- 1. <u>Park Ten Road</u> Bids were opened July 7th. Covington Engineering has reviewed the bids and provided a notice of award. The request to approve this award is on tonight's agenda. This will be Phase I of the Commercial District Transformation Project.
- 2. <u>Noma Drive Restoration</u> Bids were opened on July 28th. I am requesting to add the award to the lowest bidder based on the engineer's recommendation after certifying the bids. This will be Phase II of the Commercial District Transformation Project.
- 3. <u>Phase 4 paving</u> The paving project is set to re-mobilize on August 21st. A new change order is being presented on this agenda to move the contract end date. The new contact end date for this project will be September 15th.
- 4. <u>Diamondhead Drive Paving</u> A recommendation is on this agenda for approval. This project will pave the entire Diamondhead Drive loop.
- 5. <u>Noma Drive Utility Improvements</u> Phase 1a. notice to proceed was issued July 20th. The contract is for 45 days with final payment due in 60 days. This puts a contract end date of September 2nd.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES AND CITY OF DIAMONDHEAD

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is entered into between the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources (hereinafter "MDMR") and City of Diamondhead (hereinafter "CODH") for the purpose of establishing the agreed upon conditions under which MDMR may allocate funds to CODH for Diamondhead Drainage, Flood Prevention & Water Quality Improvement Project Phase II ("the Project") pursuant to the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act of 2006, Public Law 109-432 (hereinafter "GOMESA"). This MOU is entered into pursuant to and subject to the terms of GOMESA and relates to MDMR funds obtained through GOMESA, in the amount of One Million Nine Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Nine Dollars (\$1,999,839.00). The CODH will use some or all of the funds, which will be provided on a reimbursement basis, to advance the Project.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, GOMESA authorizes the disbursement of funds for projects and activities for the purposes of coastal protection, including conservation, coastal restoration, hurricane protection, infrastructure directly affected by coastal wetland losses, as well as mitigation of damage to fish, wildlife, or natural resources; and,

WHEREAS, funding for GOMESA is directed to the State of Mississippi through the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management within the Department of Interior; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Mississippi has directed that MDMR will administer GOMESA funding for the State; and,

WHEREAS, MDMR is authorized to allocate and disburse GOMESA funds in accordance with GOMESA in a manner as determined by the MDMR; and,

WHEREAS, GOMESA funds are federal funds and cannot be used to match any other federal funds unless those programs specifically state that such funds can be used for matching; and,

WHEREAS, the primary goal of the Project consists of three subprojects (Kome Drive, Anahalo, and Fairway Drive) that will provide drainage infrastructure improvements, wetland restoration and improve detention facilities to reduce flooding, improve water quality and preserve downstream wetland and estuarine habitats. The subprojects that are associated will improve water flow characteristics, reduce the future possibility of flooding of roadways and homes in the area, improve water quality downstream and extend runoff times; and,

WHEREAS, CODH asserts that the Project will have a direct positive impact on coastal wetland losses by reducing stream bank and wetland erosion along the major drainageways within the City of Diamondhead and that the reduction in sedimentation will improve water quality in receiving streams and estuaries, and that the Project will implement recommendations made from the Hancock County Watershed-Based Stormwater Assessment and Management Plan which is a conservation management plan for Hancock County; and,

WHEREAS, the MDMR requests CODH maintain on file all documentation related to the receipt, investment and expenditure of the funds provided for the Project, and furnish any such documentation to the MDMR upon request; and,

WHEREAS, CODH agrees to expend the funds in accordance with the purposes as outlined in GOMESA; and,

WHEREAS, CODH agrees to provide quarterly and final reports to MDMR that summarize the expenditure of the funds reimbursed by MDMR and the status of the Project until such time as the final expenditure of these funds has been made; and,

WHEREAS, MDMR finds, consistent with GOMESA, that it is in the best interest of the State of Mississippi that funds made available from GOMESA should be allocated to CODH, on a reimbursement basis, for the Project.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES AND CITY OF DIAMONDHEAD, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Each and all of the facts and findings set forth in the preamble clauses of this memorandum are hereby found and determined to be true and accurate and are incorporated

herein by this reference thereto as though set forth again in words and figures.

SECTION 2. This MOU shall be effective upon execution by both parties and shall remain in effect for a term of three years (36 months) with one optional one-year (12 months) renewal, for a total of four (4) years, unless terminated earlier. The term may be extended prior to expiration upon the written agreement of both parties.

