CALL TO ORDER: Chair Adair called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

3. Continued Public Hearing Remand of Deschutes Junction Plan Amendment and Zone Change Application

Senior Planner Nicole Mardell presented the staff overview for the continuation of the public hearing from May 18, 2022. Additional testimony was received since that date and is included in the record. Commissioner Adair called for testimony.

Bill Kloos, applicant's attorney, presented testimony via Zoom conference call and concurs with staff to have continued the hearing.

Tony Aceti, applicant, presented testimony and clarification of his application.

Carol MacBeth, Central Oregon LandWatch, was present via Zoom conference call at the hearing but noted she is not providing additional testimony.

Mr. Kloos presented rebuttal relative to the letter submitted by Central Oregon LandWatch.

Carol MacBeth expressed request to keep the written record open for seven days.

County Counsel Doyle recommended the 7-7-7 record period. The final date for decision would be August 5, 2022. Staff recommends the 21 day written record only. Commissioner Adair closed the public hearing and allowed the 7-7-7 record period.

4. Request Approval to Apply for Behavioral Health Housing Investment Grant

Behavioral Health Director Janice Garceau and Program Manager Shannon Brister-Raugust and via Zoom conference call Manager Kara Cronin presented the request to apply for the grant and reported on the services that would be provided through the receipt of the grant award.

5. Discussion of Board Approval for Extension of four (4) COVID19 Limited Duration Positions for 6 Months and Utilization of Allocated ARPA Funds for Continued Support of Temporary Workforce

Presenting the request for consideration were Deputy County Administrator Erik Kropp, and Public Health Program Manager Emily Horton. Via Zoom conference call were Public Health Deputy Director Nahad Sadr-Azodi, and Business Manager Cheryl Smallman. Staff requests a commitment of additional ARPA funding allocation of \$260,000 for the program. Nahad Sadr-Azodi reported on maintaining expected services in the public health department.

Commissioners Adair and DeBone expressed concern for the community and the continued pressure that folks encounter in the context of continuing COVID risk threats and are concerned that all of this is creating additional health impacts. Commissioner Adair expressed support for extending the temporary and limited duration staff for three months and to conduct a reevaluation. Commissioner DeBone also expressed support of the three month extension. Commissioner Chang would rather support permanent positions than temporary.
