Council Comments.

- 2. Proclaim April 2020 Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month

City Manager's Report.

- 1. <u>Hotel Feasibility Study</u> I have reviewed the draft report and provided my comments back to USM. They are finalizing the report and I hope to have it for the council in the next two weeks. This is going to be a great tool for our city to recruit a developer to build a new name brand hotel in our city. The draft is recommending an upper to upper middle hotel with 50 to 80 rooms, and a hotel that has a national points system.
- 2. <u>Slab Removal Project</u> Tonight, we are making a recommendation to accept the low bid from Moran Hauling to remove 17 slabs that are remaining from Hurricane Katrina. This will allow also allow us to issue a notice to proceed. Next meeting, we will prepare a resolution authorizing the administration to place liens on the property for the cost to remove the slab.
- 3. <u>Master Plan for I-10 Frontage</u> We are about 90% complete with the master plan work by Linfield, Hunter and Junius. The property owners in this area have been involved in this discussion and are supportive of the city developing a plan to provide access to this undeveloped land. The next step will be to receive a wetlands delineation, and I am working on a proposal to present to the council.
- 4. Mr. Harko Comments to the Council We distributed the comments from Mr. Harko regarding the street conditions in the Oaks Subdivision. This includes 10 specific areas with pirctures. He had sent this to me yesterday and I did reply to him. I told him I would go walk the streets in the fall when it was time for me to begin looking at street paving again. At present, my attention is to our current road paving project that is out for bid and the first phase that we are finishing up. I also forwarded him the SMPDD road improvement plan that was completed in 2018 when all streets were graded using the PACER scale by an outside engineering firm.
- 5. <u>COVID</u> A copy of the last executive order by the Governor (#1473) was sent to the council. In this order, the Governor did extend the stay at home order for 7 days, and he also relaxed some of the restrictions by allowing non-essential businesses to open and sell products curbside. We are expecting to get another executive order this week and we are hoping that he continues to allow more businesses to open following the CDC guidelines.
- 6. <u>Guidelines for Opening up American Again from the Federal Government</u> A copy of the guidelines has been distributed to the council. We will be looking to this document as a guide to begin opening businesses through the direction of our Governor.
- 7. Operations of City Hall Effective Monday, April 27th, all city employees will return to work for their regular hours. We will discontinue working from home. The City Hall building will still have restricted access, and the public will use the window at the court department to conduct business as we have been doing. We ask residents to not approach our public works employees working in the city, but to instead, contact city hall with any questions or concerns. This is done to protect our employees and our residents by observing the CDC guidelines for social distancing.