SECTION 3. MDMR, pursuant to GOMESA, shall provide funds received from Mississippi's allocation of GOMESA funding in an amount up to One Million Nine Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Nine Dollars (\$1,999,839.00) to CODH, on a reimbursement basis, for the purpose of providing funds to accomplish the Project as described herein.

SECTION 4. CODH shall request payment of funds hereunder for Project costs on a reimbursement basis (such requests, "Reimbursement Requests"), unless otherwise directed by MDMR. CODH shall submit written Reimbursement Requests no more frequently than monthly and no less frequently than quarterly. Each Reimbursement Request must be accompanied by detailed supporting documentation of costs incurred as required by MDMR. All Reimbursement Requests for time periods ending June 30 of any year during the term of this MOU shall be submitted no later than July 31 of that same year. MDMR will pay all properly documented Reimbursement Requests within forty-five (45) days after MDMR's receipt of same, except for any amounts disputed by MDMR in good faith. Reimbursement Requests shall be sent to Russell Weatherly, GOMESA Project Manager, Mississippi Department of Marine Resources, 1141 Bayview Avenue, Biloxi, MS 39530, russell.weatherly@dmr.ms.gov.

SECTION 5. CODH agrees to use all funds received from MDMR as allocated from GOMESA funding solely for the purposes set forth herein and authorized by GOMESA and upon the terms and provisions of this MOU; and further, by execution of this MOU, CODH does hereby certify that all GOMESA funds it receives from the MDMR shall be used exclusively for the Project. CODH understands that failure on its part to adhere to any provision within this MOU may result in termination of this MOU by the MDMR and in immediate action by the State to recover any improperly expended funds.

SECTION 6. CODH agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of CFR 2 §200, *et seq.*, including §200.501 which states that a non-Federal entity that expends Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No/100 (\$750,000.00) or more during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year in Federal awards must have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year.

SECTION 7. CODH agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of Section 70914 of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Pub. L. 117-58), also known as the Build America, Buy America Act.

SECTION 8. CODH agrees to maintain on file all documentation in accordance with the recitals of this MOU and to submit such documentation to MDMR upon request.

SECTION 9. CODH agrees to provide MDMR quarterly reports summarizing expenditure of GOMESA funds received from MDMR for the Project and the status of the Project until such time as the final expenditure or final investment of the funds has been made. The first quarterly report shall be provided within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this MOU, and thereafter within thirty (30) days of each calendar quarter end. CODH shall also provide MDMR with a final report summarizing the expenditures and use of the funds upon completion of the Project and final expenditure. Failure to timely submit reports may result in delay of payment of Reimbursement Requests. Reports shall be sent to Russell Weatherly, GOMESA Project Manager, Mississippi Department of Marine Resources, 1141 Bayview Avenue, Biloxi, MS 39530, russell.weatherly@dmr.ms.gov.

SECTION 10. CODH agrees to maintain copies of all invoices and documentation related to the funds allocated by MDMR for the Project sufficient to satisfy and confirm, to MDMR's satisfaction, that such funds have been expended **solely** for the purposes provided in GOMESA.

SECTION 11. CODH shall comply with and all activities under this MOU shall be subject to all applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations, as now existing and as may be amended or modified.

SECTION 12. CODH understands and acknowledges that if the Mississippi State Legislature fails to pass an appropriation bill for the MDMR and the prior year's appropriation bill expires, or if the Legislature fails to give MDMR the authority to expend funds, or if funds are otherwise unavailable, then the MDMR may, in its sole discretion, terminate this agreement or issue a Stop Work Order to CODH in lieu of termination. If a Stop Work Order is issued, CODH agrees to adhere to its terms.

SECTION 13. This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi, excluding its conflict of laws provisions, and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the state courts of Harrison County, Mississippi.

SECTION 14. Attached hereto as <u>Attachment A</u> and incorporated herein by reference is the document supporting the request for GOMESA funding submitted by CODH. This document outlines the scope of work to be completed for the Project. Any change in the scope of work is subject to approval by the MDMR in writing and may require an amendment to this MOU and written approval of the GOMESA Committee and others.

SECTION 15. Attached hereto as <u>Attachment B</u> and incorporated herein by reference is the budget for the Project submitted by CODH.

