- 8. <u>6621 Golf Club Drive</u> Received email regarding the residence pool. The property owner has installed a hard cover for the pool.

WHEREAS, The City of Diamondhead acknowledges the said PROJECT has been allocated FY23 GCRF funding at 83/17 cost share; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Diamondhead further acknowledges that it will comply with all requirements and assurances established for Gulf Coast Restoration Fund projects; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that <u>*City of Diamondhead*</u>, hereby authorizes its City Manager, Jon McCraw, to prepare, execute and file its Commercial District Transformation Project Phase 3 amended application to the Mississippi Development Authority for FY23 Gulf Coast Restoration Funding and, be it further

SUBJECT: Recommendation from the Planning Commission for a Text Amendment to the Tree Ordinance

The text amendment will replace the Tree Ordinance with the Tree Preservation and Protection Ordinance. The text amendment will accomplish the following:

- require new developments to hire an ISA certified arborist to develop and manage all preservation and protection plans until final plat approval.
- plan approval rests with Building Official.
- tree protection requirements during construction.
- monthly reporting on plan
- increased penalties for violations.
- increase protected trees from 2 to 7.
- permits for homeowners are required ONLY if protected trees are involved.

At its meeting on August 22, 2023, the Planning Commission voted 6-0 to recommend approving the Text Amendment.

<u>A TEXT AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDING</u> Article XI – Tree Ordinance

A resolution of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Diamondhead amending Ordinance No. 2012-019 Article 11 – Tree Ordinance.

WHEREAS, the proposed text amendment is to amend the Tree Ordinance to establish requirements to preserve and protect the tree canopy of Diamondhead. The proposed changes are to REPLACE the entire ordinance with Article 11 – Tree Preservation and Protection (attached).

ARTICLE 11. - TREE PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION

11.1. - PURPOSE AND SCOPE.

11.1.1. Aid in stabilizing the environment's ecological balance by contributing to the processes of energy and soil conservation, air purification, oxygen regeneration, pollutant neutralization, groundwater recharge, and the reduction of stormwater runoff, while at the same time aiding in noise, glare, and heat abatement by preserving the existing canopy.

11.1.2. Ensure that the stock of native trees and vegetation is maintained and replenished; and

11.1.3. Provide visual buffering and enhance the beautification of the city.

11.2. – PRINCIPLES.

11.2.1. Preservation of existing trees shall be the first, best, and standard approach.

11.2.2. If preservation cannot be achieved, on-site mitigation shall next be pursued.

11.2.3. If those approaches cannot be achieved, off-site mitigation shall be next pursued.

11.3. – APPLICABILITY.

11.3.1. Except as noted herein, requirements apply to all land located in the city. Trees may not be cleared from any site for any purpose without a Tree Preservation permit, unless specified otherwise herein.

11.4. – PERMIT REQUIRED. Under this Article, the clearing of any site is permitted only after a tree inventory has been completed and Tree Preservation permit has been issued.

11.4.1. Tree inventory required. An inventory of existing trees is required for any site plan or subdivision. The inventory must be conducted by an International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) certified arborist, a Mississippi licensed tree surgeon, or a Mississippi licensed horticulturalist and submitted to the Building Official for approval.

11.4.2. The tree inventory shall include:

a.

The location, size, type, and quality of existing significant, specimen and heritage trees.

b. Which trees are to be removed and which retained.

11.4.3. Exception. If the property owner is notified by their insurance company that a tree is to be trimmed or removed as a condition of insurability, no tree inventory is required. Upon receipt of proof of the condition of insurability, a Tree Preservation permit shall be issued.

11.4.4. Exception. Trees on developed properties that are not heritage, specimen or significant do not require a permit. Pine trees of any size on developed lots do not require a permit.

11.4.5. Exception. Utility companies, public works, and Diamondhead Water and Sewer District are exempt. No tree inventory or permit shall be required.

11.5. – SITE DESIGN GUIDELINES. Design for development shall consider:

11.5.1. Generally. Potential for retaining existing site topography and existing vegetation.

11.5.2. Parking lots. Shall be designed to preserve the maximum number of existing significant, specimen, and heritage trees and other significant vegetation.

11.5.3. Curb cuts. All proposed curb cuts shall consider damage to trees and tree groves and shall be placed in areas to provide the least damage to existing trees and tree groves.

11.6. – TREE PRESERVATION CRITERIA. The ISA certified arborist, Mississippi licensed tree surgeon, or Mississippi licensed horticulturalist, shall consider the following factors, and any other relevant information, when submitting the Tree Preservation permit application:

11.6.1. The desirability of preserving a tree or group of trees by reason of age, location, size, or species.

11.6.2. Whether the size or shape of the lot reduces the flexibility of the design.

11.6.3. The general health and condition of the tree or group of trees, or the presence of any disease, injury, or hazard.

11.6.4. The placement of the tree or group of trees in relation to utilities, structures, and the use of the property.

11.6.5. The need to remove the tree or group of trees for the purpose of installing, repairing, replacing, or maintaining essential public utilities.

11.6.6. Whether roads, utilities and building footprints are designed in relation to the existing topography, and located, where possible, to avoid damage to existing tree canopy.

11.6.7. Construction requirements of on-site and off-site drainage.

11.6.8. The extent to which development of the site and the enforcement of this article are impacted by state and federal regulations.

11.8. – TREE PROTECTION. Trees identified on an approved Tree Preservation permit to be retained shall utilize the following protection methods:

11.8.1. Install four-foot-high perimeter fencing at the extreme outer edge of the dripline.

11.8.2. Perimeter fencing located within 50 feet of any building footprint, unless approved by the Building Official, shall be constructed of materials equivalent to those used for silt fencing.

11.8.3. There shall be no activity of any kind inside the perimeter other than hand-brush clearing and signage clearly identifying the tree as protected must be placed at or near the perimeter.

11.8.4. No land clearing or building permits shall be issued until the perimeter of all protected trees and tree groves have been properly fenced.

11.8.5. Grates or other pervious surfaces shall be utilized within the dripline of existing trees to allow water and air to reach the tree roots.

11.8.6. Fill (other than soil disturbance) shall be prohibited, as well as any vehicle traffic or material storage in areas under the dripline of trees to be protected.

11.8.7. Drastic changes in drainage patterns which may negatively affect existing trees shall be avoided. Pre and post construction grading plans must be submitted as set forth in the Land Alterations and Disturbances Ordinance.

11.8.8. Any person who intentionally damages a protected tree shall be in violation of this article and subject to the maximum fine allowable by law and/or up to 30 days in jail.

11.8.9. The removal of the protected fencing, or encroachment into the area, without explicit approval of the property owner or his designated agent, shall be punishable by a fine up to the replacement value of the tree(s) involved. Replacement value shall be determined by a method approved by the International Society of Arboriculture (ISA). This applies to any person or entity, public or private.

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11.9. – TREE MITIGATION REQUIREMENTS. The intent is to leave undisturbed as many existing significant, specimen and heritage trees as possible. Mitigation is required for removal of significant, specimen, and heritage trees removed.

11.9.1. Each development will have a ten percent credit applied before any mitigation is required. For example, if there were 1,000 inches DBH of existing trees, 100 inches could be removed without mitigation.

11.9.2. For trees that will be removed, the number of trees required for mitigation shall be based upon the existing significant, specimen, and heritage trees removed.

11.9.3. Mitigation may be made through replanting on-site and if not possible, off-site.

11.9.4. Trees in poor health and/or hazard trees will not require mitigation if the condition is so determined by the ISA certified arborist, or a Mississippi licensed tree surgeon, or a Mississippi licensed horticulturalist.

11.9.5. Existing significant trees located within a building footprint, street, driveway, sidewalk, pathway, or utility easement shall generally not require mitigation.

- 11.9.6. Replanting.
 - a. For each significant, specimen, and heritage tree removed, replacement trees shall be planted at one, two-inch caliper tree per five inches of trees removed, measured at DBH.
 - b. Smaller trees. The Building Official may approve the use of trees of less than two-inch caliper for the planting of medium tree species (dogwoods and redbuds) and/or greater than two-inch caliper on an equal total caliper basis, e.g., two, three-inch caliper trees equal three, two-inch caliper trees.
 - c. Placement of trees. The applicant is expected to plant trees in locations on the site where the environmental benefits of canopy cover are most likely to offset the impact of development. Trees shall not be placed within utility and drainage easements, or in other locations where their future protection cannot be assured.

11.11. – PRIOR TREE REMOVAL.

11.11.1. Prior removal of significant, specimen and/or heritage trees. If a site is cleared or significant specimen or heritage trees removed prior to obtaining Tree Preservation permit approval, then any permit application for the site shall be denied for up to 24 months and a fee of \$500.00 per lot or acre of trees cleared and \$2,000.00 per each heritage tree removed shall be imposed.

11.11.2 Any request for permit approval within the 24-month time frame may, however, be considered if the proposed Application for Tree Preservation permit incorporates a reforestation plan that results in a future canopy coverage of 40 percent of the site. The square foot percentage of canopy area required for reforestation shall be based on the total area of the property less the square footage dedicated to any building footprints, streets, driveways, sidewalks, pathways, or utility easements.

