Daniel Decker has lived and worked in Dillingham for almost 25 years. He has been the Acting City Manager for the City of Dillingham since March 2024. Prior to that, he was serving as the City Clerk for the city starting in August 2023. He also served the city as a Police Officer/Field Training Officer earlier in his career, from 2013-2015. Prior to his recent time serving the city, Mr. Decker was Tribal Administrator for the Native Village of Georgetown, and he served in Grant Writer/Grant Administrator positions for the Alaska Department of Natural Resources and the Bristol Bay Area Health Corporation. He was also Station Master for Peninsula Airlines and a Public Safety Officer and First Sergeant for the Bristol Bay Native Association from 2005-2013. He is currently working on a bachelor's degree in Business Administration.

Sidney Miller most recently completed a six-month contract assignment as Human Resources Manager for the City of Wasilla, Alaska. Prior to that, he was with the Douglasville-Douglas County Water and Sewer Authority in Georgia for 17 years where he was the Director of Human Resources/General Services. He was responsible for all Human Resources, Purchasing, Risk Management, Emergency Management, Facilities Management, Dispatch, and Pension Secretary functions and managed 15 staff in his department. He also served as Director of Administration Operations for a private firm for five years in New York. Mr. Miller has a bachelor's degree in Industrial Engineering and a Master of Public Administration degree, both from Kennesaw State University in Georgia.
