Council Comments.

a. The next regularly scheduled Council Meeting will be held Tuesday, July 21, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. CST in Council Chambers located at 5000 Diamondhead Circle.

City Manager's Report.

- 1. <u>Debris Clean Up from Tropical Storm Cristobal –</u> We opened quotes from 5 contractors last Thursday. The lowest quote was Morrealle Construction. We have a contract on the agenda for council approval tonight. They will start working tomorrow once the contact is signed and notice to proceed is issued. They indicated it would take them 5 days to complete.
- 2. <u>Debris Monitoring Contract</u> I am still waiting to hear back from the MEMA review of the RFQ for debris monitoring for Diamondhead. As soon as we have it back, we will present this to council for consideration.
- 3. <u>Diamondhead Water & Sewerage District</u> I asking the council to request that the board for the DWSD waives the fees for financial records we have requested to complete the consolidated financial statements.
- 4. Grant Awarded to City The city has been awarded a grant from the Emergency Watershed Protection Program for \$90K. This does have a 20% local match. The city applied for this grant in June 2019 to improve erosion in the ditch along Alkii Way.
- 5. <u>GRPC Grant Application</u> The city applied for a TIP grant from GRPC for the sidewalks on E. Aloha. This grant was not funded, but GRPC has informed me that they could consider funding this application through the TAP funds. No new application is required. Our original application will be considered for this funding source.
- 6. GCRF Grant Last week, it was announced that MS State Legislature has awarded Diamondhead \$1.5 million for our Diamondhead Commercial District Transformational Project. This is to start developing new roads to provide access to undeveloped land along I-10. This is the largest grant the city has ever received. We need to thank Senator Philip Moran, Representative Jay McKnight and our lobbiest, Trey Bobinger, for the work in Jackson to get this awarded.
- 7. Police and Security Policy In order to control the cost of providing security for special events, I am asking the council to approve a new Police and Security Policy. This will identify which events the city provides security using general funds. If someone request security for another event, they would need council approval to have the city fund the security. In addition, this policy explains the process for someone requesting security for their event at their own expense.
- 8. <u>Ieke Drainage</u> We are still getting complaints from two residents on Ieke Drive for drainage problems. Rick and Jason have reviewed the area and are recommending that we redirect the drainage to the east. This work assignment will allow Jason to design drainage plans to help with this problem. Jason is not able to be with us tonight since he had to be at another meeting that was previously scheduled.
- 9. <u>Kayak Launch</u> Several residents have requested that we open the path at the Bayou Drive Kayak Launch to allow vehicle traffic to the bottom to drop off and pick up kayaks. The steep hill makes it very difficult to get the kayaks to the launch. Rick and Jason have looked at this and determined that we could increase the width of the path by 3-4 ft using limestone for about \$6K. This project can be completed by our staff. There would be no parking at the bottom.
