#### **Board Meeting Minutes**

4:00 p.m. to 5:15 p.m. on Monday, October 27, 2025 Hybrid

CHRO Board Members Attendance: Commissioner Phil Chang (Deschutes County Commissioner), Co-Chair Megan Perkins (City of Bend Mayor Pro Tem), Co-Chair Molly Heiss (NeighborImpact), Mayor Jeannine Earls (City of La Pine), Councilor Cat Zwicker (City of Redmond), Councilor President Sarah McDougall (City of Sisters), and Eliza Wilson (HLC Chair).

#### 1. Call to Order at 4:02 p.m.

#### 2. Approval of Minutes from September 22, 2025, CHRO Board Meetings

Co-Chair Megan Perkins asked for edits or a motion to approve the September 22, 2025, Board Meeting minutes.

Motion: Councilor Cat Zwicker

Second: Eliza Wilson Votes: Motion Approved

#### 3. CHRO Budget Update

Erik Kropp, Deschutes County, brought the board a budget update. Mr. Kropp also suggested for the \$250,000 going to COIC for staff that an intergovernmental agreement be created and signed.

#### 4. Public Comment

Thomas Bonnington, J Bar J, introduced himself to the group as the new Chief Business Officer. Mr. Bonnington expressed his goal to become more involved with these meetings and programs to better learn about the community.

Rick Russell, Executive Director of Mountain View Community Development, brought a request for \$75,000. Mr. Russell also asked the Board of County Commissioners for the same amount and is hoping that the CHRO Board will match it to help ensure Safe Parking sites in Redmond remain open and operating.

## 5. CHRO Remaining Budget Allocation Consideration – NeighborImpact Prevention and Keeping People Housed

Co-Chair Molly Heiss presented on eviction prevention as consideration for the Board to spend more funding. Co-Chair Heiss explained that eviction prevention is designed to help individuals and families maintain stable housing through financial assistance, legal support, and case management. NeighborImpact's funding for eviction prevention was cut drastically from the previous biennium. Co-Chair Heiss asked that the Board

consider utilizing some CHRO funding towards this effort. Further discussion will take place in November.

## 6. CHRO Remaining Budget Allocation Consideration – COIC Regional Office Staff and Operations

Mickie Derting reviewed staff recommendations allocating the remaining CHRO funds to staffing and office operations to support long-term sustainability and capacity building. The purpose of this discussion was to preview the recommendations ahead of the November meeting. Ms. Derting recommended this because it aligns with the intentions of HB 4123 to build regional capacity, advance shared housing goals, and coordinate support with the Homeless Leadership Coalition (HLC). This will also allow staff to pursue new funding opportunities.

The group discussed looking at the future of the CHRO and how it could align with the RHC; the current value adds of CHRO in this moment; and if a significant investment in staff is necessary or if the current allocation could be reworked with tasks.

## 7. HUD Continuum of Care (CoC) Program aka Central Oregon Homeless Leadership Coalition (HLC) – Point in Time Count Awareness

Co-Chair Heiss presented on the Point in Time Count. The purpose of the presentation was to give the Board an overview of the county and why it's important. Each year the Central Oregon Continuum of Care (Coc) also known as the HLC, does a complete county to make sure the region is aware of the sheltered and unsheltered populations.

The committee meets every two weeks now to prepare for the January 2026 count. There are designated community leads to provide a touchpoint in each community who is responsible for planning, incentive management, volunteer management, confidentiality agreements, and so on.