DEFINITIONS

Arborist: A professional in the practice of arboriculture, which is the cultivation, management, and study of individual trees, shrubs, vines, and other perennial woody plants.

Clearing: The removal of vegetation, including tree stumps, or the material damage of landscape materials by disturbing, excavating, or removing the underlying soil.

DBH (diameter breast height): The diameter of a tree as measured four and one-half feet above grade level.

Development: Any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation, or drilling operation.

Dripline: The periphery of the area underneath a tree, which would be encompassed by the perpendicular lines, dropped from the farthest edges of the crown of the tree.

Fill: The placing, storing, or dumping of any materials such as earth, clay, sand, concrete, rubble, or non-decomposable waste of any kind upon the surface of the ground which results in increasing the natural surface elevation.

International Society of Arboriculture, ISA: Credentialing organization that promotes the professional practice of arboriculture. ISA focuses on providing research, technology, and education opportunities for tree care professionals to develop their arboricultural expertise.

Subdivision: The division of a lot, tract, or parcel of land into two or more lots, plats, sites, or other divisions of land for the purpose, whether immediate or future, of sale or building development by means of an appropriately recorded legal document. A subdivision which reduces the size of an existing lot may require approval of a new site plan for any existing development on that lot.

Tree grove: A stand of native significant and/or specimen trees with understory vegetation cover intact, drainage conditions unchanged, and general slope and grades unaltered. The extent of a grove will extend three feet beyond the dripline of the perimeter trees in the grove.

Tree, heritage: Any tree by virtue of its species and/or size included in the heritage tree list. The listed trees are predominantly species native to Hancock County and of size and maturity important to the health and conservation of Diamondhead's urban forest.

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Tree, large: An evergreen or deciduous upright woody perennial plant having a single main stem or several main stems, which is a minimum of two-inch caliper, 12 to 14 feet with the maximum of 16 feet in height at the time of planting and which attains generally more than 30 feet in height at maturity.

Tree, native: A tree that is indigenous to the area.

Tree, protected: Any tree which meets the requirements of being classified as a "significant tree" or is declared by the developer, or as required by the Diamondhead Planning Commission, as to be preserved and protected from clearing or infringement by development.

Tree, significant: Plant materials which meet the following requirements: Healthy hardwood and evergreen trees, except pines, with a DBH of 15 inches or greater.

Tree, small: An evergreen or deciduous upright woody perennial plant having a single main stem or several main stems, which is a minimum of six to eight feet overall height at the time of planting, and which attains a minimum height of 15 feet and a maximum height of 30 feet.

Tree, specimen: Any tree identified by the Diamondhead Tree Ordinances' Master Tree List at least four inches or more DBH that exemplifies a unique color, texture scent, growth habit, outstanding size, or other distinguishing characteristic that makes it unique compared to other trees found on the site in question.

Vegetation, significant: Any large shrub meeting or exceeding eight feet in height at maturity.

A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE EXISTING FOUR (4) ELECTION WARDS FOR THE CITY OF DIAMONDHEAD AND THE POLLING PLACES FOR EACH WARD TO BE UTILIZED IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Diamondhead became incorporated under the laws of the State of Mississippi on or about January 30, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated § 21-9-15 the City Council was empowered and authorized to divide the city into four (4) equally populated single member election districts for the purpose of electing council members and the City Council found it desirable to do so; and,

WHEREAS, in pursuit of re-evaluating its election districts in furtherance of the 2020 Census, the City Council did retain the services of a demographer to develop said plan and guide the process leading up to the adoption of said plan; and,

WHEREAS, said demographer prepared its findings on the four (4) election districts within the City of Diamondhead and the City Council has decided there is no need to redraw the existing four (4) election districts and this decision was put before the public at a duly noticed public hearing held on August 15, 2023 at 6:00 p.m.; and,

WHEREAS, during the course of the public hearing there were no questions from members of the public and no objections to the proposed plan for the maintenance of four (4) election districts within the City of Diamondhead; and,

WHEREAS, elections conducted by the City of Diamondhead currently utilize two polling places within Diamondhead and such polling places are familiar to the voters within the City and should, for consistency purposes, continue to be utilized for City elections; now therefore,



BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Diamondhead, Mississippi, as

follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> That the City of Diamondhead is and continues to be and it is hereby apportioned and divided into four (4) wards, with each such ward being set out on the map attached hereto and marked as part of EXHIBIT A. The perimeter metes and bounds description of the four (4) wards, as apportioned, are declared to be as follows as originally set forth by the City Council on July 16, 2012 in Ordinance No. 2012-008 attached hereto and marked as EXHBIT A:

Ward 1

Beginning at the point of intersection of the centerline of Interstate Highway 10 and the centerline of the Jordan River (also known as the Jourdan River), said centerline being the West City Limits line of the City of Diamondhead as they exist on April 3, 2012; thence run Northerly along the meanderings of the thread or centerline of said Jordan River to the point of intersection of the thread or centerline of said Jordan River with the thread or centerline of Rotten Bayou; thence run Northeasterly along the meanderings of the thread or centerline of said Rotten Bayou to its intersection with the North line of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 26, Township 7 South, Range 14 West; thence run East along the North line of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of said Section 26 to an iron pipe set on the Eastern bank of Rotten Bayou; thence East a distance of 932 feet to an iron stake set at the Northeast corner of the above mentioned Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter; thence South to a point on the North line of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 26; thence East to the Northeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 26; thence South a distance of 550 feet, more or less, to a point on the Northerly right-of-way of an existing Mississippi Power Company Transmission Line Easement, said easement containing a 230 kV and a 115kV transmission line; thence run Northeasterly along the Northerly right-of-way of said existing Mississippi Power Company Transmission Line Easement a distance of 1,170 feet, more or less, to a point; thence run South and parallel to the East line of said Section 26 for a distance of 2,050 feet, more or less, to the intersection of the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West and the centerline of a power line easement; thence run Westerly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West for a distance of 575 feet, more or less, to the centerline of Laa la Way; thence run along the centerline of Laa la Way to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West; thence run Southwesterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West and continuing Southwesterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North to its intersection with the centerline of Mahalo Hui Drive; thence continue Southwesterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North a distance



of 382 feet, more or less, to the centerline of Analii Street; thence run southwesterly along the centerline of Analii Street to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North; thence run south along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North to its intersection with the traffic circle encompassing the Diamondhead P.O.A. offices; thence traverse around the western margin of the traffic circle to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive; thence run south along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive to its intersection with the centerline of Gex Drive; thence continue south along the centerline of Gex Drive to the intersection of the centerline of Interstate Highway 10; thence run Southwest along the centerline Interstate Highway 10 to its intersection with centerline of the Jordan River and the Point of Beginning.

Ward 2

Beginning at a point on the North line of the City Limits of Diamondhead, said point being the Northwest corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 26, Township 7 South, Range 14 West; thence run East along the North line of the Northeast Ouarter of the Southeast Ouarter of said Section 26 to the East line of said Section 26, said point also lying on the Northwest corner of the South half of Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 14 West; thence run East along the North line of the South half of said Section 25 to the Northeast corner of the South half of said Section 25, said point also lying on the County line common to Hancock and Harrison Counties, and the same being the line common to Ranges 13 and 14 West, Saint Stephens Meridian; thence run Southerly along said common County line a distance of 3,155 feet, more or less, to a point of intersection with the centerline of a power line easement; thence run Westerly along the centerline of said power line easement to its intersection with the centerline of Golf Club Drive; thence run Southwesterly along the centerline of Golf Club Drive to its intersection with the centerline of Cherry Hill Drive; thence run Northwesterly along the centerline of Cherry Hill Drive a distance of 165 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of the cart path of the Cardinal Golf Course; thence run Westerly along the meandering centerline of the cart path course around Holes 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the Cardinal Golf Course to its intersection with the centerline of Turnberry Drive; thence run Southwesterly along the centerline of Turnberry Drive to its intersection with the centerline of Mahalo Hui Drive; thence run Northwesterly along the centerline of said Mahalo Hui Drive to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North; thence run Northeasterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North and continuing Northeasterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Drive; thence continue Northeasterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West a distance of 1,932 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of Laa la Way; thence run along the centerline of Laa la Way to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West; thence run Easterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive West a distance of 575 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of a power line easement; thence run North and parallel to the East line of said Section 26 for a distance of 2,050 feet, more or less, to the point of intersection with the North Line of the City of Diamondhead, said point being on the Northerly right-of-way of an existing Mississippi Power Company Transmission Line Easement, said easement containing a 230 kV and a 115kV transmission line; thence run Northeasterly along the Northerly right-of-way of said



existing Mississippi Power Company Transmission Line Easement to its point of intersection with the West line of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 26; thence run North to the Northwest corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 26 and the Point of Beginning.

Ward 3

Beginning at point of intersection of the East Line of the City of Diamondhead and a Easterly projection of the centerline of Lanai Street, said point also lying on the County line common to Hancock and Harrison Counties, and the same being the line common to Ranges 13 and 14 West, Saint Stephens Meridian; thence run Southerly along said common County line to a point intersecting the present corporate limits of the City of Bay St. Louis, said point lying at the intersection of the line common to Ranges 13 and 14 West, Saint Stephens Meridian, with the center of the St. Louis Bay; thence run Southwesterly along the present corporate limits of the City of Bay St. Louis to the center of regular Section 14, Township 8 South, Range 14 West; thence leaving the present corporate limits of the City of Bay St. Louis, run Northwesterly to the point where the thread or centerline of Cutoff Bayou intersects St. Louis Bay, said point lying at the mouth of said Cutoff Bayou; thence run Northwesterly along the meanderings of the thread or centerline of said Cutoff Bayou to the point of intersection of the thread or centerline of said Cutoff Bayou with the thread or centerline of the Jordan River (also known as the Jourdan River); thence run Northerly along the meanderings of the thread or centerline of said Jordan River to the point of intersection with the centerline of Interstate Highway 10; thence run Northeasterly along the centerline of Interstate Highway 10 to its intersection with the centerline of Gex Drive; thence Northerly along the centerline of Gex Drive to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North; thence run northerly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North to its intersection with the traffic circle encompassing the Diamondhead P.O.A. offices; thence traverse around the western margin of the traffic circle to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North; thence run north along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North a distance of 1,725 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of Analii Street; thence run Northeasterly along the centerline of Analii Street to its intersection with the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North; thence run Northeasterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive North a distance of 382 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of Mahalo Hui Drive; thence run Southeasterly along the centerline of Mahalo Hui Drive to its intersection with Turnberry Drive; thence run Northeasterly along the centerline of Turnberry Drive to its intersection with the cart path of the Cardinal Golf Course thence run Easterly along the meandering centerline of the cart path around Holes 4, 3, 2, and 1 of the Cardinal Golf Course to its intersection with the centerline of Cherry Hill Drive; thence run Southeasterly along the centerline of Cherry Hill Drive a distance of 165 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of Golf Club Drive; thence run southwesterly along the centerline of Golf Club Drive a distance of 1,660 feet, more or less, to its intersection with a westerly projection of the south line of the Lanai Village Condominiums; thence run Easerly along said projection and the south line of the Lanai Village Condominiums to the Southeast corner of the Lanai Village Condominiums; thence run Easterly along a



projection of the south line of the Lanai Village Condominiums to the centerline of the cart path of the Diamondhead Pine Golf Course; thence run Southwesterly along the centerline of the cart path, said cart path being in vicinity of Hole 10, a distance of 1,060 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of Ahihi Street; thence run Southeasterly along the centerline of Ahihi Street to its intersection with Diamondhead Drive East; thence run easterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive East to its intersection with the centerline of the traffic circle at the intersection of Diamondhead Drive East and Lanai Street; thence traverse around the eastern margin of the traffic circle to its intersection with an Eastward projection of the centerline of Lanai Street; thence run East along the Eastward projection of the centerline of Lanai Street to its intersection with the East Line of the City of Diamondhead and the Point of Beginning.

Ward 4

Beginning at point of intersection of the East Line of the City of Diamondhead and the centerline of a power line easement, said point also lying on the County line common to Hancock and Harrison Counties, and the same being the line common to Ranges 13 and 14 West, Saint Stephens Meridian; and the same point lying 3,155 feet, more or less, South of the Northeast corner of the City of Diamondhead; thence run Westerly along the centerline of said power line easement to its intersection with the centerline of Golf Club Drive; thence run Southwesterly along the centerline of Golf Club Drive to its intersection with the centerline of Cherry Hill Drive; thence continue southwesterly along the centerline of Golf Club Drive a distance of 1,660 feet, more or less, to its intersection with a westerly projection of the south line of the Lanai Village Condominiums; thence run Easterly along said projection and the south line of the Lanai Village Condominiums to the Southeast corner of the Lanai Village Condominiums; thence run Easterly along a projection of the south line of the Lanai Village Condominiums to the centerline of the cart path of the Diamondhead Pine Golf Course; thence run Southwesterly along the centerline of the cart path, said cart path being in vicinity of Hole 10, a distance of 1,060 feet, more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of Ahihi Street; thence run Southeasterly along the centerline of Ahihi Street to its intersection with Diamondhead Drive East; thence run easterly along the centerline of Diamondhead Drive East to its intersection with the centerline of the traffic circle at the intersection of Diamondhead Drive East and Lanai Street; thence traverse around the eastern margin of the traffic circle to its intersection with an Eastward projection of the centerline of Lanai Street; thence run East along the Eastward projection of the centerline of Lanai Street to its intersection with the East Line of the City of Diamondhead, said point also lying on the County line common to Hancock and Harrison Counties, and the same being the line common to Ranges 13 and 14 West, Saint Stephens Meridian; thence run Northerly to along the East line of City of Diamondhead a distance of 3,165 feet more or less, to its intersection with the centerline of a power line easement and the Point of Beginning.

SECTION 2: That for the purpose of facilitating elections and bringing about a

coordinated election system with that of Hancock County, there shall continue to be two



polling places within the City of Diamondhead to be utilized for the purpose of municipal elections. Each such polling place and the respective election ward served thereby shall be as follows:

<u>Diamondhead City Hall</u>, 5000 Diamondhead Circle, shall be the designated polling place for Ward 1.

<u>Diamondhead Community Center</u>, 5300 Diamondhead Circle, shall be the designated polling place for Ward 2, Ward 3 and Ward 4.

<u>SECTION 3:</u> That beginning with the regular municipal election in the year 2025 or any required municipal election prior thereto, and in all municipal elections thereafter, all elections for the City of Diamondhead, Mississippi shall be held based upon the wards as established and defined herein utilizing the polling places hereinabove designated. <u>SECTION 4:</u> The City Clerk is hereby directed to arrange or cause to be arranged the voter rolls of the qualified electors of the City in accordance with the voting Wards established herein, beginning such arrangement as soon as practicable following the administrative preclearance of this ordinance pursuant to Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and completing the same in ample time for the voter rolls to be used for the party primaries held in connection with the regular municipal election to be held in the year 2025.

<u>SECTION 5:</u> That the city attorney is hereby directed to prepare and submit or cause to be prepared and submitted the necessary documentation to the United States Attorney General for administrative preclearance in accordance with Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, if necessary.

SECTION 6: That this Resolution shall take effect and be in force as is provided by law.



Mr. Drude:

There are piles of debris from land clearing on the above-mentioned properties. It is in violation of the City of Diamondhead Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance No. 2012-019), Section 16.7 – Care of Premises and Property, "...the general site and/or premises shall be maintained in general with particular reference to insuring that appearance will be and remain compatible and harmonious with properties in the general area and will not be so at variance with other properties in the general area as to cause a substantial depreciation of such property values. In addition these debris piles are a hazard to the public safety of residents due to extremely dry conditions and hurricane season.

The violation is: Debris piles from land clearing - Zoning Ordinance, Article 16.7; Mississippi Code §21-19-11.

Based on the violation identified, the City requests that you take the following corrective action: Remove and properly dispose of all debris.

The City is asking that you please take the above action within the next FOURTEEN (14) days to prevent further action as set out in the paragraph below.

NOTICE OF HEARING

If you have not taken the above corrective actions within the 14 days provided, you are hereby given notice of and invited to attend a hearing before the Diamondhead City Council on September 5, 2023, at 6:00 PM in the City Council chambers at 5000 Diamondhead Circle, Diamondhead, Mississippi 39525, on the violations set forth above. At this hearing, the City Council will be asked to adjudicate that the subject property is in a state of uncleanliness or a menace to the public health, safety, and general welfare of the community. This adjudication will also authorize the City of Diamondhead to re-enter the property for a period of two (2) years without any further hearings if

notice is posted on this property and at City Hall, 5000 Diamondhead Circle, Diamondhead, Mississippi 39525, at least seven (7) days prior to re-entering the property for resolution of the same type of violation. In addition, the City Council will be asked to authorize advertisements for bids to perform the necessary corrective actions. All costs incurred will be assessed to your property taxes and/or posted to the Hancock County Judgment Rolls. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter the "MOU") is entered into between the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Board of Trustees (hereinafter the "Board") and the <u>City of Diamondhead, MS</u> (hereinafter "Entity") (collectively, the "parties") for the purpose of establishing the agreed upon conditions under which the Board may disburse funds to assist the <u>Entity</u> in paying costs associated with the local (project) <u>Noma</u> <u>Drive Boat Ramp Improvements</u> (hereinafter the "Project") specified in Miss. Code Ann. Section 49-39-7 (hereinafter the "Act"). This MOU is entered into in accordance with Miss. Code Ann. Section 27-104-351, also known as the Line-Item Appropriation Transparency Act, and pursuant to, and subject to the terms of the Act, which authorizes an amount not to exceed (<u>\$250,000.00</u>) (hereinafter the "Project Funds"), for the Project. (IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO SPEND THE FUNDS RECEIVED FROM THE STATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACT AS WELL AS ALL STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS.)

RECITALS

WHEREAS, The Board is a state agency that acts as <u>Mississippi Outdoor</u> <u>Stewardship Trust Fund</u> with a principal place of business at <u>501 N. West St., Suite</u> <u>1301, Jackson, MS 39201</u>.

WHEREAS, the Entity is a state agency, or governmental entity with a principal place of business at <u>5000 Diamondhead Circle, Diamondhead, MS 39525</u>.

WHEREAS, Miss. Code Ann. Section 49-39-7, authorized expenditures from the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund for certain projects.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. Section 49-39-7, the Legislature has appropriated funds to the entity to pay the costs of the Project.

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the Board to disburse monies in the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund to pay the costs of the Project.

WHEREAS, the Board has requested the entity to maintain on file the documentation listed in "Exhibit A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

WHEREAS, the Entity shall obtain a builder's risk insurance policy at the time any construction begins. The insurance must cover potential losses after initiation, but before completion, of the construction or modernization caused by theft, fire, vandalism, and other types of accidental loss or damage to the project. The Board may waive this requirement if the Entity shows that it is effectively self-insured against the risks involved. The term "effectively self-insured" shall mean that the recipient has sufficient funds to pay

for any damage, including total replacement, if necessary, or to satisfy any claims against the project.

WHEREAS, The Board shall retain ten percent (10%) of each reimbursement request. Upon the completion of the project and all required documentation has been submitted and approved by the Board, the retainage amount shall be released to the Entity after a final audit is conducted.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees that the Board shall reimburse the Entity once project expenses have been incurred and paid for by the Entity, proper itemized expenditure documentation has been submitted to the Board, and the Board has approved the requested reimbursement up to the amount in this agreement. Proper documentation includes all invoices, receipts and bank statements associated with the reported expenditures. Reimbursement requests shall be provided within thirty (30) days of each calendar end of the month.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees expenses directly related to the project scope but incurred prior to this agreement are not reimbursable. Appraisals, project planning, and environmental compliance review expenses may be counted as match only if incurred within eighteen (18) months of this agreement.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees that any incidental costs or items not directly associated and essential for the completion and execution of a project shall be ineligible for reimbursement or match.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees that the value of donations and third-party contributions provided at no cost cannot be reimbursed and to be counted towards a project's match, the Entity shall provide an invoice and a letter from the organization acknowledging the donation and its fair market value.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees that labor donations shall be valued at an hourly rate of pay to be calculated using the Mississippi Median Hourly Wage standards for the most comparable occupation identified on the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics site, found at https://www.bls.gov/oes/current/oes_ms.htm, excluding taxes, benefits, and overtime.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees to expend the funds within twenty-four (24) months from the date of this agreement.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees that if any proceeds from the Project Funds are remaining at the completion of the Project, the Entity will immediately notify and consult with the Board regarding the disposition of the funds, and said funds shall be directed in accordance with the Act.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees that the Entity may request project term extensions if the project is expected to exceed the 24-month deadline. Extensions must be requested within a reasonable time before the expiration of the original 24-month deadline. At a

minimum, extension requests must inform the Board of the current status of the project, current expenditures, anticipated completion date, and reason for the delay. The Board, at its discretion, may request any additional information necessary to make its determination. Extensions are limited to ninety (90) day increments and subject to approval by the Board. If approved, the Entity shall sign a Project Agreement Amendment. If disapproved, and this agreement cannot be fulfilled, the Board may deobligate in part or in whole the funds appropriated in this agreement.

WHEREAS, the Entity agrees to provide quarterly reports to the Board which provide an update on the status of the Project including future expenditure of the funds. The quarterly reports must be provided on a form designated by the Board and must include all invoices and bank statements associated with the reported expenditures. The quarterly reports shall be provided within thirty (30) days of each calendar quarter end. The Entity shall also provide to the Board a final report no more than thirty (30) days after final expenditure of funds, summarizing the expenditures and use of the Project Funds upon completion of the Project. All invoices that have not previously been submitted, shall be submitted upon completion of the Project.

WHEREAS, the Board finds that it is in the best interest of the Board and the Entity that the funds on deposit in the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund for the Entity should be disbursed to the Entity and that the Entity shall directly administer the expenditure of such funds for the Project.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS MUTALLY AGREED BY THE BOARD AND ADMINISTRATION AND THE ENTITY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board, pursuant to the Act, shall disburse the Project Funds from the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund upon written request of the Entity to reimburse the costs associated with the Project.