SECTION 16. Attached hereto as <u>Attachment C</u> and incorporated herein by reference is the Project Selection Form approved and executed by the GOMESA Committee. In the event of a discrepancy between Attachment A and Attachment C, Attachment C will govern.

SECTION 17. All notices or information required or permitted to be given pursuant to this MOU shall be in writing and personally delivered or sent by Certified United States mail,

postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the party to whom the notice should be given at the address set forth below. Notice shall be deemed given when actually received or when refused. The parties agree to promptly notify each other in writing of any change of address.

9. Provide Brief Project Description/Overview:

The City of Diamondhead is seeking GOMESA funding from the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources for the Diamondhead Drainage, Flood Prevention & Water Quality Improvement Project Phase II. Phase I of the project was funded during the 2022 cycle and the proposed projects identified in Phase II include one of the subprojects that were not funded in Phase I due to budgetary constraints. Additionally, two subprojects have been identified as critical components to Diamondhead's drainage and water quality program specific to Watershed A (the largest watershed in the City of Diamondhead). The project consists of three subprojects that will provide drainage infrastructure improvements, wetland restoration and improve detention facilities to reduce flooding, improve water quality and preserve downstream wetland and estuarine habitats. The subprojects that are associated will improve water flow characteristics, reduce the future possibility of flooding of roadways and homes in the area, improve water quality downstream and extend runoff times.

As part of a county-wide effort, Waggoner Engineering produced the Hancock County Watershed-Based Stormwater Assessment and Management Plan in December 2019 that included a step-by-step plan for implementation. The plan created by Waggoner Engineering provided Hancock County a storm management plan for the long-term future of the County that was realistic and manageable. The county-wide effort by Waggoner Engineering resulted in a detailed project description for the three subprojects of the Diamondhead Drainage, Flood Prevention & Water Quality Improvement Project. The following pages contain the full project descriptions from the Waggoner Engineering produced plan for Kome Drive, Anahalo and Fairway Drive.

10. LIST Project Goals/Objectives:

- Kome Drive: Goals and objectives of this subproject are to improve flow characteristics, reduce possibility of flooding of roadway and homes in the area. The objectives include re-establishing ditch sections, ditch armoring to prevent erosion and replacing inadequate infrastructure with properly sized channels and culverts. The project will also investigate detention possibilities and establishing riparian buffers along streams in the Watershed.
- Anahalo: Goals and objectives of this subproject are to improve flow characteristics, reduce possibility of flooding of roadways and homes in the area, improved water quality downstream and extended runoff times. As documented by Waggoner Engineering, the reported problems are water over the road in a typical storm event and houses flooding in the area multiple times. Site is the singular out fall for watershed with no detention facility. Previous methods for the handling storm water are causing expedited runoff times. Open ditches have been eliminated in places where they are needed. The recommended solutions for this subproject are to: re-establish open ditch sections where water is being forced onto the roadways; incorporate LID drainage measures in the channel (step pool) that increase runoff times to mitigate immediate problems and aid in addressing those downstream; build inline and offline detention within the watershed.
- Fairway Drive: Goals and objects of this subproject are to improve flow characteristics, reduce possibility of flooding of roadways and homes in the area, extend future runoff times and improve water quality downstream. When documenting the reported problems with this subproject. Waggoner Engineering stated, "Ditch sections along Fairway drive and thru the easement are not large enough to accommodate the current volumes and there is potential for further development within the basins." The recommended solutions to remediate the problems associated with this subproject are to: Construct additional detention facilities, enlarge hydrologic section along Fairway Drive, remove, replace, install additional drainage structures under the roadway.

AMENDMENT # 1 OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES AND

THE CITY OF DIAMONDHEAD

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources (MDMR) and the City of Diamondhead (CODH) for GOMESA funding which was fully executed on September 27, 2021 is hereby mutually amended to change the name of the Project from "Restoration of Marsh Erosion Prevent (Basis "C" Watershed Hydrologic/Hydraulic Analysis" to "Diamondhead Flood Prevention and Detention Pond Restoration". The MOU is further mutually amended as follows:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, GOMESA authorizes the disbursement of funds for projects and activities for the purposes of coastal protection, including conservation, coastal restoration, hurricane protection, infrastructure directly affected by coastal wetland losses, as well as mitigation of damage to fish, wildlife, or natural resources; and,

WHEREAS, funding for GOMESA is directed to the State of Mississippi through the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management within the Department of Interior; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Mississippi has directed that MDMR will administer GOMESA funding for the State; and,

