chang pointed out the importance of the China Hat houseless community having appropriate places to which persons can relocate, should they be asked to do so.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:
