**I. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL**

The meeting was called to order at 5:30pm by Mayor Barry Hottmann. Members present: Shaun Sersch, Roxanne Reynolds-Lair, Tom DeVoss, Jeff “Potsie” Weber, Mike Olson, Julie Johnson-Solberg, Michelle Peterson. Members absent: Jerry Johnson (excused). Others present: Logan Hanson (Vierbicher), Dylan Wadzinski (DPW), Brandon Wilhelm (Police Chief), Wendy Nipple (Dodgeville resident), Pat Sieling (Dodgeville resident)

During public comment, Mayor Hottmann read a letter that City resident Wendy Nipple provided. The letter that Ms. Nipple provided to Mayor Hottmann included concerns about incorrect information being shared in the packet for the June 16<sup>th</sup> Common Council meeting, regarding fireworks permits being requested. This letter also included concerns of open records violations to the City of Dodgeville, in which responses to open record requests she has submitted have not been received in a timely fashion. Ms. Nipple also addressed concerns of the barbwire fence at City Hall, and asked that this be removed/recycled, and that the income received from the recycling of this material be used to make needed repairs to the parking lot at City Hall. Nipple also referenced her concern of council meetings still NOT occurring via Zoom. Lastly, Nipple referenced it being illegal for the City of Dodgeville to appoint DPW Dylan Wadzinski as both the Health Officer and ADA coordinator for the City of Dodgeville. Mayor Hottmann informed that the appointment of Health Officer and Interim ADA coordinator to Dylan Wadzinski had been recommended by City Attorney Eric Hagen. Finally, Nipple spoke in the letter that Mayor Hottmann read that a separate email had been sent to all alderman on Monday, June 15<sup>th</sup>, regarding her concerns with physical hazards across the city.

Wolfe also noted that because there were so many candidates on the ballot for various contests on the ballot, the express vote ticket used for early voting and voting on election day would now be 17" in length instead of the standard 14" in length.

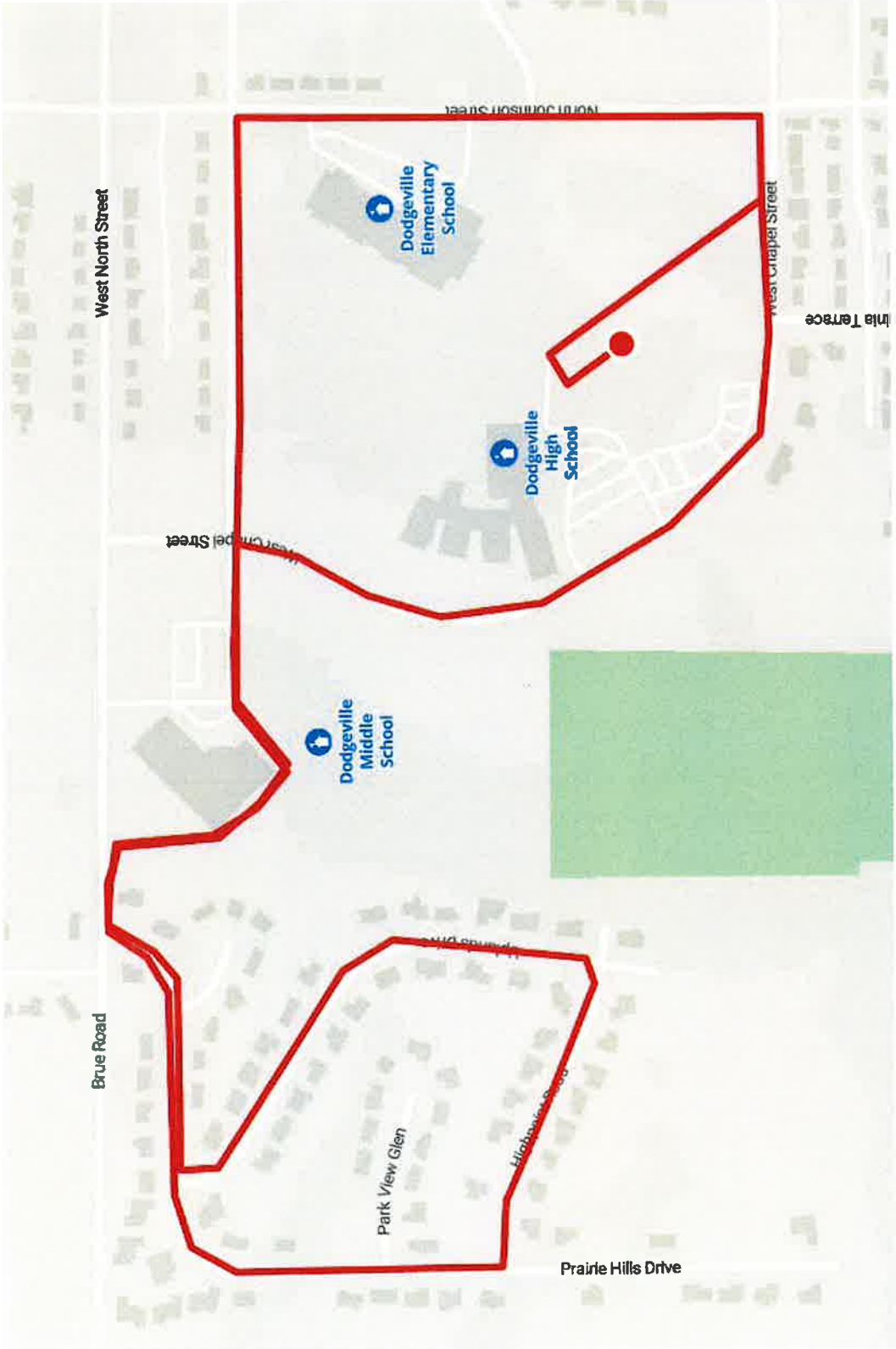

## Dodgeville Community Assembly — Summary Overview

### What We Are Proposing

The City of Dodgeville and Dodgeville School District are being invited to co-sponsor a Community Assembly which is a structured, facilitated process that brings together everyday residents to learn, deliberate, and develop consensus recommendations on a pressing community question. This is not a town hall or a public comment session. It is a proven process that reaches past the loudest voices to hear from a representative cross-section of the community.

### The Question We Are Exploring

*"How do we focus our resources to best address the local housing crisis and declining school enrollment?"*

### Why This Matters for Dodgeville

Dodgeville is feeling pressure from multiple directions such as rising housing costs, low housing inventory, and a school enrollment decline that threatens both the district's financial sustainability and the community's long-term vitality. These challenges are connected, and solving them requires more than expert analysis. It requires community voice, shared understanding, and public will.