WHEREAS, MDMR is authorized to allocate and disburse GOMESA funds in accordance with GOMESA in a manner as determined by the MDMR; and,

WHEREAS, GOMESA funds are federal funds and cannot be used to match any other federal funds unless those programs specifically state that such funds can be used for matching; and,

WHEREAS, the primary goal of the Project is for drainage infrastructure improvement which will include the restoration of two existing stormwater retention ponds, the Miller Pond (located just north of Interstate 10) and the Lily Pond; and,

WHEREAS, CODH proposes that the Project will reduce stream bank and wetland erosion along the major drainage ways within Diamondhead and will reduce sedimentation which will improve water quality in receiving streams and estuaries; and,

SECTION 6. CODH agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. § 200, *et seq.*, including § 200.501 which states that a non-Federal entity that expends Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No/100 (\$750,000.00) or more during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year in Federal awards must have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year.

SECTION 18. CODH agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of Section 70914 of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Pub. L. 117-58), also know as the Build America, Buy America Act.

SECTION 19. Attached hereto as <u>Attachment D</u> and incorporated herein by reference is a letter GOMESA application, with a revised Scope of Work and <u>Attachment E</u> Amended Budget.

SECTION 20. Attached hereto as <u>Attachment F</u> and incorporated herein by reference is the revised Project Selection Form approved and executed by the GOMESA Committee. In the event of a discrepancy between Attachment D and Attachment F, Attachment F will govern.

All other terms and conditions set forth in the original MOU executed September 27, 2021, remain in full effect.

9. Provide Brief Project Description/Overview:

The City of Diamondhead is seeking GOMESA funding from the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources for the Diamondhead Flood Prevention & Detention Pond Restoration. Diamondhead's drainage and water quality program specific to Watershed A (the largest watershed in the City of Diamondhead) and Watershed C (the second largest watershed). The project consists of two sub-projects that will provide drainage infrastructure improvements and improve detention facilities to reduce flooding, improve water quality and preserve downstream wetland and estuarine habitats.. The sub-projects that are associated will improve water flow characteristics, reduce the future possibility of flooding of roadways and homes in the area, improve water quality downstream and extend runoff times.

As part of a county-wide effort, Waggoner Engineering produced the Hancock County Watershed-Based Stormwater Assessment and Management Plan in December 2019 that included a step-by-step plan for implementation. The plan created by Waggoner Engineering provided Hancock County a storm management plan for the long-term future of the County that was realistic and manageable. The county-wide effort by Waggoner Engineering resulted in a detailed project description for these two sub-projects of the Diamondhead Flood Prevention & Detention Pond Restoration. The following pages contain the full project descriptions from the Waggoner Engineering produced plan for the I-10 Pond (Miller Pond) and Lily Pond (Anela Pond).

10. LIST Project Goals/Objectives:

- I-10 Pond: Goals and objectives of this sub-project are to improve flow characteristics, reduce possibility of flooding of roadway and homes in the area, increase runoff times, and increase water quality downstream. This detention pond's capacity has been reduced over the years due to sediment build up. The removal of this sediment and cleaning of the pond banks will allow the pond to hold more water and to allow for a slower runoff of stormwater.
- Lily Pond: Goals and objectives of this sub-project are to improve flow characteristics, reduce possibility of flooding of roadway and homes in the area, increase runoff times, and increase water quality downstream. This detention pond is primary for the retention of stormwater before it travels into Montjoy Creek and eventually Rotten Bayou. This detention pond's capacity has been reduced over the years due to sediment build up. The removal of this sediment and cleaning of the pond banks will allow the pond to hold more water and to allow for a slower runoff of stormwater.



This area is located on the southern marsh of our city and northern part of the Bay A large part of the city drains directly into the Bay of St. Louis. Rotten Bayou and the Jourdan River impacting the water quality In this area of Coastal Mississippi. The city engaged Seymour Engineering to create a plan for improving water quality as part of a larger watershed-based approach to storm water management. Part of their review included (1) the hardening of the bottom of Bay of Saint Louis with an oyster ridge or bar and rang, a clam beds; (2) reintroducing sea grasses among the clams compatible with tidal hydrology and salinity: and (3) monitoring both conservation and restoration of coastal marshlands in Diamondhead. The project restores the shoreline, restores water quality and enables monitoring for both conservation and restoration progress. In order to further improve the water quality in this area another part of this project is the restoration of an existing stormwater retention pond located just north of 1-10. EXHIBIT "D" FEES

AND EXPENSES

The City shall pay the Engineer on an actual Labor Hour/Unit Cost Basis for the satisfactory completion of the Scope of Work set forth herein, for all salaries, payroll additives, overhead, direct costs and the Engineer's fixed fees attributable to a Work Assignment. The Engineer shall prepare an estimate for the specific work identified for the contemplated transportation improvement, and the City shall review and may approve this amount on a Work Assignment by Work Assignment basis using typical rates, and when acceptable issue the Notice to Proceed to the Engineer.