Section 2. The Entity certifies and agrees to make every effort to expend all funds received from the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund within twenty-four (24) months from the date of this agreement and solely for the costs of the Project as set forth in the Act and upon the terms and provisions of this MOU. Failure of the Entity to adhere to any provision within this MOU may result in immediate action by the State to recover project funds.

Section 3. The Entity agrees to execute any procurements utilizing the funding in a commercially reasonable manner. Failure to adhere may cause the Board to withhold all sums for the Project and/or seek recovery of the same. Further, the Entity agrees to maintain on file the documentation listed in "Exhibit A" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 4. The Entity agrees to provide the Board quarterly notarized reports as set forth hereinabove, in a format prescribed by the Board. The quarterly reports shall be

provided within thirty (30) days of each calendar quarter end. The Entity shall also provide the Board with a final report summarizing the expenditures and use of the Project Funds no more than thirty (30) days after final expenditure of the Project Funds.

Section 5. The Entity agrees to maintain copies of all invoices, bank statements, and similar documentation for each expenditure of all funds received from the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund sufficient to satisfy and confirm, to Board satisfaction, that such funds have been expended solely for the costs of the project as authorized and provided by the Act.

Section 6. The Entity agrees that if any proceeds from the Project Fund are remaining at the completion of the Project, the Entity will immediately notify and consult with the Board regarding the disposition of the funds and said funds shall be directed in accordance with the Act.

Section 7. The Entity agrees that Project Funds shall be expended in accordance with all State and Federal laws and regulations, and that failure to do so may cause the Board to withhold funds for the Project or seek recovery of same.

Section 8. Any notice from one party to the other under this Agreement shall be in writing and may be either personally delivered, emailed, or sent by registered or certified mail in the United States Postal Service, Return Receipt Requested, postage prepaid, addressed to each party at the addresses which follow, or to such other addresses provided for in this Agreement, or as the Parties may hereinafter designate in writing. Any such notice shall be deemed to have been given as of the date transmitted.

Section 9. This MOU may be amended or modified only by written agreement signed by both parties.

Section 10. The Board has authority to hear, oversee, and resolve any disputes that may arise in carrying out the duties of the parties under this MOU. The Parties agree

to undertake a good faith attempt to resolve any such disputes before seeking Board resolution.

Section 11. If any term or provision of this MOU is prohibited by the laws of the State of Mississippi or declared void by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this MOU shall not be affected thereby and each term and provision of this MOU shall be valid and enforceable.

Section 12. Each party shall be responsible for all claims, demands, liabilities, suits, damages, costs, and expenses of every kind, including court costs and attorney's fees, arising out of this MOU and caused by the party's own principals, agents, employees, contractors, or subcontractors while performing under this MOU. Further, the parties do not assume liability for any actions or omissions of each other's agents, representatives, employees, contractors, subcontractors, or providers.

Section 13. The Entity's tort liability, as political subdivision of the State of Mississippi, is determined and controlled in accordance with Mississippi Code Annotated § 11-46-1 *et seq.*, including all defenses and exceptions contained therein. Board's liability, as a political subdivision of the State of Mississippi, is determined and controlled in accordance with Mississippi Code Annotated § 11-46-1 *et seq.*, including all defenses and exceptions contained therein. Section 15. This MOU, including any exhibits, attachments, and appendices, is subject to the "Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983," and its exceptions. See Miss. Code Ann. § 25-61-1, *et seq.* and Miss. Code Ann. § 79-23-1. In addition, this MOU may be subject to the provisions of the Mississippi Accountability and Transparency Act of 2008. Mississippi Code Annotated §§ 27-104-151 *et seq.*

Section 16. Neither Party shall have the right to assign this MOU to a third party without the prior written consent of the other Party. Any permitted assignee shall assume all obligations of its assignor under this MOU. No assignment shall relieve any party of responsibility for the performance of any obligations that have accrued prior to such assignment.

Section 17. The failure of either Party to insist upon the strict observation or performance of any provision of this MOU or to exercise any right or remedy shall not impair or waive any such right or remedy in the future. Every right and remedy given by this MOU to the Parties may be exercised from time to time as often as appropriate.

Section 18. The Board and the Entity each represent and warrant to the other that the person signing below has all requisite legal power and authority to execute this MOU on behalf of each party and each party shall thereby be bound.

Section 19. This MOU is effective on the date of the final signature to the MOU ("Effective Date of this MOU"). Facsimiles and electronic transmissions of signatures shall constitute acceptable, binding signatures for purpose of this MOU.
