Call to Order

Meeting was called to order at 12:04 p.m.

Introductions

Attendees of the meeting introduced themselves and, if applicable, identified the organization they represent.

Public comment

Kurt Springman, 8681 W Antler Ave, Redmond: Had comment about signage for the Tumalo underpass. It's a great feature but it is not well signed. Informal surveys of cyclists in the area, they're unaware there is a tunnel and they use the roundabout, which is relatively unsafe. How to add signage? The group discussed the jurisdictional issues (ultimately it will become the County Road Department's purview); further discussion is below.

Approval of Prior Minutes

The April 2025 minutes were postponed until next month due to a clerical error.

Committee Business

- Introduction of new members: Meghan Windschill, Kim Curley, Pat Addabbo (not in attendance)
- Safe Sidewalk Awards update: Waiting for date for annual report, considering June 11 (Tanya to confirm). Tanya requested help contacting the safe sidewalk winners once a date is set (Meghan and Diane)
- Annual Report: looking for volunteers to compile and present (summarize letters, Summit, etc.),
 Dave Green and Kim will volunteer

- Tumalo underpass signage concern: Chris from ODOT noted existing signs as envisioned by the
 project are complete. The route was intended to be uni-directional, which is why the signage is
 only on one side. Tanya to ask Chris Doty if he can weigh in. Kim had an idea of having a type of
 ribbon-cutting ceremony or event to raise awareness beyond just signage. Could it be worth
 asking Bend MPO (Neil)?
- Post-Summit review: overall went really well! Morning sessions had more engagement than
 afternoon sessions. One difficulty was the AV, was hard to hear. Wendy: struggled a bit with the
 Tri-County aspect of things since it was hard to get participation from the others. Kim: what
 about having the event in those counties?
- What is the ultimate goal for the summit?
- Possible to have a post-event survey? Matt has the ability to do so via Eventbrite, though it is a bit late.
- Media outreach was great
- Think of what we could do with actual funding. Consider some way to partner with an organization that could provide some funds more easily/directly.

Sisters Presentation

Jackson provided a summary of what's happening in Sisters:

- McKinney Butte Rd Safety Improvements: came about after the relocation of elementary school.
 Pedestrian safety improvements: three raised crossing tables; moved an odd midblock crossing; added some additional crossings (one came about from citizen input)
- North Pine Street multi-use path connecting Forest Service property to Barclay. Creates a loop around the entire FS property. Built by city via ODOT Small City allotment funding
- Hood and Pine intersection improvements: removed turn lane, made a 4-way stop
- New roundabout at Locust and Hwy 20 is working really well
- Transportation Hub (East Portal): on west end of town. Substantial completion of Phase 1 by June 30. Includes an RV pull-through with dump stations; will have bus stops; multi-use paths. May be able to function as a trailhead for existing scenic bike routes. Close to a lot of new multifamily housing.
- Barclay Drive improvements: first phase currently in construction, to be completed mid-May.
 Adding crossings and bulb-outs.
- Elm Street multi-use path: connects Village Green Park to Petersen Ridge Trail System
- N Locust Street Pedestrian improvements: new ramps, marked crossings, removed turn lane, adding rapid flashing beacons

 Adams Avenue Streetscape: bringing Adams and the connecting side streets to the same design standard as Hood.

Working group updates

- State is developing a capital investment plan; some people noted the lack of items for Central/Eastern OR
- County: Chris Doty discussed Sunriver roundabouts

La Pine:

- 2045 comprehensive plan is ready for public hearing at the end of the month, then move into TSP update once approved and anticipate BPAC involvement
- In talks with COTA to try and get a pump track
- Anthony will be regularly speaking with City Council about BPAC initiatives

Sunriver

• Have a safety pathway task force, coming together with a plan. Lots of people involved.

Aaron Harding, DCSO introduced himself and is aiming to participate in future BPAC discussions

- For Title 17, we are moving into the Board's review process for Clear and Objective standards which will lead to a public hearing likely on 6/4/25.