Actual costs as the term is used herein shall include all direct salaries, payroll additives, overhead and direct. Direct salaries are those amounts actually paid to the person performing the services which are deemed reasonably necessary by the City for the advancement of the Scope of Work. Overtime work is not contemplated by the Work Assignment. Accordingly, direct salaries chargeable to the Work Assignment shall not include any overtime premium. Salaries for officers, principals or partners shall not increase at a rate in excess of that for other employees. Payroll additives and overhead consist of employee fringe benefits and that part of Engineer's allowable indirect costs attributable to the Work Assignment.

Direct costs ate those charges deemed reasonably necessary by the City for the successful completion of the Scope of Work which are charged directly to the Work Assignment and not included in overhead.

Fixed-fee as the term is used herein shall mean a dollar amount established to cover !he Engineer's profit and business expenses not allocable to overhead for the successful completion of the Services.

Labor Hour as the term is used herein shall include all direct salaries, payroll additives, overhead, and profit. Unit-Costs, as the term is used herein shall include all direct costs and profit. Labor Hour/Unit-Costs are not subject to any adjustments on the basis of the Engineer's cost experience in performing the Work Assignment. The Labor Hour/Unit-Costs shall be paid based on the rates established in the Work Assignment

Each month, the Engineer shall submit OCR-484-C found on MDOT's website to the CITY along with the Invoice. This form certifies payments to all Subcontractors and shows all firms even if the Engineer has paid no monies to the firm during that estimate period (negative report).

If requested by City all labor charges for services must be substantiated by supporting data, i.e. certified time sheets, daily logs, check stubs, pay vouchers, etc.

Direct costs:

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS, FEDERAL AID CONTRACT COMPLIANCE WITH TITLE VI OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIESACT, COPELAND ANTI-KICKBACK ACT, DAVIS BACON ACT, CONTRACT WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS ACT, CLEAN AIR ACT, ENERGY POLICY AND CONSERVATION ACT, DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES ACT, WORKER VISIBILITY

During the performance of this Agreement, the Engineer, for itself, its assignees and successor-ininterest (hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer") agrees as follows:

- 1. <u>Compliance with Regulations</u>: The Engineer will comply with the Regulations of the City, relative to nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the U. S. Department of Transportation (Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations"), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>: The Engineer, with regard to the work performed by it after award and prior to completion of the contract work, will not discriminate on the grounds of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age or disability in the selection and retention of sub-consultants including procurement of materials and leases of equipment. The Engineer will not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when this Agreement covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations. In addition, the Engineer will not participate either directly or indirectly in discrimination prohibited by 23 C.F.R.710.405(b).
- 3. <u>Solicitations for Subcontracts. Including Procurement of Materials and Equipment:</u> In all Solicitations, either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Engineer for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurement of materials or equipment, each potential sub-consultant or supplier shall be notified by the Engineer of the Engineer's obligations under this Agreement and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age or disability.
- 4. Anti-kick back provisions: All agreements and subcontracts for construction or repair shall include a provision for compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kick Back" Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR, Part 3). This Act provides that each consultant/contractor or sub-consultant/sub-contractor shall be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he is otherwise entitled. The Engineer shall report all suspected or reported violations to the City.
- 5. <u>Davis Bacon Act</u>: When required by the federal grant program legislation, all construction contracts awarded to contractors and subcontractors in excess of \$2,000 shall include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a to a-7) and as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR, Part 5). Under this Act, contractors shall be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the minimum wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, contractors shall be required to pay wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. Clean Air Act: Compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under section 306 of the Clear Air Act (42 U.S.C. 1857 (h), Section 508 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1368), Executive Order 11738, and Environmental Protection Agency regulations (40 CFR Part 15) (Contracts and subcontracts in amounts in excess of \$100,000).
