	 Required to serve all students regardless of background, situation, and status. Must always have resources. Holly mentioned that this also applies to a community mental health program.
	 Job is to educate kids- when child has a disability or BH issue, they need to provide resources or connect with resources.
	 Group homes have moved into Redmond, but do not provide the school with resources.
	 They used to be able to limit a child's time at the school, however with SB819 a child must served the whole day
12:15PM	 It was mentioned that we need a child/adolescent psychiatric inpatient unit- Holly stated that there is a lot of momentum around this. Resources have always been a barrier; however, there is a private company with resources
-	willing to help.
12:45PM	 School Based Health Center was discussed. ESD would like to have a clinician on site. However, the state is not funding this.
	 Jennifer Stephenson stated that they are struggling with hiring clinicians and the cost of hiring clinicians, and the mental health expansion grant, which pays for SBHC clinicians decreased this year.
	 ESD reiterated that they want to remove barriers to mental health, but they are educators, not mental health providers.
	 Danielle spoke about her experience with the system and the need for prevention before crises. She had a great experience with wraparound services, sagebrush, but she
	had to leave her job for all the appointments, and that is not always an option for parents to do that. She also stated that it was difficult to navigate the services and what is
	covered by mental health and what is covered by disability.

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	 Patti Adair stated there is legislation around this and asked Danielle if she would be willing to testify, Danielle agreed. Mosaic helped push a new federal law to make more Medicare available. ESD is working on getting a Medicare/Medicaid system set up. He has invested in a person to work through this. Callie asked if there is any movement or flexibility in the school district to contract with ABA providers in the area? They have one contract with an ABA and they have just hired one ABA into the Student Success clinician role. What can BHAB do to help? The board was encouraged to vote yes on the levy as it will support schools. ESD stated they are open to collaboration. A workgroup was suggested.
